## Reopening of A&P of Ortley Beach Provides Valuable Store Space for The Salvation Army's Continued Outreach to Families Struggling to Rebuild

To receive assistance, families must provide either their FEMA number or proof of residency in an effected area.

"The Salvation Army is honored to be able to continue to serve the residents of Ocean County who were affected by Superstorm Sandy through our facility in Ortley Beach in addition to our Community Center in Toms River," said Bramwell Applin, the Salvation Army New Jersey's community relations manager. "It is our hope that in partnering with the A&P Family of Supermarkets, the residents of this area can rebuild not only their lives, but also rebuild a community."

A&P's 50,014-square-foot Ortley Beach store suffered significant damage from Superstorm Sandy. Repairs included repainting, new flooring, replacing fixtures and cases, and clearing aisles.

"As a member of the Ortley Beach community for the last 26 years, we are proud to welcome our neighbors back to our newly remodeled store, and we're glad that we were able to assist by donating space to the Salvation Army," said Sam Martin, A&P's president and CEO.
