The same Senator, on leave, introduced

Senate Bill No. 196, entitled "An act to amend 'An act respecting the Orphans' Court, relating to the powers and duties of the ordinary and Orphans' Court and Surrogates (Revision of 1898),' " approved June fourteenth, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight,

Which was read for the first time by its title, ordered to have a second reading, and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

The same Senator, on leave, introduced

Senate Bill No. 197, entitled "An act to empower municipalities to exclude the amount of bonds issued for the construction of a sewer system and interest, sinking fund and maintenance in connection therewith, from any limitation as to the amount of bonded indebtedness and from the maximum tax rate prescribed by law,"

Which was read for the first time by its title, ordered to have a second reading, and referred to the Committee on Municipal Corporations.

Mr. Lewis, on leave, introduced

Senate Bill No. 198, entitled "An act appropriating one thousand two hundred dollars for the purpose of carrying into effect Senate Joint Resolution No. 5,"

Which was read for the first time by its title, ordered to have a second reading, and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

Mr. Leavitt, on leave, introduced

Senate Bill No. 199, entitled "An act making appropriation for the extension of the government survey and the erection of monuments for the permanent location thereof on the route of the ship canal across the State of New Jersey, and for other incidental expenses in connection therewith,"

Which was read for the first time by its title, ordered to have a second reading, and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

The same Senator, on leave, introduced

Senate Bill No. 200, entitled "An act for the relief of the heirs of George W. Fox from the imposition of a collateral inheritance tax,"

Which was read for the first time by its title, ordered to have a second reading, and referred to the Committee on Unfinished Business.

The same Senator, on leave, introduced

Senate Bill No. 201, entitled "An act authorizing the exchange of certain lands belonging to the State of New Jersey now used for the purpose of the State Hospital for the Insane at Trenton, for land of the Trenton Country Club, upon terms and conditions and making appropriations for consideration in addition to such exchange, and authorizing conveyance of the State's lands to be named,"

Which was read for the first time by its title, ordered to have a second reading, and referred to the Committee on Miscellaneous Business.

Mr. Price, on leave, introduced,

Senate Bill No. 202, entitled "An act concerning persons, firms, associations and corporations engaged in the business of receiving and selling farm produce on commission,"

Which was read for the first time by its title, ordered to have a second reading and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

Mr. Silzer, on leave, introduced

Senate Bill No. 203, entitled "An act to amend an act entitled 'An act for the publication of the laws and chancery reports,' " approved February twenty-eighth, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven,"

Which was read for the first time by its title, ordered to have a second reading, and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Mr. Gebhardt, on leave, introduced

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4, entitled "A concurrent resolution providing for change of Article two of the Constitution of the State of New Jersey, and providing for women the right of franchise,"

Which was read for the first time by its title, ordered to have a second reading, and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Mr. Nichols, on leave, introduced

Senate Bill No. 204, entitled "An act to amend an act entitled 'An act to amend an act to provide for the organization of the New Jersey Home for Disabled Soldiers, Sailors, Marines, and

Which was read for the first time by its title, ordered to have a second reading, and referred to the Committee on Boroughs and Townships.

Mr. Read, on leave, introduced

Senate Bill No. 303, entitled "An act permitting the admission of attorneys and counsellors-at-law, admitted to the bar of another State, and residing in this State, to practice law in the courts of this State,"

Which was read for the first time by its title, ordered to have a second reading, and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Mr. Leavitt, on leave, introduced

Senate Bill No. 304, entitled "An act to validate and confirm any election, and all other proceedings heretofore held or taken in any county of this State in accordance with the provisions of an act entitled 'An act to reduce the number of members of the boards of freeholders in the counties of this State, and to fix the salaries and to provide for the election of the members of said boards,'" approved March twenty-sixth, one thousand nine hundred and two, and the supplements and amendments thereto,

Which was read for the first time by its title, ordered to have a second reading, and referred to the Committee on Elections.

Mr. Colgate, Chairman of the Committee on Highways, reported

Assembly Bill No. 216, entitled "An act to amend an act entitled 'An act to authorize boards of chosen freeholders to lay out, open, widen, straighten, alter, change the grade or location of, or otherwise improve any public highway under their control, and for that purpose to acquire lands by gift, purchase or condemnation, and to vacate any part of said public highway that may be rendered unnecessary for public travel by the widening, straightening, altering or changing of location of said public highway or any part thereof,'" approved April fourteenth, nineteen hundred and eight,

Without amendment.

Mr. Colgate, Chairman of the Committee on Militia, reported

Assembly Bill No. 362, entitled "An act to authorize the erection and equipment of an armory at New Brunswick, New Jersey, according to the provisions of an act entitled 'An act to provide for the erection and equipment of armories in counties of the

second class in this State, and making appropriations therefor,'" approved April twenty-seventh, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, the amendments thereof and supplements thereto,

Assembly Bill No. 363, entitled "A supplement to an act entitled 'An act to provide for the erection and equipment of armories in counties of the second class, and making appropriation therefor,'" approved April twenty-seventh, one thousand nine hundred and eleven,

And

Assembly Bill No. 427, entitled "An act to authorize the acquisition of land and the erection of an armory thereon in the city of Jersey City, county of Hudson, New Jersey,"

Without amendment.

Mr. Edge, Chairman of the Committee on Judiciary, reported Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4, entitled "A concurrent resolution providing for change of Article two of the Constitution of the State of New Jersey, and providing for women the right of franchise,"

Without recommendation.

Mr. Lewis, Chairman of the Committee on State Prison, reported

Senate Bill No. 224, entitled "An act to amend an act entitled 'An act providing for the employment of inmates of penal, correctional or reformatory institutions of this State, and creating a board for the control, regulation and supervision of the labor of such institutions, and for the disposal of the products of the labor of such inmates,'" approved June seventh, one thousand nine hundred and eleven,

Without amendment.

Mr. Smalley, Chairman of the Committee on Education, reported

Senate Bill No. 270, entitled "An act to authorize private secondary schools and institutions of learning incorporated and existing under and by virtue of an act of the Legislature of New Jersey to elect one or more non-resident trustees,"

And

Senate Bill No. 280, entitled "An act to authorize the board of education in any city of this State to transfer and convey certain lands to such city,"

Favorably, without amendment,

And

Senate Bill No. 252, entitled "An act to repeal an act entitled 'An act to amend an act entitled "An act to establish a thorough and efficient system of free public schools and to provide for the maintenance, support and management thereof," approved October nineteenth, one thousand nine hundred and three,' which amendatory act was approved April twenty-seventh, one thousand nine hundred and eleven,"

With the following amendments, which were read and adopted:

Amend the title by placing a comma at the end thereof instead of a period, and by adding the words "and is known as chapter 282 of the laws of 1911".

Amend section 1, line 5, by inserting after the word "eleven" the words "and is known as chapter 282 of the laws of 1911".

Senate Bill No. 224, entitled "An act to amend an act entitled 'An act providing for the employment of inmates of penal, correctional or reformatory institutions of this State, and creating a board for the control, regulation and supervision of the labor of such institutions, and for the disposal of the products of the labor of such inmates,' approved June seventh, one thousand nine hundred and eleven,

Senate Bill No. 252, entitled "An act to repeal an act entitled 'An act to amend an act entitled "An act to establish a thorough and efficient system of free public schools and to provide for the maintenance, support and management thereof," approved October nineteenth, one thousand nine hundred and three,' which amendatory act was approved April twenty-seventh, one thousand nine hundred and eleven,"

Senate Bill No. 270, entitled "An act to authorize private secondary schools and institutions of learning incorporated and existing under and by virtue of an act of the Legislature of New Jersey to elect one or more non-resident trustees,"

Senate Bill No. 280, entitled "An act to authorize the board of education in any city of this State to transfer and convey certain lands to such city,"

And

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4, entitled "A concurrent resolution providing for change of Article two of the Constitution of the State of New Jersey, and providing for women the right of franchise,"

Were severally taken up, read a second time, considered by sections, agreed to, ordered to be printed, and to have a third reading.

Assembly Bill No. 216, entitled "An act to amend an act entitled 'An act to authorize boards of chosen freeholders to lay out, open, widen, straighten, alter, change the grade or location of, or otherwise improve any public highway under their control, and for that purpose to acquire lands by gift, purchase or condemnation, and to vacate any part of said public highway that may be rendered unnecessary for public travel by the widening, straightening, altering or changing of location of said public highway or any part thereof,' approved April fourteenth, nineteen hundred and eight,

Assembly Bill No. 362, entitled "An act to authorize the erection and equipment of an armory at New Brunswick, New Jersey, according to the provisions of an act entitled 'An act to provide for the erection and equipment of armories in counties of the second class in this State, and making appropriations therefor,' approved April twenty-seventh, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, the amendments thereof and supplements thereto,

Assembly Bill No. 363, entitled "A supplement to an act entitled 'An act to provide for the erection and equipment of armories in counties of the second class, and making appropriation therefor,' approved April twenty-seventh, one thousand nine hundred and eleven,

And

Assembly Bill No. 427, entitled "An act to authorize the acquisition of land and the erection of an armory thereon in the city of Jersey City, county of Hudson, New Jersey,"

Were each taken up, read a second time, considered by sections, agreed to, and ordered to have a third reading.

The Assembly amendments to

Senate Bill No. 186, entitled "An act to regulate the sale of insecticides,"

Having been read three times, were concurred in by the following vote:

In the negative—None.

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4, entitled "A concurrent resolution providing for change of Article two of the Constitution of the State of New Jersey, and providing for women the right of franchise,"

Was taken up and read a third time.

Senate Bill No. 184, entitled "An act providing for the payment of a pension to the widow of any Governor of this State."

Mr. Edge moved that the Senate take a recess until 2 P. M., Which was agreed to.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

At 2 o'clock P. M. the Senate met.

Under the direction of the President, the Secretary called the Senate, when the following Senators appeared and answered the call:

Messrs. Colgate, Edge, Gaunt, Johnson, Lewis, Low, Pierce, Price, Prince (President), Read, Slocum, Smalley—12.

Mr. Colgate moved that the vote by which

Assembly Bill No. 423, entitled "An act concerning the annexation of part of one township to another municipality and also the creation of new municipalities from such townships or parts thereof and relating to the tenure of office and salary of police officers in the territory so annexed or created,"

Passed second reading, be reconsidered,

Which was agreed to.

Mr. Colgate offered the following amendments, which were read and adopted:

Amend title by inserting after the word "one" the words "town or" and by inserting on line 2, after the word "such", the words "town or".

Amend section 1, line 1, by inserting after the word "a" the words "town or", and line 4 by inserting after the word "such" the words "town or".

Amend section 2, by inserting after the word "any" the words "town or", and line 3 by inserting after the word "such" the words "town or", and line 10 by inserting after the word "such" the words "town or".

Said bill, as amended, was then read a second time, considered by sections, agreed to, amendments ordered to be printed, and the bill to have a third reading.
