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DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS AUGUST 2015

Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

WFNJ/TANF

- As of the end of August, the TANF caseload had decreased by 6,421 cases, from 33,606 in August 2014 to 27,185 in August 2015, a decrease of 19.1%.
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since August 2014 were Warren (-49.2%), Salem (-36.5%), and Gloucester (-31.8%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 6,877 or 25.3% were child-only in August 2015.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,013), Camden (967), and Hudson (772).
- Essex (13,792), Passaic (8,314), Hudson (7,879), Camden (7,328), and Atlantic (4,990) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in August 2015.

NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)

- In August 2015, there were 445,620 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 6,597, or 1.5%, since August 2014.
- There were 885,828 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of August 2015, a decrease of 16,124 or 1.8% since August 2014.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since August 2014 are Cape May (9.0%), Atlantic (4.5%), and Bergen (3.9%).

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

- There were 4,680 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in August 2015, a decrease of 1,688 or 26.5% since August 2014.
- In August 2015, EA payments were made for 1,361 SSI recipients.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

GA Emergency Assistance

- There were 4,093 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in August 2015, a decrease of 1,225 or 23.0% since August 2014.
- The two counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Passaic (14.9%) and Camden (10.9%).

GA Program

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 30,738 to 24,130 since August 2014, a decrease of 21.5%.
- There were 13,548 Employable GA and 10,582 Unemployable GA cases in August 2015.
- Atlantic (8.5%), Bergen (4.1%) and Burlington (0.8%) counties showed the highest percent increase for GA cases since August 2014.
- In August 2015, GA cases showed a 2.7 percent decrease since July 2015.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$337 million from April 2015 to June 2015, an increase of 1.4 percent over the same period for FFY 2014.
- Total distributions increased 1.8% from June 2014.


WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)

- During the report month of August 2015, there were 3,382 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 499 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (891), Camden (398), and Hudson (321).
- There were 2,998 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.





Work Participation Rates Achieved Over 12 Month Period Ending With AUGUST 2015










ACRONYMS

CASS: Consolidated Assistance and Support System

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA) - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

NJ SNAP - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

FAMIS: Family Assistance Management Information System

GAAS: General Assistance Automated System

NJKiDS: New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE: The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

OMEGA: Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

SSI-EA: Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

WFNJ: Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, WFNJ/TANF for families with children, and WFNJ/GA (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
