His Excellency, Joseph D. Bedle, Governor and Commander-in-Chief:

I have the honor to transmit my report of the operations of this department for the past year, and the number and condition of the arms and equipments belonging to the State, the number loaned out, in whose hands, and whether under proper responsibility.

Whole number of arms, the property of the State, serviceable, is twenty-two thousand five hundred and eighteen, (22,518).

Unserviceable, three hundred and eleven, (311).

Total number of different calibres, twenty-two thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, (22,829).

Whole number in hands of National Guard, three thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, (3,931).

Number in the Arsenal, eighteen thousand five hundred and eighty-seven, (18,587).

Number of cannon of different calibres, the property of the State, forty (40), making seven (7) complete batteries, comprising caissons, battery wagons, forges and implements; also two (2) Billingham batteries, with implements. Of the above there have been issued ten (10) cannons with caissons.

There have been received from the United States, during the year, two thousand six hundred (2,600) Springfield rifles, breech loaders, calibre forty-five (45).

There have been received from military companies, during the year, one thousand six hundred and ninety (1,690) muskets, under orders for re-arming the National Guard.

The First, Third, Fourth, Sixth, Seventh and Ninth Regiments, and the Second Battalion of the National Guard, have been armed with Springfield rifles, breech-loaders, calibre forty-five (45); the Fifth and Eighth Regiments are armed with the muzzle-loading rifled muskets.

Annual returns have been received from sixty-one (61) companies, reporting generally the good condition of the arms and equipments. Four (4) companies have failed to make returns according to law.

By the statement in the appendix, you will observe the total expenditures on militia account for the past year are sixty-six thousand two hundred and eighty-nine dollars and seventy-three cents (\$66,289.73), of which seven thousand six hundred and thirty-four dollars and fifty-seven cents (\$7,634.57) is for the purchase and repair of arms, ordnance, clothing, and camp and garrison equipage; forty-four thousand one hundred and thirty-seven dollars and seventy-three cents (\$44,137.73) was for armory rent, by act of the Legislature, and seven thousand eight hundred and two dollars and eighty-four cents (\$7,802.84) was for current expenses. The amount expended for calling out the Seventh Regiment to preserve the peace at Hopewell, on the 7th and 8th of January, was eight hundred and seventy-seven dollars and fifty-three cents (\$877.53). The expenditures of the Encampment, as far as bills rendered and paid at this office, is six thousand five hundred and sixty-three dollars and forty-five cents (\$6,543.45).

In the appendix will be found statements giving full particulars of issues, receipts and disbursements on account of the National Guard. These statements are as follows :

Statement J, stores issued from the State Arsenal to city of Elizabeth, State Institutions and N. J. Centennial Commission during the year.

Statement K, stores issued to independent organizations and Washington Headquarters Association, at Morristown.

Statement L, stores turned into the State Arsenal from State Institutions and N. J. Centennial Commission during the year.

Statement M, stores turned into the State Arsenal by sundry independent organizations and Washington Headquarters Association.

Statement N, ammunition, clothing, camp and garrison equipage issued from the State Arsenal to five companies of the Seventh Regiment, National Guard, ordered out for duty, to preserve the peace at Hopewell.

Statement O, clothing, camp and garrison equipage turned into the State Arsenal by five companies of the Seventh Regiment, National Guard, ordered out to preserve the peace at Hopewell.
