# Report of the State Board of Education.

---

DECEMBER 1, 1908.

*To the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:*

As required by law, I herewith submit the annual report of the State Board of Education and accompanying documents.

The report of the Principal of the State Normal School at Trenton shows that institution to be in a very satisfactory condition. The enrollment is about the same as heretofore and is as large as can be accommodated.

The report of the Principal of the School for the Deaf shows that the work in the school is up to its former high standard, but that it is impossible to provide for the children desiring to attend the school owing to lack of sufficient class rooms and dormitories. Between forty and fifty applicants have been refused admission owing to lack of accommodations. The Board recommends that the State should, at as early a date as possible, increase the accommodations at the school so as to enable every deaf child in the State to secure an education.

The State Normal School at Montclair was opened for the reception of pupils September 15, 1908. One hundred and eighty-seven pupils have been enrolled. 75 are residents of Essex County, 56 of Hudson, 16 of Passaic, 15 of Morris, 10 of Union, 7 of Bergen, 5 of Somerset and one each of Cumberland, Middlesex and Ocean.

Dr. Charles S. Chapin, Principal of the State Normal School at Providence, R. I., was selected as Principal, and a corps of instructors secured sufficient to meet the needs at the present time.

Next year when the work of the second year of the course is taken up, additional instructors will be required.

SCHOOL REPORT.

The building was formally dedicated on September 28, 1908. Addresses were delivered by Governor Fort, members of the State Board of Education, the State Superintendent and the principals of the Trenton and Montclair Normal Schools.

The cost of the entire plant was \$314,998.79, divided as follows:

The increased appropriation for the Manual Training and Industrial School for Colored Youth has enabled the Board to enlarge the course of study along industrial lines. The new course has not been in operation long enough to show definite results, but the improvement in the work of the students is evidence of its value. The new dormitory was completed last winter and all the students now are comfortably housed. At the last session of the Legislature an appropriation of \$6,000 was made for the erection of an infirmary. The contract has been awarded and the building will be completed during the present school year.

As required by law the Reserve Fund, being ten per cent. of the State School Tax, was apportioned at a meeting held on the fourth day of February as follows:

The appeal of H. L. Johnstone from the decision of the State Superintendent in the case of Johnstone vs. the Board of Education of Glen Ridge; the appeal of Anna Magill from the decision of the State Superintendent in the case of Magill vs. the Board of Education of Gloucester City and the appeal of Thomas J. Bissell from the action of the State Board of Examiners were heard and the decisions of the State Superintendent and the action of the State Board of Examiners were affirmed.

During the year the following public High Schools were placed on the Approved List for four years of academic work:

Acquackanonk Township (Clifton), Passaic County; Bernards Township (Bernardsville), Somerset County; Bordentown City, Burlington County; Bridgeton, Cumberland County; Cranford, Union County; Glassboro, Gloucester County; Gloucester City, Camden County; Hasbrouck Heights, Bergen County; Hardyston Township (Hamburg), Sussex County; Lambertville, Hunterdon County; Matawan, Monmouth County; Palmyra, Burlington County; Penn's Grove, Salem County; South Amboy, Middlesex County; Wildwood, Cape May County.

The following public High Schools were registered for three years of academic work:

Barnegat, Ocean County; Cape May Court House, Cape May County; Cedarville, Cumberland County; Clayton, Gloucester County; Clinton Borough, Hunterdon County; Collingswood, Camden County; Haddon Heights, Camden County; Hardyston Township (Franklin Furnace), Sussex County; High Bridge, Hunterdon County; Hobokus, Bergen County; Jamesburg, Middlesex County; Metuchen, Middlesex County; Netcong, Morris County; Paulsboro, Gloucester County; Pemberton, Burlington County; Stanhope, Sussex County; Sussex, Sussex County; Tuckahoe, Cape May County.

The following private schools were registered for four years of academic work:

Carteret Academy, Orange; English and Classical School, Newton, for classical and scientific courses, for three years for English course; German Theological School, Bloomfield; Leal's School for Boys, Plainfield; Morris Academy, Morristown; Mt. St. Dominic, Caldwell; N. J. Military Academy, Freehold; St. Mary's, Newark; St. Vincent's, Newark; Steven's Preparatory School, Hoboken; Vail-Dean School, Elizabeth.

The Hoboken Academy, Hoboken, was registered for three years of academic work, and the Sacred Heart Academy, Bloomfield, for one year of academic work.

The courses of study in Manual Training in the following districts were approved:

Collingswood, Camden County; Haddonfield, Camden County; Merchantville, Camden County; Millville, Cumberland County; Nutley, Essex County; Rahway, Union County; Tenafly, Bergen County.

The courses of study for evening schools for foreign-born residents submitted by Elizabeth and Newark were approved.

J. H. Hulsart was appointed County Superintendent of Schools for Morris County, vice Watson J. Matthews, deceased.

The statistics reported by the State Superintendent show that our schools have not only maintained the high standard of previous years, but that in some particulars marked improvement has been made. The seating capacity of our school buildings is still less than the enrollment, but during the year additional accommodations were provided for 13,463 pupils, while the enrollment increased only 8,806. The present seating capacity of our schools is 395,296 and the total enrollment of pupils is 402,866. This does not mean, however, that if 7,570 additional seats were added all the children attending schools could be accommodated without crowding.

Many of our rural schools have many seats to spare while in our cities and large towns many of the rooms, especially in the primary grades, are over-crowded, or else half-day classes are maintained. There is an increase of 268 in the number of teachers employed, and an increase of \$79.59 in average annual salary paid them. As stated above the increase in total enrollment was 8,806 or 2.2 per cent. The

average enrollment was 313,526, an increase of 13,127 or 4.3 per cent., and the average daily attendance was 289,167, an increase of 13,072 or 4.7 per cent. This increase in regularity of attendance is most gratifying.

For more detailed information concerning the public schools and the several schools under the direct control of this Board, your attention is called to the reports of the State Superintendent and of the principals of the schools.

# ANNUAL REPORT.

Though the report for the school year ending June 30th, 1908, is much abridged, it far surpasses those of former years in importance. It records the fruition of the larger things which have been so long anticipated, and toward which school legislation and school administration have in recent years been directed.

The generous appropriations of the State for the current expenses of the schools have so lightened this formidable burden upon the school districts as to enable them to meet in larger measure than ever before, the imperative demand for more adequate school accommodations.

During the year the formidable aggregate of \$3,119,196.01 was expended for building and repairs and the seating capacity of the schools was increased 13,463. This provided for an increase of 8,806 in school enrollment and for a portion of the unfortunate children who, because of the lack of school accommodations, had been organized into half-day classes and thus deprived of a portion of the suitable school facilities to which they are, under the law, entitled.

An increase of \$79.59 in the average annual salary paid to the 10,279 teachers employed in our public schools is another outcome of the State's more liberal support of the public schools, and is the one which assures the most important and far-reaching results. Boards of education have been enabled to retain their best teachers and to secure others of like equipment when additional teachers have been needed or unavoidable vacancies have occurred. This means a constant advance in the standard of qualification of teachers and is the most effective means of improving our schools.

That "the teacher is the soul and center of the school" and "as is the teacher so is the school" are truisms which have come down to us from the ages. No matter how well constructed and commodious the building or how excellent its

equipment, if those who essay to teach therein have not the teacher's art and the teacher's knowledge, there is nothing to dignify by the name of school. Of the 10,602 certificates in force in the State, 74 per cent. are held by those who have had either normal or college training and by the studious and progressive teachers who have advanced from the lowest grade of certificate issued to one of the various forms of State Certificates. This is an admirable showing as regards the standard of qualification of New Jersey teachers and is not surpassed by any other State.

A third important result of the increased appropriations from the State is shown in the reduction in the amount of tax voted by school districts for current expenses. That for the school year 1907-1908 was \$4,798,311.17, that for the current school year is \$2,732,448.88, showing a decrease of \$2,065,862.29.

The unusual and much-needed addition to our school accommodations, the advance in the standard of qualification of our teachers as a result of the increase in their salaries, and the formidable reduction in district school tax for current expenses are the direct and happy results of the Act of 1906, appropriating the increase in the tax upon main stem or first class railroad property for the support of our public schools.

COUNTY CERTIFICATES.

During the past ten years an average of 1,040 county certificates have been issued (470 of which average were Third Grade) and an average of 2,570 teachers have been employed under county certificates. For the said ten years the salaries paid these teachers holding such certificates have averaged about \$35.00 per month, making an annual outlay of \$900,000, and an aggregate outlay of \$9,000,000. The present apparent result of this large expenditure which has been continued during all the years in which our present system of licensing teachers has been in operation, is 931 teachers who have learned to do by doing and are worthy to be classed among our best.

Certainly an expensive training school if considered solely from a financial standpoint. The sacrifice, the loss of opportunity on the part of the poor children to whom school days come but once is beyond estimate.

During the last five years an average of less than 1,000 new teachers have been needed to provide for our increasing school population and recruit our teaching force.

SCHOOL REPORT.

Surely the day is not far distant when we shall be able to discontinue the very expensive training school in which so small a percentage of the pupil teachers learn to do by doing and those who, before entering upon the work, have prepared themselves for the profession of teaching will not be subjected to a competition which is both unfortunate and unfair.

*Hon. Charles J. Baxter, State Superintendent of Public Instruction:*

DEAR SIR—As State Inspector of High Schools I submit to you my fourth annual report of the work done during the present year from November first, 1907 to November first, 1908.

The general progress in the High School movement throughout the State has been very satisfactory. While no uniformity in details of the curriculum is aimed at, certain fundamental principles have been held in view, and seem to be gaining a wider and more cordial acceptance throughout the State. The miscellaneous elective principle has been almost universally abandoned to the great improvement and strengthening of our system. In its place the High Schools are meeting the views of the State Board of Education by offering parallel standardized courses, planned in general to be of equal difficulty and educational value, among which choice is made by the pupils upon the advice of parents and principals. In the large schools such courses offer within themselves reasonable elective freedom, so that individual plans and individual needs are met. There is a marked decrease under this system of mixed classes in which students of widely different attainment are grouped together for recitation and a corresponding encouragement of purposeful work, with a definite aim in view. "Snap" electives are discouraged, and a more serious tone promoted.

The great increase in the number of schools to be visited has made it impossible to inspect individual schools more than once during the year, except where special circumstances required a second visit. On the basis of these visits of inspection the following schools have been recommended to the State Board of Education and have received their approval as four-year High Schools:

Bernardsville, Bordentown, Bridgeton, Clifton, Cranford, Glassboro, Gloucester City, Hamburg, Lambertville, Matawan, Palmyra, Pennsgrove, South Amboy and Wildwood.

The list of High Schools on the "Approved List" reaches a total at the present time of 93.

The following High Schools after inspection were recommended for registration as "Partial" High Schools, maintaining a standard course of three years of work:

Barnegat, Cape May Court House, Cedarville, Clayton, Clinton, Collingswood, Franklin Furnace, Haddon Heights, High Bridge, Jamesburg, Metuchen, Netcong, Paulsboro, Pemberton, Ramsey, Stanhope, Sussex and Tuckahoe.

The number of schools now registered as maintaining three years of "Approved" work is 29.

In spite of the additions made during the present year there are only 17 in excess of the number upon the three-year list last year. This small increase is due to the fact that eleven of the schools approved last year for three years of work, have been advanced to the four-year "Approved List," which is quite in harmony with our expectation, and with the normal growth of the work. Schools newly organized should not in general attempt more than two or three years of High School work, growing naturally as the enrollment increases into the full type of a four-year school.

It is pleasant to be able to report that the State Board has has not found it necessary during the year to drop any one of our schools from the "Approved List." Where visits of inspection have revealed such unsatisfactory conditions that changes were necessary, reports have been sent to the local boards and their cooperation has in every case been secured in remedying defects, or in adopting measures to meet the requirements within a reasonable time.

I have again to report a marked increase in the work demanded of the State Inspector. Under the stimulus of the legislation of 1906, rural High Schools are springing up all over the State. Many are still insufficiently developed to receive State recognition, but it is a question of a short time only before the State will be practically covered, so far as the needs of the secondary grades are concerned.

In connection with these rural schools two very grave problems present themselves and should be called to your

attention and to the attention of the State Board for consideration and appropriate action.

The first problem is of the utmost importance in its bearing upon the quality of the work done in the High School grades. In many places the pupils graduated from the eighth grade county examinations enter the High School with such equipment only as they have obtained in ungraded country schools. Such pupils, as a rule, are not fitted to do standard High School work. This is particularly true in English, the foreign languages and history. If the small country High Schools are to do standard work, equivalent to that of the large High Schools, the improvement of the country schools becomes a pressing and imperative necessity. The work of the High School Inspector therefore articulates closely with that of the County Superintendent and the need of the immediate future is to promote, by legislation if necessary, or by executive action, the concentration in graded schools of the pupils in the four years below the High School, so that standard work may be done in these grades all through the State. The one room school should never attempt more than the work of the four primary grades under a single teacher, and until this standard, or something approaching it, has been reached the pupils in the small rural High Schools will remain at a marked disadvantage in comparison with their more favored competitors. As one remedial measure I would suggest that the transportation law be amended so that for pupils transported within a district, Boards of Education should receive the same rebates from the State as for those transported from one district into another. This change would promote not only the gathering of High School pupils at central points where they could be properly cared for, but would also tend to bring pupils in the upper grammar grades from the one room ungraded schools into village schools where the teaching can be more adequate to their needs.

The second point that requires careful attention is the unnecessary multiplication of small High Schools. Up to a certain point this multiplication should proceed, but where it results in placing two or more weak and competing schools in a territory that should have but one for its effective service two-fold evil results. On the one hand, inferior work causes a loss to the pupils themselves, for in general, it may be said

that High School work tends to increase in efficiency as the total enrollment of the school approaches at least 100. Two schools, therefore, of 30 pupils each are in general far less effective than one of 60 pupils. The other loss consists in the waste of public money in unnecessary duplication of teachers and equipment. So far as the local appropriations are concerned, this might, perhaps, be left to the decision of individual communities, but under our present system the funds of the State are also concerned to a large amount, and the responsibility of the State Board to prevent, as far as possible, unnecessary waste cannot be disregarded.

I would suggest that the establishment of independent High Schools in communities where the total public school enrollment is less than 500 should be discouraged by appropriate rules, except in such places where the distance of accessible High Schools, or insufficient means of transportation, makes a local school justifiable on general grounds.

The increase of the system of secondary schools may be illustrated by a comparison of the four years during which regular inspection has been carried on:

Besides the regular duties of the office, the Inspector has been called upon during the year to give numerous educational addresses, before educational bodies, and Boards interested in public school problems. Chief among these have been addresses before the State High School Teachers' Association, the New Jersey State Teachers' Association, the State Board of Agriculture and the Association of County Superintendents; many other addresses have been given to County School Board Associations, and local Boards of Education on particular phases of their work where the advice of the Inspector has been sought.

The Inspector has also made a preliminary study of the French secondary school system, with particular reference to

the problems of industrial education, now attracting such wide-spread interest. A brief survey of the field may be added.

Students of education return from a tour of observation on the continent of Europe more profoundly impressed than ever before with the splendid service of our own public school system, and at the same time no less profoundly impressed with its short-comings.

What I have to say at the present time is brief. None of it is new, none of it is revolutionary, yet some suggestions, may, I hope, be practical and helpful. It is based in part on personal observation of the French schools, and in part on a more extended reading concerning them.

It is wise to say first, that no adoption of French methods is either desirable or possible. Undesirable because the aims of public education in France are not ours, and can never become so. We have a wider task, a buoyant and hopeful democracy of thought and aspiration which demands as a fundamental principle equal opportunity for all, whereas public education in France is based on a two-fold principle, viz., full opportunity of development for the favored class, and restricted opportunity of development for the masses. It is impossible because the adoption of the essential features of French public education would profoundly change the fundamental principle of American education and be in distinct antagonism to the spirit of our democracy. But though the adoption of any one of the salient features of their educational system, however well it works in France, would be a misfortune, the adaptation of their best ideas to our own conditions is altogether desirable and only the part of ordinary wisdom and intelligence to learn.

A word as to the French system is in point. The so-called secondary schools in France, the Lycees and colleges are pay schools, with many aids for deserving students, but nevertheless pay schools much more like the older academies of fifty years ago than like our present public High Schools. The course proper consists of two cycles, the first of four years, for the ages of eleven, twelve, thirteen and fourteen, and the second of three years for the ages of fifteen, sixteen and seventeen. At seventeen or eighteen the boy finishes his secondary education, takes the baccalaureate degree, and is ready for

the university professional school or technological school. But the Lycee also provides four years of preparatory instruction, and takes children of six and seven years of age from the ecoles maternelles, or classes enfantines, giving them continuous and carefully arranged instruction for the entire eleven years antecedent to the baccalaureate degree.

The so-called primary schools of France constitute a second and measurably independent system, covering the demands of another class of pupils for their school life. They are not primary at all in relation to the secondary schools, but primary in the sense of primal relation to the ordinary occupations of the masses. Transfer from one system to the other is not the rule but the rare exception. The primary schools form, therefore, an independent system, which is free to all, with a specific purpose that is well attained, *i.e.*, the conscious fitting of the pupils for industrial effectiveness. The system includes first the ecoles maternelles (maternal schools) or classes enfantines (baby classes) for the children of the earliest school age, the ecoles primaires elementaires (elementary primary schools) for the six succeeding years (covering the ages between six and thirteen) the ecoles primaires superieures (upper primary schools) which require in general about three years for the completion of the course and the winning of a certificate. These form a great system of industrial schools, with a large and growing enrollment, providing a large variety of courses more or less specialized, and fitting the industrial army of boys and girls immediately for effective service in position of manual work. In the year 1904, which is the latest for which I have the figures, these schools turned out 6,075 pupils, 3,561 of whom were successful in passing the rigid final examination and winning the State certificate. The present numbers, at the rate of increase of the past four years, must have been for 1908 about 10,000 and 6,000 respectively. An army of young people, boys and girls are thus fitted each year for places of usefulness in the chief industries of the Republic.

It is quite obvious, from this simple outline, that our school system has been and still is one-sided. It leads, if anywhere, to professional and managing vocations, and leads distinctly away from the great industries on which the prosperity of the country must in the long run depend.

For comparison with our High Schools parts of both classes of French schools should be studied, *i.e.*, the last years of the Lycees and colleges, and the upper primary schools. In both there are some definite characteristics which merit, in my judgment, imitation. They are at least suggestive.

First, there is a definiteness of aim which makes school a much more serious business than the average American or English boy or girl, and perhaps than the average American teacher, makes of it. This is seen in the hours of the days demanded for the average pupil to sustain the course. To quote from the last revision of the Lycees' curriculum in 1902, in which an attempt was made to *lighten* this load by a better arrangement of work: "The total number of hours for recitation and study will be reduced to *nine* for pupils below sixteen, and to *seven* for pupils below twelve." The pupils above sixteen for the last one or two years of the Lycee courses are expected to increase the time to ten or eleven hours. Translating this into American terms, and subtracting school hours from the total, the ninth and tenth grade pupils in our High Schools would be expected to devote not less than four and a half hours of the day to home study, and for the eleventh and twelfth grades this would be increased to about six hours. The average American High School principal, and the average American parent, especially the mothers, would stand absolutely aghast at any such suggestion. But the French boys actually devote to their work approximately the scheduled time, and apparently without greater strain than results with us from school life, complicated as it so often is with exacting and enervating social distractions. One result is that the French boy at seventeen in his intellectual equipment is at least two years, some critics say four years, ahead of the American boy of the same age. There are some balancing compensations of course, which are not wholly to our disadvantage, but this is not the place to do more than point out the more salient facts. Their discussion and valuation would take far too long.

Another consequence of the definite aim of the French education is that the folly of indiscriminate elective freedom, which allows a boy to study what he pleases, when he pleases, and if he pleases, is wholly avoided. It is quite clear that if he purposes to do something definite a definite course must be

arranged and there is no time to waste on experimental excursions. Hence the principle that lies at the basis of all the French schools for youth is the election between carefully planned courses, leading to definite results, and not between individual subjects. I have already noted the fact that our schools are improving in this respect.

A third point may be passed with a mere mention. With a definite aim in every case before the school authorities, with ample power lodged with the Minister of Public Instruction the curriculum has been made the subject of expert study, from the bottom to the top, and a more scientifically ordered continuity of subjects, and a more progressive development of each subject year by year, has been attained, so that there is less wearisome repetition than with us, and a keener stimulus to pupils, who find themselves confronted with what is new both in matter and in intensiveness of demand with each year. They feel that they are "getting somewhere," not only as to ultimate aim, but in the mastery of each subject of study.

We must note another phase of the French educational system, which not only challenges our admiration, but calls for imitation, as fast as actual circumstances permit. The French secondary school teachers are admirably equipped on the intellectual side, and are in point of scholarly equipment quite the equals of the American college professor. The pitiful spectacle of an overworked teacher trying vainly to keep ahead of her class in a subject she is required to teach, but has never studied is not only unheard of, but is practically unthinkable. The reason lies in two noteworthy facts. First, the far greater intellectual competition of an older civilization crowds the profession of teaching with many highly educated men from whom choice may be made, and secondly, in a fact measurably within control, namely, the right to teach in a school of secondary grade demands a certificate not only of general fitness but particularly in the special subject which he is to teach. For the strengthening of our own system in this respect further opportunity should be provided for the preparation of teachers for the High School grades, and the system of certification should be modified in order to assure competency in the particular subjects in which a teacher is to give instruction.

I would further urge hearty cooperation with the forces that are promoting industrial forms of secondary education, to the end that these may be an integral part of the State system, and that appropriate legislation may be obtained to establish and maintain a new type of secondary school to fill a void now clearly recognized. These schools will come, and are coming soon. If they grow up outside the public school system, their usefulness will be circumscribed, and their lack of articulation with the lower grades will deprive them of that public support and interest, which are essential, if the movement is to have a healthy and normal growth.

In conclusion, a word should be said about this new movement for industrial education, new only in America, old and tried and approved on the continent. There should be developed a number of new forms of High Schools separate from the cultural High Schools, but not supplanting them. There should be:

- a. Agricultural High Schools in rural communities.
- b. Manual Training High Schools in cities and towns.

Such schools should have—

1. A general course with a large cultural element in the curriculum, graduation from which would permit entrance to a higher institution, college or technological school, and so conduct to places of leadership.

2. Technical courses with large laboratory element, and in the last years a specific instruction in the various branches of agriculture, of trade and of manufacturing. In these the pupils should be taught by skilled mechanics, rather than theoretic Manual Training teachers. Models for such schools and their curriculum can be found in abundance among the splendid schools with similar purpose long in successful operation in France and Germany.

- c. Continuation schools which might be arranged to demand only a part of the time of pupils, actually engaged in shop, or manufactory in coordination with the night schools, which are already doing so useful a work.

All of these schools could be and should be in close articulation with the eighth grade, and would require no essential modifications of the lower grades except that nature work should be made much more practical, and given a distinctively agricultural application, and that Manual Training, including

Drawing, both for boys and girls, should be more highly developed, and more carefully supervised both in city and country schools, in a far more practical form.

## Teachers' Retirement Fund.

Report of the Board of Trustees of the Teachers' Retirement Fund of the State of New Jersey for the fiscal year 1907-1908.

Presented by the Secretary at "The Annual Convention of the Teachers' Retirement Fund," held in the State House, Trenton, New Jersey, at twelve o'clock, noon, on Saturday, September 26th, 1908.

In compliance with the law, I have the honor to submit the report of the Board of Trustees of the Teachers' Retirement Fund for the fiscal year which ended June 30th, 1908:

To June 30th, 1908, a total of 203 annuities had been granted, and \$203,616.43 paid on account thereof; 43 annuitants had died; the Fund's liability for the fiscal year 1908-1909 to the 160 annuities in force June 30, 1908, was \$57,894.63, and on the same date 20 applications for annuity, aggregating \$8,441.00 awaited the decision of the Board. The State Treasurer reported assets (investments and cash) amounting to \$95,235.60.

INCREASE IN ANNUAL VALUE OF ANNUITIES.

The average value of annuities granted rose from \$334.24 in 1906-7 to \$472.56 in 1907-8. This very substantial increase is due to three causes: First—Many city teachers of long service and maximum salaries were retired; Second—Annuities granted under the Act of 1907 are three-fifths of salary for the last five years (minimum, \$250; maximum, \$650), instead of one-half as formerly with a maximum of only \$600; Third—Because of the general advance in salaries, especially in the cities, which, by the way, is a practical refutation of the argument: "With pensions, teachers' salaries must go down."

The financial statement is all the more encouraging when it is known that the Fund is only now beginning to benefit in a substantial way by the higher rates of dues. A large percentage of acceptances of the Act of 1907 were dated last December, so that the increased contributions affected only the latter half of the school year. Many others transferred only at the end of last June. The new, "By Virtue of Appointment,—" membership has as yet added little to receipts, because this provision of the Law took effect only on January 1st, and most of the new teachers had been appointed prior to that date. Income, however, in the current six months will be considerably augmented from this source.

THE INTEREST ACCOUNT.

Of the Fund's \$95,000 of assets, \$79,500 is invested and \$15,735.60 is cash. An invested capital is not only a guarantee of stability, but means a substantial addition to income. Last year, interest contributed \$3,842.85. Our main object, however, is not to accumulate a great surplus, but to secure and maintain an income sufficient to meet every just demand.

The Fund shouldered at the start, and has since been carrying the accumulated disability of New Jersey's veteran teachers, and we may expect to reach very soon the maximum average annuity demand, which must ever tread sharply upon the heels of income.

### THE IMMEDIATE PROBLEM.

The immediate problem, therefore, before the Board of Trustees is not to "pile up money" but to so dispense it that the maximum amount of relief may be promptly afforded the teachers and the schools.

### TIME-LIMIT EXPIRES ON NEW YEAR'S.

The time-limit for members to accept the Act of 1907 and for teachers employed in New Jersey prior to January 1st, 1908, expires on New Year's Day.

The Law was vastly improved by the Act of 1907 which, besides increasing annuities, confers many privileges and benefits not conferred by any previous Act. To be eligible to the privileges of this Act, however, members must accept the same in writing. Already the great majority have accepted. The time-limit for members to accept the Act of 1907 and for teachers employed in New Jersey prior to January 1st, 1908, to join, expires on New Year's Day.

### ACCRUEING ANNUITIES PAY DEBT TO FUND.

Of the thirty-five annuities declared in 1907-8, two were granted under the original Law of 1896; one under the Law of 1900; one under the law of 1906, and thirty-one under the Law of 1907. One teacher of the thirty-one last-named, paid in a "lump" her balance due the Fund, and received her annuity in full at the end of the quarter. Four teachers permitted one-half their indebtedness to the Fund to be liquidated by their accruing annuities, and then "squared" their accounts by cash settlement. The remaining twenty-six availing themselves of the lenient provision of the Act of 1907, authorized the Board of Trustees to withhold their annuity payments until the amount so withheld and credited should cancel their balances due; and thus, in six months or so, with

not a cent out of pocket, they began to receive their regular quarterly annuities full, free and clear. If the Act of 1907 boasted of no other special privilege than that conferred by Section 217, just described, this alone would commend it to the majority of members.

### AS TO DISTRICT CLERKS.

The Board still has some trouble with District Clerks, but it is usually through their ignorance of the Law and not, as in the old days, because of hostility to the Fund. On the contrary, letters from many of these officials express hearty good-will, and ask for information to enable them to do the business properly
