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



Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent



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



Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup


This graph presents the percentages of enrollment for each subgroup defined by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001




Enrollment by Gender























Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03





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







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


Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03


This graph presents the grade level outcomes in the categories of Advanced Proficient, Proficient, and Partially Proficient over the last four years.




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03










Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup














NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03







Additionally, this school is meeting 50% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.

Student Growth

This school outperforms 78% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 72% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of Student Growth. 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



Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent








Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup






NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 06




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 06




