It appears from the petition filed herein and the records of this Division that on December 14, 1965, Julius Jako, president of the licensee-petitioner, was fined \$50 and \$10 costs in the South Amboy Municipal Court after being found guilty of a charge of sale of alcoholic beverages to a minor on October 12, 1965, in violation of R.S. 33:1-77. The conviction resulted in the automatic suspension of the license for the balance of its term. R.S. 33:1-31.1. The suspension has not been effectuated because of the pendency of this proceeding.

It further appears that the municipal issuing authority has suspended the license for thirty days effective February 1, 1966, after the licensee's confessional plea to charges in disciplinary proceedings alleging the same sale to the minor and sale to another minor on another date. 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BY THE DIRECTOR:

Petitioner's criminal record discloses that he was convicted in a neighboring country in 1950, 1951 and 1952 for possession of unlawfully imported goods (smuggling); that on his first conviction he was fined \$100 (or one month in prison), on his second conviction he was fined \$750 (or one year in prison) and on his last conviction he was fined \$500 (or one year in prison).

It further appears that petitioner was convicted in the same country in 1951 and 1952 for failing to stop when ordered to do so by a Peace Officer and was fined \$100 (or one year in prison) and \$400 (or one year in prison), respectively.

On July 31, 1951 petitioner was convicted in another State for assault (third degree) and was fined \$25.

Since a conviction of the crime of smuggling involves the element of moral turpitude, petitioner was thereby rendered ineligible to be engaged in the alcoholic beverage industry in this State. R.S. 33:1-25, 26. In view of this it is unnecessary to determine whether or not petitioner's other convictions, outlined above, involve that element.

At the hearing held herein, petitioner (42 years old) testified that he is married and living with his wife and three children; that for the past ten or eleven years he has lived at his present address; that since 1958 he has been employed in licensed premises as a bartender (three years) and as a manager (five years) and that until recently, when advised by one of two prospective partners with whom he contemplated the purchase of a licensed business, he had no knowledge of his ineligibility for such employment.

Petitioner further testified that he is asking for the removal of his disqualification to be free to engage in the alcoholic beverage industry in this State and that, ever since his convictions in 1952, he has not been convicted of any crime or arrested.

The Police Department of the municipality wherein the petitioner resides reports there are no complaints or investigations presently pending against the petitioner.

Petitioner produced three character witnesses (two automobile salesmen and an operating engineer) who testified that they have known petitioner for more than five years last past and that, in their opinion, he is now an honest, law-abiding person with a good reputation.

The only hesitation I have to grant the relief sought herein is based on the fact that petitioner, although disqualified, worked for a licensee in this State. I am, however, favorably influenced by three factors -- (a) that petitioner's criminal

record shows that he was last convicted of a crime about fourteen years ago, (b) the testimony of his character witnesses and (c) his sworn testimony that he was unaware of his ineligibility to be employed by a licensee in this State. Knowledge of the law, moreover, is not a prerequisite to removal of disqualification in these proceedings. Re Case No. 1738, Bulletin 1510, Item 7.

Considering all of the aforesaid facts and circumstances, I am satisfied that petitioner has conducted himself in a law-abiding manner for five years last past, and that his association with the alcoholic beverage industry in this State will not be contrary to the public interest.

Accordingly, it is, on this 1st day of June 1966,

ORDERED that petitioner's statutory disqualification because of the convictions described herein be and the same is hereby removed, in accordance with the provisions of R.S. 33:1-31.2.


