

Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup









Students in both elementary and middles schools begin to demonstrate college readiness behaviors long before they even enter high school. Among the behaviors that research has shown to be indicative of success and college and career readiness are regularly attending school and challenging themselves with rigorous course work. 



Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup












NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 04










Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup



Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent














NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 06




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 06



NAEP assesses fourth-, eighth-, and twelfth-grade students in subjects such as reading, mathematics, science, and writing. The reporting of NAEP scores on state report cards is a federal mandate. The results of NAEP are also published as the Nation's Report Card, and are available for the nation, states, and, in some cases, urban districts. 


