


Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




Enrollment by Ethnic/ Racial Subgroup












Visual and Performing Arts



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
Absenteeism




Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




Enrollment by Ethnic/ Racial Subgroup

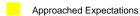









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
Visual and Performing Arts








Chronic Absenteeism Trend




Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




Enrollment by Ethnic/ Racial Subgroup





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




Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




Enrollment by Ethnic/ Racial Subgroup

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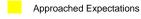









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




Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




Enrollment by Ethnic/ Racial Subgroup

The PARCC assessment has five Performance Levels. Students performing at levels 4 and 5 (met or exceeded expectations) have demonstrated readiness for the next grade level/course, and are on track for college and careers.

This section also measures Science as demonstrated in NJ ASK Science assessments.



PARCC ELA Performance Trends







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
Absenteeism
