Appellants appeal from an order of respondent dated June 3, 1968 suspending their plenary retail consumption license for premises 540 No. White Horse Pike, Magnolia, for twenty days effective June 18, 1968, for sale to a minor.

The suspension was imposed following (and notwithstanding) my order dated May 29, 1968, fixing the suspension date for the violation involved effective June 4, 1968, in dismissing a previous appeal. Anconetani v. Magnolia, Bulletin 1805, Item 5.

Prior to the hearing, appellants' attorneys advised me that the suspension has been served in accordance with my previous order; that respondent's order which is the subject of this appeal has been vacated and that the appeal herein is withdrawn, with consent of respondent's attorney to an order of dismissal.

Licensee pleads non vult to charges as follows:

1. In your application dated May 29, 1967, filed with the Municipal Board of Alcoholic Beverage Control of the City of Newark on June 1, 1967, and upon which you obtained your current plenary retail consumption license you falsely stated, "No" in answer to Question No. 29, which asks: "Has any individual, partnership, corporation or association, other than the applicant, any interest, directly or indirectly, in the license applied for or in the business to be conducted under said license?", whereas in truth and fact Margarito Reyes had such an interest in that he was co-owner and partner with you in said license and in the business conducted thereunder; such false statement being in violation of R.S. 33:1-25.

2. From on or about April 26, 1967, until the present time you knowingly aided and abetted Margarito Reyes to exercise contrary to R.S. 33:1-26, the rights and privileges of your plenary Retail Consumption license; in violation of R.S. 33:1-32.

The facts are sufficiently set forth in the quoted charges when there is added the fact that Margarito Reyes is the husband of the licensee and is a national of Cuba (with which country the United States has no reciprocal trade treaty) and hence is ineligible to hold a license by reason of his non-citizenship.

During the pendency of these proceedings, the interest of Margarito Reyes in the license and licensed business was conveyed to the licensee, in consequence of which the unlawful situation has been corrected.

Absent prior record, the license will be suspended for thirty days, with remission of five days for the plea entered, leaving a net suspension of twenty-five days. Re Kinney, Bulletin 1217, Item 5; Re Carlton, Bulletin 1535, Item 5.


