This cordial thus prepared, was of so durable a nature, that no length of time could waste it: And what is very remarkable, says our author, it increased in weight and value the longer you kept it.</p> <p>The <i>Moderns</i> have most grossly adulterated this fine receipt: Some of the ingredients, indeed, are not to be found; but what they impose upon you, as friendship, is as follows.</p> <p><i>Outward Professions</i>, (a common weed that grows every where) instead of the flower of <i>Union</i>; the <i>Desire of being pleased</i>, a large quantity; of <i>Self-Interest</i>, <i>Conveniency</i>, and <i>Reservedness</i>, many handfuls; a little <i>Pity</i> and <i>Tenderness</i>.
