BY THE DIRECTOR:

Appellant appeals from the action of respondent whereby it denied appellant's application for renewal of her plenary retail consumption license C-594 for the 1967-68 licensing period for premises 702 Springfield Avenue, Newark.

At the date of the hearing on appeal, the parties herein, by their respective attorneys, entered into a stipulation wherein it was agreed that the respondent's action in denying renewal of appellant's license should be reversed provided, however, that appellant consent to transfer forthwith her license to a bona fide purchaser and retain no interest, directly or indirectly, in said license.

Inasmuch as the differences expressed in the appeal appear to have been amicably settled to the satisfaction of the parties hereto, I see no reason why the said stipulation should not be approved by me.

Accordingly, it is, on this 3rd day of August 1967,

ORDERED that the action of respondent in denying renewal of appellant's license be and the same is hereby reversed; and it is further

ORDERED that respondent be directed and ordered to grant such application for renewal of appellant's license with the proviso, however, that the granting of the application shall not thereafter permit any operation under the license by appellant but the renewal thereof shall be solely for the purpose of permitting grant of application for transfer of the 1967-68 license to a bona fide person or persons approved by respondent within thirty days of the date of this order, if the application for transfer is in good order and in the absence of any new issues not raised in this appeal.

BY THE DIRECTOR:

Licensee pleads non vult to a charge alleging that on June 7, 1967 it hindered an investigation then being conducted by an agent of the Division, in violation of R.S. 33:1-35.

Report of investigation discloses that on the date alleged a bottle containing alcoholic beverages apparently not truly labeled, which had been detained as evidence by the investigating agent, was removed from the licensed premises and either hidden or destroyed by an employee of the licensee.

Licensee has a previous record of suspension of license by the Director for thirty-five days effective May 7, 1958 for permitting acceptance of numbers bets, employing bartenders without work permits in violation of municipal ordinance, and failure to have copy of license application on premises, and for sixty days effective June 26, 1967 for permitting acceptance of numbers bets (Re Maxwell Tavern & Grill, Inc., Bulletin 1230, Item 2; Bulletin 1746, Item 5).

The prior record of suspension of license for dissimilar violation in 1958 more than five years ago disregarded, the license will be suspended for ten days (Re Farkas, Bulletin 1727, Item 5; cf. Re Turlinski, Bulletin 1622, Item 4; Re First & Last Chance, Inc., Bulletin 1738, Item 4), to which will be added five days by reason of the record of suspension of license for dissimilar violation in 1967 within the past five years (Re Harris, Bulletin 1739, Item 5), or a total of fifteen days, with remission of five days for the plea entered, leaving a net suspension of ten days.

Absent prior record, the license will be suspended on the first charge for sixty days (Re Talk of the Town, Inc., Bulletin 1614, Item 3; Re Uncle Milty's, Bulletin 1501, Item 5) and on the second charge for five days (Re Rodriguez, Bulletin 1739, Item 3), or a total of sixty-five days, with remission of five days for the plea entered, leaving a net suspension of sixty days.

BY THE DIRECTOR:

It appears from the petition filed herein and the records of this Division that on July 19, 1967, the licensee-petitioner was fined \$100 and \$5 costs in the Passaic Municipal Court after pleading guilty to a charge of sale of alcoholic beverages to a minor on July 3, 1967, in violation of R.S. 33:1-77. The conviction resulted in the automatic suspension of petitioner's license for the balance of its term. R.S. 33:1-31.1. Because of the pendency of this proceeding, the statutory automatic suspension has not been effectuated.

It further appears that disciplinary proceedings are in contemplation but have not yet been instituted by the municipal issuing authority against the licensee because of said sale of alcoholic beverages to the minor. In fairness to petitioner, I conclude that at this time the effect of the automatic suspension should be temporarily stayed. Re Dopart, Bulletin 1733, Item 7.

Licensee pleads non vult to charges (1), (2), (3) and (4) alleging that since November 18, 1958, American Bowling Corp. was the undisclosed real and beneficial owner of the licensed business and the corporate stock of the licensee corporation and, since November 26, 1965, Brunswick Corporation was such undisclosed owner, in violation of R.S. 33:1-25,34 and 52.

During the pendency of this proceeding, the unlawful situation was corrected by transfer of all of the corporate stock to Brunswick Corporation.
