# REPORT.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY,

*His Excellency, T. F. Randolph, Governor of New Jersey :*

SIR : I have the honor to transmit herewith my report agreeably to the provisions of an act entitled, "An Act for the organization of the National Guard of the State of New Jersey," containing a return of the number and condition of the arms and equipments belonging to the State, the number bound out, in whose hands, and wither they remain under proper responsibilities, including in said return all camp equipage in my charge."

Under the provisions of said act arms and equipments are bound out upon the application of the officers of companies attached to the National Guard, upon their giving bond with sufficient surity, that the same shall not be loaned out nor suffered to go out of the possession of the Company, and shall be returned to the State Arsenal whenever they shall be required.

No returns have been made to this office by Brigade Inspectors of the number and condition of public arms and equipments loaned out to the respective companies of the National Guard as required by said act, and as far as information can be obtained, the property of the State remains under proper responsibilities.

There has been received from the United States, on account of claims for expenses incurred in aiding to suppress the late rebellion, since making my last report, the sum of twenty-seven thousand, five hundred and forty-nine dollars and forty-five cents, (\$27,549.45), which has been paid into the Treasury as follows :

The balance still claimed against the United States amounts to seventeen thousand, one hundred and eighty-seven dollars and thirty-three cents (\$17,187.33), the settlement of which is still being prosecuted with entire confidence that the greater part of it will be allowed and paid.

In the appendix will be found in detailed statements the number kind and condition of the property loaned out, belonging to this State, and in whose hands, and the number and condition of the arms in store at the State Arsenal.

Statement A contains an account of clothing, camp and garrison equipage, quartermaster stores, baggage train, hospital supplies, ordnance and ordnance stores, serviceable and unserviceable, remaining on hand at the State Arsenal on the 30th of November, 1869.

Statement B, the number of arms cleaned and repaired during the year ending November 30, 1869.

Statement C, the quality of ammunition expended during the year ending November 30, 1869.

Tabular Statement A contains in detail the issue of clothing to the different companies equipped during the year ending November 30, 1869.

Tabular Statement B contains the issue of arms and accoutrements during the same period.

Tabular Statement C contains an account of ordnance and ordnance stores, clothing, &c., turned into the Arsenal by disbanded and other military companies during the year ending November 30, 1869.

Tabular Statement D contains an account of ordnance and ordnance stores dropped by affidavit during the year ending November 30, 1869.

Tabular Statement E is a consolidated report of ordnance and ordnance stores, clothing, camp and garrison equipage, &c., in possession of the New Jersey Militia on the 30th of November, 1869.
