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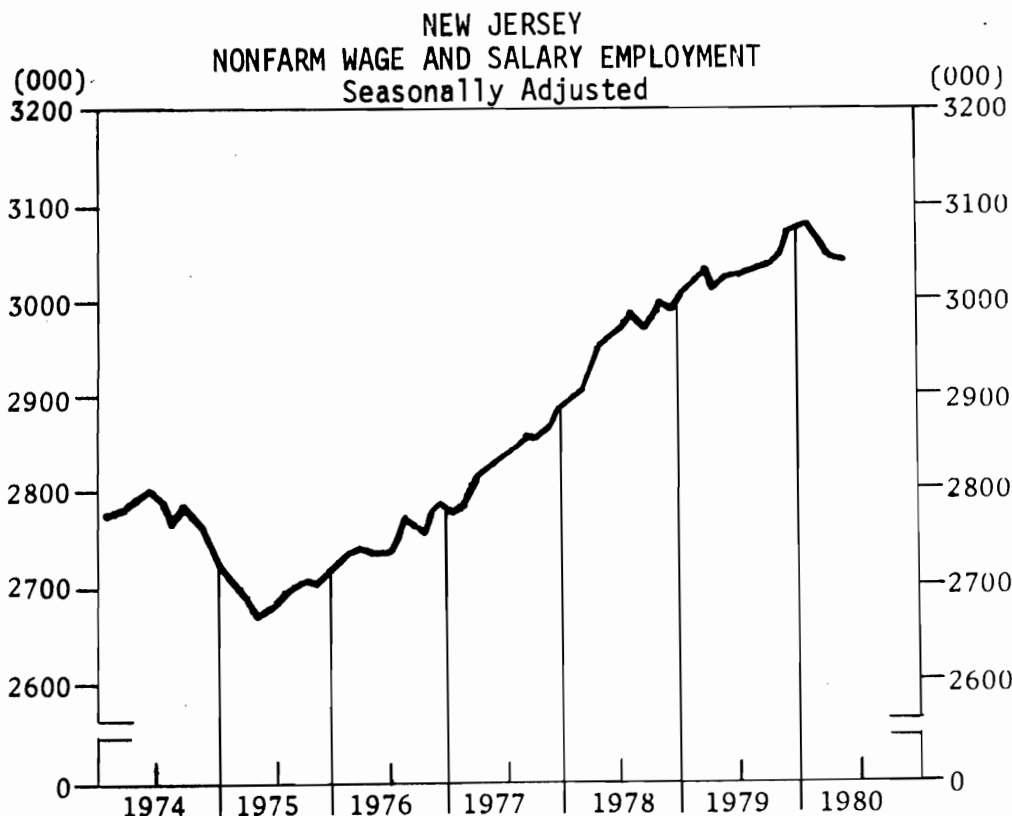

New Jersey's nonfarm employment before seasonal adjustment increased by almost 50,000 in June to a record level of 3,096,700. However, the employment picture for June continued to exhibit weakness. When adjustments were made for traditional seasonal patterns, nonfarm employment in June actually declined for the fourth consecutive month.

Although expected seasonal hiring in June for services, construction, and certain retail trade businesses such as restaurants boosted employment levels in the nonmanufacturing sector by over 44,000, the May and June levels in nonmanufacturing remained essentially the same after adjusting for seasonal patterns. The manufacturing industries, on the other hand, while increasing employment by 5,600 over-the-month, normally experience a greater increase from May to June. Since this did not occur this year the total nonfarm employment actually declined by

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4,200 after seasonal adjustment, i.e., after adjusting to remove the influence of seasonal developments. This marks the fourth successive month that seasonally adjusted employment had dropped.

The seasonally adjusted manufacturing level has declined for four consecutive months, reaching 777,100 in June, the lowest total since December 1977. Specifically, the electrical machinery, apparel, and paper products industries each dropped by about 1,500 from May to June after seasonal adjustment. The total job loss in manufacturing was moderated somewhat by gains in the automobile industry where Ford recalled over 2,000 and in the nonelectrical machinery industry group where two strikes were settled returning over 1,000 workers to their jobs.

Bolstered by casino hiring and the June openings of two race tracks, employment in the service sector reached an all-time high of 595,900 in June on a seasonally adjusted basis.

The construction industry experienced an increase of 2,800 in employment after allowing for the usual seasonal hiring in June. This reversed, at least temporarily, a four-month decline in seasonally adjusted employment in this industry. The industry was still 6,200 below the June 1979 job level. The June job figures were aided by the return to work of 1,100 strikers in the special trades segment of the construction industry.

These increases in construction and services were partially balanced on a seasonally adjusted basis by losses of 3,200 in wholesale and retail trade and 1,300 in transportation, particularly the trucking/warehousing segment.

Most of the labor areas followed the pattern of the State, with total employment increasing less in June than seasonally anticipated. The manufacturing sector was particularly weak as six out of ten labor areas reported decreases in employment before seasonal adjustment. Although nonmanufacturing jobs went up in all ten labor areas from May to June, due to traditional summer hiring, the growth was once again below seasonal expectations. In over the year comparisons, total nonfarm employment dropped in six out of ten labor areas. Newark experienced the sharpest decline, followed by Jersey City and Camden.

The weekly earnings of New Jersey's manufacturing production workers averaged \$296.02 in June, an increase of \$3.58 from May, and an increase of \$19.55 from the year ago figure. After seasonal adjustment, the average weekly hours edged downward to 40.7 hours in June from 40.9 hours in May and from 41.5 hours in June 1979. This decline in weekly hours is the fifth such decline in as many months.

TECHNICAL NOTES

Nonfarm Wage and Salary Employment

Employment data refer to persons on establishment payrolls who received pay for any part of the pay period which includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude proprietors, the self-employed, unpaid family workers, farm workers, and domestic workers in households. Salaried officers of corporations are included. Government employment covers only civilian employees; federal military personnel are excluded.

Persons on an establishment payroll who are on paid sick leave (when pay is received directly from the firm), on paid holiday or paid vacation, or who work during any part of the pay period but are unemployed or on strike during the rest of the period, are counted as employed. Not counted as employed are persons who, during the pay period which includes the 12th, are laid off, on leave without pay or on strike for the entire period, or who are hired but do not work during the period.

Average Hours and Earnings

Hours and earnings data are derived from reports of payroll and man-hours for production and related workers in manufacturing. When the reported pay period exceeds one week, the payroll and man-hour figures are reduced to a weekly basis.

Average hourly earnings for manufacturing are on a "gross" basis, reflecting not only changes in basic hourly rates, but also such variable factors as premium pay for overtime and shift work, and changes in output of workers paid on an incentive plan. Excluded from average earnings are irregular bonuses, retroactive items, payments of various welfare benefits, and payroll taxes paid by employers.

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
