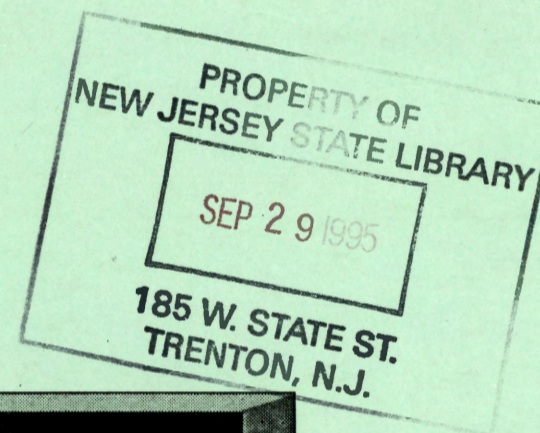
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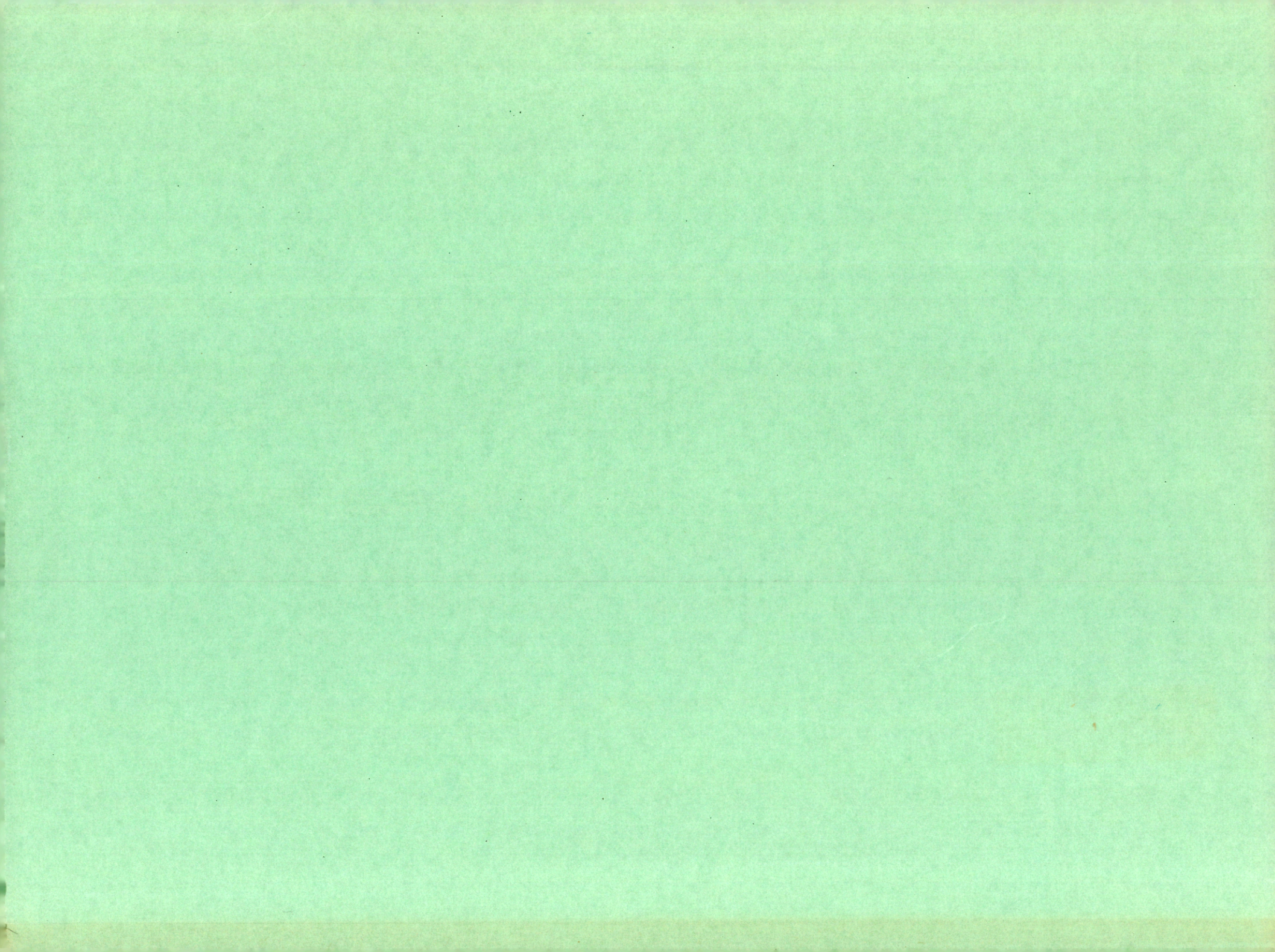

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INTRODUCTION

INTRODUCTION

The 1994-95 edition of Vital Education Statistics presents the status of education in New Jersey as demonstrated by local district and school organization, student enrollments, dropouts, and post-graduation plans of high school graduates. Also included are data pertaining to certificated and non-certificated district personnel and identified nonpublic schools.

As in previous editions, the data are reported within the following five distinct sections as a single volume:

Section I contains local district and school organization data;

Section II reports student enrollments, dropouts, and high school graduate data including post-graduation plans and graduation rates;

Section III contains certificated staff data, including assignment, degree, age, experience, salary, mean salary, and mobility;

Section IV reports non-certificated support staff data by position classification; and

Section V contains school count, enrollment, and program data for identified nonpublic schools.

These data are compiled from the New Jersey State Department of Education's annual fall survey data collection of local districts and schools. This information is used to meet state and federal mandates for information pertaining to the current condition of education in New Jersey, as well as for the purposes of educational research and policy considerations.

Beginning with the 1993-94 school year, changes occurred in the methodology for reporting student enrollment. In previous years, shared-time vocational education students (i.e., those students appearing in the New Jersey School Registers of an academic high school and a county vocational school for a half school day each) were counted in their appropriate grade (Grades 9-12, Post-Graduate, or Ungraded) by their home district and duplicated in counts of shared-time students who were sent and those who were received by each location. For the current school year, counts of students "on-roll" full-time and shared-time were combined with full-time students reported as "1" and shared-time as ".5" at each location. Furthermore, in this edition, full-time and shared-time students attending vocational school districts are reported separately under the heading "Vocational Education."

Please note that enrollment counts that include a decimal (".5") for demographic categories such as racial/ethnic origin and sex are due to the reporting limitations of the New Jersey School Register. For example, pupils attending a private school for the handicapped on a shared-time basis would only be reported as a ".5" by the public school where the child is enrolled for a half school day each day. Enrollments, full- or shared-time, are not reported in a school register for private schools for the handicapped.

Also, beginning with the 1993-94 edition, non-certificated staff counts are reported in Full-Time Equivalency (FTE). In prior years, those staff counts were reported separately as whole numbers for full- and part-time status.

HIGHLIGHTS OF VITAL EDUCATION STATISTICS 1994-95

1. The number of operating school districts in 1994-95 is 594. The number of non-operating districts remained at 26 for 1994-95.
2. An increase in the number of public schools from 2,287 in 1994-95 to 2,296 in 1994-95.
3. The overall number of enrollments increased by 22,263.5 in 1994-95 as there were 19,207.5 more elementary and 3,056.0 more secondary students.* These increases continue a trend as appears below:

From a 1989-90 low of 1,076,005 to the present 1,174,252.5, enrollments have risen by 98,247.5 or 9.1%.

4. Enrollments have increased from 1993-94 to 1994-95 for all racial/ethnic categories: White by 8,908.0 or 1.2%, Black by 3,976.0 or 1.9%, Hispanic by 5,868.0 or 4.0%, American Indian/Alaskan Native by 346.0 or 22.1%, and Asian/Pacific Islander by 3,165.5 or 5.4%. See "Selected Educational Statistics for School Years 1990-91 to 1994-95" for enrollments by racial/ethnic categories and school year.
5. As a percentage of the total enrollment, Hispanic, American Indian/Alaskan Native, and Asian/Pacific Islander student populations have increased. White enrollments have declined. The percentage of Black students remained the same. The percentage of overall minority enrollments increased, as indicated below:

6. The total number of dropouts reported for Grades 9-12 in 1993-94 was 13,028. The total number of dropouts for Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 6 (1,849), and Special Education (1,806), in addition to Grades 9-12, was 17,671. The percentages of dropouts by racial/ethnic category in descending order were: White, 36.7%; Black, 36.7%; Hispanic, 24.3%; Asian/Pacific Islander, 2.2%; and American Indian/Alaskan Native, 0.2%.
7. The number of public high school graduates decreased from 67,134 in 1992-93 to 66,125 for 1993-94. As a percentage of the ninth grade class enrolled four years earlier, the number of graduates have decreased from 85.8% for 1992-93 to 85.3% for 1993-94. Please note graduates are reported for the preceding school year.
8. An increase in the number of graduates continuing their education as a percentage of all high school graduates from 78.3% in 1992-93 to 79.4% in 1993-94. Of those continuing their education, 94.0% of these students plan to attend a college or university.
9. A 1.8% decrease in full-time administrators/supervisors from 8,133 in 1993-94 to 7,989 in 1994-95.*
10. An increase in the reported number of full-time classroom teachers from 82,991 in 1993-94 to 83,478 in 1994-95. The student/full-time classroom teacher ratio increased to 14.1:1 for 1994-95 from 13.9:1 in 1993-94.
11. A 13.9% increase in the number of full-time classroom teachers who entered the educational system from 6,748 in 1992-93 to 7,685 in 1993-94. The number of full-time classroom teachers who left the educational system increased by 55.1% from 1992-93 (4,300) to 1993-94 (6,671). Mobility occurring during a school year is reported on the department's annual fall survey in the subsequent school year (See "Mobility" in Glossary).

* For 1994-95, enrollments for full-time and shared-time students were combined. Full-time students were reported as "1" and shared-time as ".5" at each location. Hence, as explained in the preceding Introduction section, enrollment counts may include a decimal in tenths (".5").

- (1) For the 1994-95 school year, enrollments were collected for "on-roll" students who attend public school full-time and those who attend two schools on a shared-time basis. These students attend two different schools in one day for a half school day each. For example, students who spend a half school day in an academic high school and a half school day in a county vocational school are enrolled in the high school register under the program type, Grades 9-12, and also appear in the appropriate county vocational school register. For the purposes of the department's annual Fall Survey data collection, the results of which appear in this publication, these students were reported as ".5" at each location. Please note that enrollment totals for the 1993-94 school year differ from those previously published due to changes reported by local school districts.
- (2) Graduation data are for the preceding school year.
- (3) Includes four-year college, two-year college, and other type college. See Glossary.
- (4) The number of Grade 12 graduates represented as a percentage of the Grade 9 enrollment four years earlier.
- (5) Beginning in the 1992-93 school year, an additional factor other than that of staff migration (staff entering, leaving, new hires, etc.) may impact these figures. This factor results from the greater precision with which staff time may be allocated for those full-time staff members who are counted in more than one major assignment category due to reporting by Full-Time Equivalency (FTE).
- (6) Beginning with the 1993-94 school year, non-certificated staff were reported in Full-Time Equivalency (FTE). In previous editions, as indicated by the years 1990-91 through 1992-93 above, this data was reported for only full-time staff. As the 1994-95 data includes full- and part-time personnel, the percent change indicated is for the 1993-94 and 1994-95 school years only.

Number of operating and non-operating school districts by county. A non-operating school district is a district that has been legally established with a board of education but does not operate any schools. Table includes county totals, percentage of total operating school districts by county, and statewide totals.

TABLE 2: UNIVERSE OF LOCAL AND COUNTY OPERATING EDUCATIONAL AGENCIES AS OF OCTOBER 14, 1994.

Number of operating educational agencies by county. Table includes Type I regular and vocational districts, Type II regular, regional, and consolidated districts, as well as educational services commissions, special services district, and statewide totals. In Type I school districts, the Board of Education members are appointed by the mayor and a Board of School Estimate establishes the annual school budget. In Type II districts, the members of the Board of Education are elected and the annual school budget is submitted for voter approval at a school district election. Consolidated districts are formed by the merger of two or more municipalities into a single district. Regional districts are formed when two or more school districts combine for a limited purpose, as in establishing a Grade K-12 or 9-12 district.

CERTIFICATED STAFF INFORMATION**

This section contains information pertaining to the certificated staff employed full and part-time. For the purposes of this publication, certificated staff are classified into three categories that define the major work assignments in the educational profession. These categories are: administrators and supervisors; classroom teachers; and educational support services personnel. The following tables report the staff in these categories by location (system-wide or central office assignment, elementary or secondary), sex, race/ethnicity, age, experience, academic degree acquired, and mobility (entering and leaving).

As in the previous edition, certificated staff counts are reported in Full-Time Equivalency (FTE). In order to comply with federal reporting requirements and resolve discrepancies as to identification of major work assignments and associated category classification, the "Report of Certificated Staff Status," distributed as part of the department's annual Fall Survey, was revised to include FTE for each reported assignment. 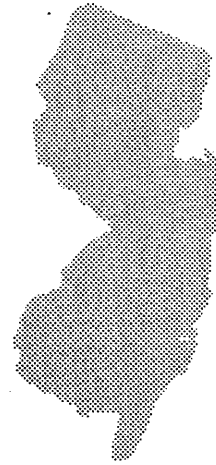

GLOSSARY

GLOSSARY

ADMINISTRATOR/SUPERVISOR:

A staff member with valid certification who has been assigned the responsibility to manage or direct the activities of a district or a portion of these activities.

ASSIGNMENT:

The specific group of activities for which a staff member has been given responsibility.

CERTIFICATE:

The legal document giving authorization, from the New Jersey State Board of Examiners, to perform the services to which the person is assigned.

CLERICAL/SECRETARIAL STAFF:

Staff members in positions requiring skills and training for all clerical work including such activities as preparing, transcribing, systematizing, or filing written communications and reports; and operating such equipment as bookkeeping machines, typewriters, calculating machines, word processors, and personal computers. Tables include bookkeepers, messengers, office machine operators, clerk-typists, stenographers, secretaries, hearing reporters, statistical clerks, dispatchers, payroll clerks, and data entry operators.

COLLEGES OR UNIVERSITIES:

Tables include post-secondary institutions offering a two-year or four-year curriculum and empowered to confer a degree, as well as armed services academies and other post-secondary degree granting institutions.

CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL DISTRICT:

A legal entity established in accordance with New Jersey Statutes 18A, Chapter 8-25. Such districts are formed through the merger of two or more existing municipalities into a single district.

DEGREE:

A title conferred by an approved college or university as official recognition for a completed course of study.

DROPOUT:

Any student who leaves school before completing the requirements of the board of education for graduation without legally transferring to a public school, nonpublic school, state institution, or to an equivalent educational program of parental instruction; or whose permanent record is in the custody of a school, but the student is no longer attending the school and their residence and school status is unknown.

EDUCATIONAL SERVICES COMMISSION:

A legal entity established in accordance with New Jersey Statutes Title 18A, Chapter 6. Such agencies are established in one or more counties for the purpose of carrying on programs of educational research and development and providing to public school districts such educational and administrative services as may be authorized pursuant to the rules of the State Board of Education.

EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT SERVICES PERSONNEL:

A staff member with valid certification who provides administrative, technical, and logistical support to achieve the objectives of a district's educational programs.

EMPLOYED, NOT CONTINUING EDUCATION:

Tables include individuals working full-time or those participating in an apprenticeship or on-the-job training program, as well as those in government service through enlistment in the armed services or other government sponsored program.

ESSIA CHAPTER 1:

The federal Elementary/Secondary School Improvement Act chapter that provides federal funds to eligible schools for supplemental remedial programs which meet the special needs of students performing below minimum levels of proficiency.

EXPERIENCE:

A year of professional, educational employment (excluding current year) in a public school, college, or university.

FREE MEALS AND/OR FREE MILK PROGRAM:

The National School Lunch, School Breakfast and Special Milk Programs are federally-assisted programs that provide balanced, low-cost or free meals and or free milk respectively each school day. Any child enrolled at a participating school can purchase a meal and or milk through one of these programs. Children from families with incomes at or below an established percentage of the poverty level are eligible for free meals or free milk.

FTE (FULL-TIME EQUIVALENCY):

FTE is the amount of time required to perform an assignment stated as a proportion of a full-time position. This proportion is usually represented by a decimal in tenths for each assignment.

FULL-TIME (STUDENT OR CERTIFICATED STAFF MEMBER):

For students who attend or certificated staff employed, a full school day is four or more hours of actual class time (except for Pre-Kindergarten and half-day Kindergarten). One continuous session of two and one-half hours for Pre-Kindergarten or for a half-day Kindergarten class constitutes a full school day.

GRADUATION RATE:

The number of Grade 12 graduates represented as a percentage of the Grade 9 enrollment four years earlier.

HALF-DAY (PRE-KINDERGARTEN OR KINDERGARTEN):

A required program of instruction of one continuous session of two and one-half hours for Pre-Kindergarten or a half-day Kindergarten class.

HOME ECONOMICS:

A consumer and homemaking program of instructional and laboratory experiences taught by a home economics teacher and which (1) contributes to personality development; (2) teaches the child's role in school and home life; (3) develops appreciation of the family; and (4) enriches the child's skills in other areas such as foods and clothing.

INDUSTRIAL ARTS:

A program of instructional and laboratory experiences which provides basic education related to the industrial and technological aspects of life through experiences with tools, materials, and processes.

LABORERS, UNSKILLED:

Staff members in full-time positions performing manual labor and not classified in another activity assignment area.

MOBILITY:

Includes the source from which a staff member new to a school or district was recruited (entering) and the relocation of a staff member from the site reported in the previous year (leaving). The criteria for "entering" includes out-of-district transfers; placement from a college or university, home duties, military service, non-teaching occupation, or other; and return from a leave of absence without pay. The criteria for "leaving" includes out-of-district transfers; continuing education; enter military service or non-teaching employment; leave of absence without pay, resignation, retirement, death, or other; and not offered re-employment.

NEW HIRES:

Refers to persons who were hired for the first time or after a break in service for full-time employment in the district. Personnel returning from official leaves of absence granted by the district are not counted as new hires.

NON-CERTIFICATED STAFF:

Staff members in positions for which a certificate issued by the New Jersey State Board of Examiners is not required for the performance of professional services in the school or district. Table includes persons engaged in administration, such as accountants and attorneys; in health services, such as doctors, dentists, and psychiatrists; in facilities planning and operations, such as architects and engineers.

NOT CONTINUING EDUCATION:

Tables include high school graduates, who are unemployed, engaged in additional secondary schooling, homemaking, deceased, or where status is unknown.

NON-OPERATING DISTRICT:

A district that has been established legally having a board of education, but does not operate any schools.

NONPUBLIC SCHOOL:

Tables include agencies, also known as "private schools," that are established for the purposes of providing education to children in programs of study under college grade which do not derive support entirely or in part from public funds.

OTHER EDUCATION:

Tables include high school graduates attending other post-secondary institutions such as business or secretarial schools, cosmetology or barber schools, art schools, nursing schools, technical, trade, or vocational schools, industry sponsored schools, or other post-secondary institutions not granting a degree.

OTHER TYPE COLLEGE:

Includes armed services academies, as well as any post-secondary degree granting institution.

PART-TIME:

A staff member whose total current assignments constitute less than full-time service. A part-time staff member maybe employed full-time for a part of the school year, part-time for a part of the school year, or part-time for the entire school year.

POST-GRADUATE:

Students who, after graduating from high school (Grade 12), re-enroll in the same or another secondary school for additional high school courses.

PRE-KINDERGARTEN:

A group or class organized to provide educational experiences for children during the year or years preceding kindergarten and are part of the elementary school program under the direction of a qualified teacher.

PROGRAM OF STUDIES:

A combination of related courses and/or self-contained classes organized for the attainment of specific education objectives such as, a program of special education for handicapped pupils or program of occupational (vocational) education.

REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT:

A legal entity established in accordance with New Jersey Statutes Title 18A, Chapter 13. Such districts are formed when two or more school districts combine for a limited purpose as in establishing a Grade K-12 or 9-12 district.

RACE/ETHNICITY:

The group which an individual appears to belong, identifies with, or is regarded as belonging to in the community. The four categories, mandated by federal reporting requirements, are: White, not Hispanic origin; Black, not of Hispanic origin; Hispanic; American Indian or Alaskan Native; and Asian or Pacific Islander.

SCHOOL DISTRICT:

A legal entity established in accordance with New Jersey Statutes Title 18A, Chapter 8. Each municipality is considered a separate local school district. A Type I school district is the legal classification of a local school district in accordance with New Jersey Statutes Title 18A, Chapter 9-2. Such districts are formed where the board of education members are appointed by the mayor of the municipality and a board of school estimate establishes the annual school budget. A Type II school district is the legal classification of a local school district in accordance with New Jersey Statutes Title 18A, Chapter 9-3. Such districts are formed when members of the board of education are elected and the annual school budget is submitted for voter approval in a school district election.

SCHOOL YEAR:

A calendar year which begins on July 1 and ends on June 30 of the following year.

SERVICE WORKERS:

Staff members in positions performing paraprofessional services in the areas of cafeteria operation, maintenance, security, transportation, etc. Tables include food service workers; custodial workers with the responsibility for cleanliness of buildings and operating such equipment as heating and ventilating systems; security workers with the responsibility for preserving the security of district property and keeping the buildings safe for occupancy; and transportation workers.

SHARED-TIME:

Students who attend two different schools in one day for a half school day each; for example, students who spend a half school day in an academic high school and a half school day in a county vocational school are enrolled in the high school register under the appropriate program type, Grades 9-12, and also in the county vocational school register.

SKILLED CRAFTS:

Staff members in positions performing jobs which require special manual skills and a thorough and comprehensive knowledge of the processes involved in this work. Such skills may have been acquired through on-the-job training and experience, through apprenticeship, or other formal training programs. Tables include mechanics, carpenters, electricians, plumbers, heavy equipment operators, stationary engineers, skilled machinery operators, compositors, and typesetters.

SPECIAL EDUCATION:

Students on roll in self-contained special education classes. Special Education students who are mainstreamed are reported in their respective grade levels.

SPECIAL SERVICES SCHOOL DISTRICT:

A legal entity established in accordance with New Jersey Statutes Title 18A, Chapter 46-29. Such districts are established by a county board of chosen freeholders for the education and treatment of handicapped children.

TEACHER:

A staff member with valid certification who instructs students.

TEACHER AIDES:

Staff members in positions performing assigned activities which assist certificated staff members perform professional educational-teaching assignments. Tables include teacher aides, library aides, playground aides, guidance aides, etc.

TECHNICIANS:

Staff members in positions requiring a combination of knowledge and manual skill which has been obtained through approximately two years of post-high school education, such as is offered in many technical institutes and/or junior colleges, or through equivalent on-the-job training. Tables include computer programmers and operators, film inspectors, projectionists, and graphic artists, draftsmen, technicians (medical and dental) and similar occupations which cannot be properly classified in other activity area assignments.

UNEEMPLOYED:

Not employed at any paid work.

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION:

Program offering education and training in such semi-skilled, skilled and/or technical occupations as agriculture, home economics, office occupations, distributive education, and technical education.

VOCATIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT:

A legal entity established in accordance with New Jersey Statutes Title 18A, Chapter 54. Such districts may be established by the county board of chosen freeholders or referendum and are administered by a separate board of education.
