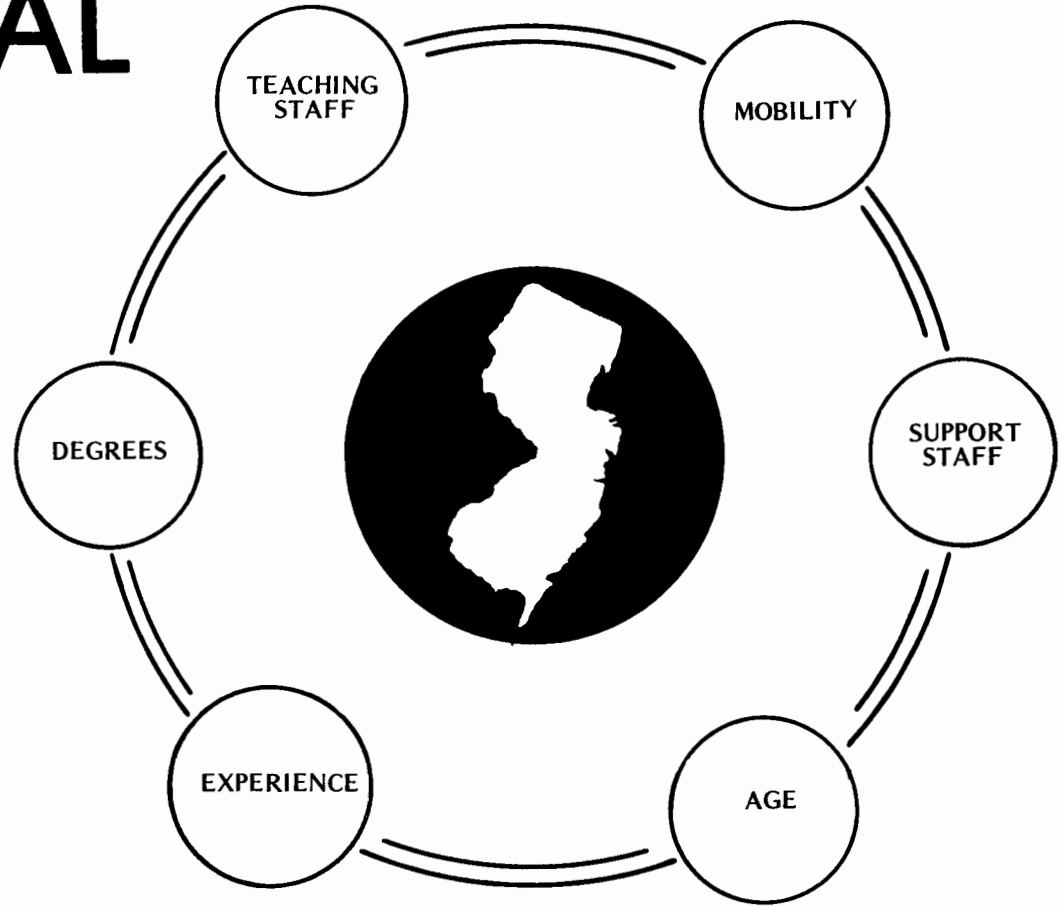

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## PREFACE

The 1981-82 edition of Vital Educational Statistics is the eighth in a series which began in 1974-75. It is the fifth year of a revised series using data derived from re-designed instruments supported by detailed and illustrated instructions. It is also the fourth year the publication has been divided into two volumes. A glossary of terms and definitions was added for the first time in 1979-80.

Volume II contains both certificated and non-certificated staff personnel data. The certificated staff data (Section I) deals with staff employed on a full-time and part-time basis; academic degrees held; certificates held; staff mobility; racial/ethnic composition and sex. Three new tables have been added to the 1981-82 edition of Volume II: (1) Classroom Teachers Employed by Major Position Assignment; (2) Classroom Teacher Separations by Major Position Assignment; (3) Beginning and Reentering Teachers, by Major Position Assignment.

The non-certificated staff data (Section II) consists of the following: the number of staff employed by professional and non-professional classifications; the number employed in the various support service program areas and the racial/ethnic distribution of full-time personnel. Non-certificated staff are those support service personnel who are not required to hold State (educational) certification from the State Board of Examiners.

The data were collected from school districts and reviewed by the county data analysts before transmittal to the State Department of Education. For a comprehensive overview of the condition of education it is recommended that both Volumes I & II be used as a set. Volume I contains school district and school data, including enrollments, dropouts, graduates and facilities data and is a separate publication. Each of the sections contains narrative as well as numbers to accommodate reader and user preferences.

The back cover contains two evaluation forms on which users are invited to send comments or suggestions for improving the utility of the data.

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INTRODUCTION

This introduction presents selected trend data characteristics of the certificated and non-certificated staff employed in the public elementary and secondary schools between 1977-78 and 1981-82. The data will show that the number of certificated staff employed decreased over the five-year period by 2,337 or a decrease of 2.4 percent. Full-time non-certificated staff decreased by 365, a decrease of 0.9 percent for the period.

Changing Profiles of the  
Classroom Teacher

- Between 1977-78 and 1981-82 the number of full-time classroom teachers employed decreased by 3,606. By 1981-82 56 percent of the classroom teachers were employed at the elementary school level and 39 percent were serving the secondary schools. Another five percent of the classroom teachers were serving both elementary and secondary schools from district level positions as itinerant teachers.
- Sixty-five percent of full-time classroom teachers held the bachelor's degree in 1981-82. Thirty-four percent held the master's degree and one percent did not have a degree. There were 332 teachers (.004 percent) with a doctor's degree.
- Professional preparation in the form of advanced degrees increased noticeably during the last five years. Teachers holding the master's degree increased by 10.2 percent and classroom teachers with a doctor's degree increased by 26.7 percent.
- There was no noticeable change in the number of classroom teachers with provisional or emergency certificates. There were 414 classroom teachers with provisional certificates in 1981-82 and there were 405 in 1977-78. Five years ago there were 431 teachers with emergency certificates, and in 1981-82 there were 430. The ratio of teachers with provisional and emergency certificates may increase if the total number of teachers continues to decline and if the teachers with other than regular certificates holds at present levels.
- The median age of the 1981-82 classroom teacher was 37 years, a slight increase from the median of 35 years reported last year.
- The median years of experience of the 1981-82 classroom teacher was 11 years, a slight increase from the median of nine (9) years reported last year.

## CERTIFICATED STAFF INFORMATION

The 20 tables in this section contain data on the certificated staff employed in the public schools of New Jersey on September 30, 1981. The tables are organized to reflect staff employed systemwide by the major position categories: administrators/supervisors; classroom teachers and educational support services personnel. Racial/ethnic data are also provided for the major position categories.

Table I is the basic table in this series. The full-time and part-time certificated staff employed appear in three categories: administrators/supervisors; classroom teachers, and, educational support services personnel. On September 30, 1981 there were 94,703 full-time certificated staff employed in the state. That total was 1,696 fewer than the number reported last year. Decreases were in the following categories: administrators/supervisors 11, classroom teachers 1,319 and educational support services 366.

Of the 3,794 part-time personnel 2,063 or 54.4 percent were classroom teachers; 1,710 or 45.1 percent were support services personnel and 21 were administrators/supervisors.

Table II shows those certificated staff members who are assigned to either the elementary or secondary level and those who serve in systemwide positions. The latter may include administrators, classroom teachers or special educational support services personnel. In some instances the personnel serving systemwide are identified as "itinerants" or personnel "unclassified" in terms of specific school or educational level. There were 10,237 full-time persons serving systemwide in 1981-82. That was an increase of 58 over 1980-81. There were 1,138 certificated staff persons serving in part-time positions at the district level.

Table III takes a look at the certificated staff personnel assigned exclusively to elementary schools. The data show that of the 49,069 certificated staff serving the elementary schools 42,486 (86.6 percent) are classroom teachers, 4,257 (8.7 percent) are educational support services personnel, and 2,326 (4.7 percent) are administrators or supervisors.

Compared to last year, there was a decrease of 309 educational support services personnel serving elementary schools. There was a decrease of twenty-six (26) administrators or supervisors and a decrease of 596 classroom teachers.

Of the 2,066 elementary school part-time staff, 1,226 or 59.3 percent were classroom teachers; 830 or 40.2 percent were educational support services personnel and ten (10) were administrators or supervisory personnel.

Table IV reflects full-time certificated staff personnel assigned exclusively to the secondary schools. The data show that of the 35,397 certificated staff serving secondary schools, 28,969 (81.8 percent) are classroom teachers, 3,833 (10.8 percent) are educational support services personnel, and, 2,595 (7.3 percent) are administrators or supervisors.

Compared to last year there was a decrease of 86 educational support services personnel serving secondary schools, a decrease of 39 administrators or supervisors, and, a decrease of 698 classroom teachers.

Of the 590 part-time secondary school staff, 420 or 71.2 percent were classroom teachers; 166 or 28.1 percent were educational support services personnel and four (4) were administrators/supervisory personnel.

Table V is the first of three (3) tables dealing with the degree and certificate status of the three major certificated staff categories used in this publication. Each of the three categories: administrators/supervisors, classroom teachers and educational support personnel are also reported by sex.

Approximately 80.1 percent of all administrators and supervisors are male and 19.9 percent are female, however, between 1980-81 and 1981-82 the number of female administrators/supervisors increased by 32. Male administrators/supervisors decreased during the same period (1980-81 and 1981-82) by 43.

Approximately 84.9 percent of the administrators or supervisors held the master's degree and 9.0 percent were holders of a doctor's degree. Doctor's degree holders were up over last year whereas the holders of the bachelor's degree dropped from 384 to 349, a drop of nine (9) percent.

"Regular" certificates were held by 99 percent of the administrators and supervisors in their first or major assignment.

In terms of numbers and percentages, the degree status of administrators and supervisors improved over last year.

Table VI repeats the data elements contained in the previous table, however, the data relate to classroom teachers. This year again, an improvement is reported in the degree and certificate status of classroom teachers. Of the classroom teachers, 25,425 (33.8 percent) held the master's degree and 332 (0.4 percent) held the doctor's degree. Both of those categories were up compared to last year. Compared to last year there was a decline in the number of classroom teachers without a degree. Teachers without degrees are primarily those serving in areas where experience, in lieu of formal education, is one of the qualifying prerequisites to employment.

The number of classroom teachers reported as having no certificate in the first or major assignment decreased from 318 in 1980-81 to 225 in 1981-82.

Approximately 64.8 percent of the classroom teachers are female and 35.2 percent are male. Compared to last year there was a decrease of 760 male classroom teachers and a decrease of 559 female teachers.

Table VII is the last of the series reporting on the degree and certificate status of certificated personnel. The special educational support services group described in this table includes such titles as librarian, nurse, psychologist, counselor, remedial instructor, etc.

For the first time in over a decade the educational support services category showed a decrease in full-time personnel employed. The decrease of 366 occurred between 1980-81 and the fall of 1981. There was no significant change in the ratio of personnel employed by gender.

Table VIII is the first of three tables reporting on the racial/ethnic composition of certificated staff. Of the administrators and supervisors serving full-time, 6,465 (90.4 percent) were White, 618 (8.6 percent) were Black and 62 (0.9 percent) were Hispanic. Compared to last year there was an increase of 0.2 percent in "minority" administrators/supervisors.

Table IX reports on the racial/ethnic distribution of classroom teachers. Of the 75,231 classroom teachers employed full-time 66,826 (88.8 percent) were White, 7,018 (9.3 percent) were Black, 1,154 (1.5 percent) were Hispanic, 209 (0.3 percent) were Asian or Pacific Islander and 24 were American Indian or Alaskan Native. Compared to last year there was an increase of 0.2 percent in the group classified as "minority."

Table X is the last of three tables reporting on the racial/ethnic characteristics of certificated staff. In this table, the educational support services group is reported by racial/ethnic categories: 11,079 (89.9 percent) were White, 1,044 (8.5 percent) Black, 155 (1.3 percent) were Hispanic and there were 44 full-time personnel in the two remaining categories. The minority group is 10.1 percent of the total. Compared to last year there was a decrease of 0.1 percent in the number of educational support services personnel employed.

Table XI is the first of three tables containing age distributions for certificated staff personnel. Of the 7,150 administrator/supervisor group, 2,103 (29.4 percent) were in the 42-49 age group. Eighty-three (1.2 percent) were in the "66 and over" category and 6 (0.1 percent) were in the 18-25 category. The median age of the administrator/supervisory group was 47 years.

Table XII shows that of the 75,231 classroom teachers, 22,597 (30.3 percent) were in the 26-33 age group. In the "66 and over" age group there were 376 (0.5 percent) classroom teachers, and 4,234 (5.6 percent) were reported in the 18 to 25 age group. The median age of classroom teachers was approximately 37 years.

Table XIII is the last of three tables containing the age distributions of certificated staff. Of the 12,322 educational support services staff, 3,021 (24.5 percent) were in the 34-41 age group. There were 135 staff in the "66 and over" age group and 319 (2.6 percent) in the 18 to 25 age group. The median age of the educational support services staff was approximately 43 years.

Table XIV is the first of three tables containing experience distributions for full-time certificated staff personnel. Of the 7,150 administrator/supervisor group, 1,655 had 20 to 24 years of total experience. There were 1,532 (21.4 percent) administrators/supervisors in the 15 to 19 experience group. Nine (9) administrators/supervisors had less than one (1) year of experience. Twelve had 45 or more years of experience. The median years of experience reported for the administrator/supervisor group was 20 years.

Table XV shows that of 75,231 classroom teachers, 19,056 (25.3 percent) had 10 to 14 years of experience, and 18,512 (24.6 percent) had 5 to 9 years of experience. Seventeen (17) of the classroom teachers had 45 or more years of experience, and 1,940 (2.6 percent) had less than one year of experience. The median years of experience for classroom teachers was eleven (11) years.

Table XVI is the last of three tables containing the employment experience distributions of certificated personnel. Of the 12,322 educational support services personnel 2,897 (23.5 percent) reported 10 to 14 years of experience, and, 2,744 (22.3 percent) reported 5 to 9 years of experience. Eight educational support services personnel had 45 or more years of experience, and, 245 (1.9 percent) reported less than one (1) year of experience. The median years of experience for educational support services personnel was twelve (12) years.

Table XVII summarizes the mobility characteristics of full-time certificated staff including the three major categories: administrators and supervisors, classroom teachers, and special educational support services personnel. Statewide the data again show more certificated staff "leaving" than "entering".

The terms "entering" and "leaving" are a composite of approximately 21 coded explanations (reasons) supplied to respondents to facilitate identification of sources of staff supply, and, the destination of those who either transfer from school to school, resign, retire, or accept employment in non-teaching positions, etc.

Statewide, the mobility rates for 1980-81 exceeded the average of those rates for the last five years, with two exceptions: the entering rate for administrators/supervisors was identical with the average (for its group) over the last five years. The entering rate for educational support services staff, showed a dramatic decrease from its average for the past five years. The support service group also registered the lowest entering rate (for its group) for the five year period 1977-78 to 1981-82.

The statewide "entering" rate for all certificated staff was 14.8 (approximately 15 full-time staff per 100 employed). Nine counties exceeded that rate. The statewide "leaving" rate was 16.5 per 100 staff employed. Nine counties also exceeded that rate.

The certificated staff "entering" rates exceeded the "leaving" rates in two counties: Ocean and Sussex. Hunterdon County had the lowest mobility rate for certificated staff "leaving" as well as those "entering".

Table XVIII: of the 75,231 full-time classroom teachers employed, 37 percent were elementary teachers and 63 percent were in fields needing specialized instructional certificate endorsements.

Forty-four percent of all full-time teachers were employed in six specific fields:

Fifteen percent of the full-time classroom teachers employed were divided among the following positions: music, industrial arts, foreign languages, art and business.

Four percent of the full-time classroom teachers were employed as vocational or home economics teachers.

Table XIX: seventy-three percent of the "beginning" and "reentering" teachers (employed in 1981-82), were either elementary teachers (23 percent) or teachers in the following specific fields:

Teachers in the remaining disciplines who were "beginning" teachers or who were "reentering" teaching in 1981-82, were as follows:

1. twelve percent were divided among the social studies, music and the vocational subject area,
2. nine percent were reported among the foreign languages, industrial arts and the business disciplines, and,
3. four percent of the "beginners" and returnees" were home economics or art teachers.

The "beginning" and "reentering" teachers are approximately 31 percent of the total classroom teachers new to their positions for 1981-82. The total of all classroom teachers "entering" appears in Table XVII, column (4).

Table XX: shows that 4,884 teachers were separated from classroom duties during the school year 1980-81 and the summer of 1981. That number (4,884) was 39 percent of the classroom teachers "leaving". (see Table XVII, column 5 for total number "leaving").

Seventy-seven percent of the full-time teachers separated from classroom duties during the 1980-81 school year and the summer of 1981, were either elementary teachers (30 percent) or teachers employed in the following fields:

Eighteen percent of the classroom teachers separated (1980-81) were divided among art, business, foreign languages, industrial arts, vocational education, home economics and permanent secondary substitute teacher positions.

Four percent of the separations were full-time classroom teachers employed in music positions.

## **SECTION II**

# **NON-CERTIFICATED STAFF INFORMATION**

## NON-CERTIFICATED STAFF

This section contains three (3) tables reporting data on non-certificated staff personnel. The tables report data by support service program areas, the number of professional and non-professional personnel, the racial/ethnic distribution of full-time (non-certificated) staff, and the full-time equivalent (FTE) of all non-certificated support services personnel.

Table XXI shows that of the 42,051 full-time non-certificated support services personnel the majority (40,959.7) were reported in the non-professional category. There were 1,091.3 professionals in the non-certificated support services group.

Of the eight (8) support services program areas, business services accounted for 24,703 (58.7 percent) of the non-certificated support personnel. School administration and instructional services combined, accounted for 26 percent of all non-certificated support personnel.

Table XXII is a racial/ethnic distribution of full-time non-certificated support services personnel. Of the total number of full-time non-certificated support staff, 18.7 percent were "minority". Of the non-certificated group 6,723.5 (16.0 percent) were Black, 1,029 (2.4 percent) were Hispanic and there were 108 personnel in the two remaining categories.

Of the total number of full-time non-certificated support staff, 26,830 (63.8 percent) were female and 15,215 (36.2 percent) were male.

Table XXIII is a composite of the full-time equivalent of all non-certificated support services personnel. Column ten (10) shows that of the 48,445.1 full-time equivalent staff 58.5 percent were assigned to business services, 14.8 percent to instructional services and 10.6 percent to school administration. The remainder were reported in general administration, pupil services, community services and "other". The full-time equivalent of part-time non-certificated staff at the time of the report was 6,394.1.

## Glossary

Assignment: The specific group of activities for which a staff member has been given responsibility.

Attendance and Social Work Services: Includes non-certificated personnel who direct and manage; attendance services; pupil accounting services; social work services, etc.

Board of Education Personnel: Includes personnel employed in directing and managing the general operation of the board of education; board secretary; custodian of funds; election services; legal services; audit services, etc.

Business or Secretarial School: A non-degree granting, post-secondary institution offering courses of varying length in preparation for technical business occupations.

Certificate: The legal document giving authorization, from the New Jersey State Board of Examiners, to perform the services to which the person is assigned.

College (four year): A post-secondary institution offering a four year curriculum and empowered to confer a Bachelor's degree.

College (two year): A post-secondary institution offering a two year curriculum and empowered to confer an Associate's degree.

Data Processing Services: Directing and managing; programming services; machine operation services; data processing systems analysis, etc.

Degree: A title conferred by an approved college or university as official recognition for the completion of a course of study. (Only the highest degree conferred should be used in this report.)

Direction and Management of Personnel: Includes non-certificated personnel in planning, research, development, evaluation, information, staff, statistical and data processing services.

Directing and Managing Personnel: Includes non-certificated personnel engaged in purchasing, paying, transporting, exchanging, and maintaining goods and services for the local education agency.

Educational Media Services: Includes directing and managing; school library services; audio-visual services; educational television; computer-assisted instruction, etc.

Employment: Working full-time or part-time in one of the following categories cited in the Dictionary of Occupational Titles: Professional, Technical or Managerial; Clerical-Sales; Service; Farming, Fishing, Forestry and Related; Processing; Machine Trades; Bench Work; Structural; Miscellaneous.

Entering: The source from which a staff member new to the school or district was recruited.

Executive Administration Personnel: Includes personnel involved in staff relations and negotiation services; state and federal relations, and the secretarial or clerical staff, etc.

Experience: Whole years of professional, educational employment (excluding current year) in a public school, college or university.

Facilities - Acquisition and Construction: Includes directing and managing; land acquisition and development services; architectural and engineering services; educational specifications development; building acquisition; construction and improvement, etc.

Fiscal Services: Includes direction and managing; budgeting services; receiving and disbursing funds, payroll services; financial accounting; internal auditing; property account, bookkeepers and accountants, etc.

Food Services: Includes directing and management; food preparation and dispensing; food delivery and cafeteria and food service workers, etc.

Full-Time: The period of time in each day required for full-time certificated staff employment shall be the number of hours prescribed by the local board of education, but shall be not less than (4) clock hours.

Full-Time Equivalent: The amount of time for a less-than-full-time activity divided by the amount of time normally required for a corresponding full-time activity.

Guidance Services: Includes directing and managing and non-certificated counseling services; pupil appraisal services; information about vocational opportunities; pupil records; placement services, etc.

Health Services: Includes medical inspector; dental services; nursing services; screening for vision; hearing deficiencies, etc.

Improvement of Instruction: Includes personnel who direct and manage (non-certificated) staff training services; assist with instruction and curriculum development, etc.

Information Services: Directing and managing; internal information; public information; management information.

Instructional Aides: Persons performing a variety of non-instructional duties in the classroom with such things as setting up activities and assisting individual children.

Internal Services: Includes directing and managing; purchasing, warehousing, and distribution; printing and duplicating; publishing, etc.

Leaving: The reason for which a staff member left employment in the school or district.

Maintenance Services: Directing and managing; personnel who repair buildings and equipment and service the replacement of existing equipment; carpenters, plumbers, etc.

Non-Professional: Non-certificated personnel other than professionals. In many instances, the dividing point between the two is simply the amount of education required for the assignment. Broad general categories here will include: technicians, clerical employees, crafts and trades employees, vehicle operators and laborers.

Office of the Principal: Non-certificated staff providing support in the principal and assistant principal's office. This includes all clerical activities.

Operation of Plant Services: Directing and managing personnel care and upkeep of buildings; care and upkeep of grounds; care and upkeep of equipment. This includes custodians or building service workers and security services.

Part-Time: A certificated staff member whose total current assignments require less than his or her full-time services. A part-time staff member may be employed full-time for part of the school or academic year or part-time for part or all of the school or academic year.

Planning, Research and Evaluation: Directing and managing; development services; evaluation services; planning services; research services.

Professional: A person whose assignments require a high degree of knowledge and skills acquired through at least a Bachelor's degree (or its equivalent), but not requiring skills in the field of education. Some examples of non-certificated professionals are such school board employees as: accountants, architects, auditors, dietitians/nutritionists, engineers, attorneys, medical personnel, planners and researchers/statisticians.

Psychological Services: Planning and managing psychological services (if non-certificated) psychological testing services, etc.

Pupil Transportation Services: Service area direction; vehicle operation (drivers) monitoring

services; vehicle servicing maintenance.

Racial/Ethnic Groups: A staff member may be included in the group to which he or she appears to belong, identifies with, or is regarded in the community as belonging to. However, no person should be counted in more than one racial/ethnic category. The categories are: White, Not Hispanic Origin, Black, Not of Hispanic Origin, Hispanic, American Indian or Alaskan Native and Asian or Pacific Islander.

Rate: The total hourly, daily, weekly or monthly wage, to be paid for services rendered.

Residential Housing Services: Administrative personnel services by students or staff.

Salary: The total amount, specified by contract, to be paid for services rendered.

School Year: The "school year" begins on July 1 and ends on June 30.

Social Security Number: The unique identification number assigned to a person by the Social Security Administration.

Speech Correction and Audiology Personnel: Includes directing and managing and other personnel assisting in identification and appraisal of speech and hearing disorders.

Staff Services: Directing and managing; recruitment and placement; staff accounting in-service education; health services, etc.

Statistical Services: Directing and managing; statistical analysis service; statistical reporting, etc.
