#### **Academic Achievement**

This school outperforms 9% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 6% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of Academic Achievement. Additionally, this school is meeting 100% of its performance targets in the area of Academic Achievement.



Academic Achievement measures the content knowledge students have in language arts literacy and math. For high schools, this includes measures of the school's proficiency rate on both the Language Arts Literacy and Math sections of the New Jersey High School Proficiency Assessment (HSPA). A proficiency rate is calculated by summing the count of students who scored either proficient or advanced proficient on the assessment and dividing by the count of valid test scores.

#### **College and Career Readiness**

This school outperforms 37% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 43% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting 20% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.



College and Career Readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. For high schools, this includes measures of participation in college readiness tests such as the SAT, ACT or PSAT and in rigorous coursework as defined by participation in AP or IB courses in English, math, social studies and science.

#### **Graduation and Post-Secondary**

This school outperforms 11% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 12% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of Graduation and Post-Secondary. Additionally, this school is meeting 50% of its performance targets in the area of Graduation and Post-Secondary.



Graduation and Postsecondary measures the rate at which students who begin high school four years earlier graduate within four years. Also included is a measure of the rate at which students in a particular school drop out of school.

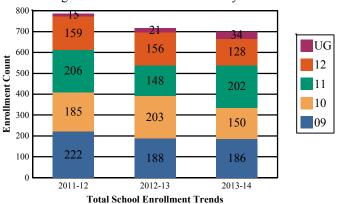

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#### **Enrollment by Grade**

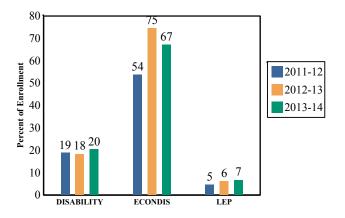

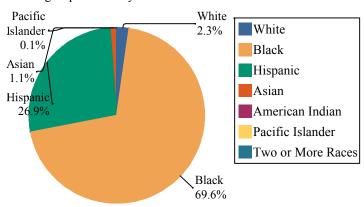

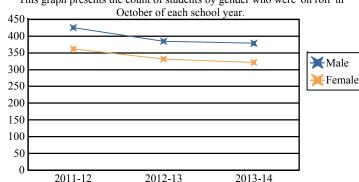
#### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

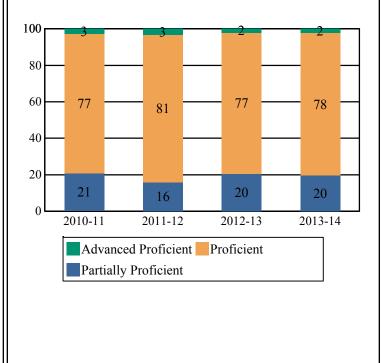

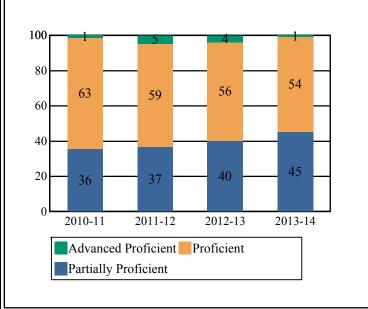

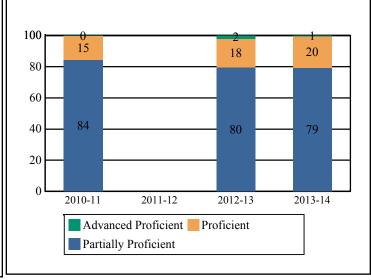
### **Proficiency Trends - Math**

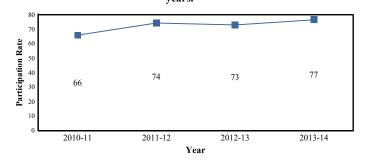

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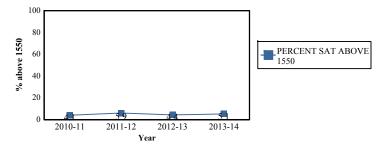
#### **Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT) Results**

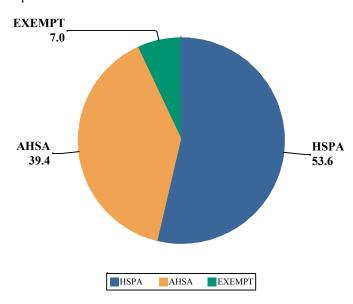
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#### **Graduation Pathway Rates**

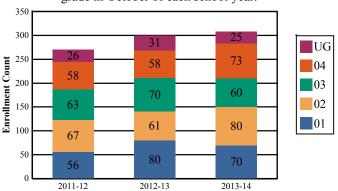

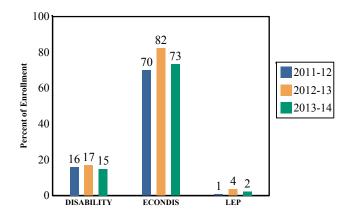

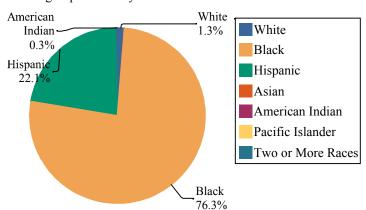

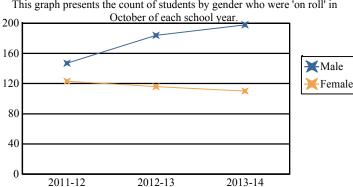
### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

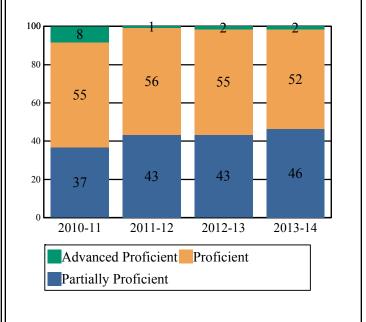

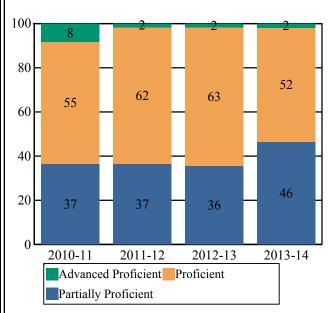

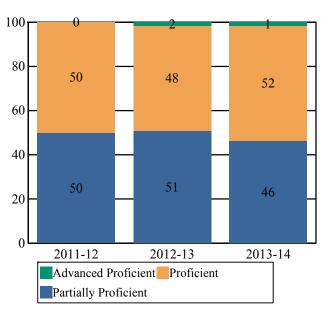
#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03

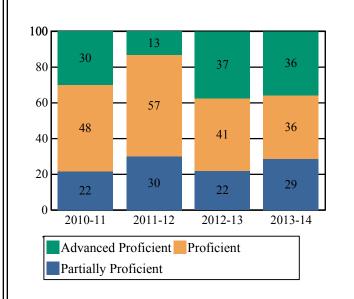

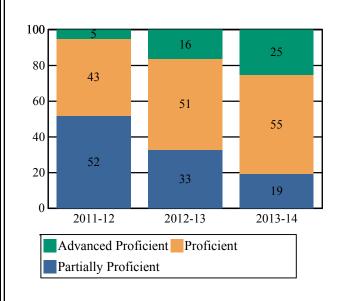
### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03

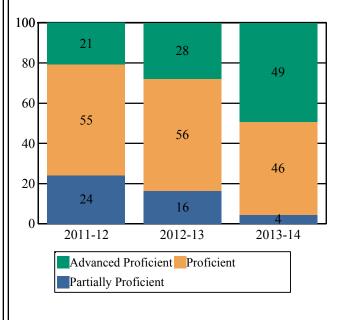

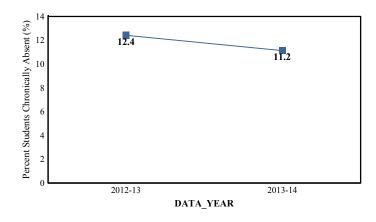

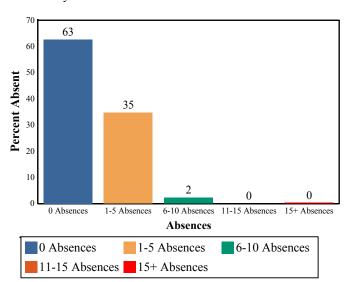
#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**

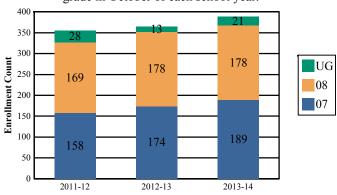

This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.

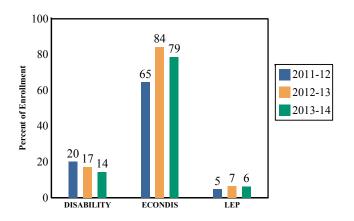

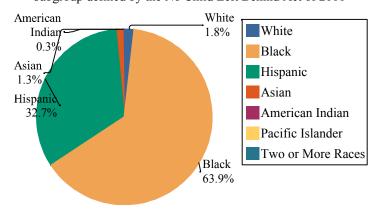

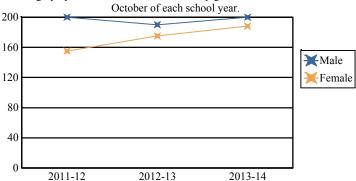
#### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

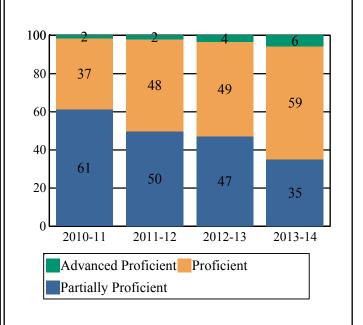

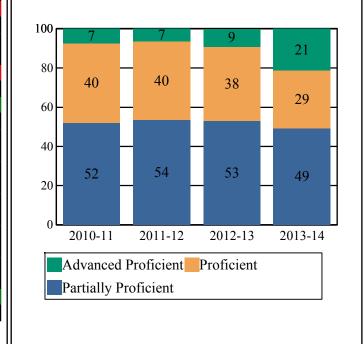

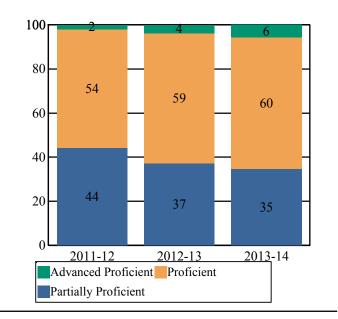

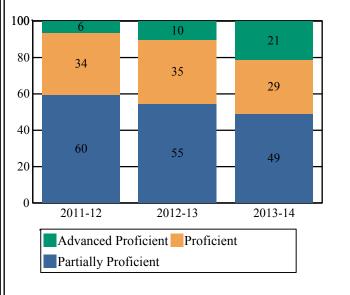
#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 07

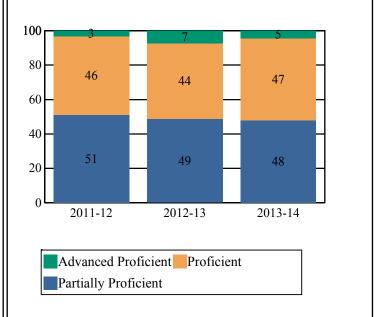

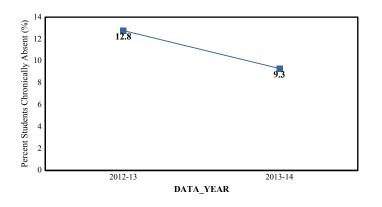

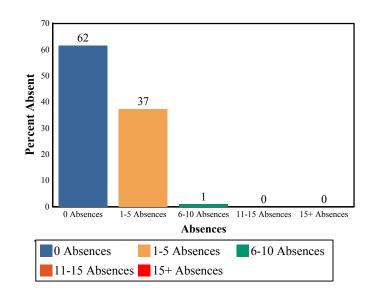
#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**

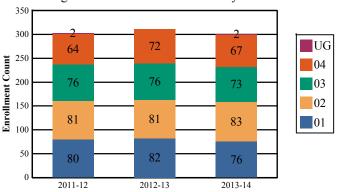

This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.

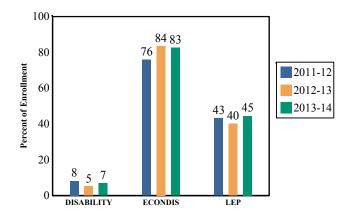

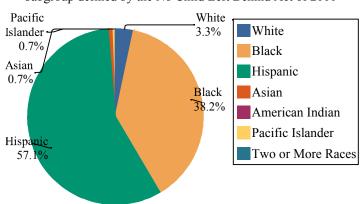

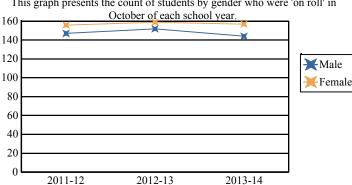
## Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

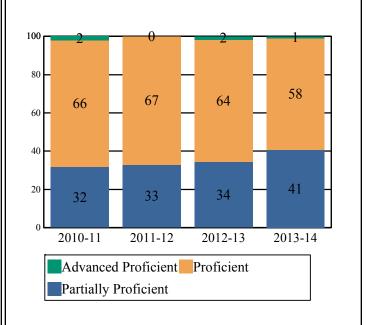

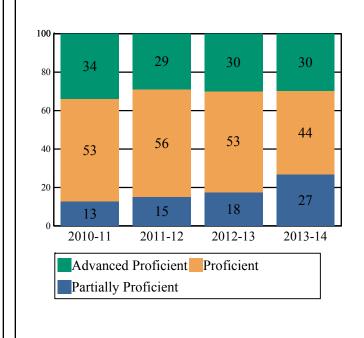

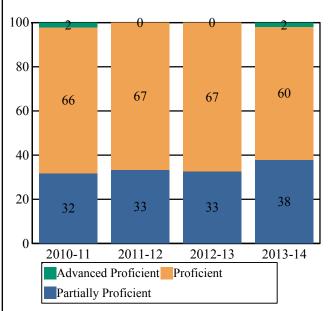

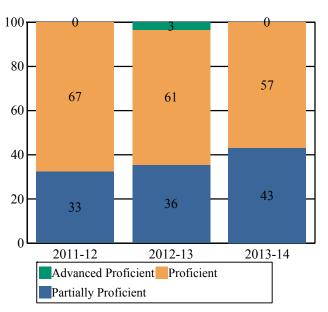
## NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03

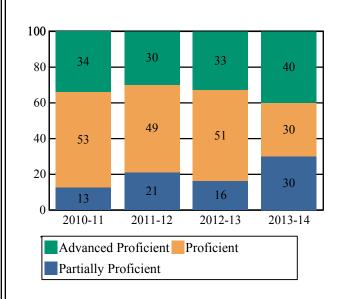

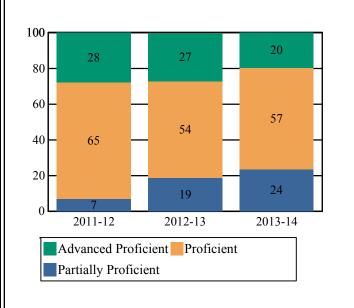
## NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03

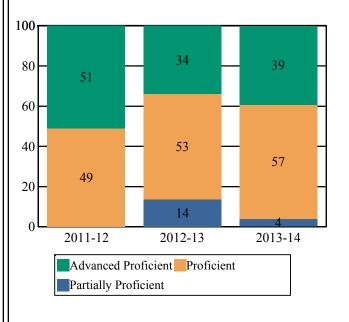

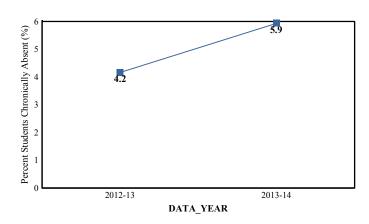

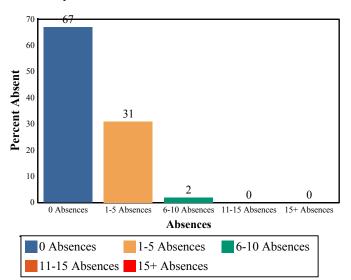
### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**

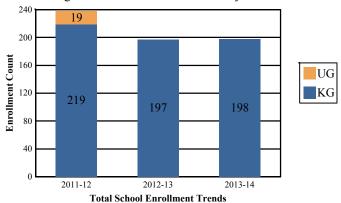

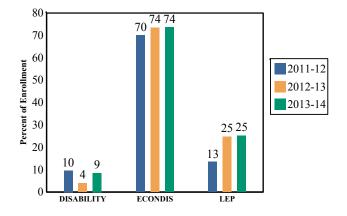

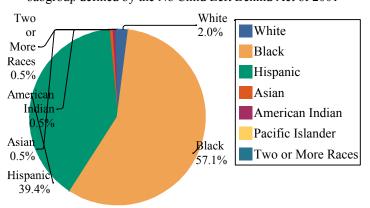

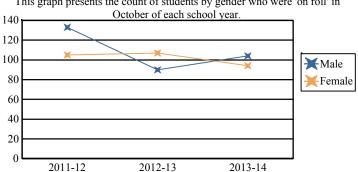
## Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

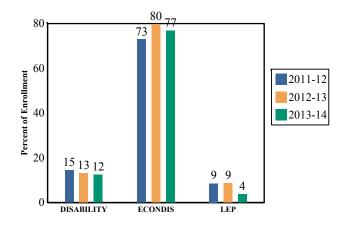

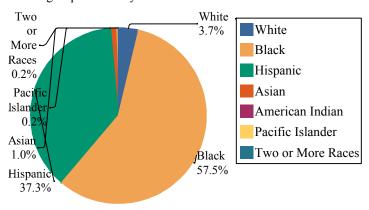

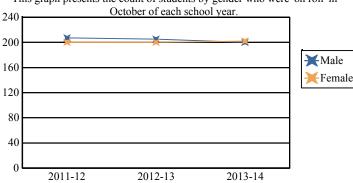
## Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

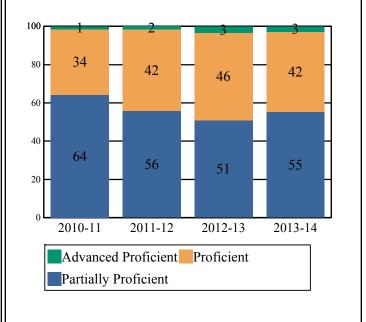

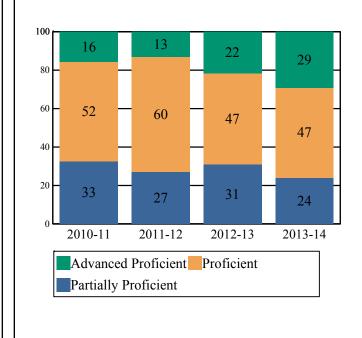

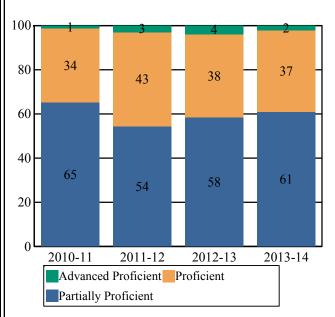

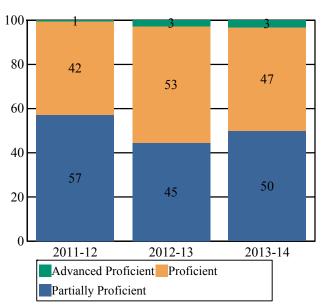
## NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 05

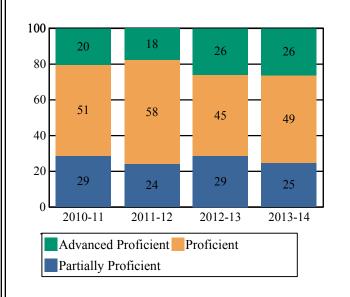

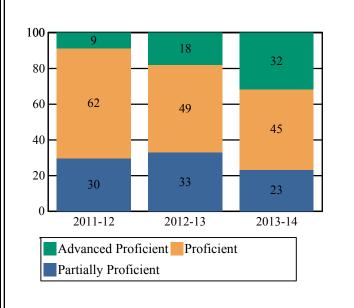
## NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 05

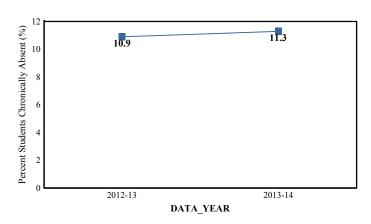

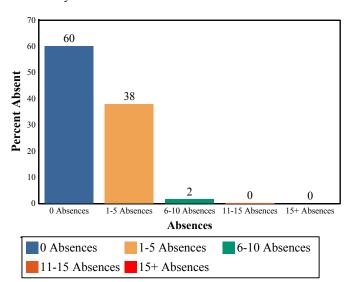
### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**

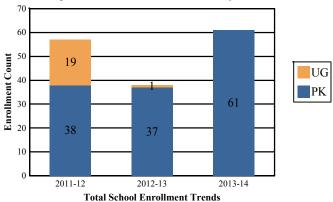

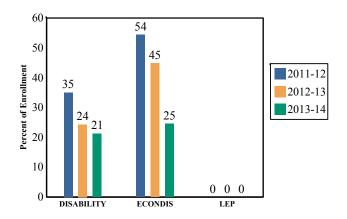

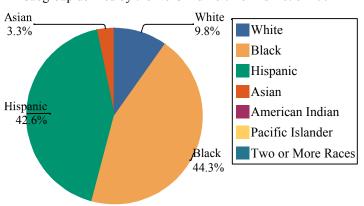

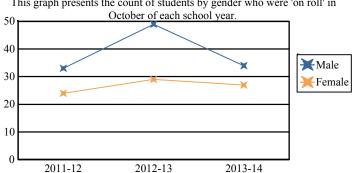

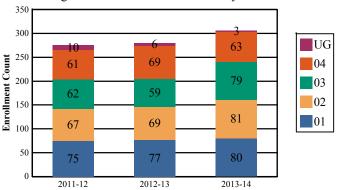

This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.

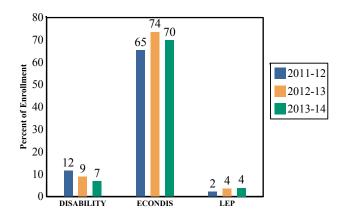

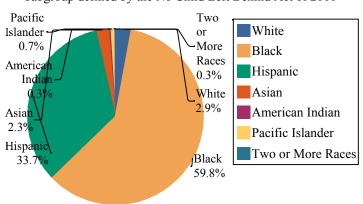

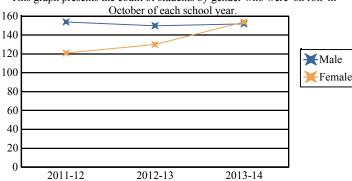
## Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

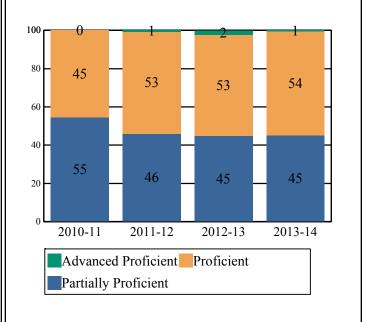

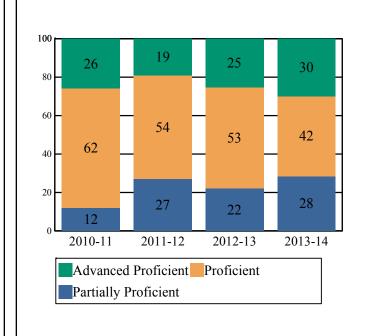

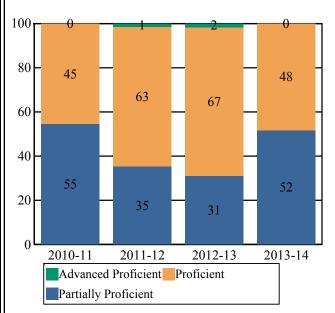

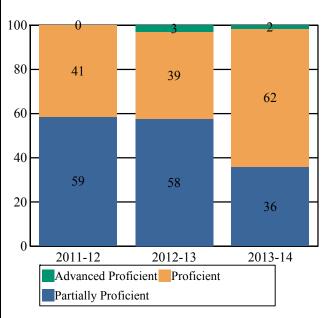
#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03

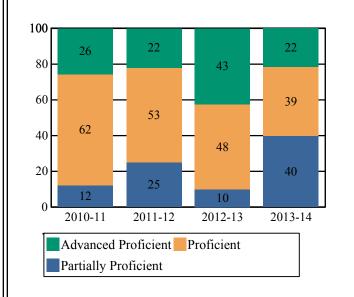

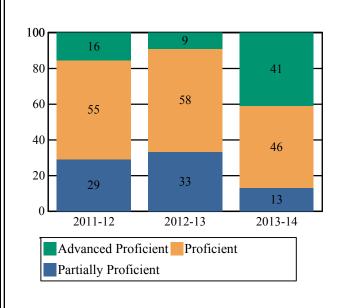
#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03

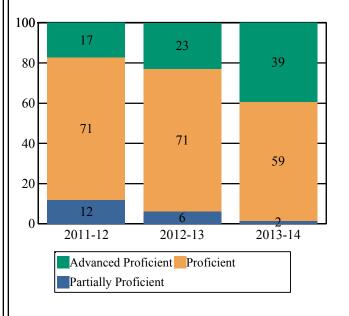

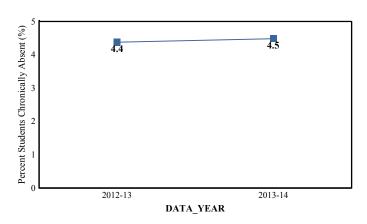

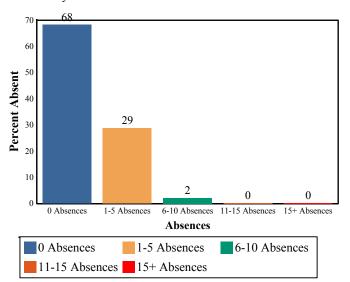
#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**
