

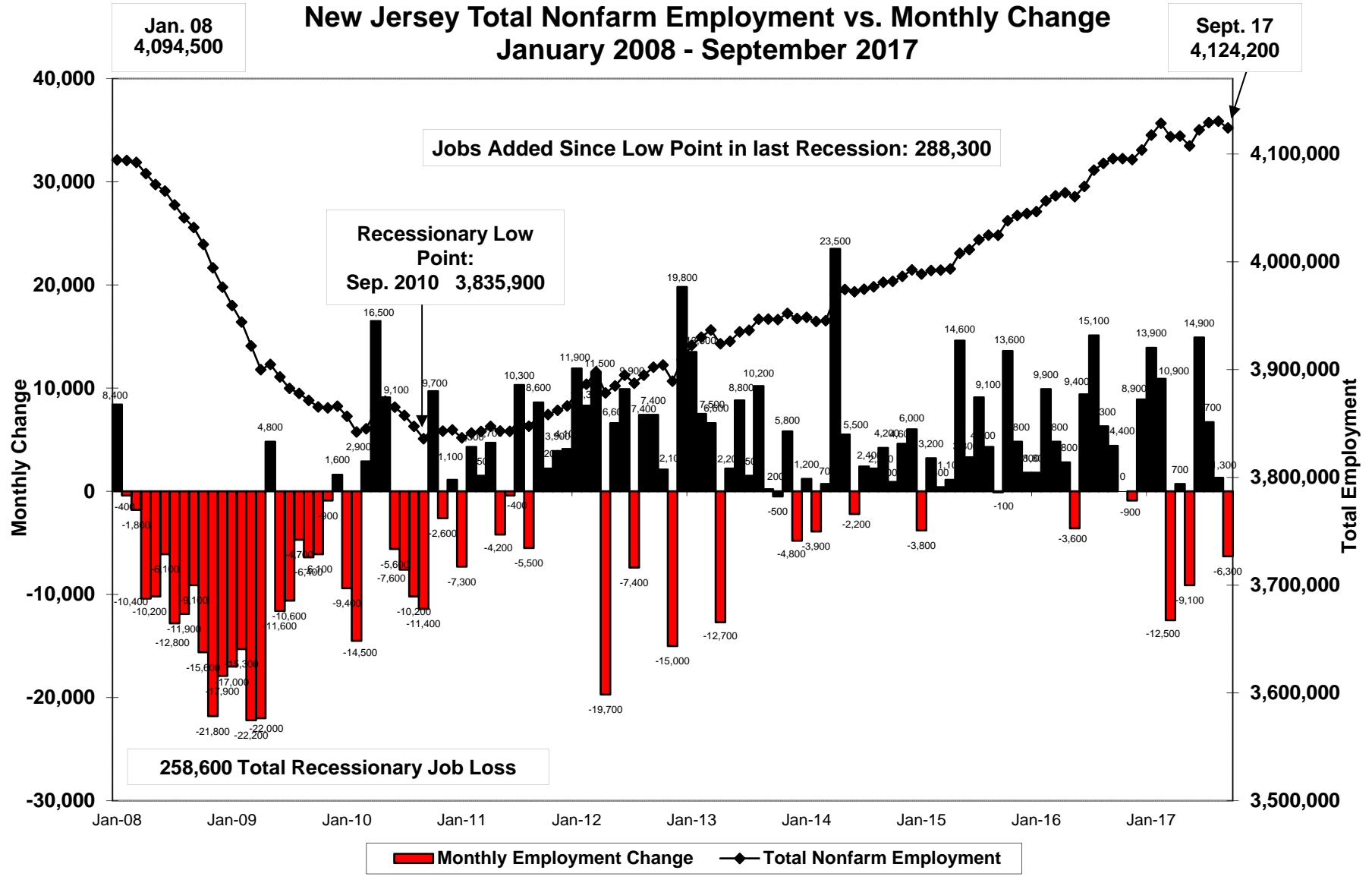

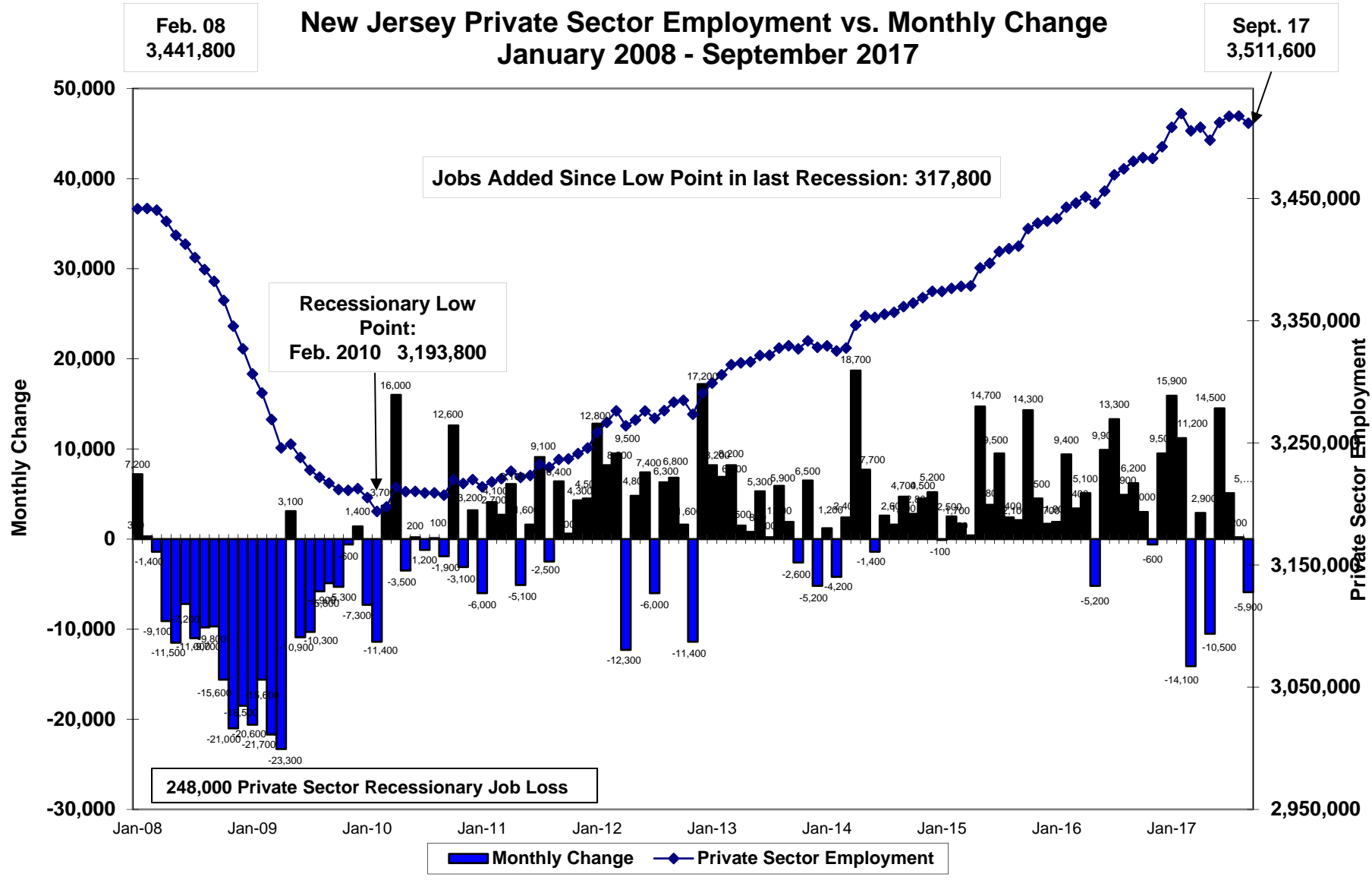

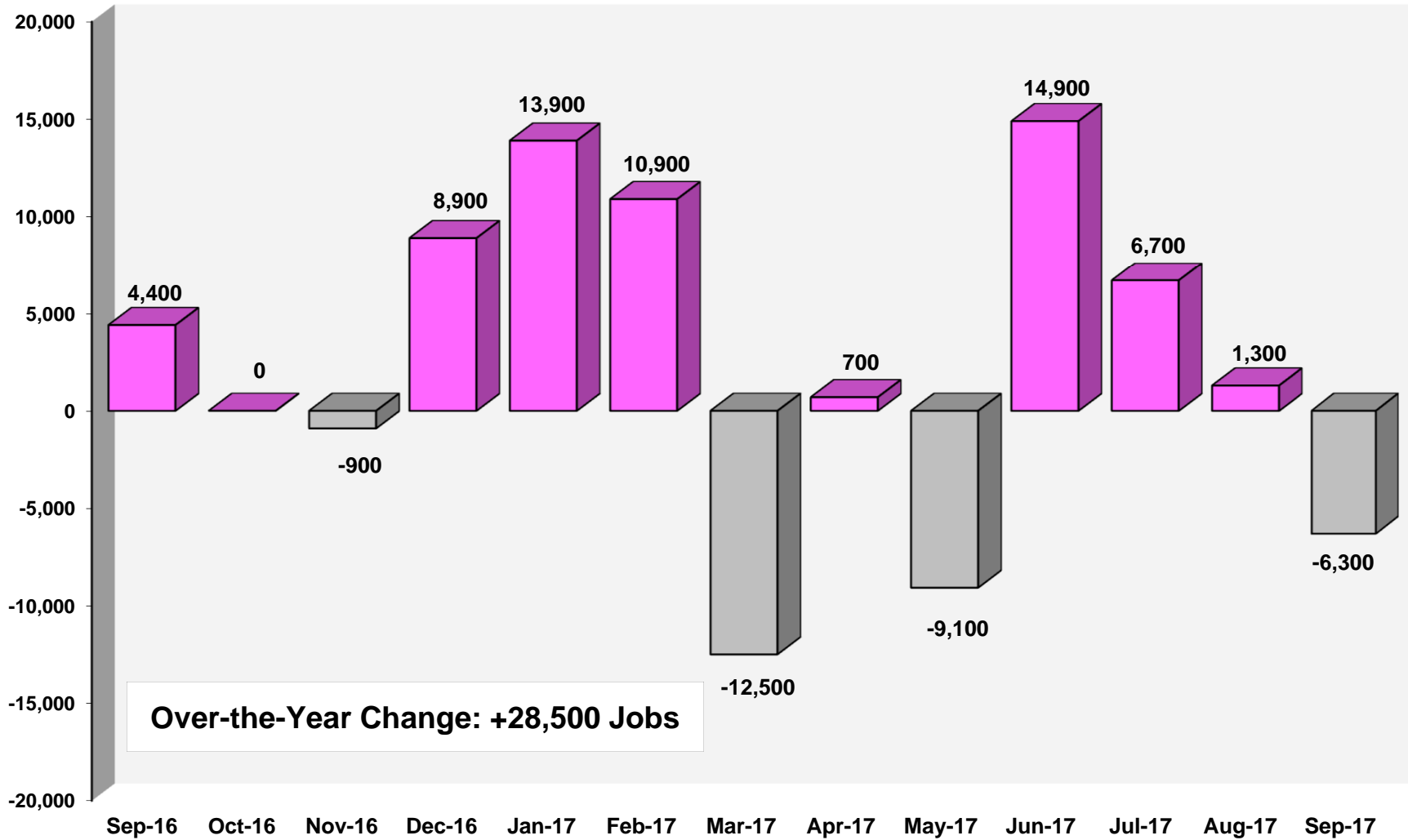
# New Jersey Total Nonfarm Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - September 2017



## New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - September 2017



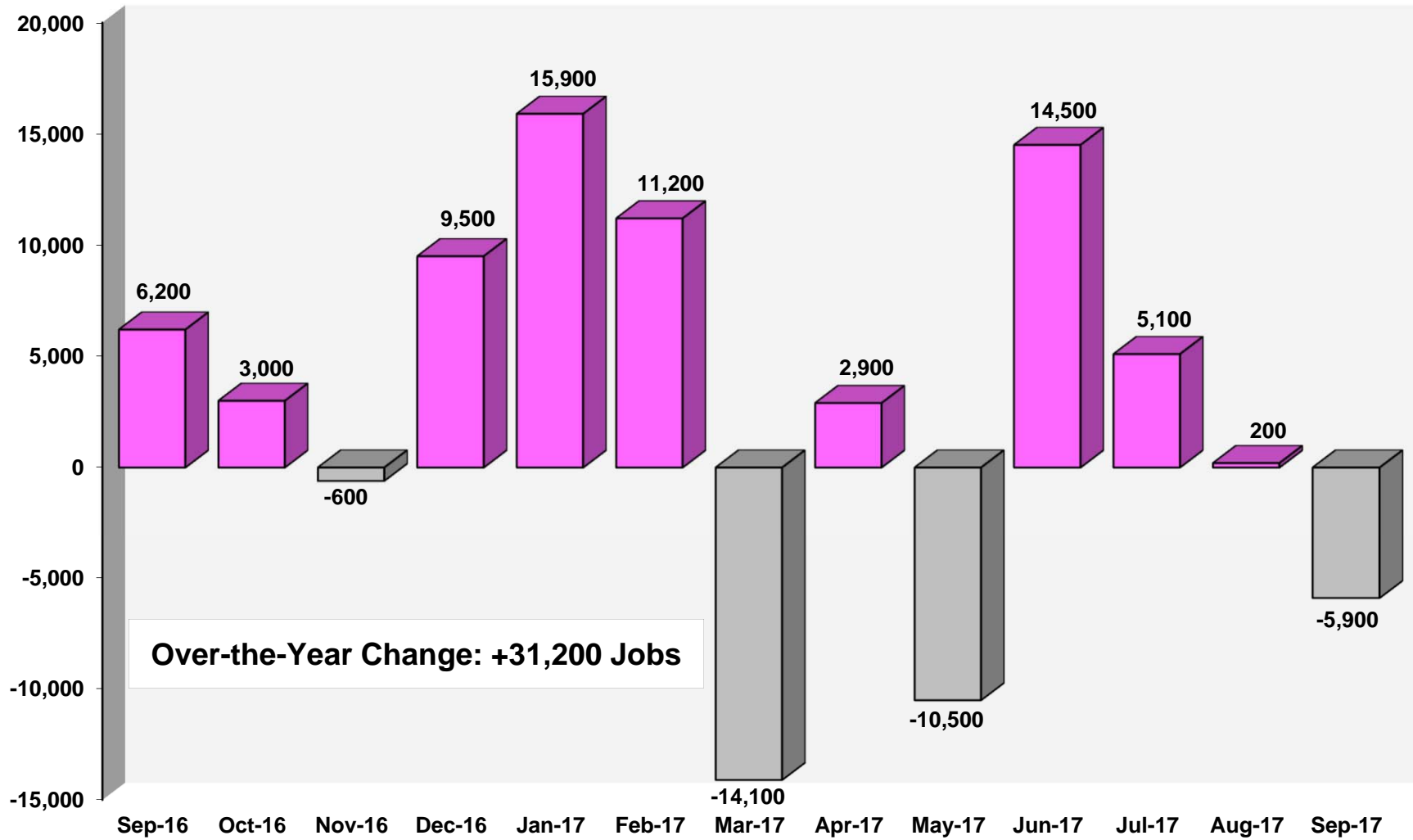
## Monthly Total Employment Change New Jersey: September 2016 - September 2017



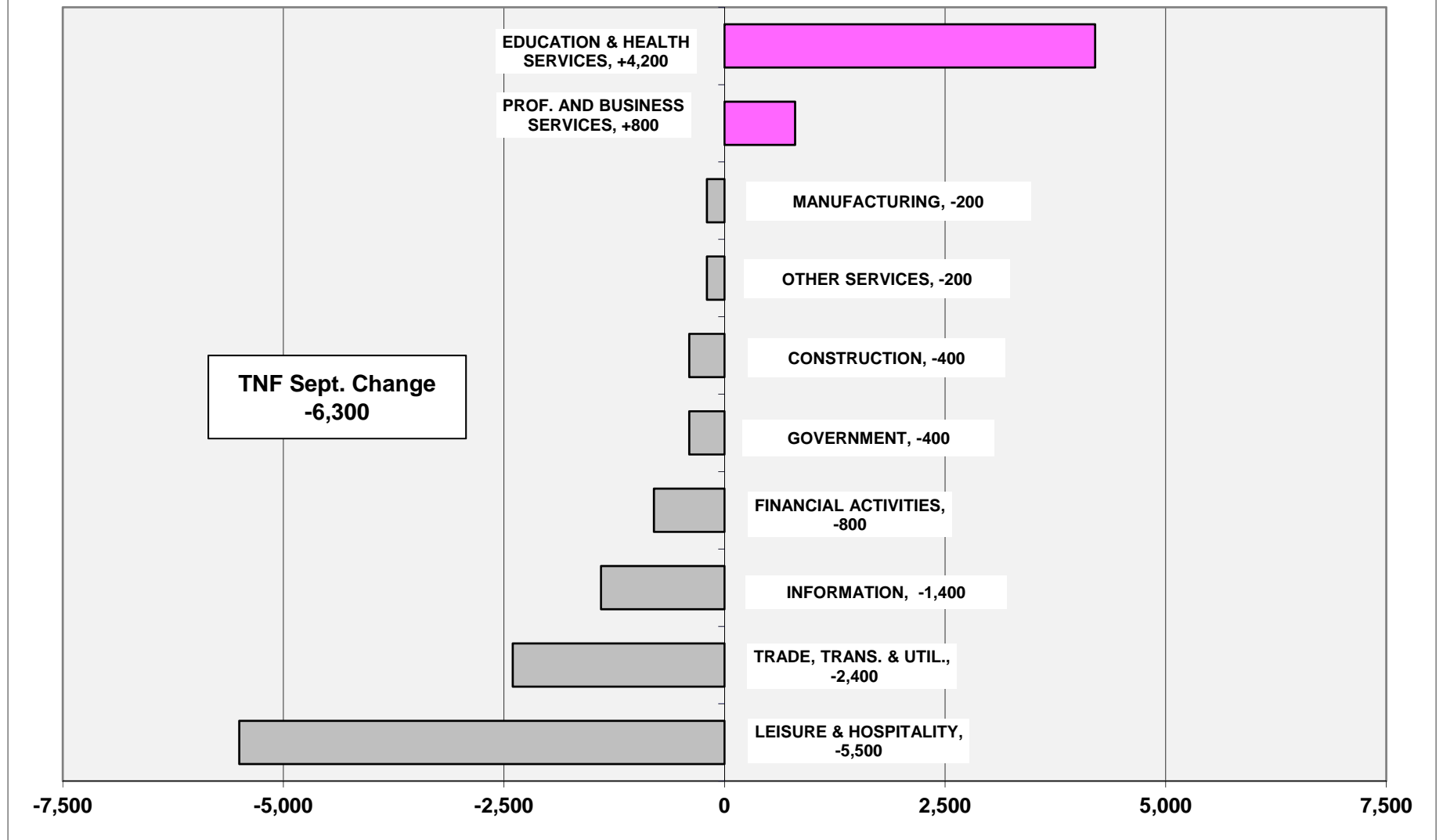
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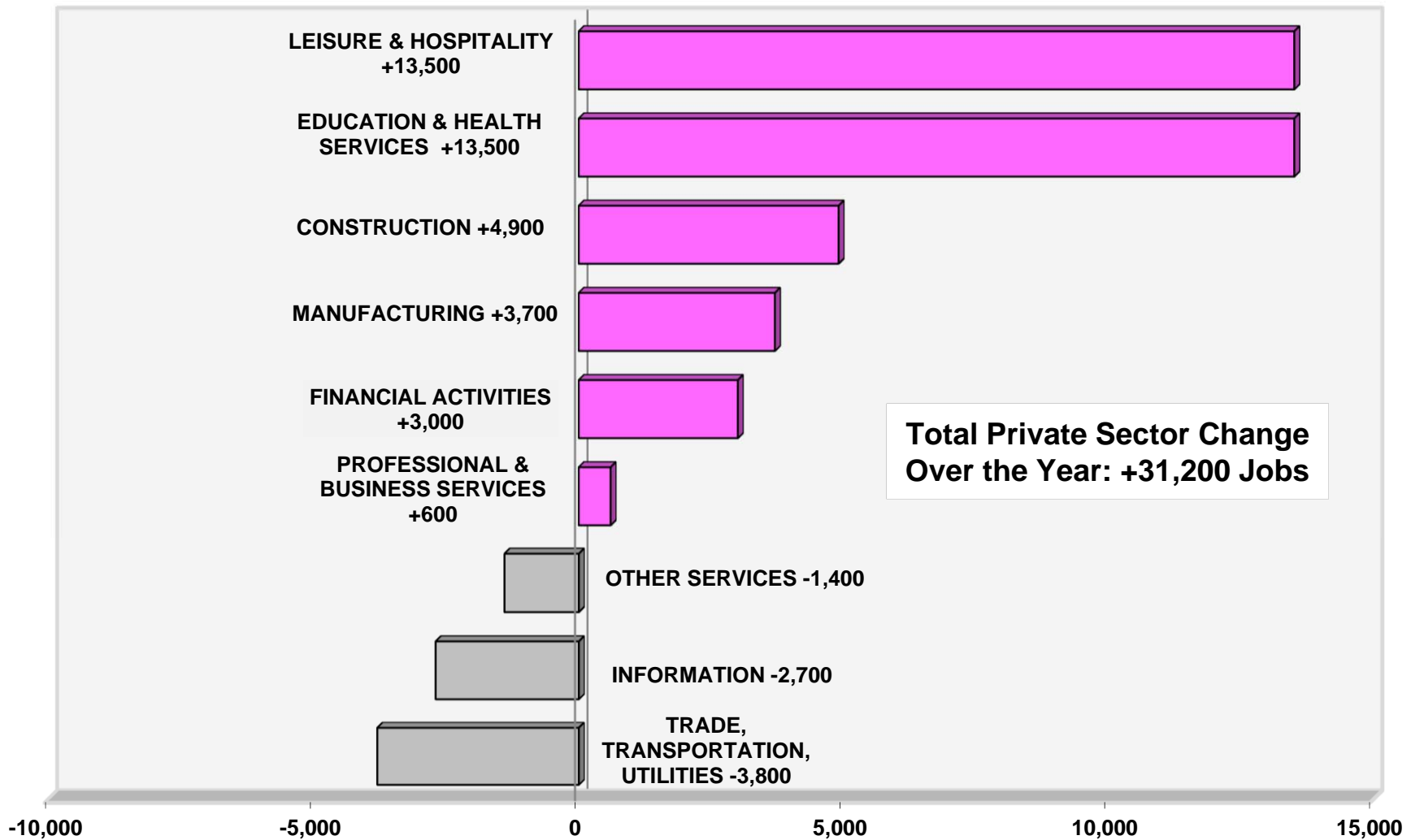
## Monthly Private Sector Employment Change September 2016 - September 2017

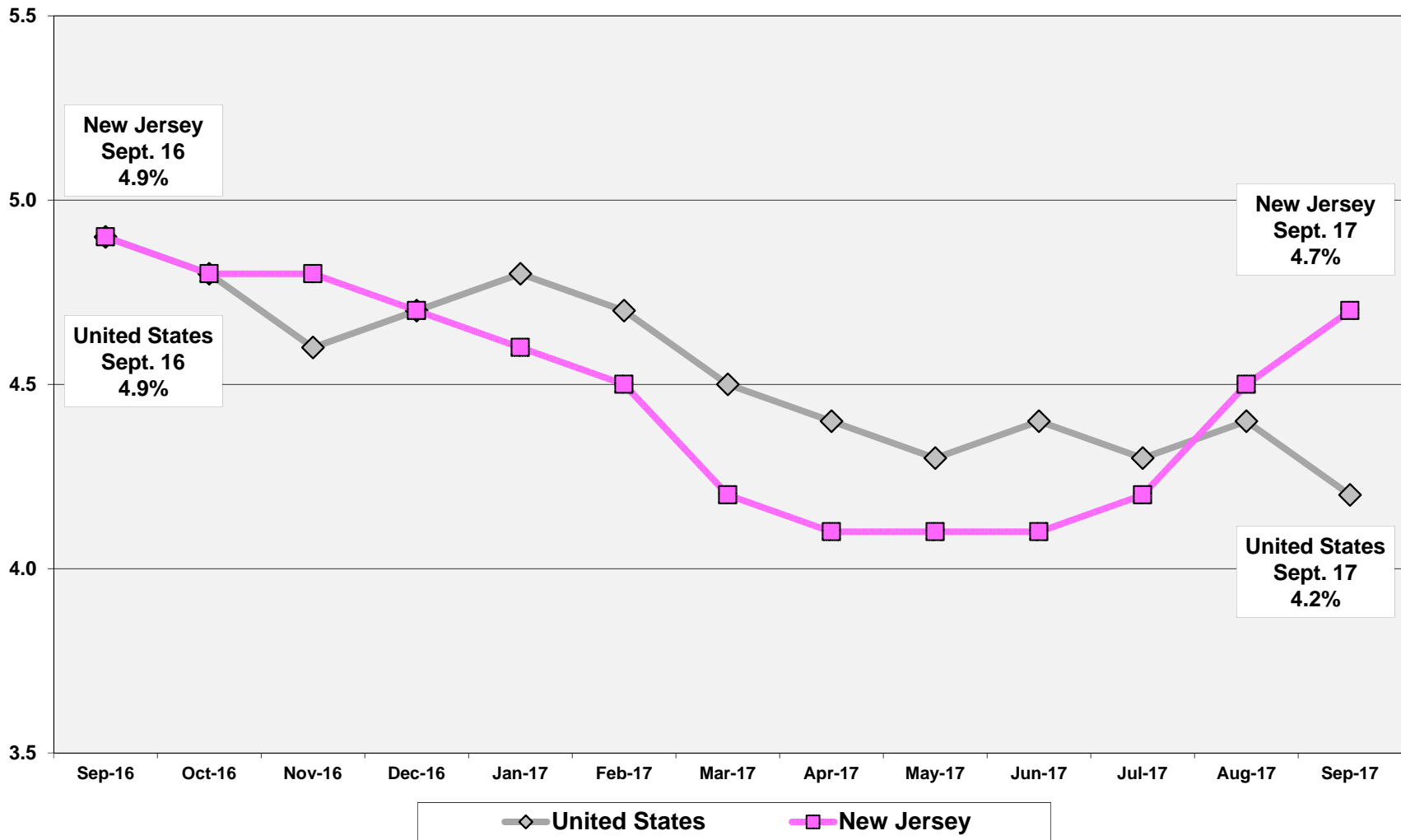
## New Jersey Private Sector Employment Change by Industry September 2016 - September 2017



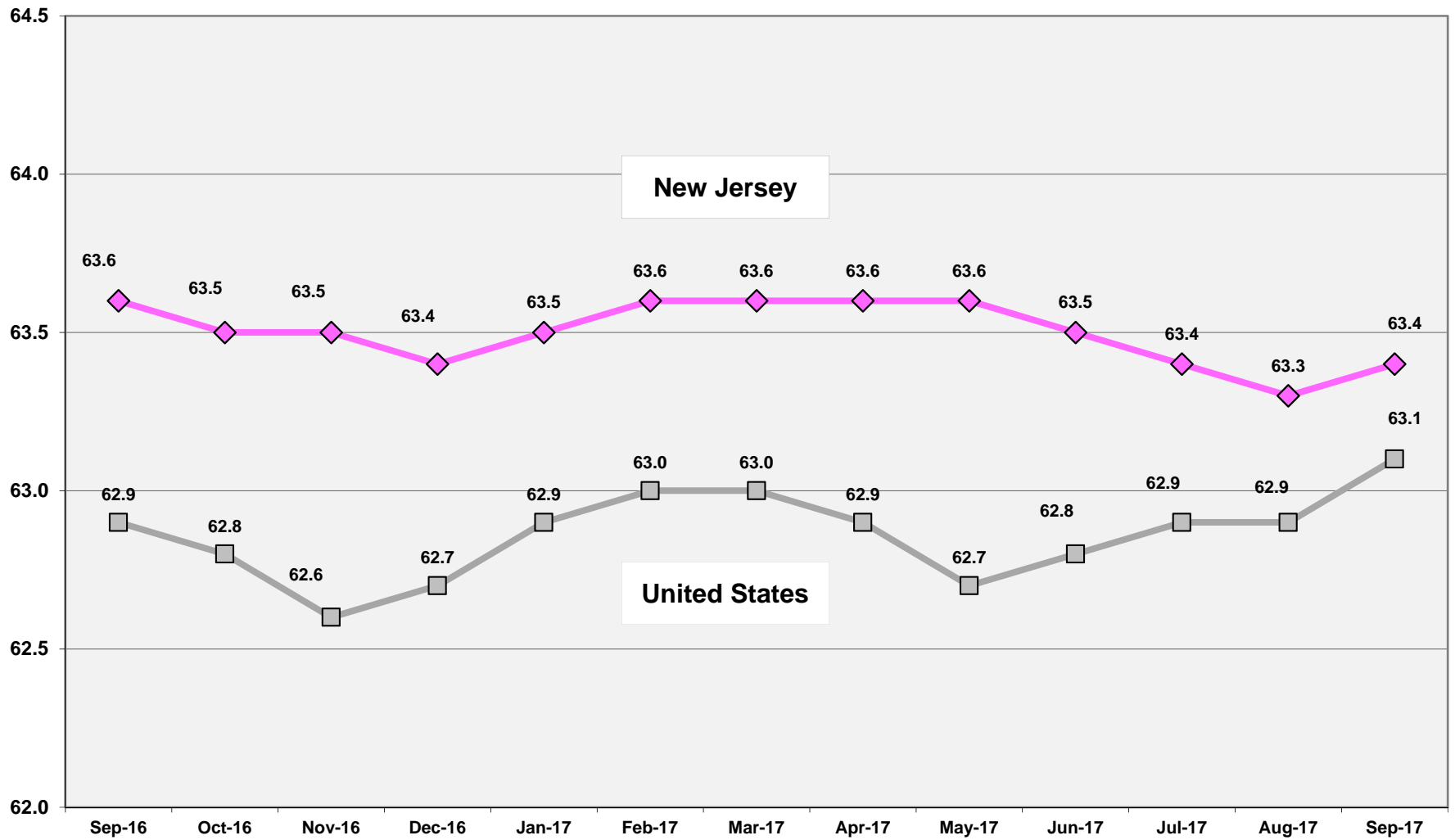
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## Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States September 2016 - September 2017



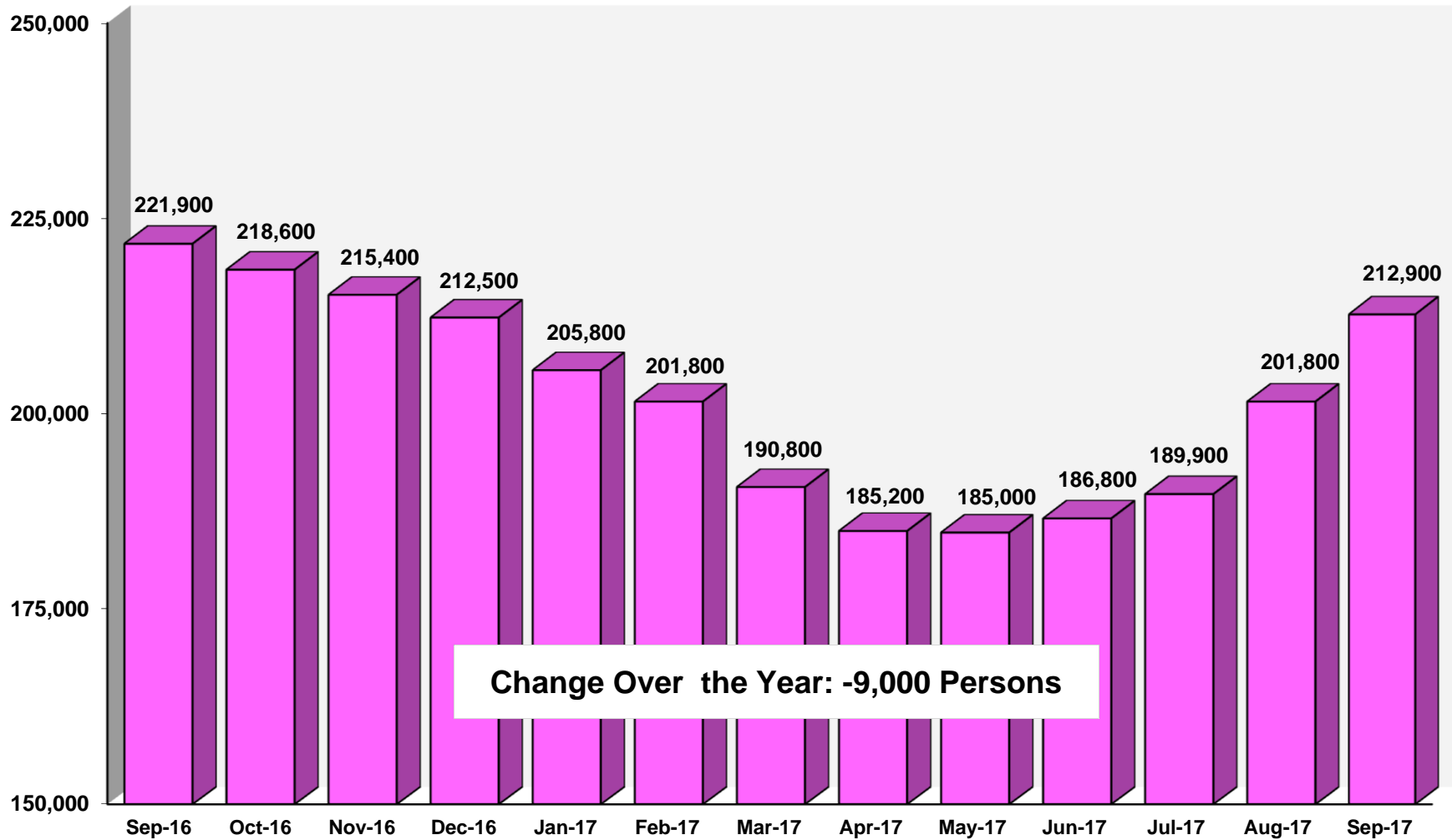
## New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: September 2016 - September 2017



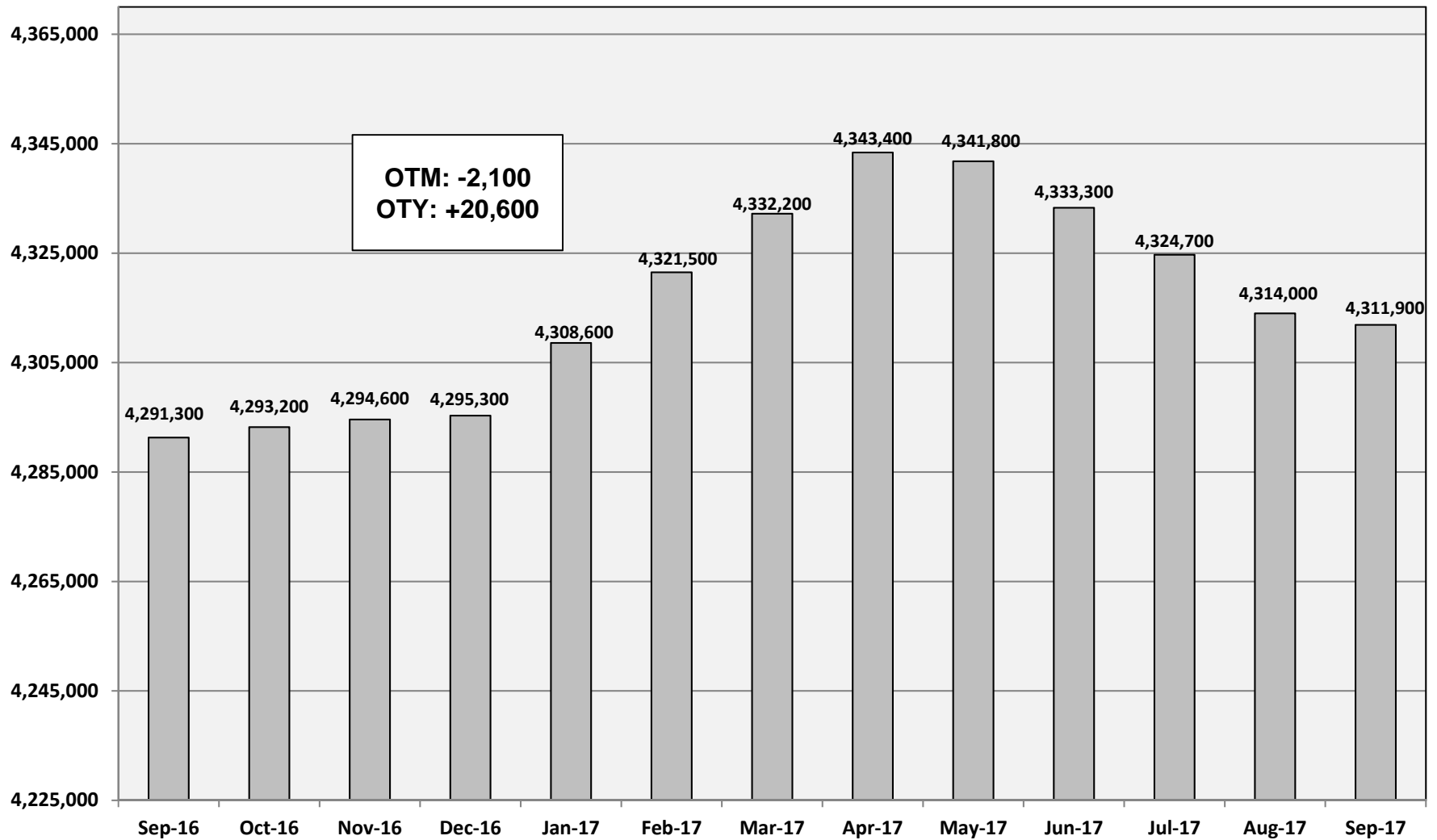
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## New Jersey Unemployed Residents September 2016 - September 2017



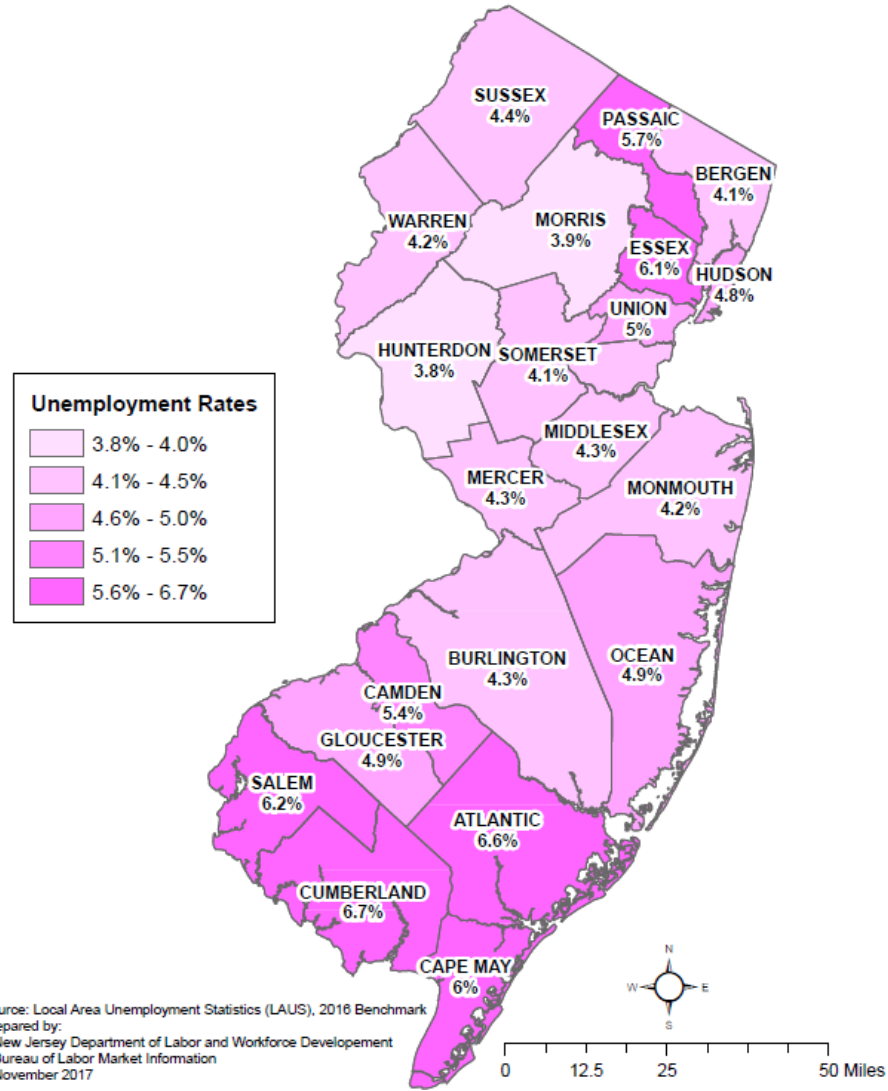
## New Jersey Employed Residents: September 2016 - September 2017



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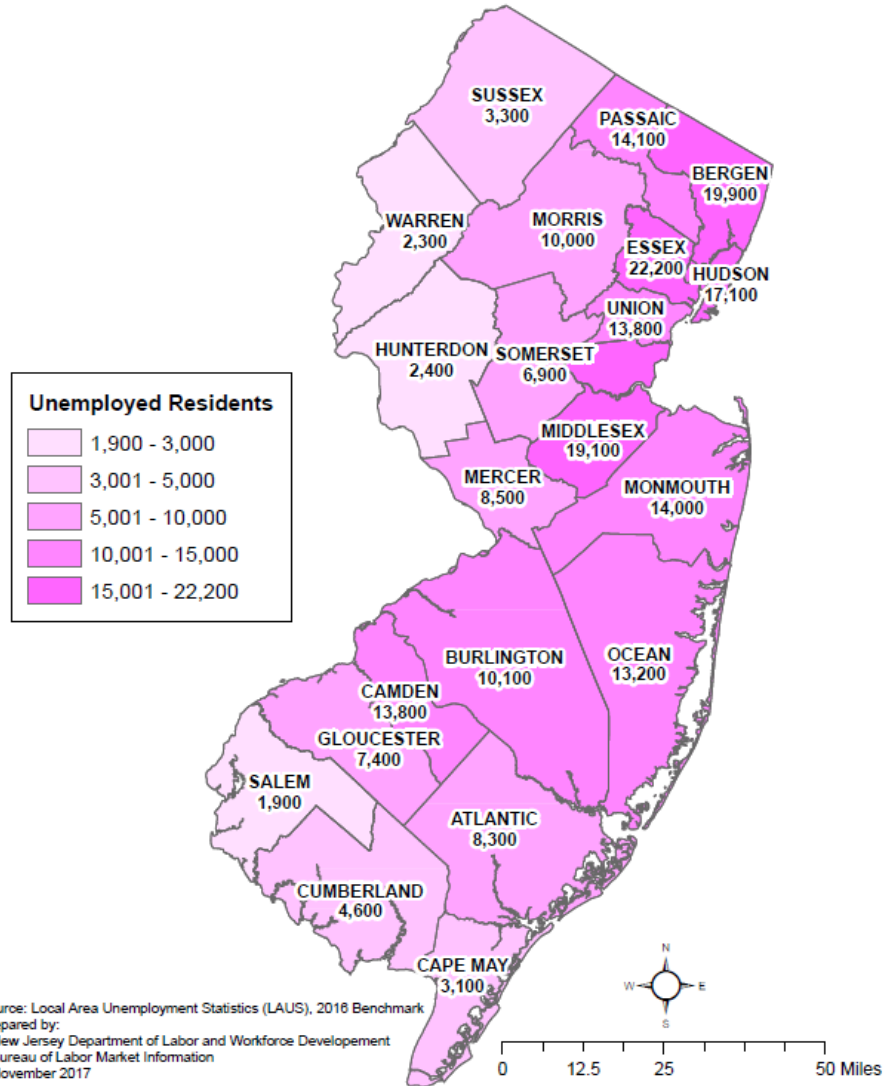
## New Jersey Counties Unemployment Rates - September 2017 (Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)



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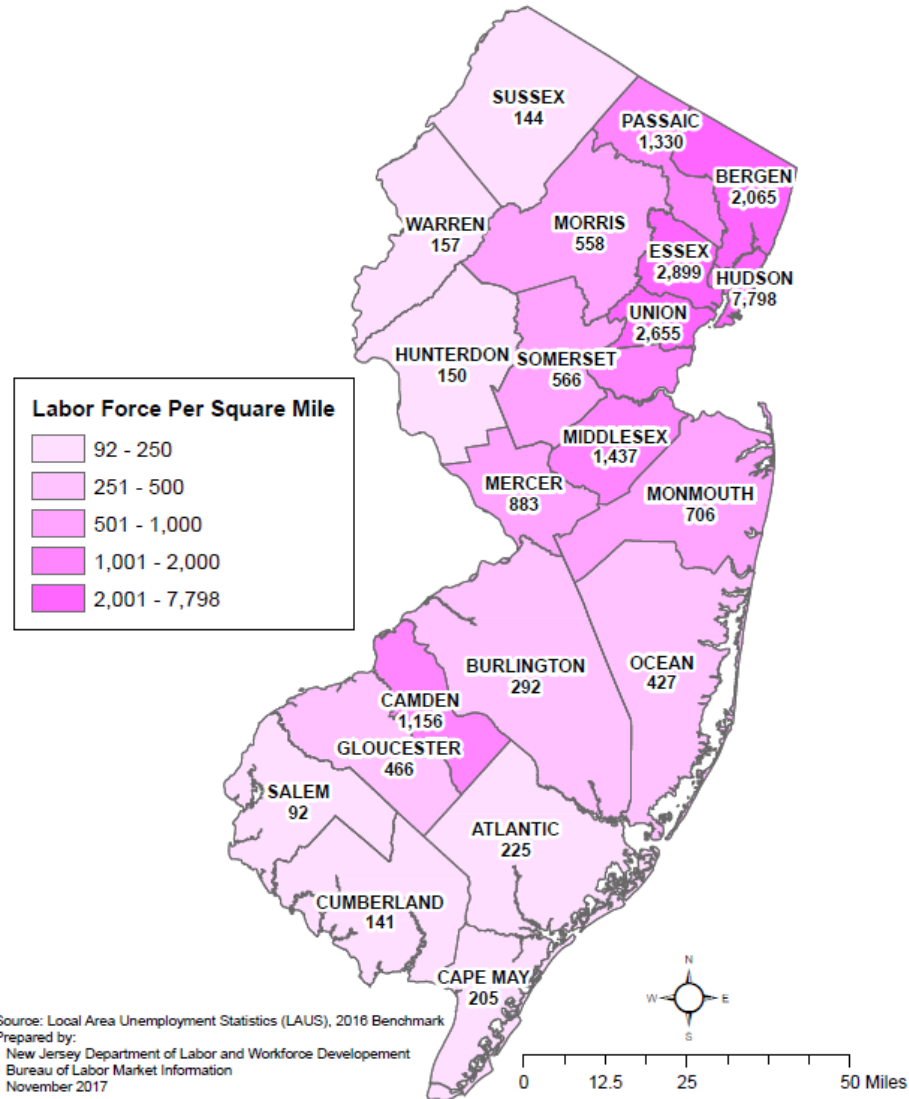
## New Jersey Counties Unemployed Residents - September 2017 (Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)



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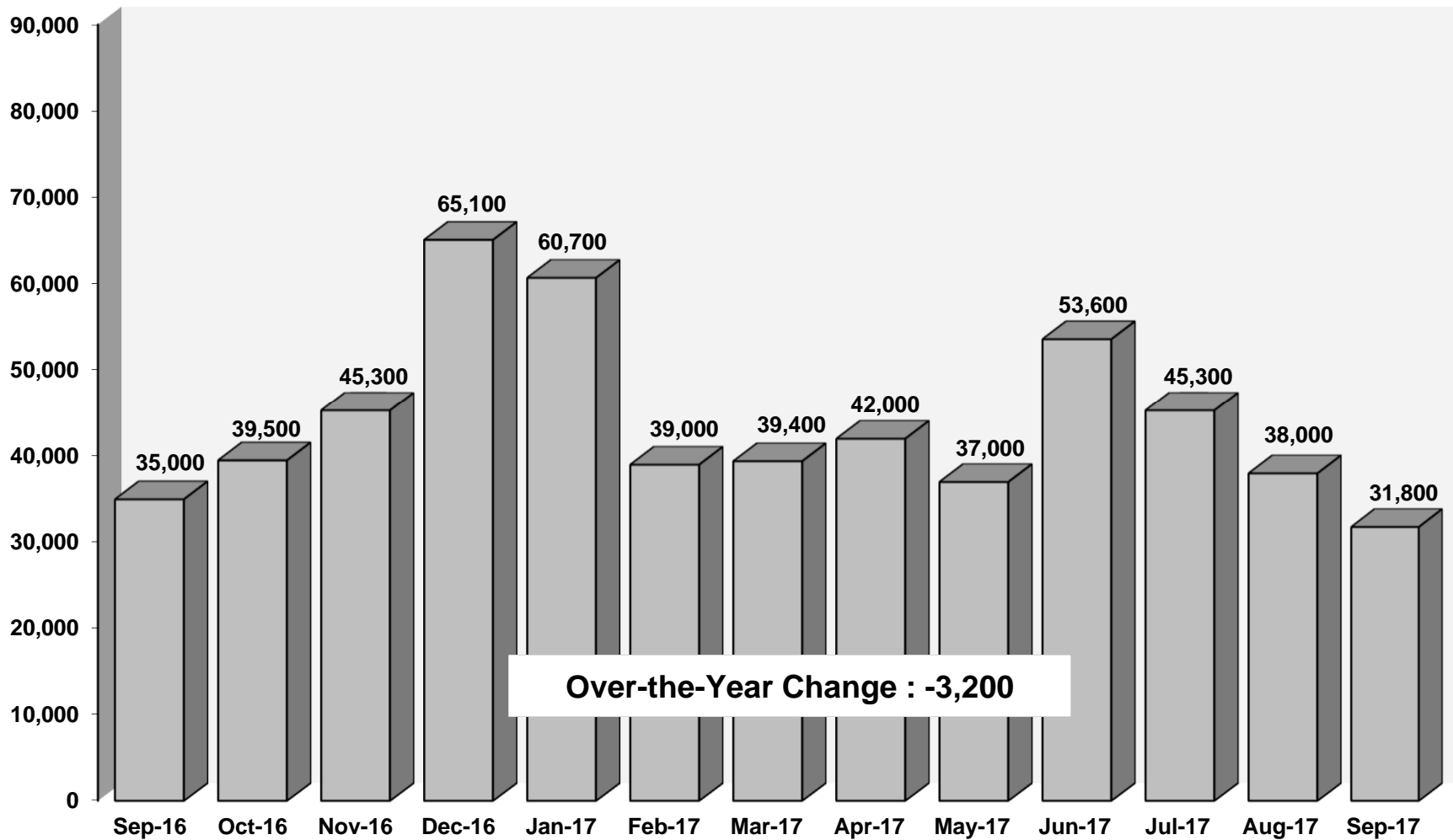
## New Jersey Counties Labor Force Per Square Mile - September 2017 (Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)
