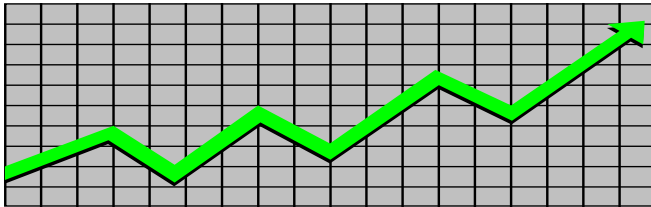

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DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS SEPTEMBER 2025

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of September, the TANF caseload had decreased by 1875 cases, from 11,514 in September 2024 to 9,639 in September 2025; a decrease of -16.3%.
- The counties with caseloads that increased the most since September 2024 were Warren (7.4%), Burlington (3%), and Cape May (1.4%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since September 2024 were Sussex (-46.4%), Union (-38%), and Essex (-34%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 2,013 or 20.9% were child-only in September 2025.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (350), Hudson (267), and Atlantic (169)
- Hudson (4,690), Camden (3,423), and Essex (2,726) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in September 2025.

NJ SNAP (Formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In September 2025, there were 432,257 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 11,915 or -2.7%, since September 2024.
- There were 802,701 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of September 2025; a decrease of 28,270 or -3.4% since September 2024.
- The counties having the highest SNAP caseload increase since September 2024 were Burlington (10.4%), Gloucester (5.3%), and Warren (3.4%).
- The counties having the highest SNAP caseload decrease since September 2024 were Essex (-13.4%), Mercer (-5%), and Union (-4.4%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 1,800 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in September 2025; an increase of 54 or 3.1% since September 2024.
- In September 2025, EA payments were made for 690 SSI recipients.

DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS SEPTEMBER 2025

- There were 3,107 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in September 2025; an increase of 817 or 35.7% since September 2024.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Salem (360%), Burlington (251%), and Middlesex (77.1%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Gloucester (-42%), Hunterdon (-38.1%), and Cumberland (-30%).

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has increased from 15,718 to 18,410 since September 2024; an increase of 17.1%.
- There were 14,077 Employable GA and 4,333 Unemployable GA cases in September 2025.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Burlington (84.8%), Cumberland (36.6%), and Essex (33.7%) since September 2024.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since September 2024 were Hunterdon (-19.2%), Sussex (-16.1%), and Bergen (-8.4%).
- In September 2025, GA cases showed a 1.69% increase since August 2025.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (QUARTERLY REPORT)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$312 million from July 2025 to September 2025; an increase of 21.11% over the same period from FFY 2024.
- Total distributions decreased 0.3% from September 2024.

WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of September 2025, there were 479 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 104 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Hudson (91), Essex (88), and Camden (80).
- There were 226 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

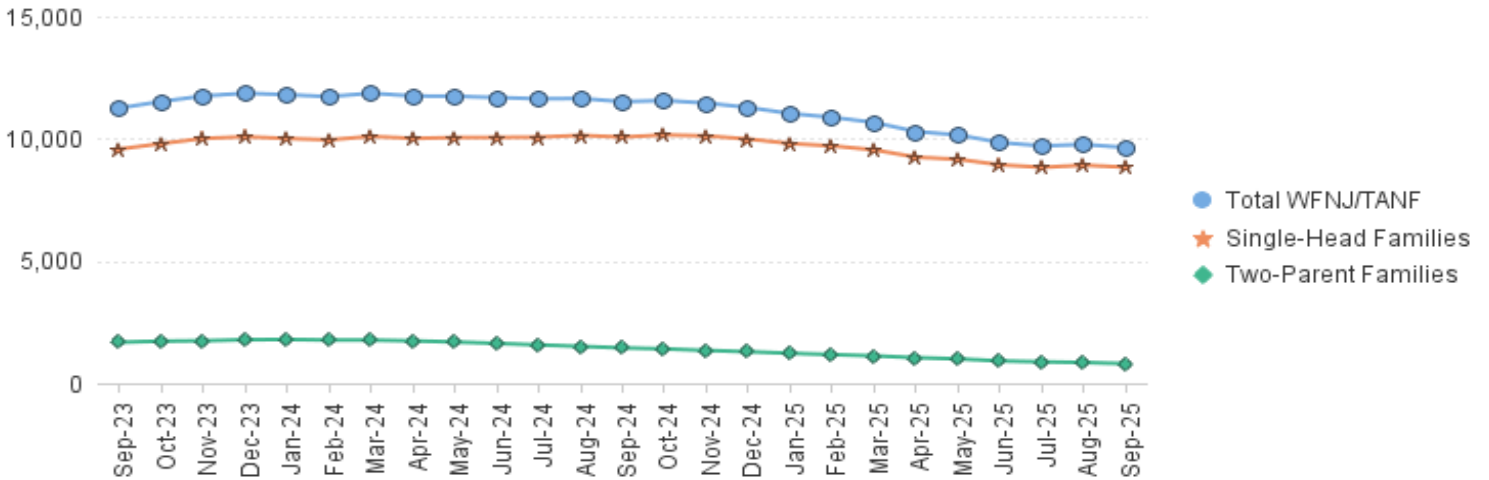

 SEPTEMBER 2023 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 2025

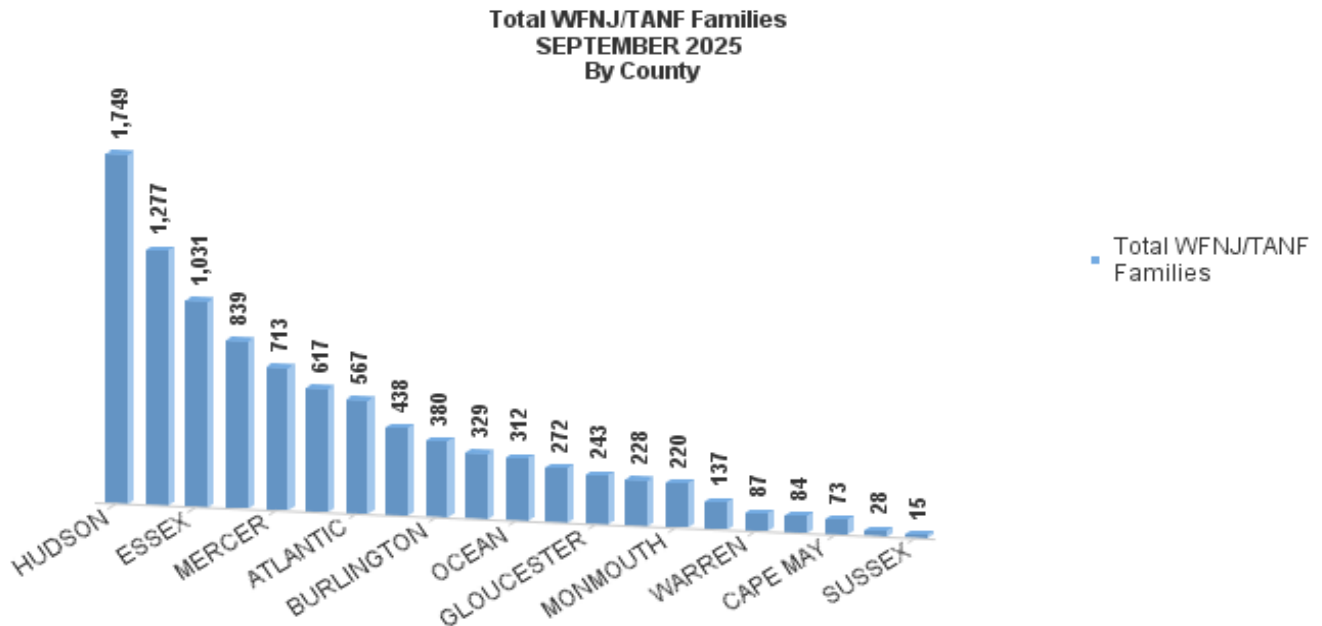

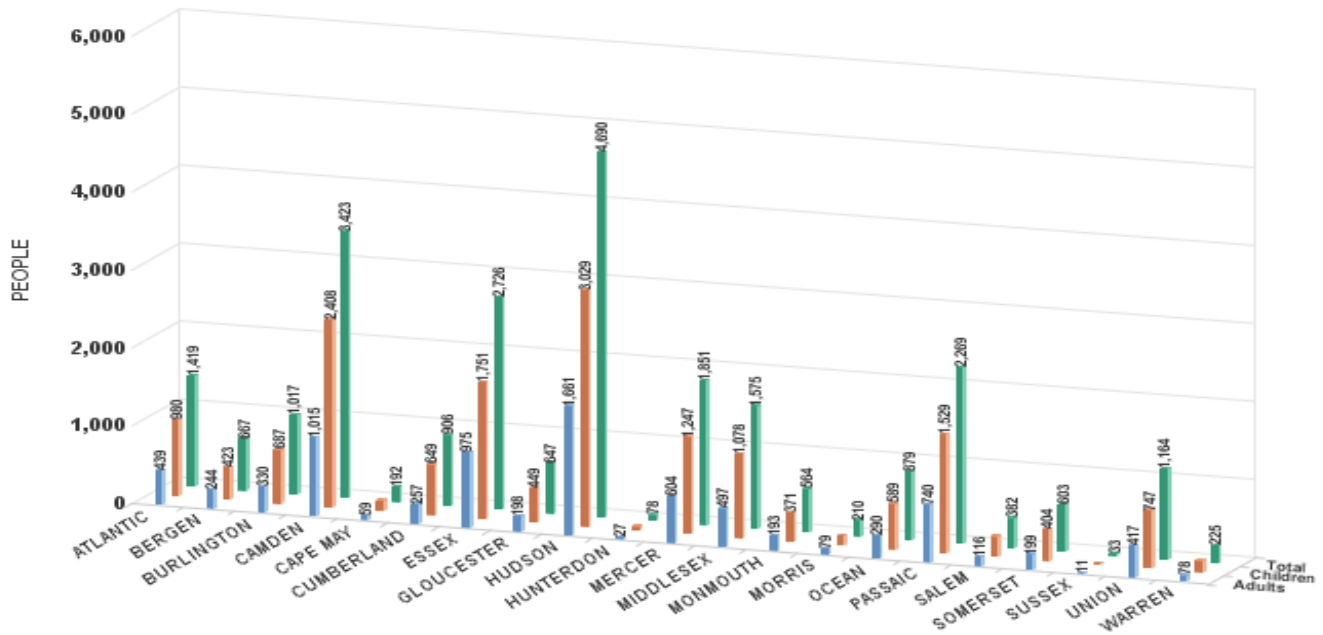

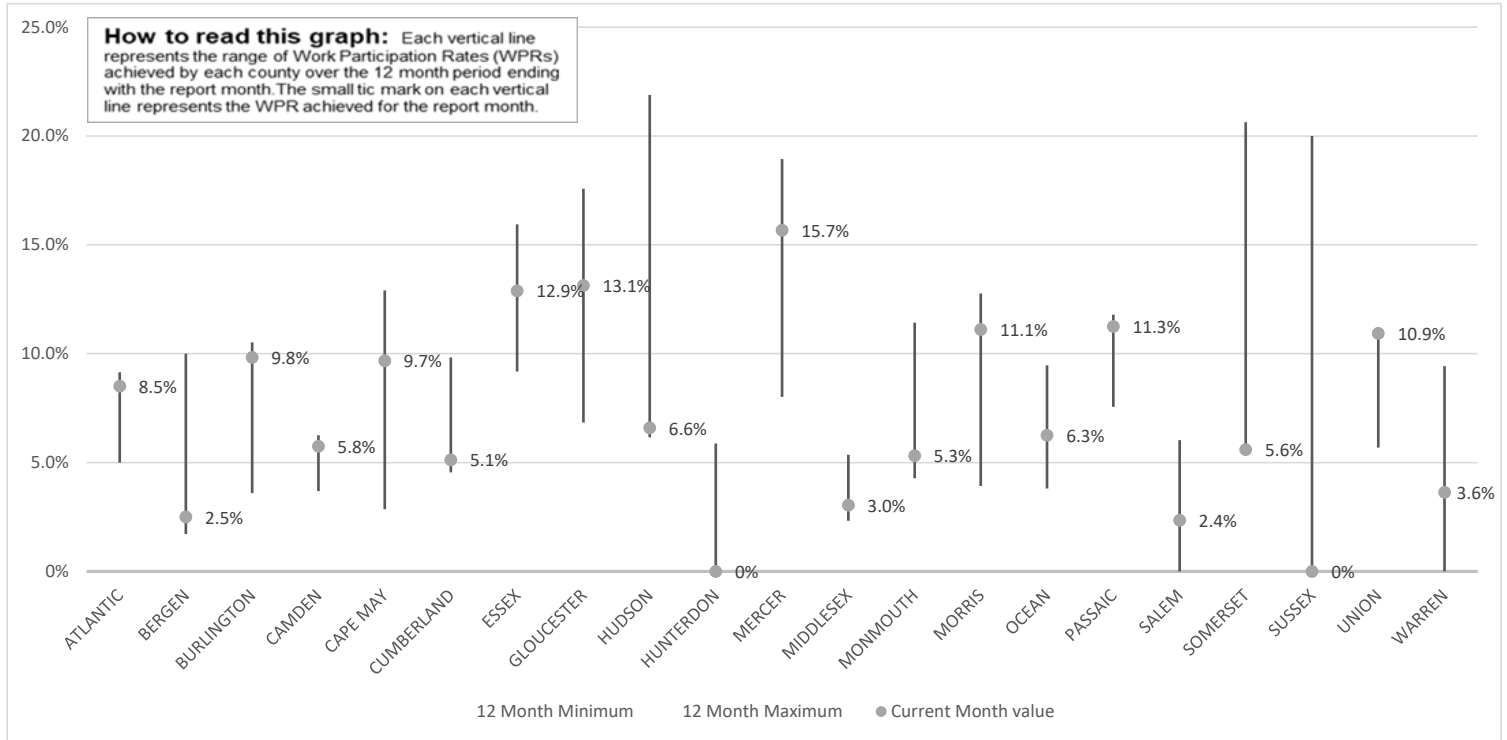

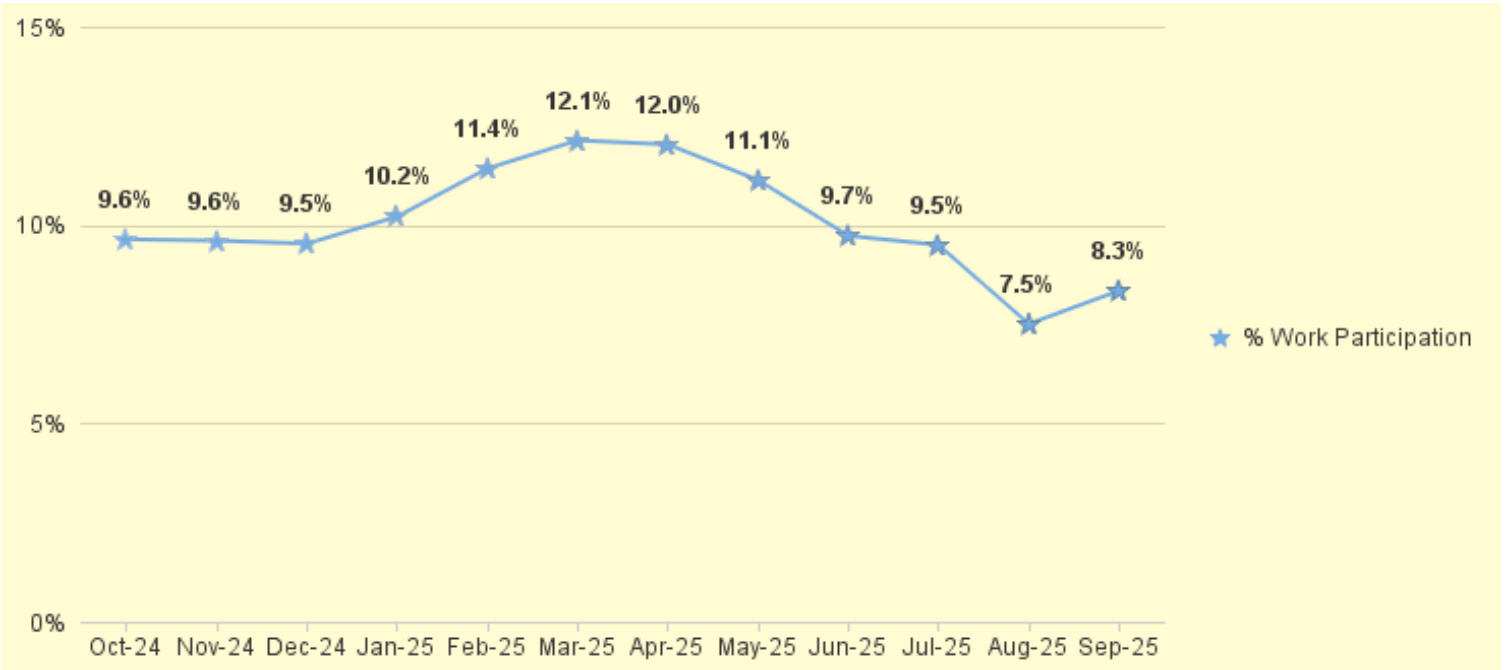
Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period

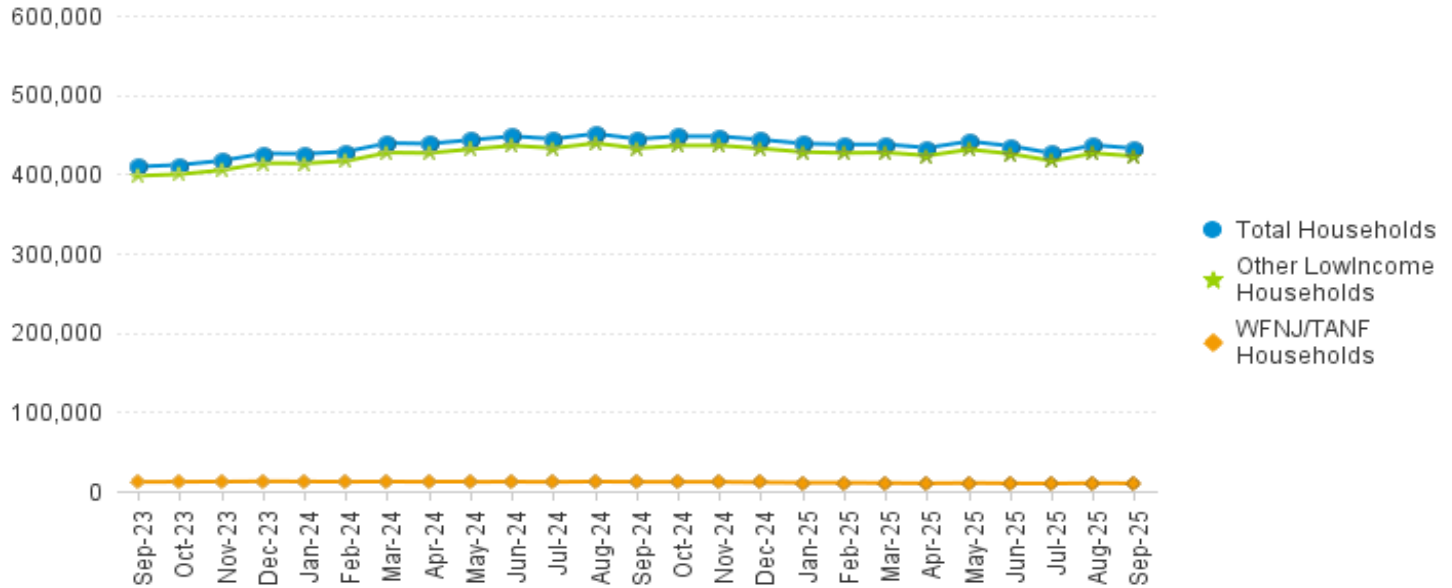
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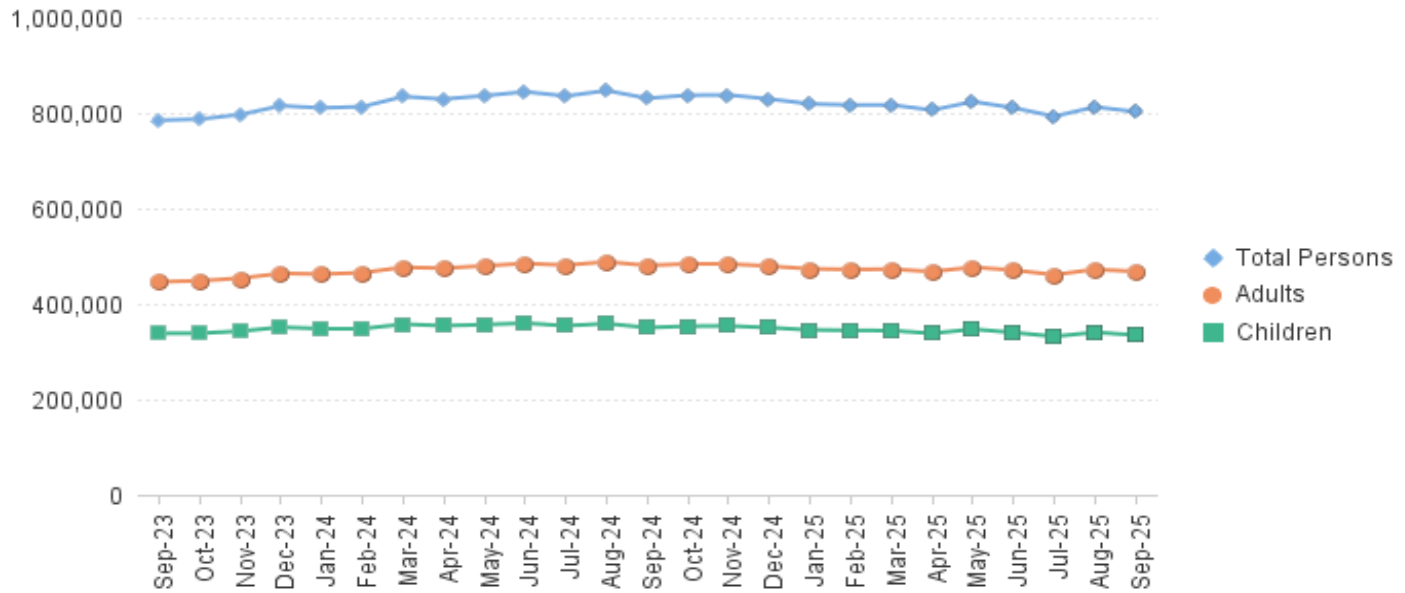

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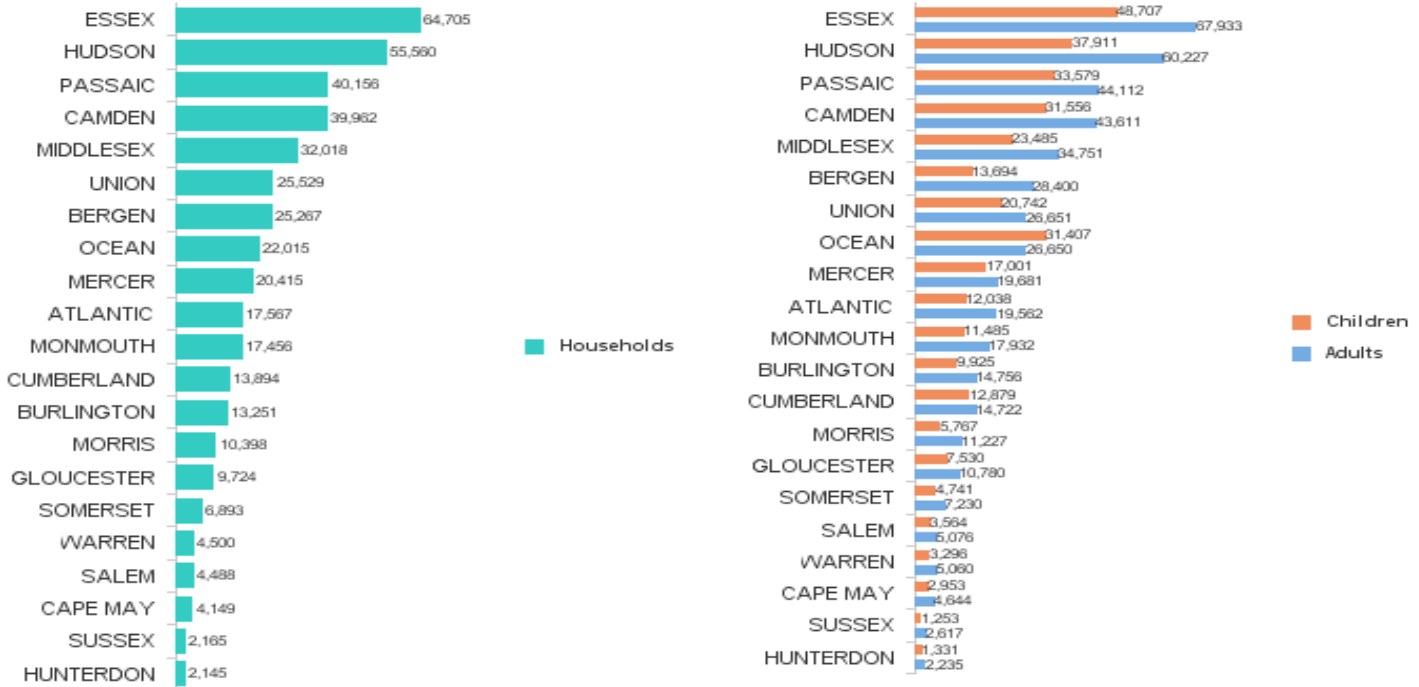

 SEPTEMBER 2025 by County**



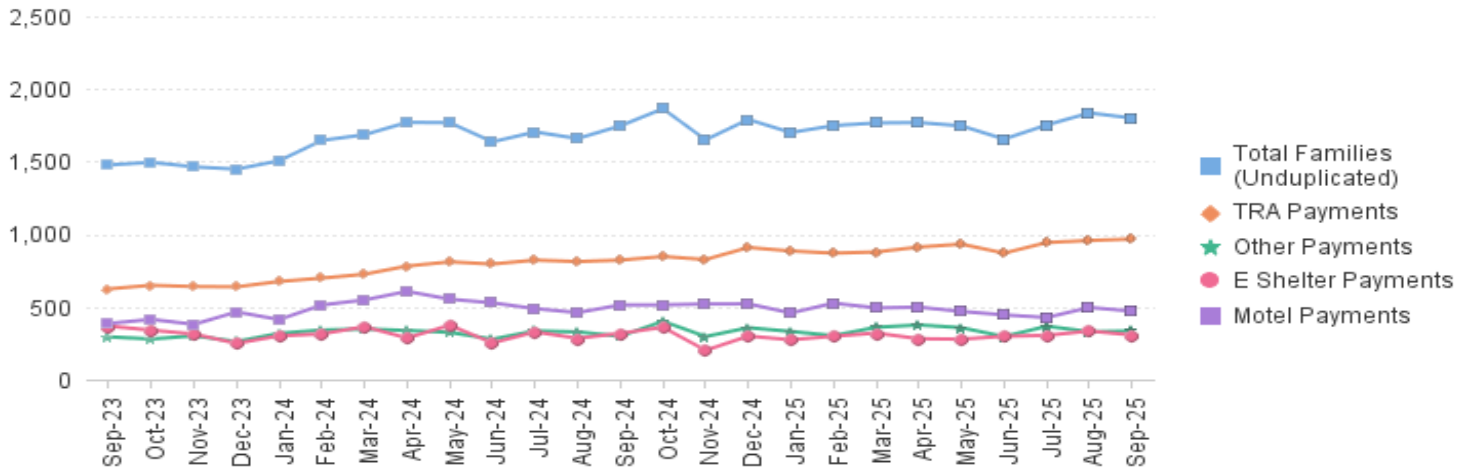

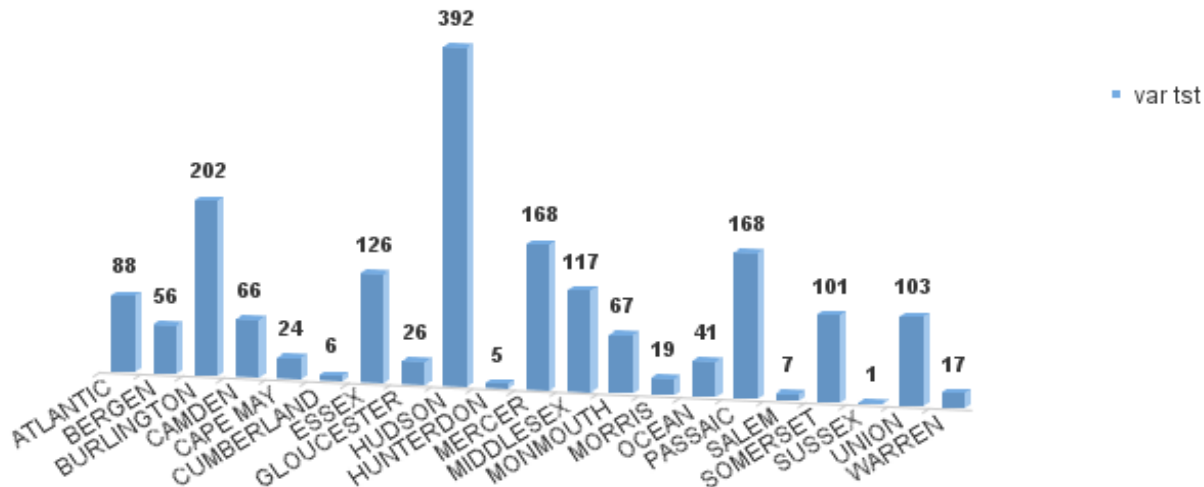

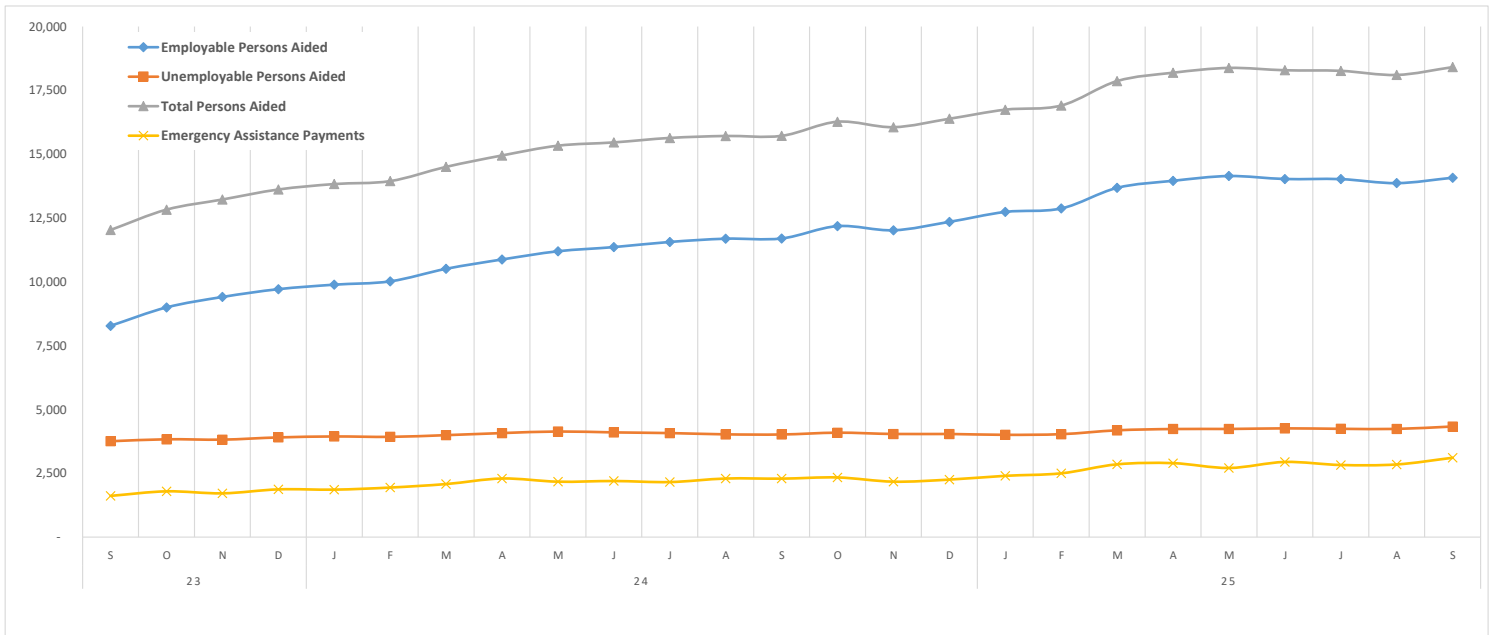

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as NJ SNAP (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
