BY THE NUMBERS: BELMAR RECOVERY SINCE SANDY

\$23,113,253

FEMA has obligated over *\$23.1 million* in federal funds through the Public Assistance program to Belmar (and other municipal entities) for eligible debris removal, emergency services and rebuilding activities.

\$15,936,226	Belmar residents and businesses have received approximately <i>\$15.9 million</i> in payouts from the National Flood Insurance Program.
\$5,090,000	Belmar residents have received approximately <i>\$5.09 million</i> in FEMA Individual Assistance, which includes repair costs, replacement costs, rental assistance and other needs assistance.
\$4,480,000	Belmar has received <i>\$4.48 million</i> through the FEMA Community Disaster Loan (CDL) program.
\$2,200,000	The Federal Highway Administration has identified roadway projects in Belmar worth approximately <i>\$2.2 million</i> .
\$1,616,000	4 Belmar homeowners signed RREM program grants totaling <i>\$516,786</i> . Approximately 111 Belmar residents received Resettlement grants totaling <i>\$1.1 million</i> .
\$152,000	EDA Stronger NJ Business Grant has approved 7 grants to Belmar business worth \$152,637.
