

The State School Tax, amounting to one million nine hundred and thirty-nine thousand two hundred and thirty-five dollars (\$1,939,235), has been received and disbursed to the several counties of the State in accordance with the apportionment of the State Board of Education.

The Agricultural College Fund, amounting to one hundred and sixteen thousand dollars (\$116,000), is all invested in the bonds of this State. The interest on the same, six thousand nine hundred and sixty dollars (\$6,960), has been received and disbursed for the maintenance of Rutgers Scientific School.

The following is a statement of amounts received and disbursed during the past fiscal year of taxes assessed by the State Board of Assessors for the use of taxing districts, under an act for the taxation of railroad and canal property, approved April 10, 1884 :
