

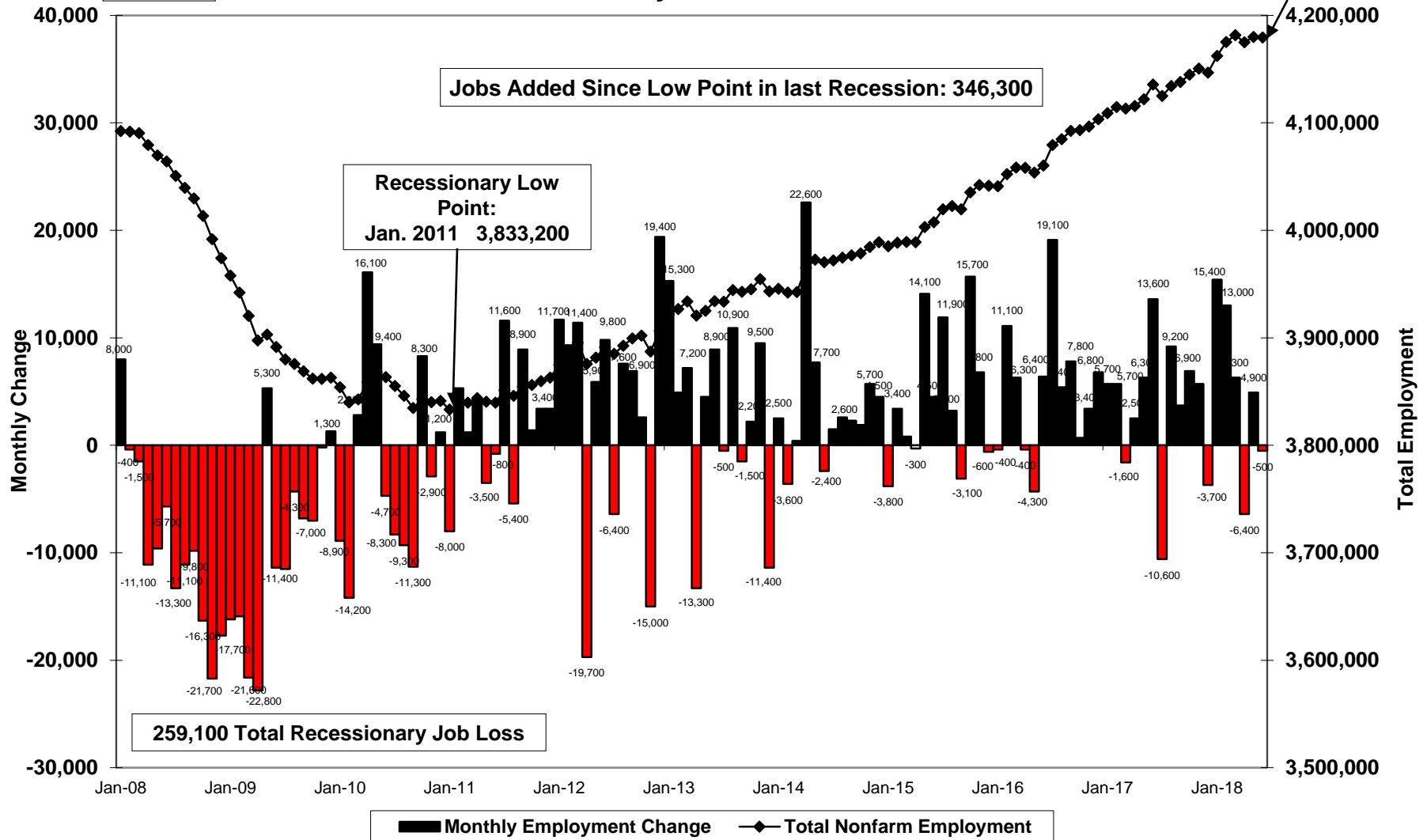

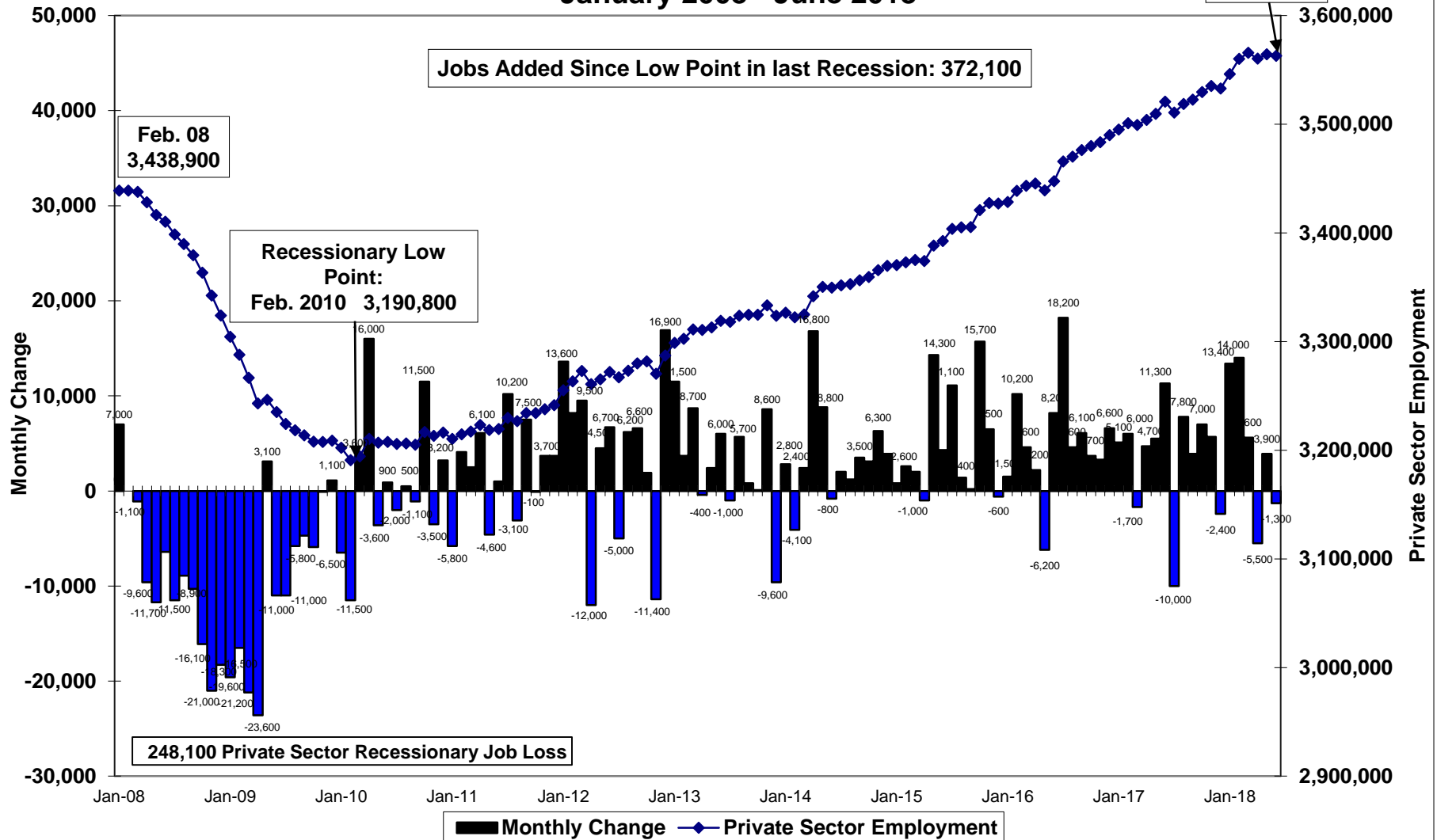

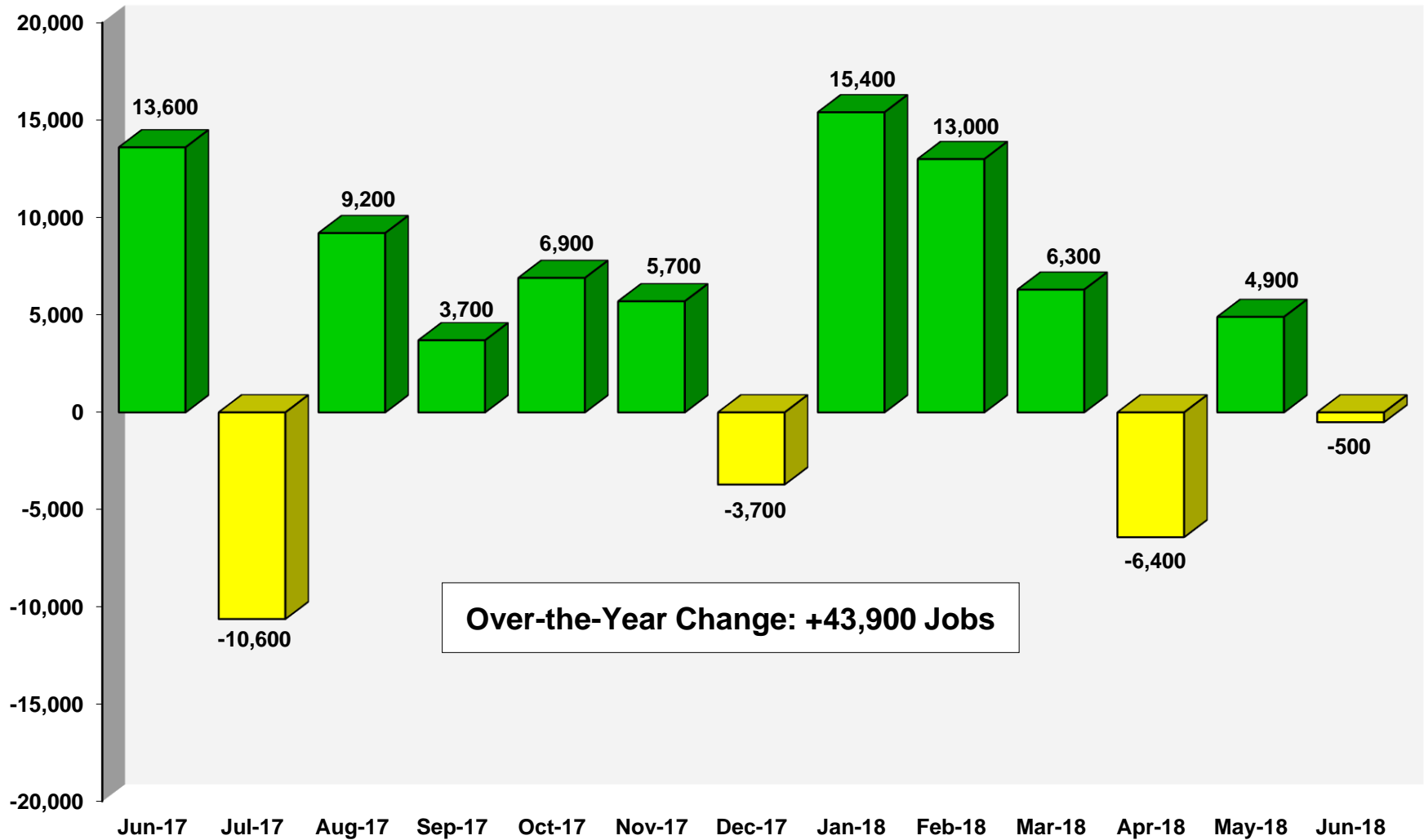
New Jersey Total Nonfarm Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - June 2018



New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - June 2018



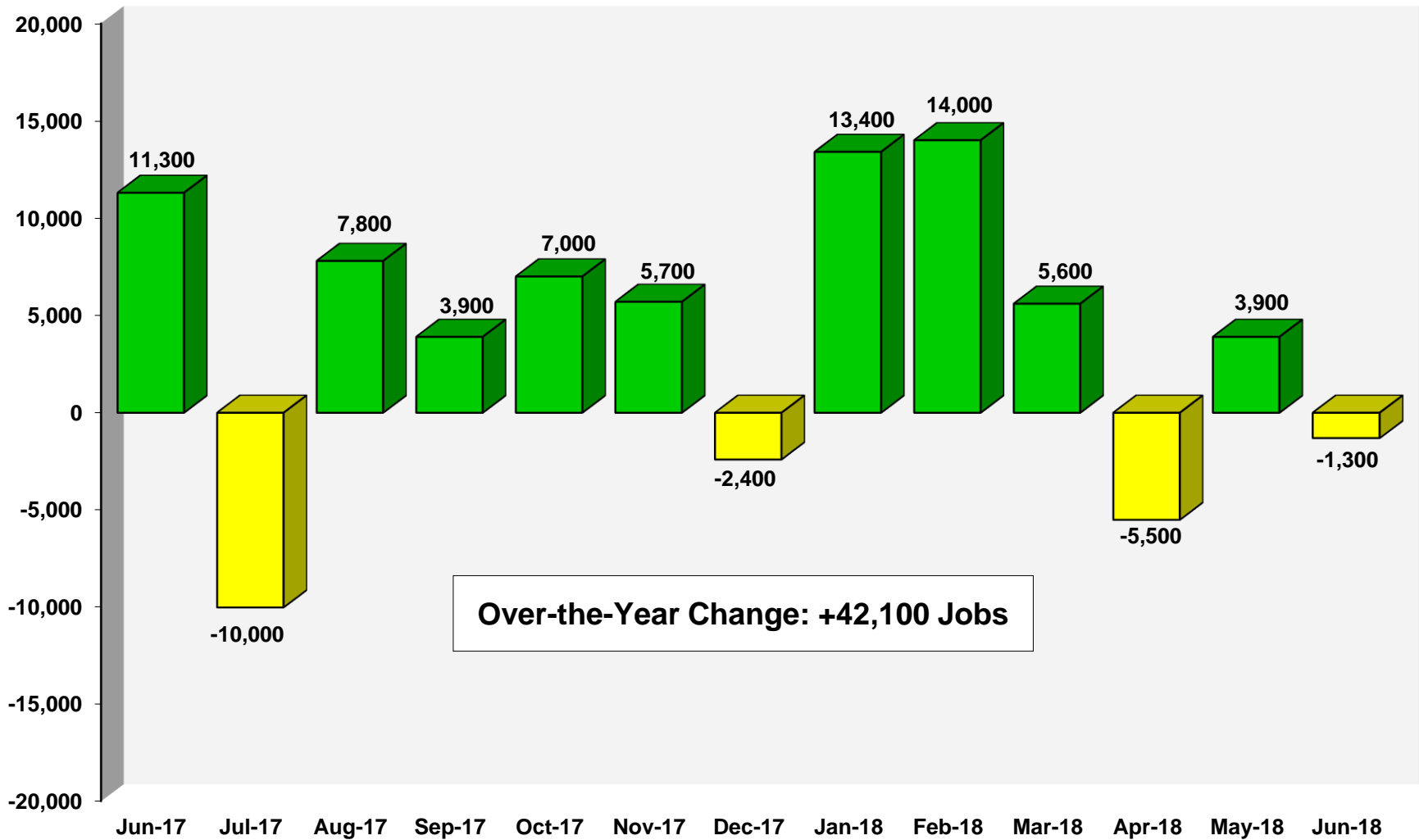
Monthly Total Employment Change New Jersey: June 2017 - June 2018



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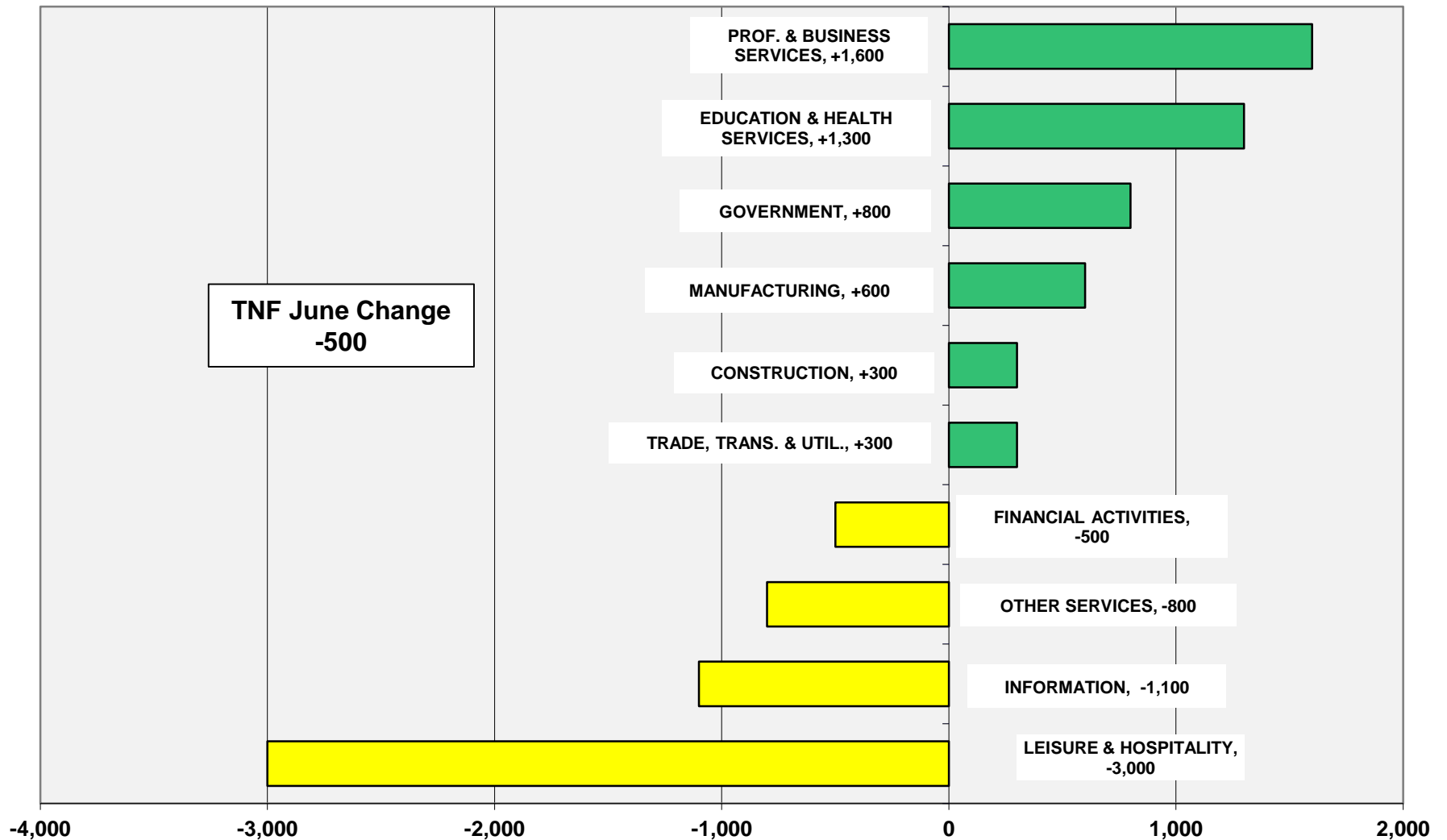
Monthly Private Sector Employment Change June 2017 - June 2018



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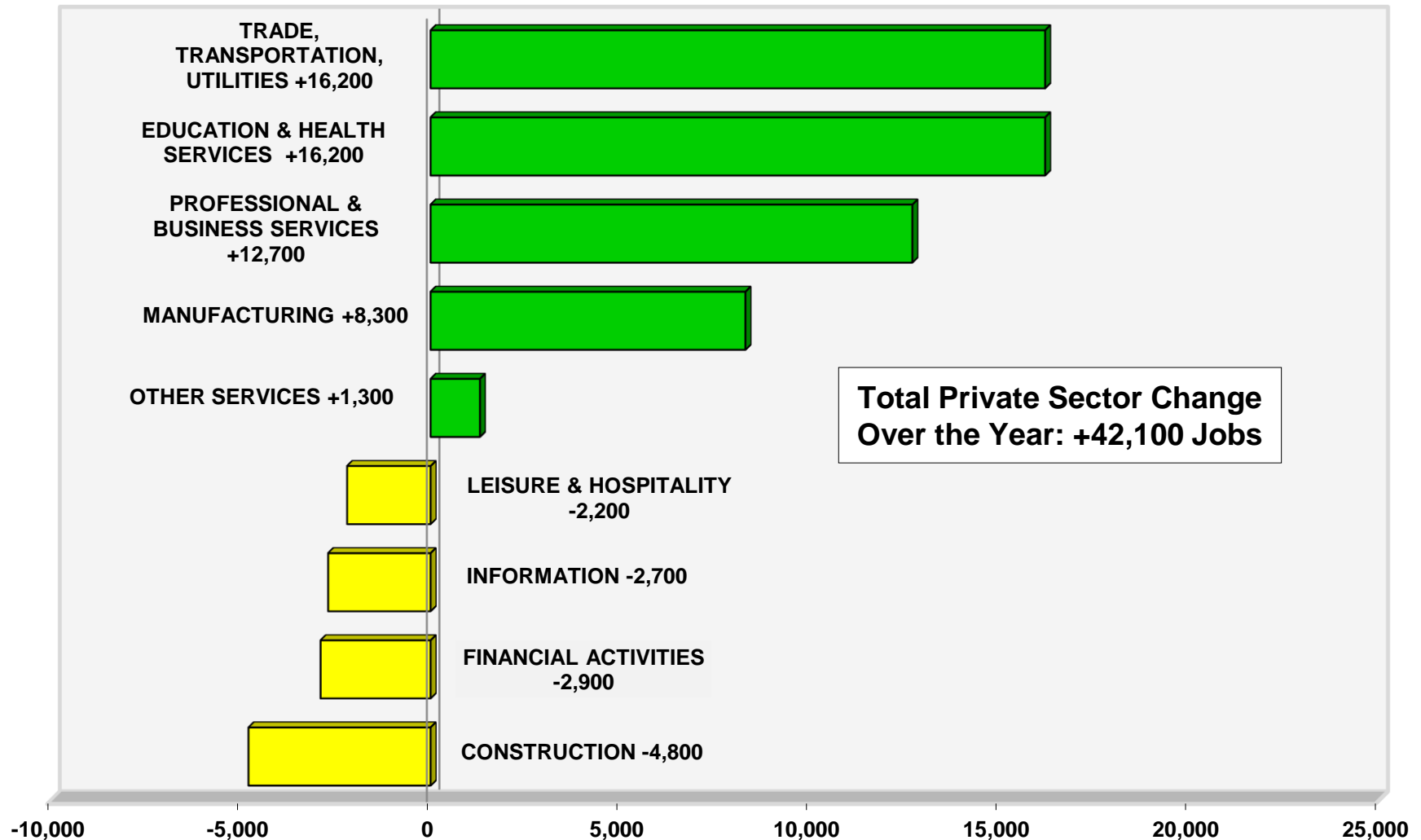

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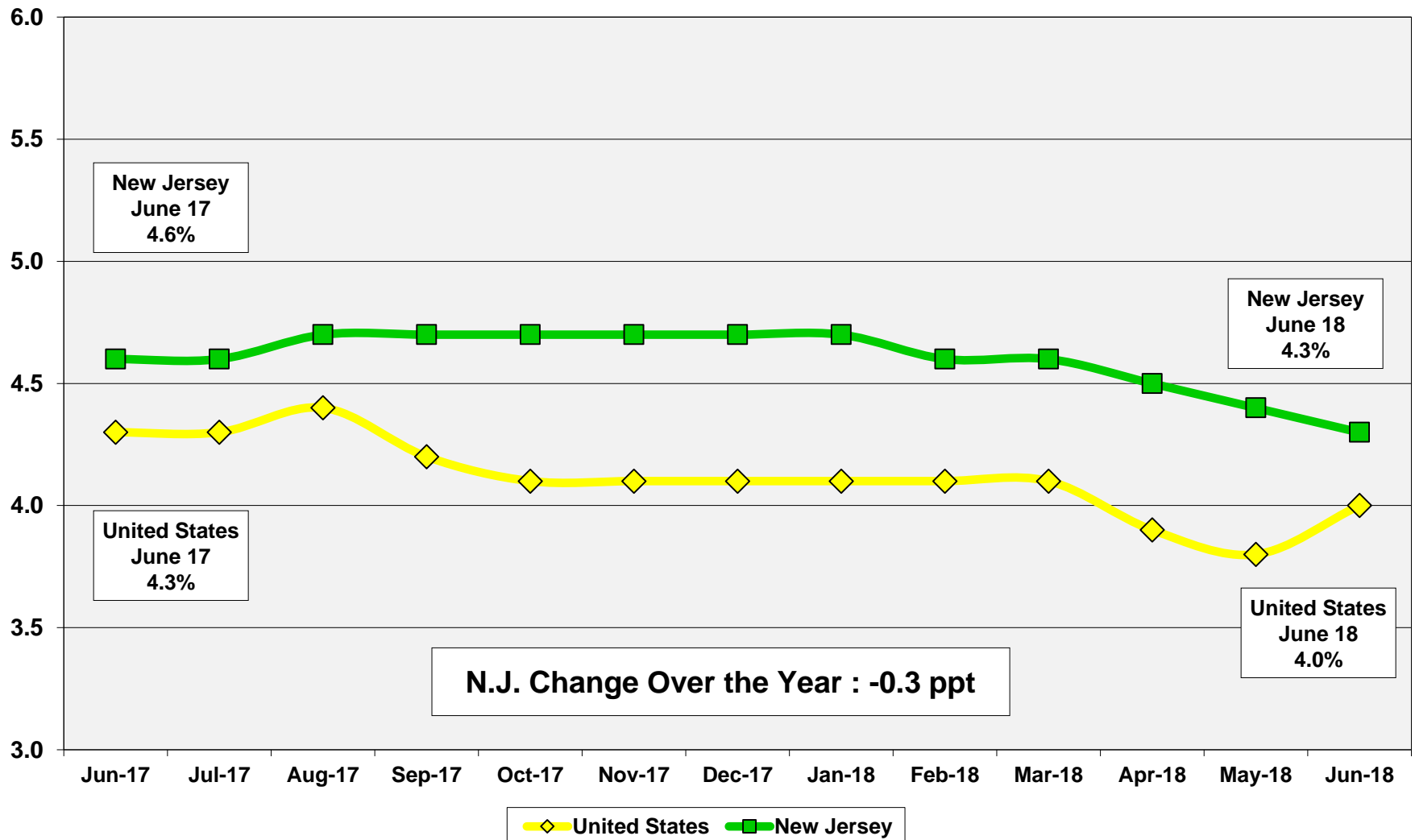
New Jersey Private Sector Employment Change by Industry June 2017 - June 2018



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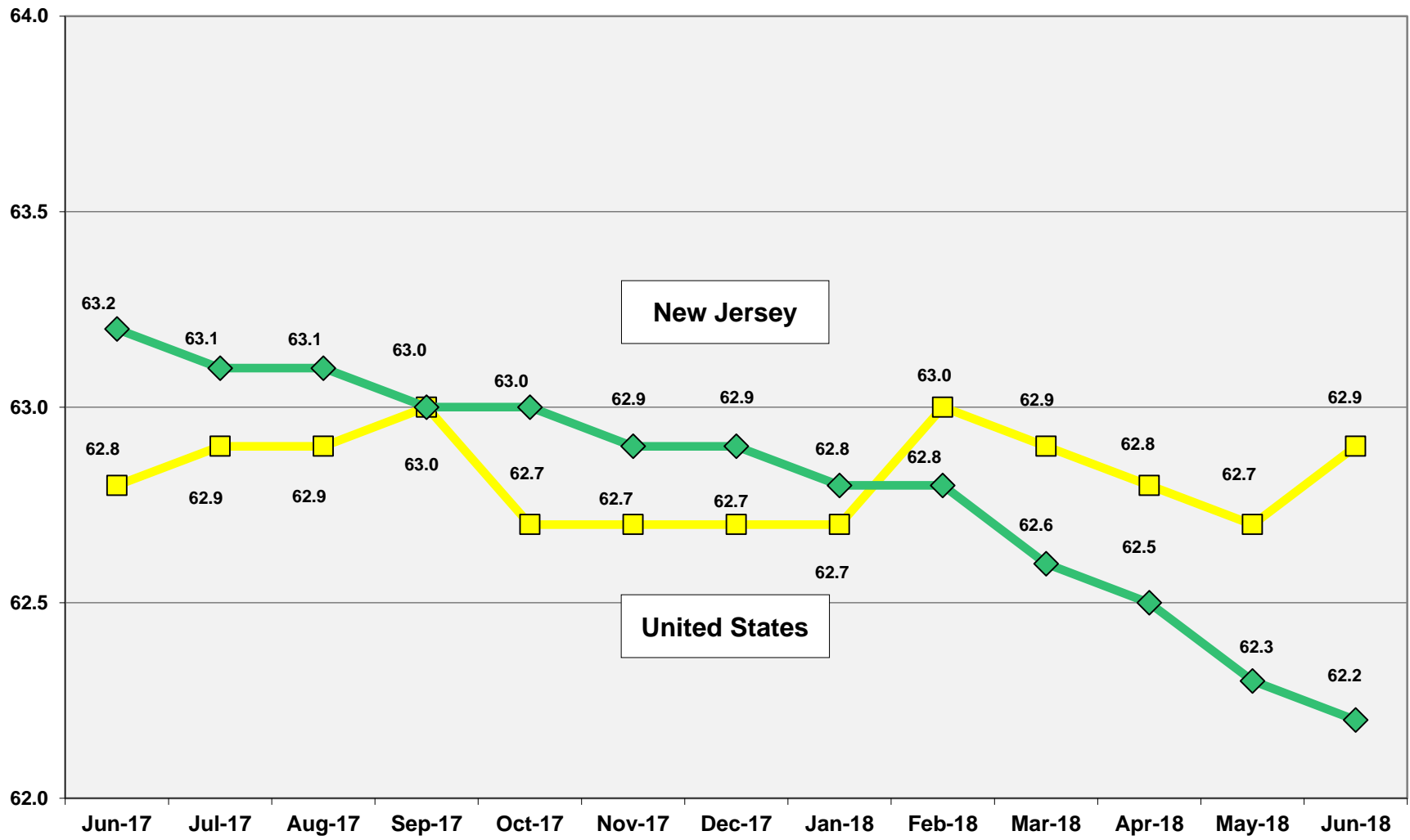
Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States June 2017 - June 2018



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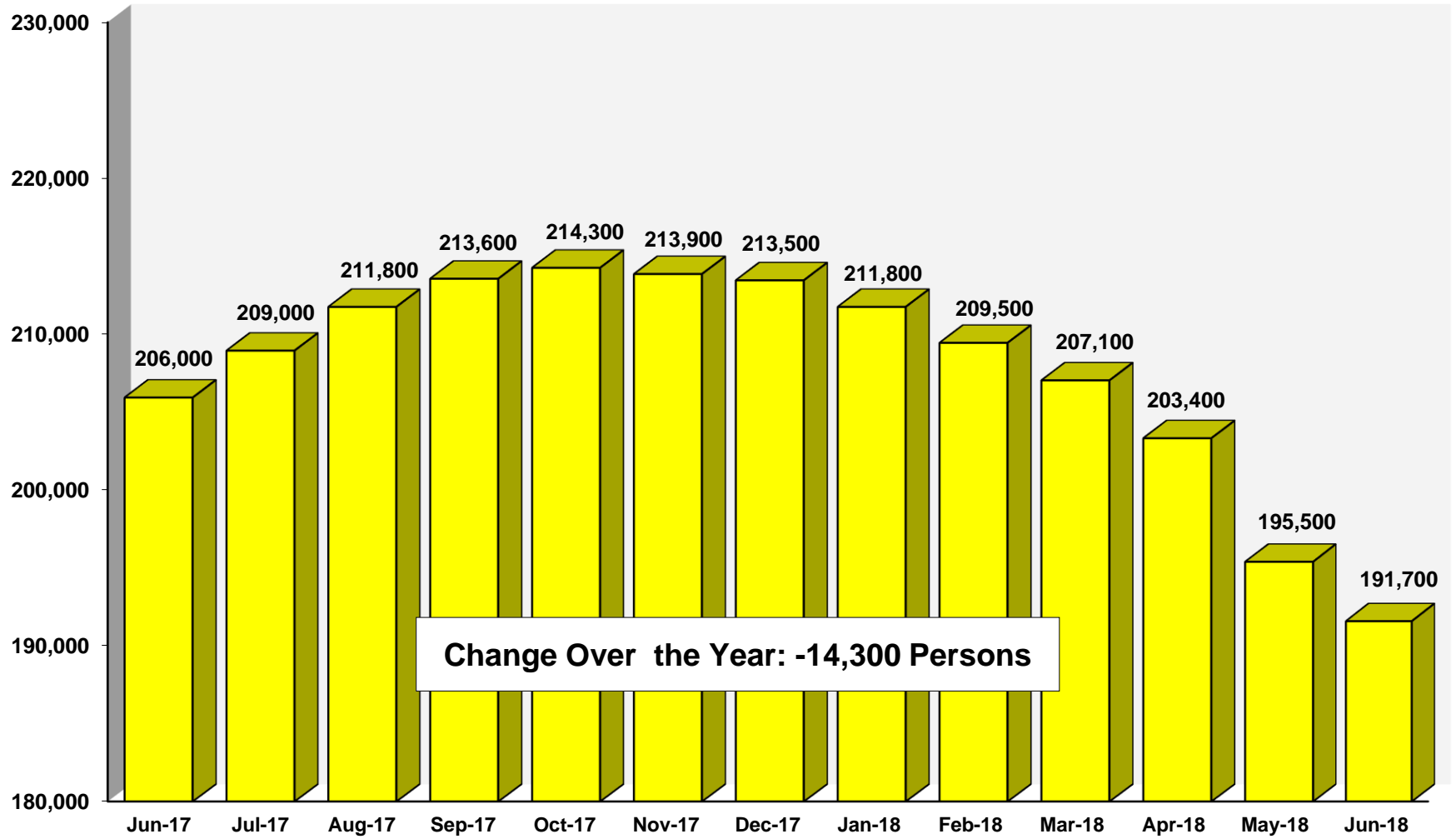
New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: June 2017 - June 2018



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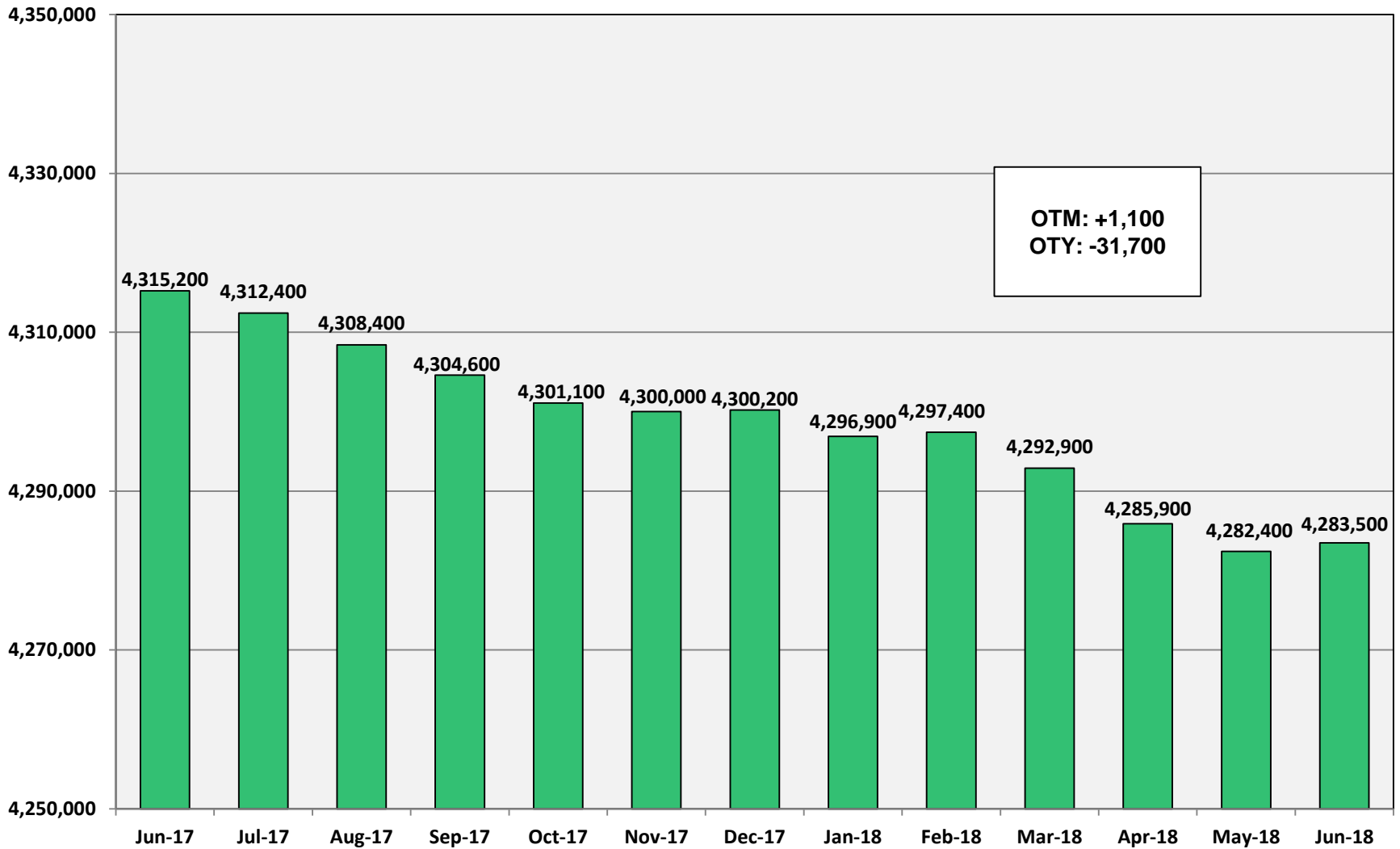
Unemployed New Jersey Residents June 2017 - June 2018



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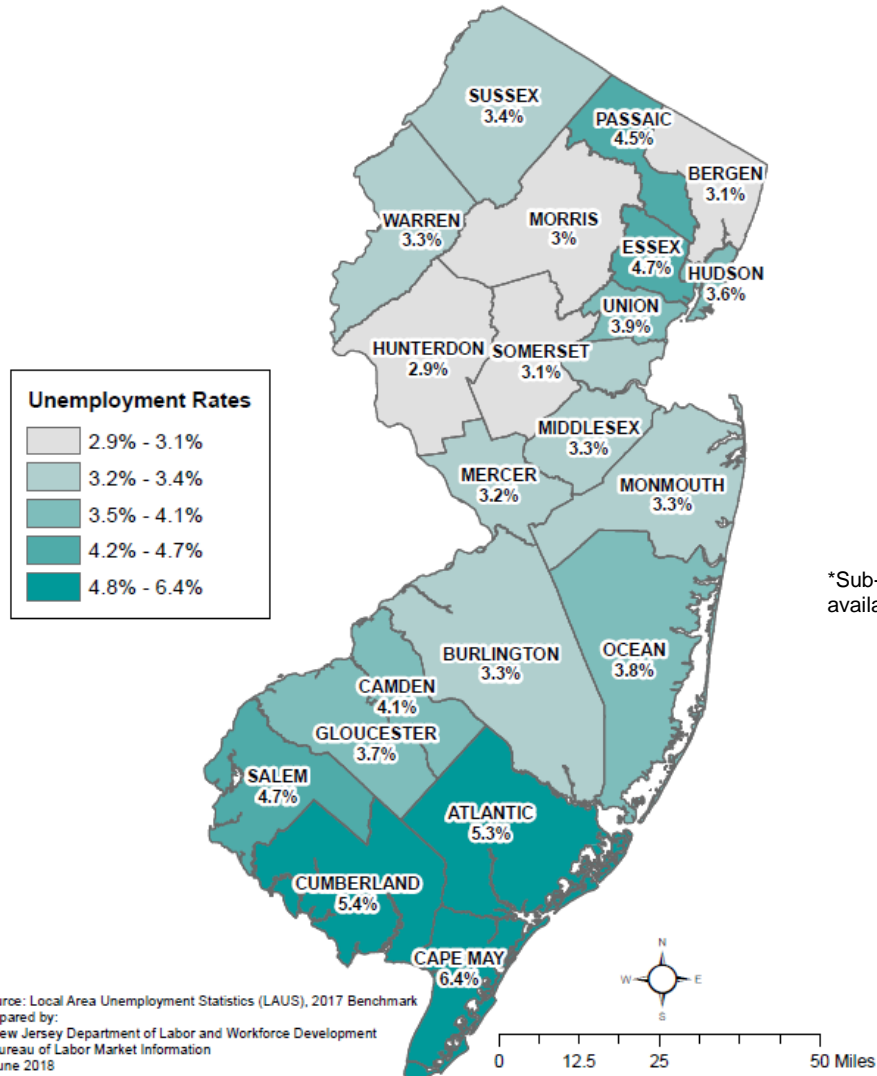
New Jersey Employed Residents: June 2017 - June 2018



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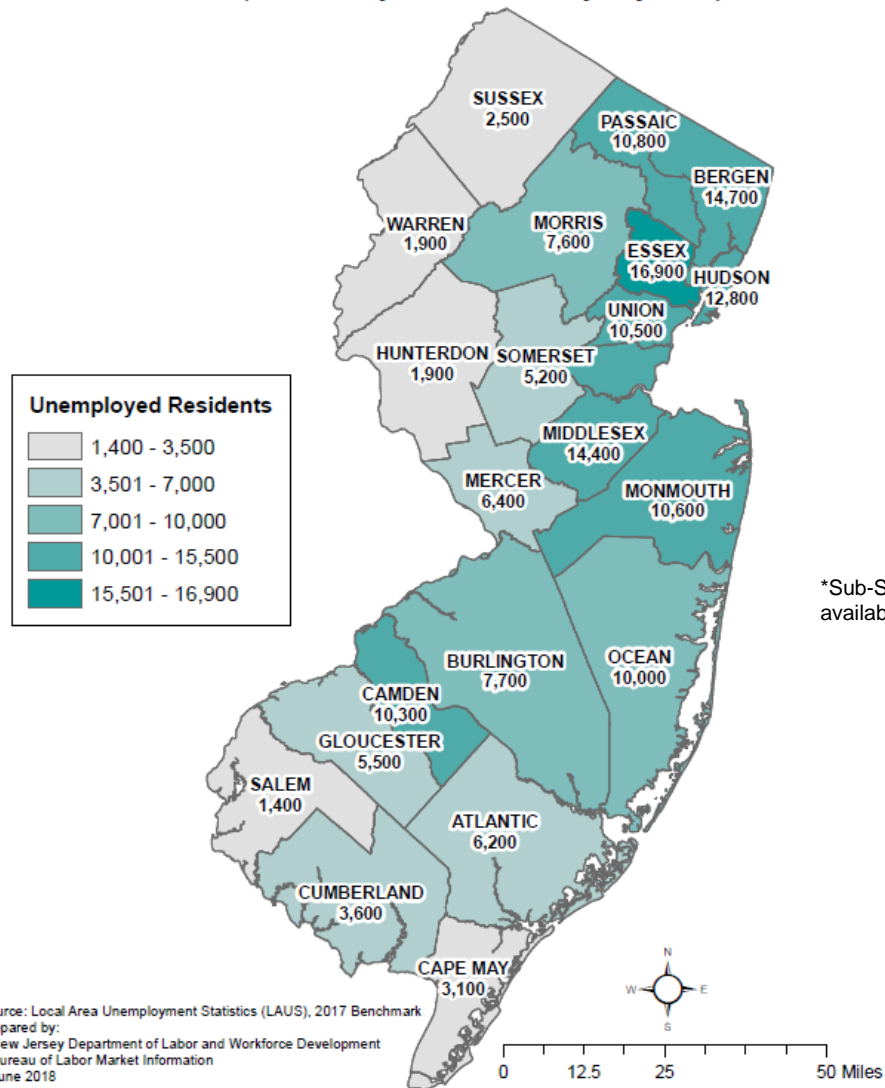
New Jersey Counties Unemployment Rates - May 2018 (Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)



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New Jersey Counties Unemployed Residents - May 2018 (Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)



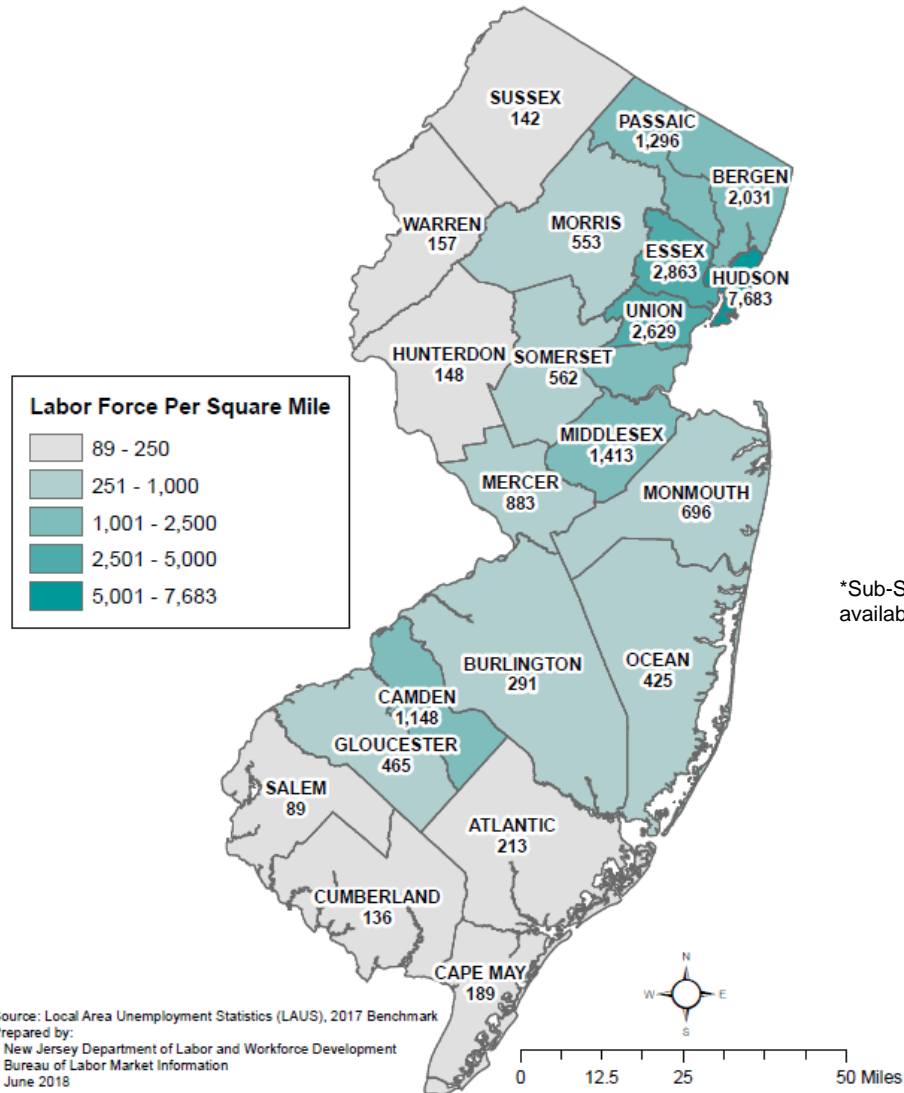

Labor Force Per Square Mile - May 2018

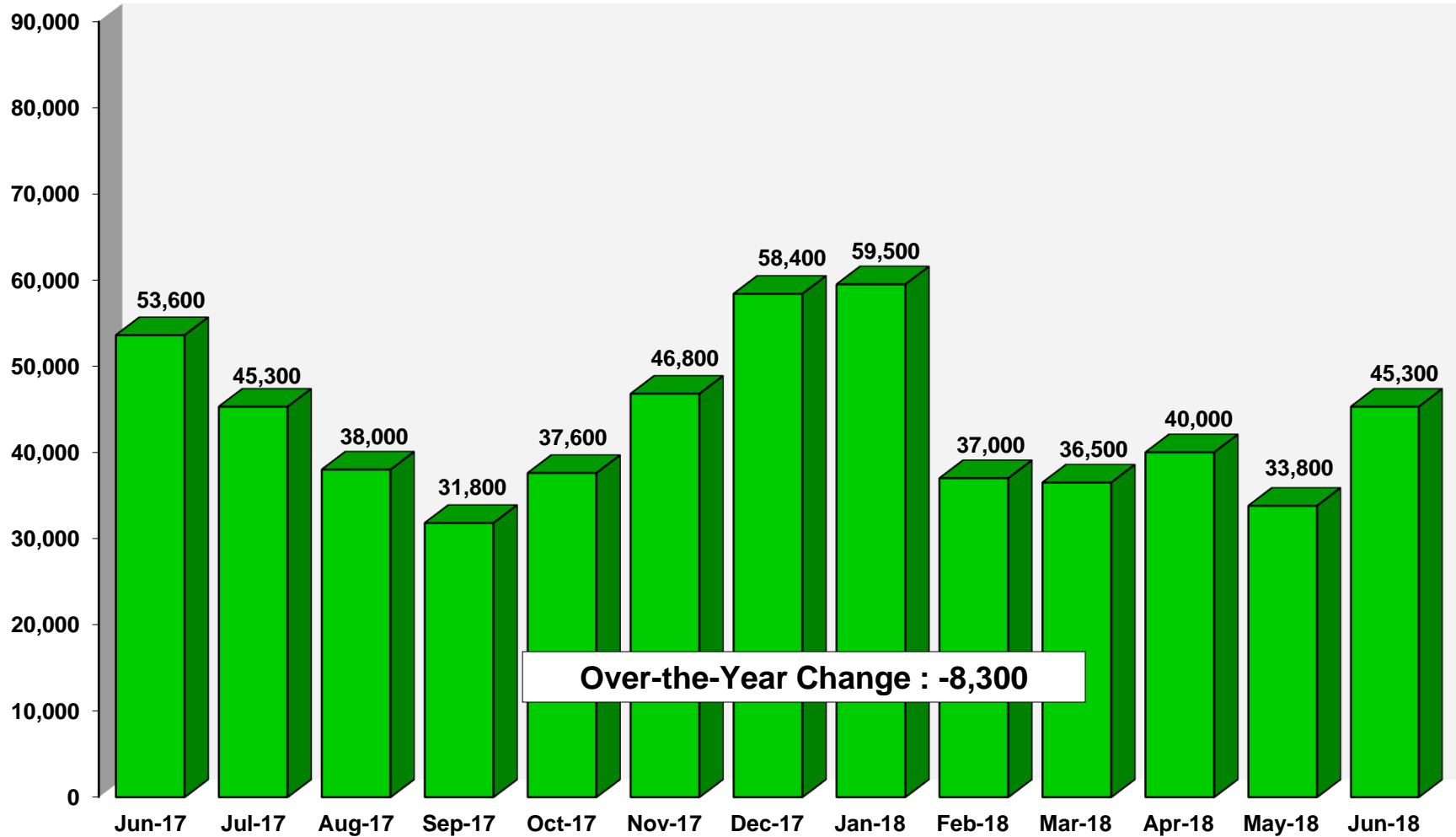
