





New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: February 2018 - February 2019




Unemployed New Jersey Residents February 2018 - February 2019






New Jersey Counties Unemployment Rates - February 2019

(Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)




New Jersey Counties Unemployed Residents - February 2019

(Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)




New Jersey Counties Labor Force Per Square Mile - February 2019
