DDHH Presents at Rowan College

On July 26, DDHH Communication Access Coordinator Cathy Grehlinger met with students in an Interpreter Practicum class at Rowan College at Burlington County (RCBC). She gave an overview about the Division of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (DDHH)



and discussed the services provided. The primary focus was on interpreter and communication access services and the problems and issues encountered when trying to advocate for and provide services for deaf and hard of hearing individuals. DDHH Works with MVC to Improve Access

For several months, DDHH Case Coordinator Jaclyne Brown has been working with the NJ Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) to resolve issues of language accessibility and interpreters. Miss Brown had given a presentation to the managers of all 29 MVC centers on language accessibility and use of sign language interpreters. Although there was confusion about "diversity" in Deaf Culture, Miss Brown discussed the concept of language in different aspects of the Deaf community. Her goal is to improve the communication access at MVC and give the Deaf community the opportunity to obtain qualified interpreters for appointments. Whether it is permit test or another kind of appointment at MVC, you have right to obtain an interpreter. Miss Brown has been invited back to MVC to train additional employees.
