





























#### New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: September 2017 - September 2018




### **Unemployed New Jersey Residents September 2017 - September 2018**







#### New Jersey Counties Unemployment Rates - August 2018

(Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)




#### New Jersey Counties Unemployed Residents - August 2018






#### New Jersey Counties Labor Force Per Square Mile - August 2018
