

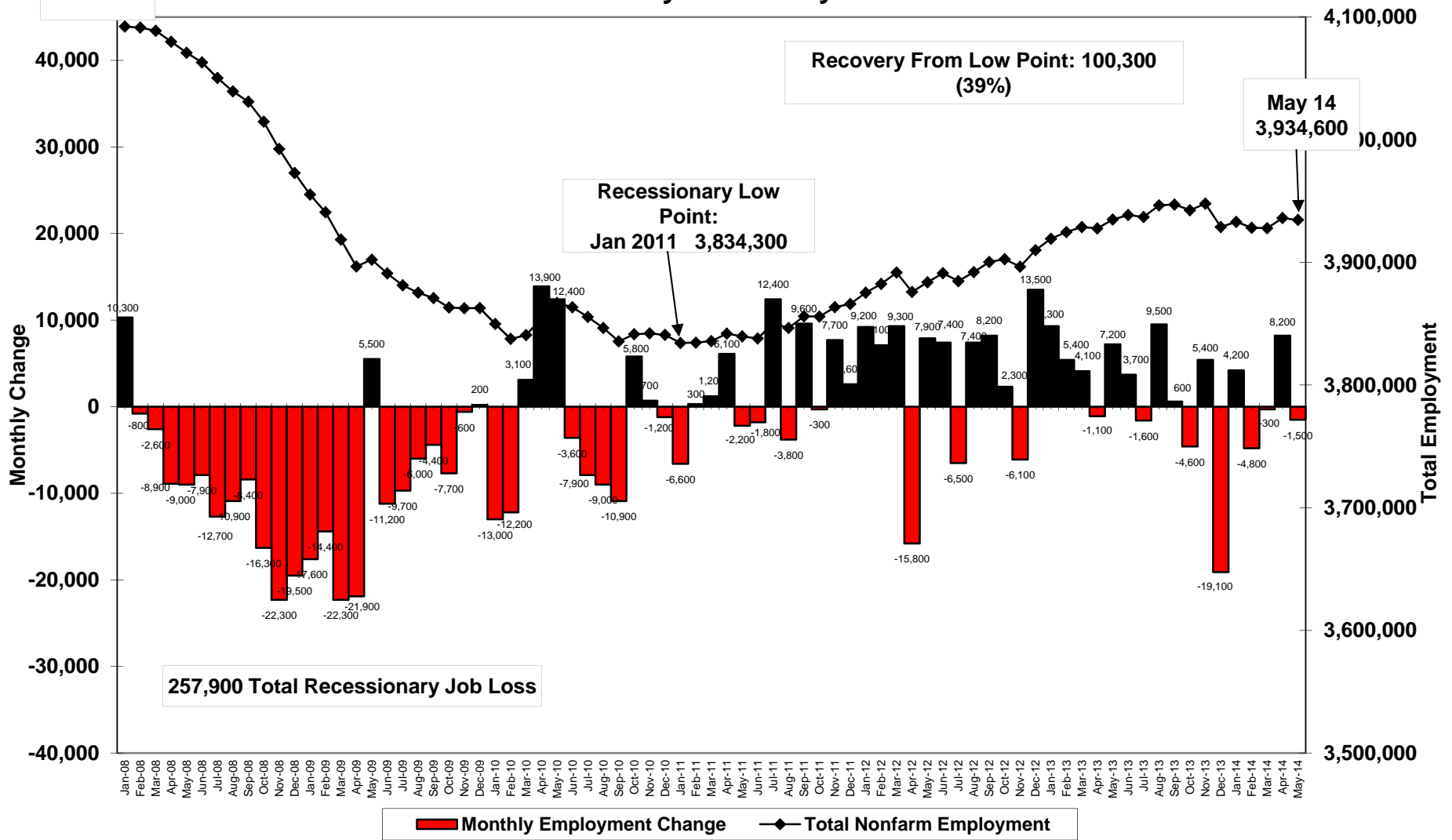

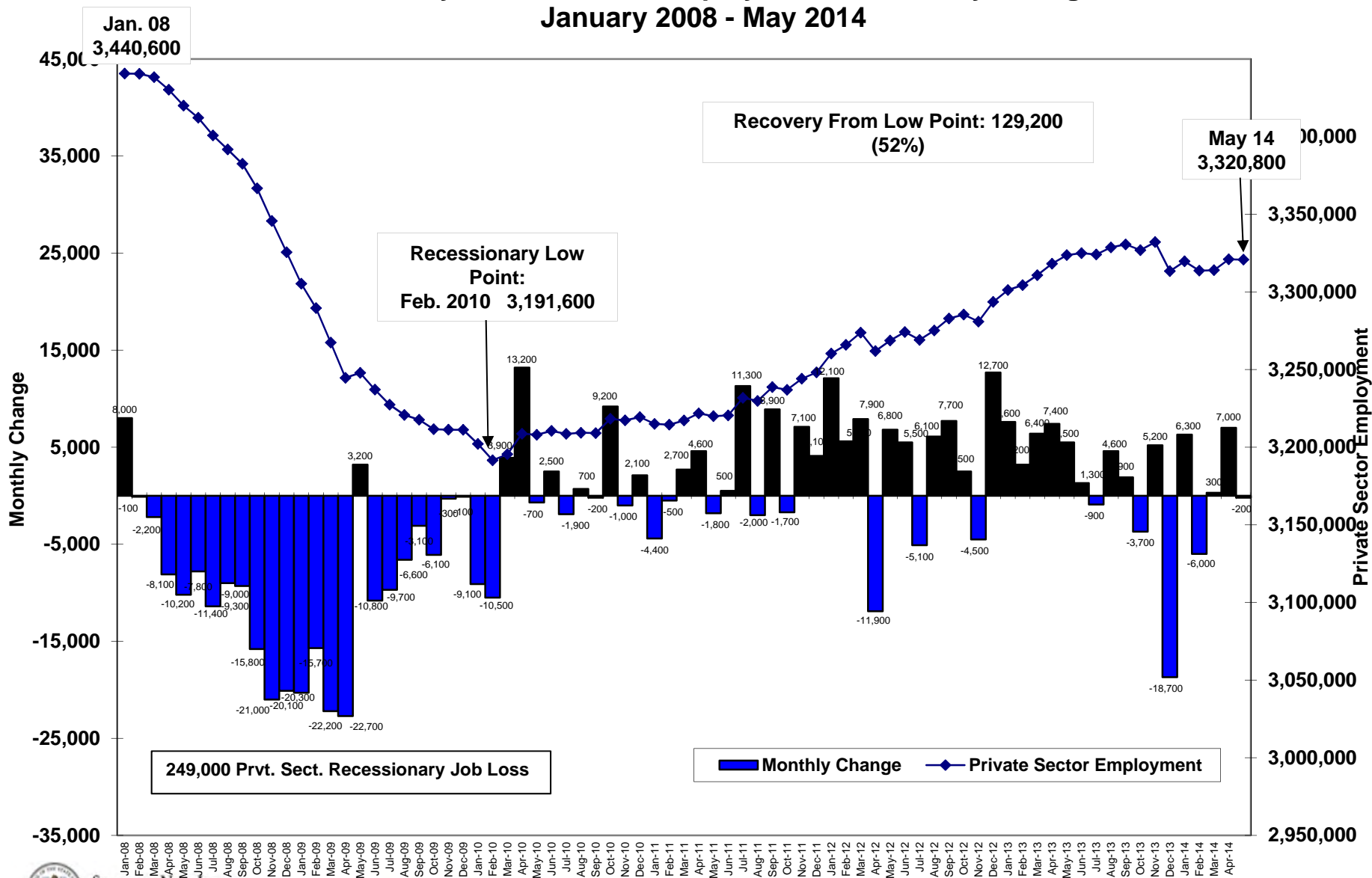

New Jersey Total Nonfarm Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - May 2014



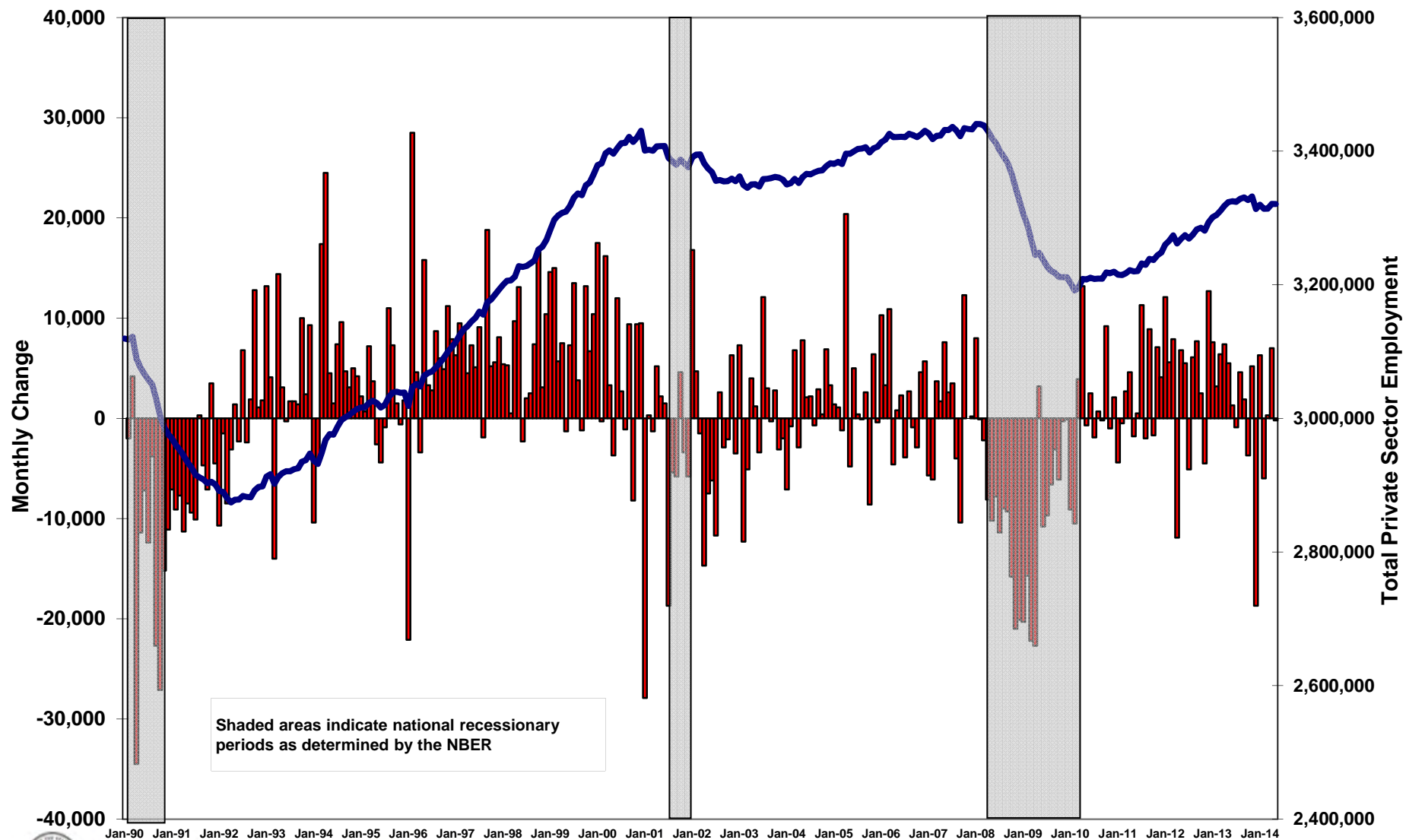
New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - May 2014



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New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 1990 - May 2014



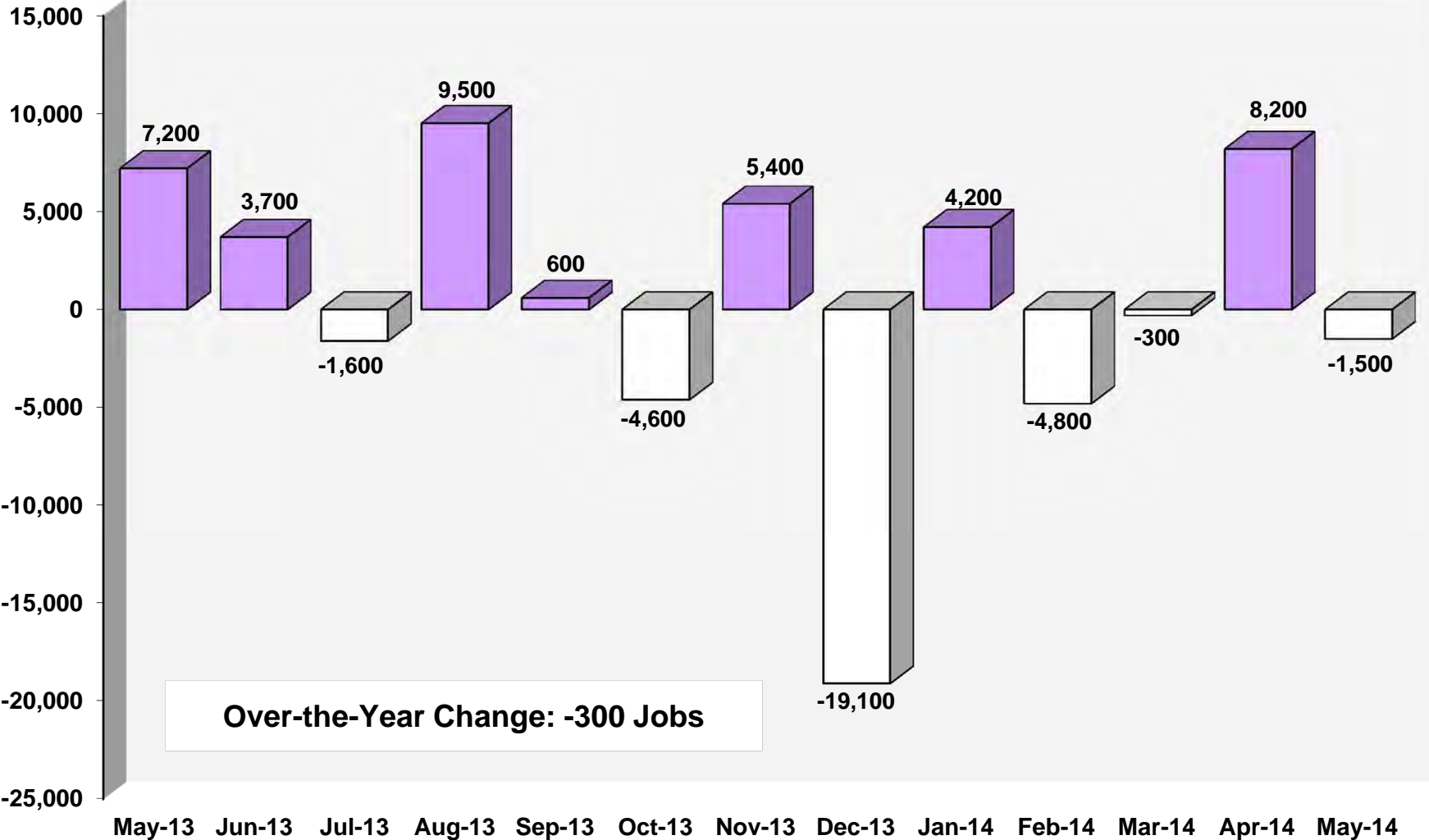
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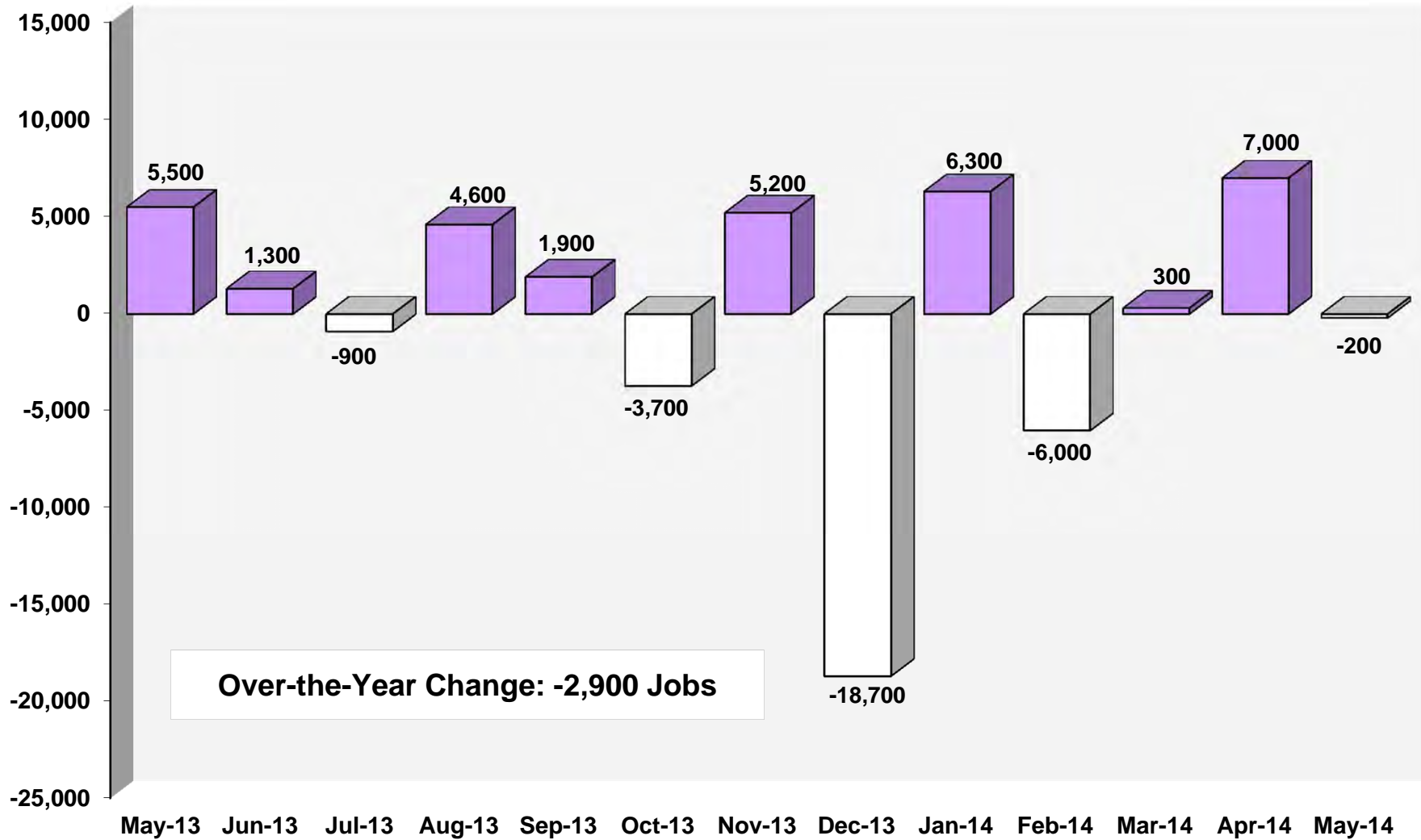

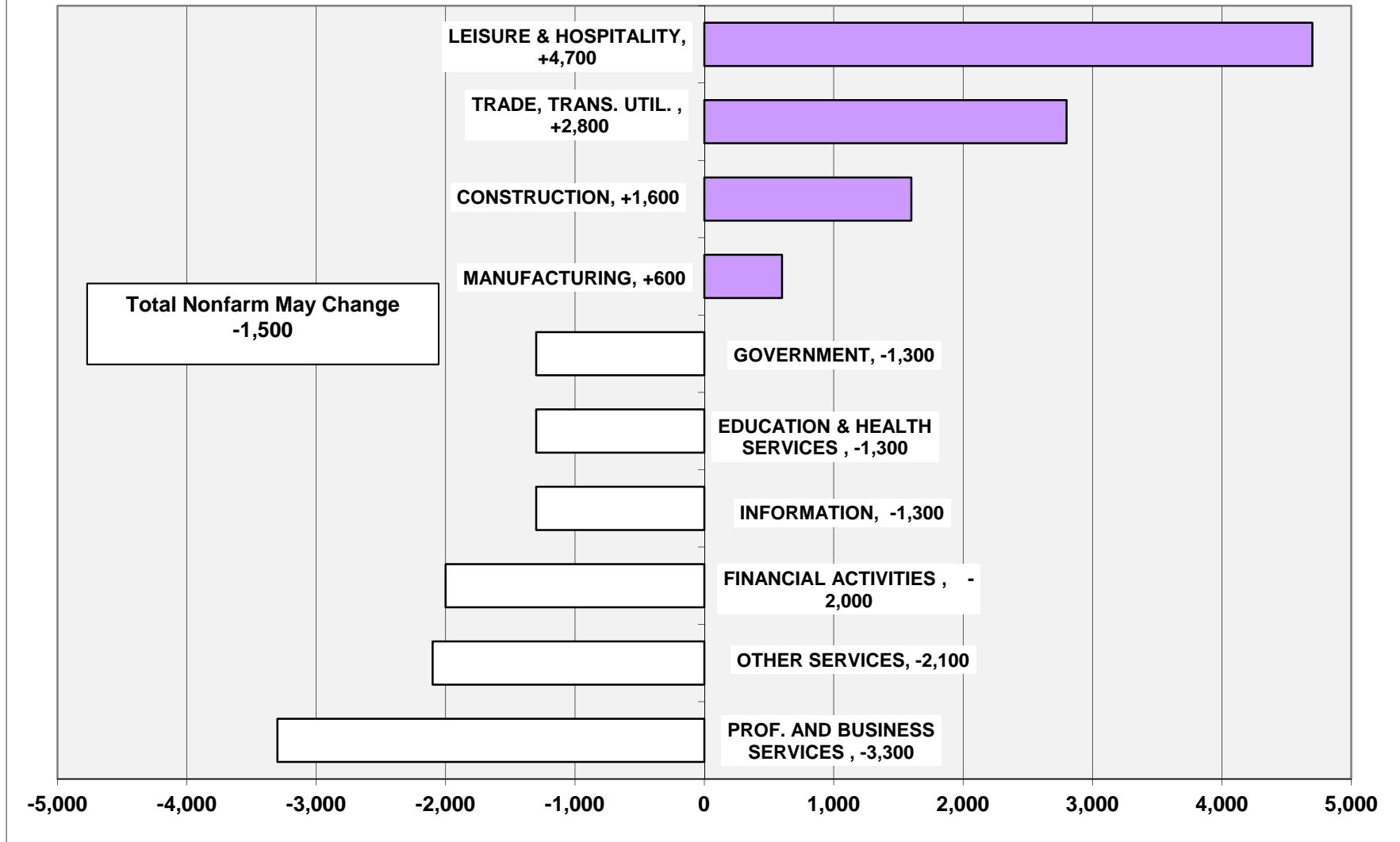
Monthly Total Employment Change New Jersey: May 2013 - May 2014



Monthly Private Sector Employment Change May 2013 - May 2014



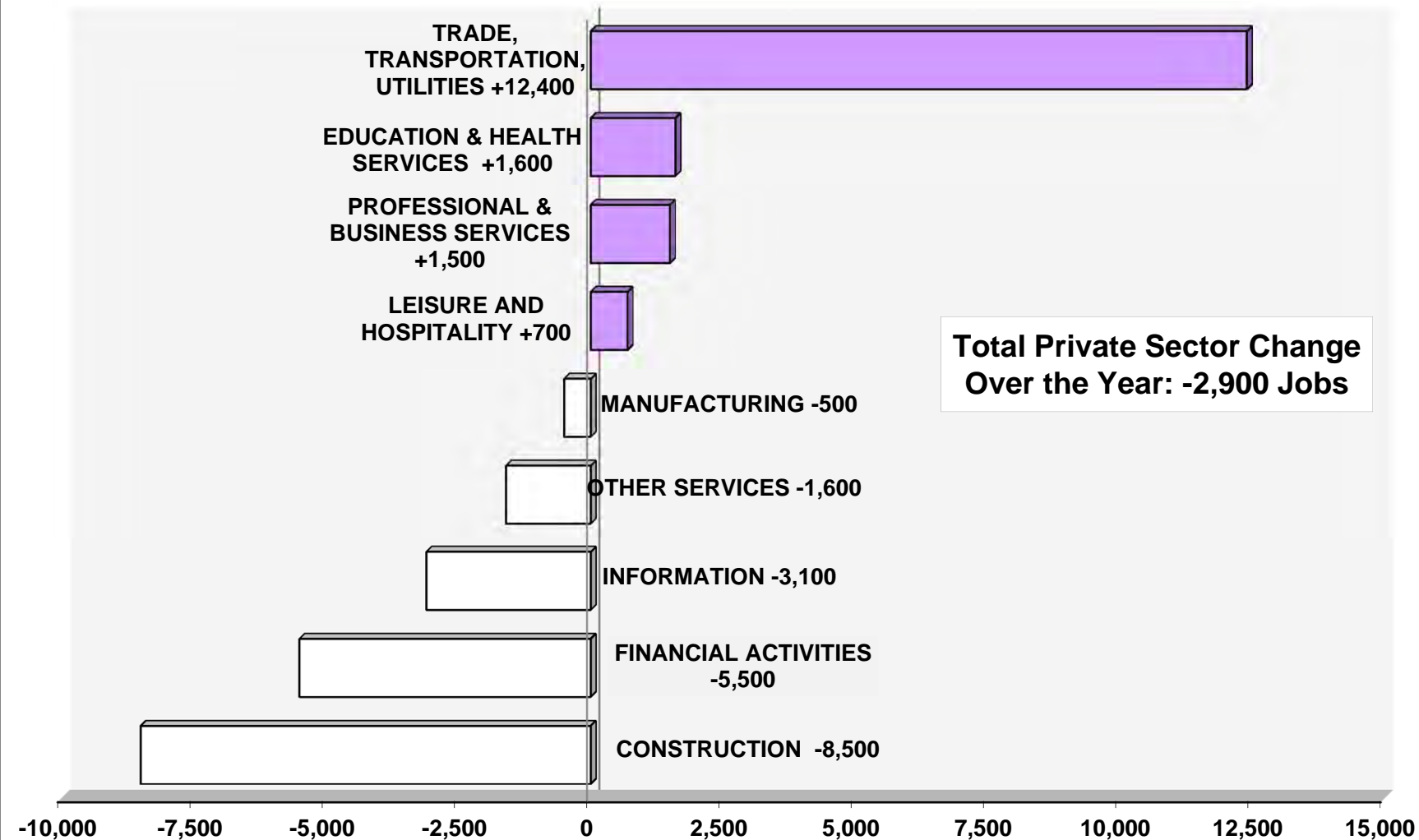

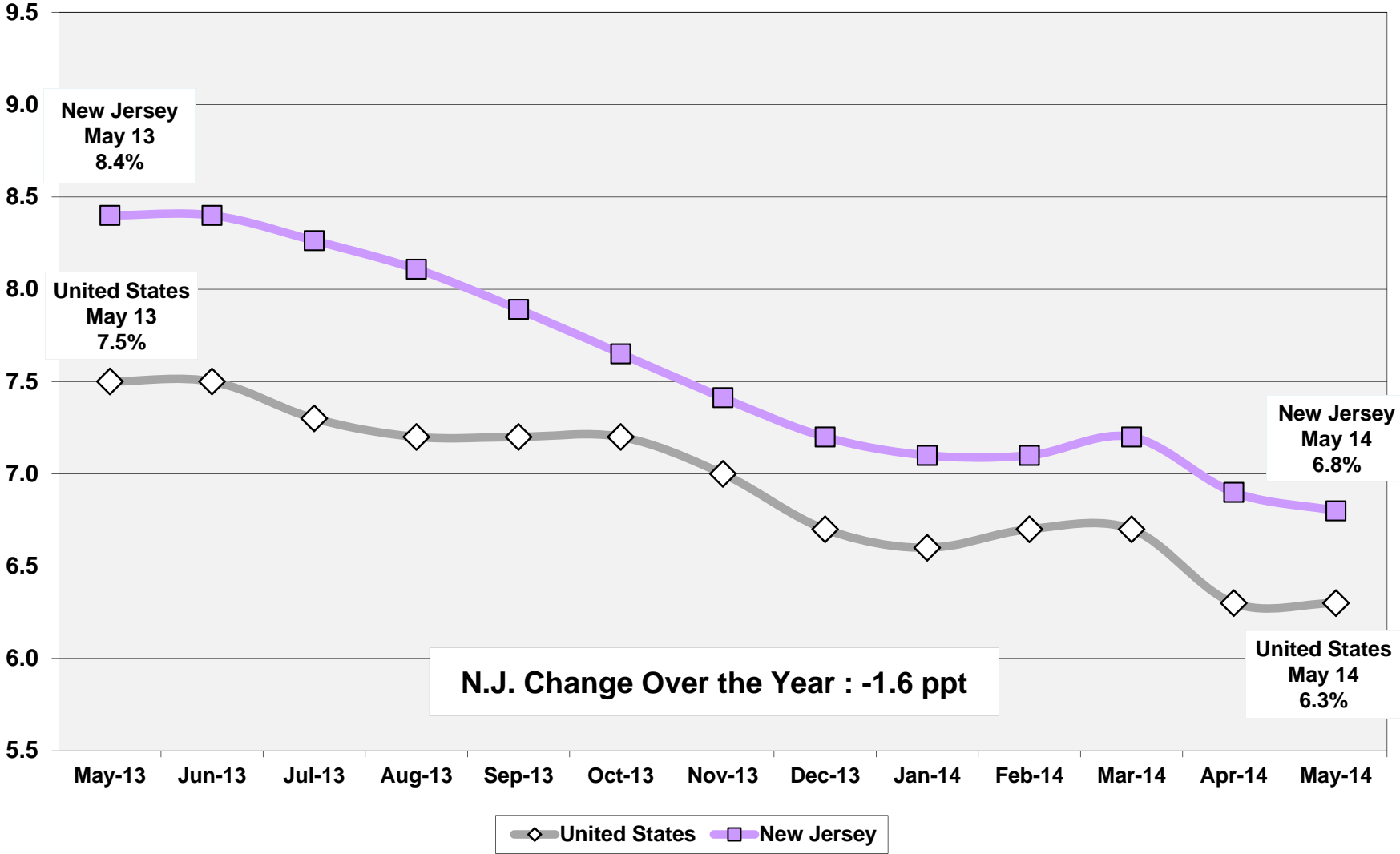
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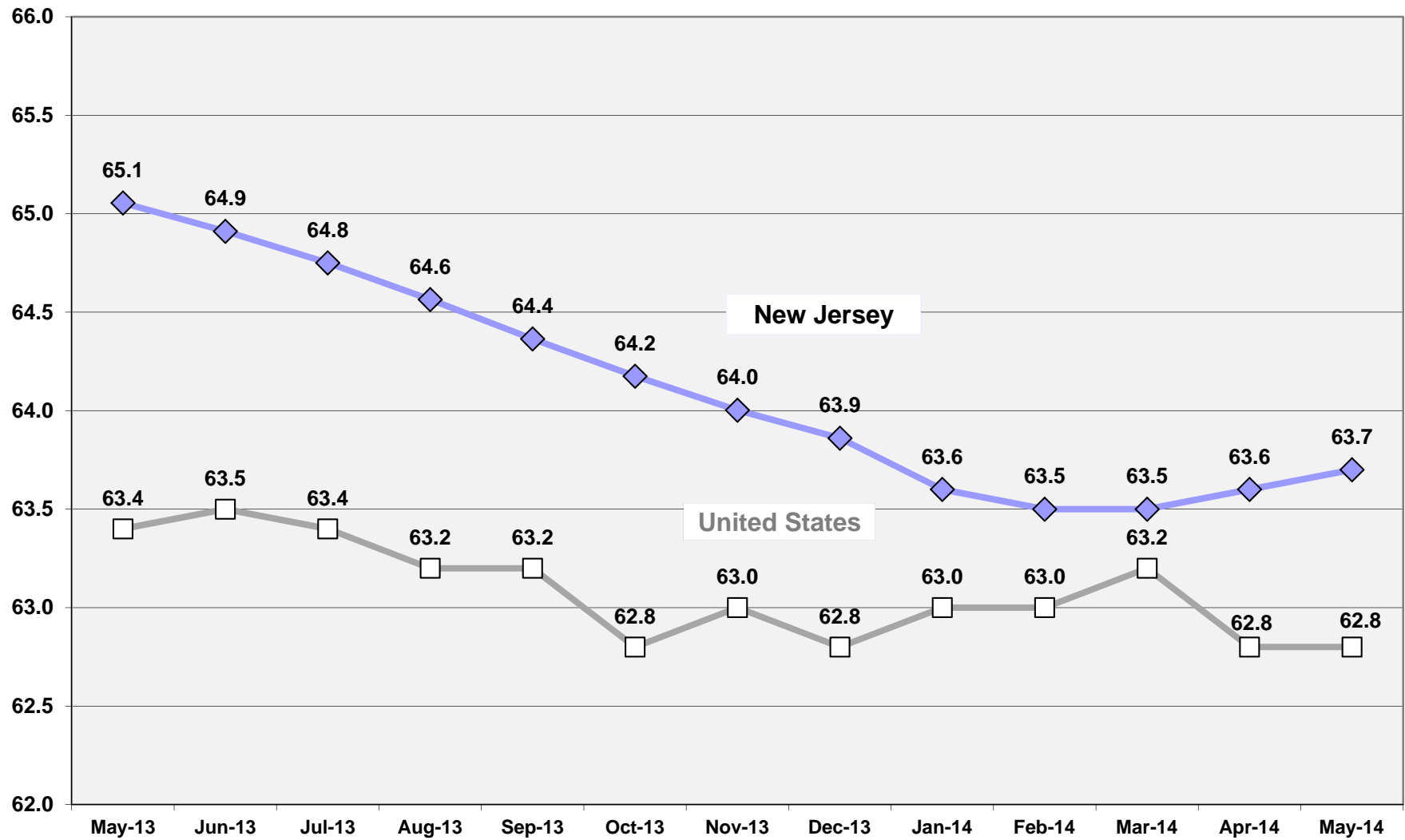
New Jersey Private Sector Employment Change by Industry May 2013 - May 2014



Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States: May 2013 - May 2014



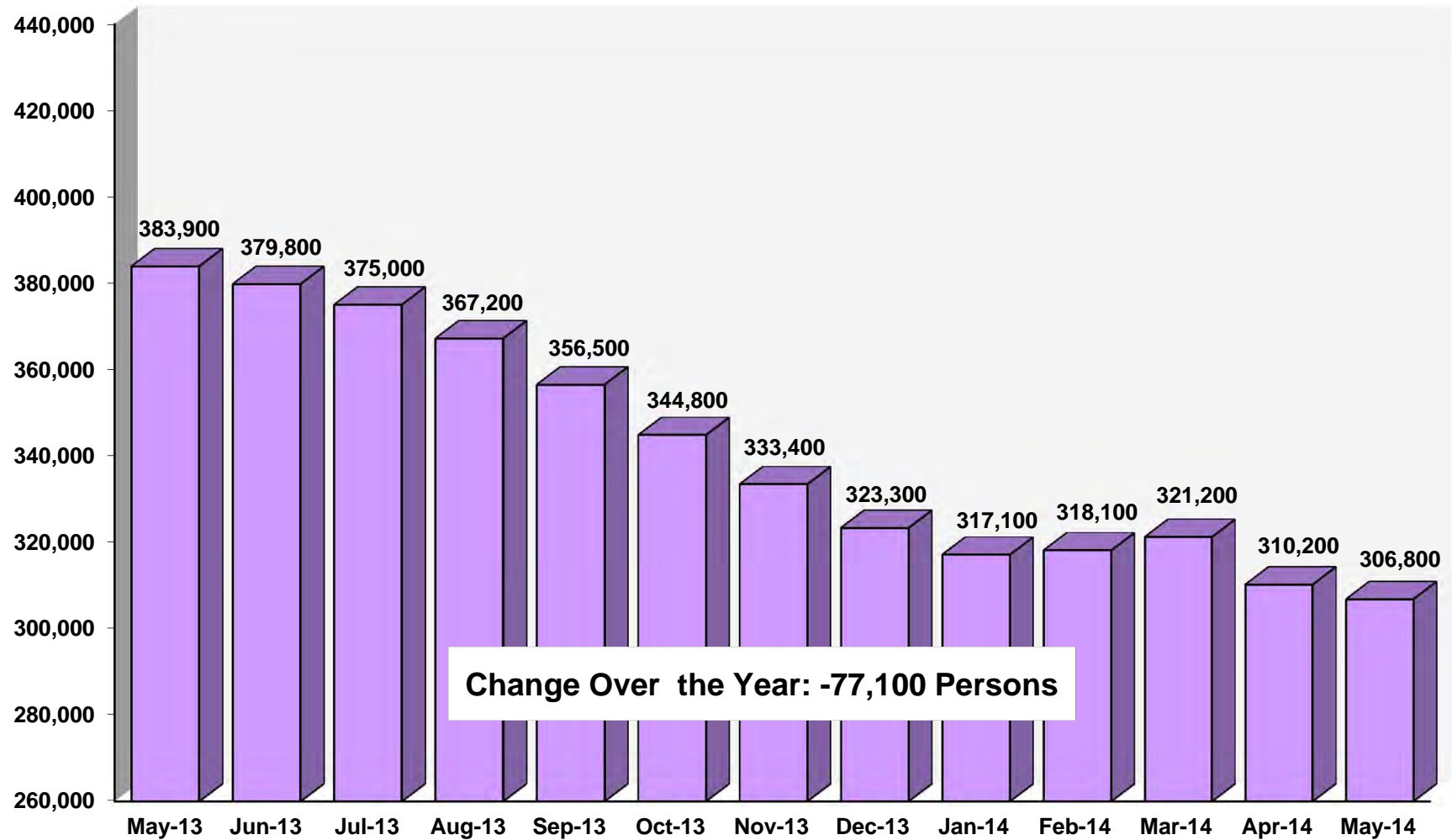
New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: May 2013 - May 2014



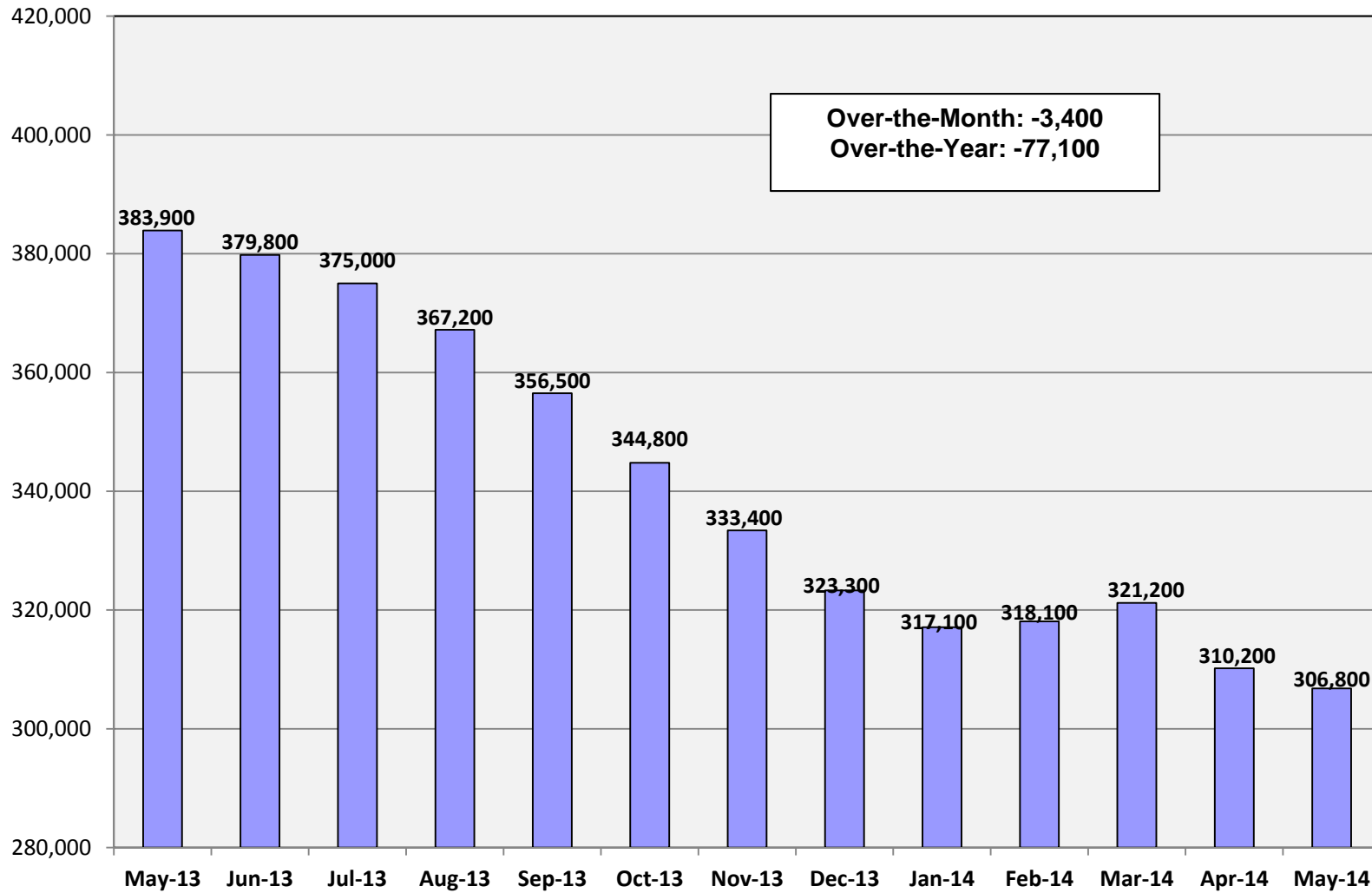
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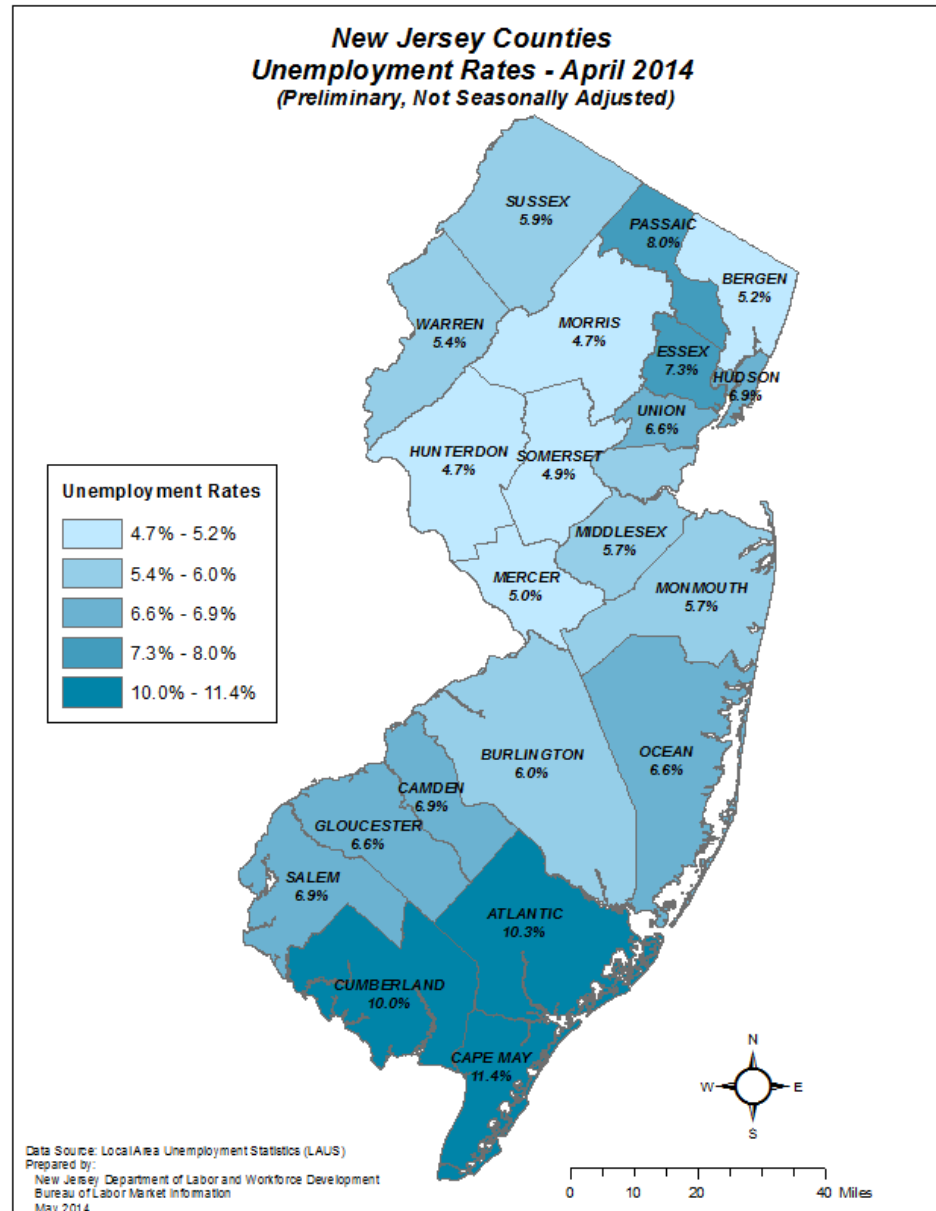
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Unemployed New Jersey Residents May 2013 - May 2014



New Jersey Unemployed Residents: May 2013 - May 2014



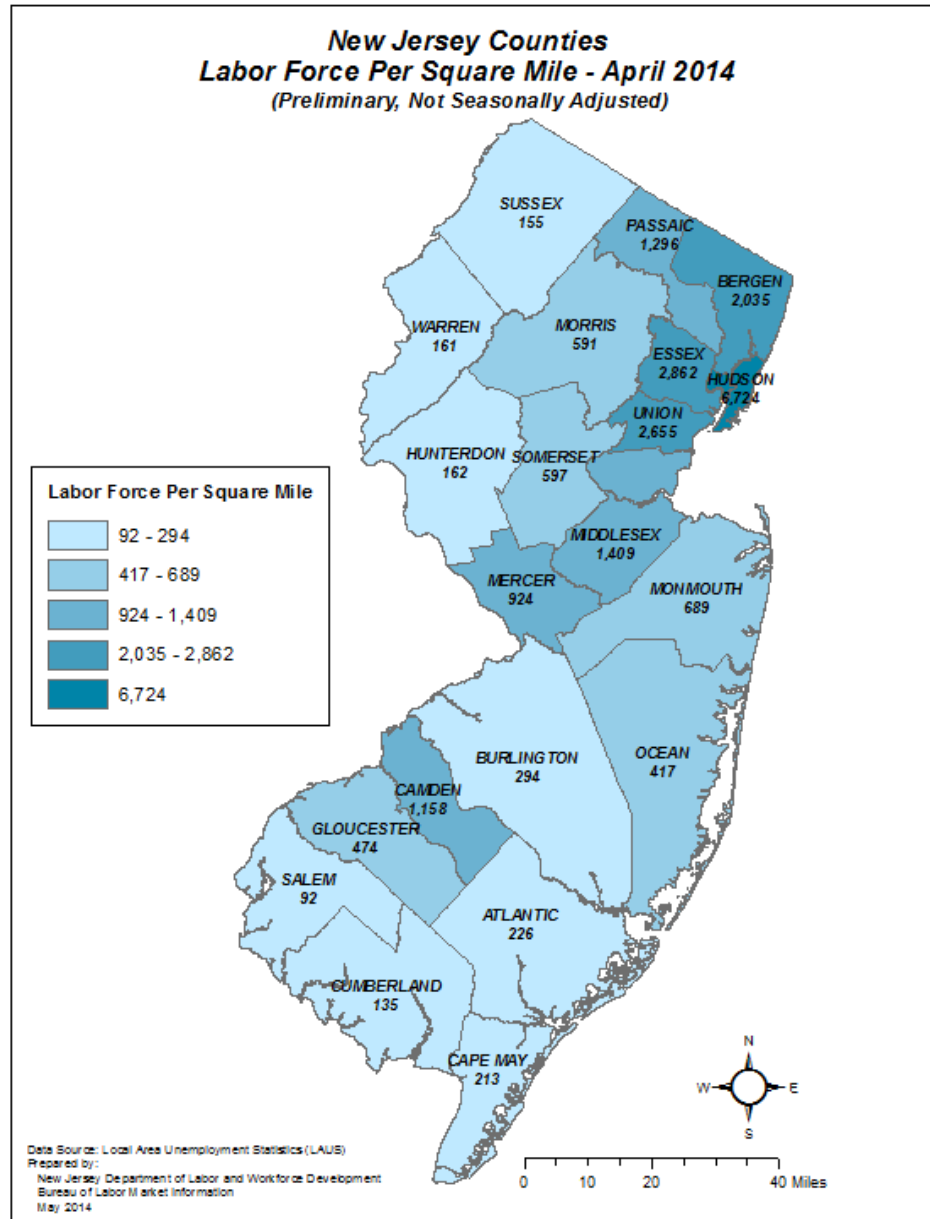

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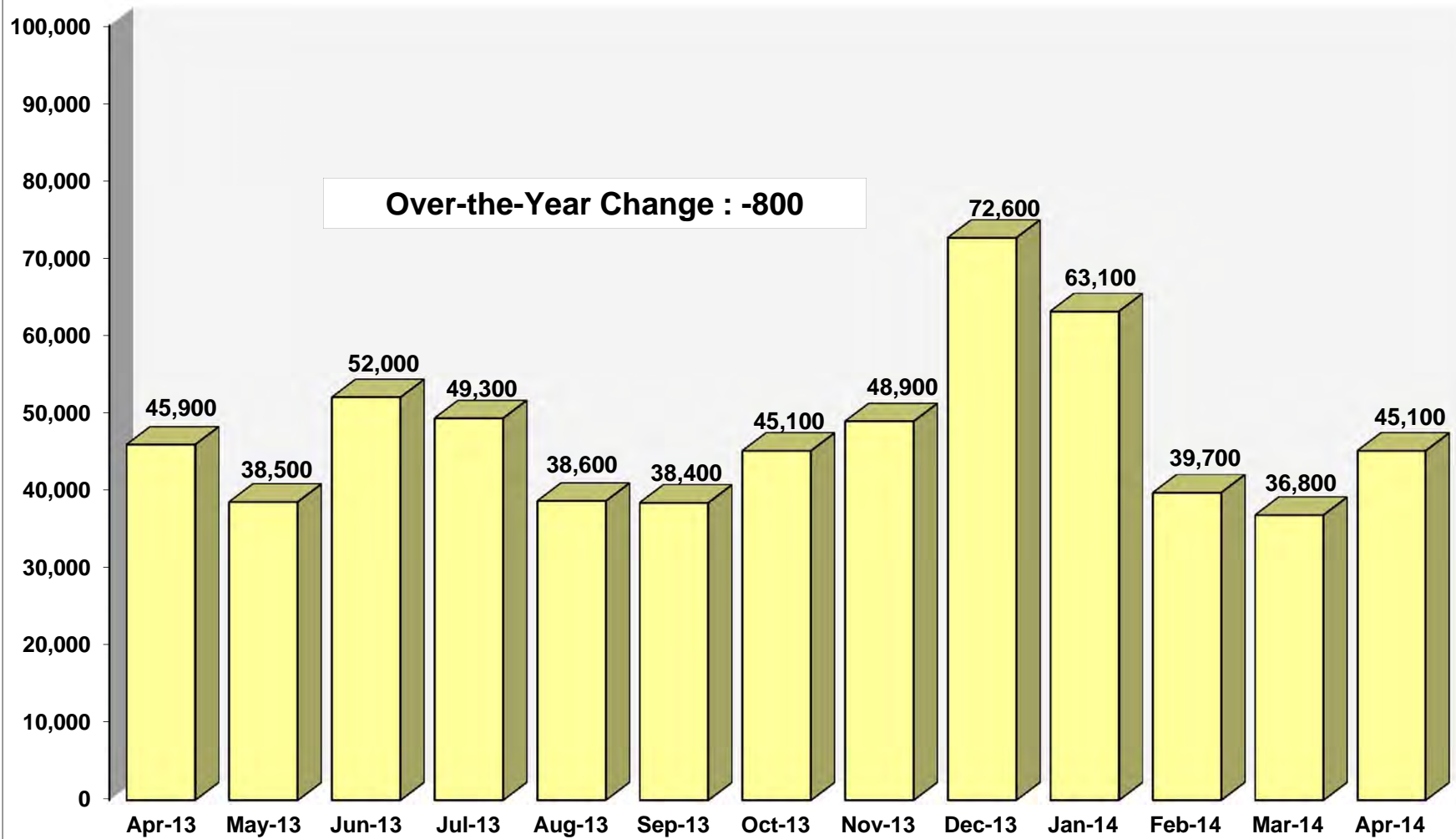
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New Jersey Monthly Initial Unemployment Claims April 2013 - April 2014
