CHANGES TO SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS FOR ELECTRONIC FILING THROUGH JEFIS IN FORECLOSURE AND SPECIAL CIVIL PART MATTERS

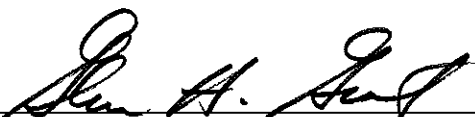
The New Jersey Judiciary's Electronic Filing and Imaging System (JEFIS) allows registered attorneys to transmit documents electronically to the Judiciary. To safeguard the integrity of that transmission process, the Judiciary periodically enhances its JEFIS-related information security measures. This notice is to advise that, in order to support the enhanced security measures, the system requirements for any computer used for JEFIS electronic filing will change effective October 5, 2015.

As of that date, an attorney seeking to file documents electronically through JEFIS must use a computer that meets the following set of minimum system platform requirements:

1. Windows Vista or Higher (Preferably Windows 7), and
2. .NET Framework 4.5.2

Computers that operate on a lesser platform after that date will not be able to launch the JEFIS application and thus will not be able to electronically file through JEFIS.
