NEW BUS AT PARAMUS HOME KEEPS VETERANS MOVING

The state Veterans Memorial Home held a bus dedication ceremony April 25 and gave thanks to 116 donors for their support in the purchase of a new bus to help get "Vets on the Go," in Paramus.

The new bus which will be used to transport handicapped veterans was purchased in an organized effort by the American Legion and individuals mostly from Bergen County.

"The last buses we had, were continually breaking down," said Giulia V. Kirsch, Supervisor of Recreation. "Thanks to the generosity of our donors, our residents will now be able to interact with the many communities around them."

"Our veterans have given us so much, it's a wonderful thing to have the opportunity to be able to give something back to them," said Kirsch.

"We want to improve the quality of life for our vets and their families," said Robert J. Salvini, American Legion Commander for Bergen County. "Our vets will now be able to get out of the home and go on picnics, go to the movies and mingle with the community."

Salvini, the person responsible for spearheading the fundraiser, presented the idea to the executive board in October 2013 and with the help of Veterans of Foreign Wars, Elks and many other individuals, they have been able to raise more than \$85,000 to make this day happen.

"I am honored to be here today to present the keys to this new bus," said Salvini. "I was raised to pay it forward and it feels good to give to those who have given so much for our freedom and our way of life."

The fund rising went above the target with more than \$18,000 going to the goal of another bus.

NJNG Soldiers teach leadership, life skills to student-athletes

Brig. Gen. James Grant, Chief of the Joint Staff, New Jersey National Guard, addressed approximately 60 high school student-athletes who are aspiring for a scholarship to attend a Division 1 college, and recounted the story of a Soldier he knew very well. A Soldier who pushed himself to be the best student, athlete and leader while in high school, military academy and in the U.S. Army.

Grant's point described the leadership and dedication skills that this young Soldier displayed as a 15-year-old student and how those attributes benefitted him in Iraq as a young 23-year-old lieutenant leading troops, some older than himself, into battle.

"Life is about choices," said Grant. "Leaders have a vision of where they want to go and how they are going to get there."

Subsequently, the New Jersey Army National Guard Recruiting and Retention Battalion participated in the NFL's High School Development Program April 29 at the Morristown Armory to

provide leadership and life skills training to the student-athletes. These student-athletes, identified as leaders on and off the field, were chosen by their coaches to attend the event.

The NFL's High School Development Program addresses challenges facing high school football programs across the country focusing primarily on underserved communities. HSDP serves as a free resource for both high school players and coaches. In addition, the program emphasizes safety and concussion awareness, character and life skills development, and football fundamentals.

The National Guard has partnered with the NFL in this endeavor, said Ken Seal, New Jersey Army National Guard Recruiting marketing specialist. "Our goal is to provide leadership skills to these young men."

During the event, the student-athletes participated in five competitive challenges: rock wall climbing, timed shuttle runs, pass/toss football, push-ups and a ping-pong relay. Afterwards, they volunteered at a local food bank and visited the New York Jets' training facility.

Soldiers from various NJNG armories assisted and provided tips to the student-athletes. Between breaks in the events, the Soldiers provided advice and career counseling to the athletes.

According to some statistics, less than six percent of student-athletes in high school will play football in a Division 1 college. Therefore, knowing there are military tuition assistance options to attend college is critical for these young men.

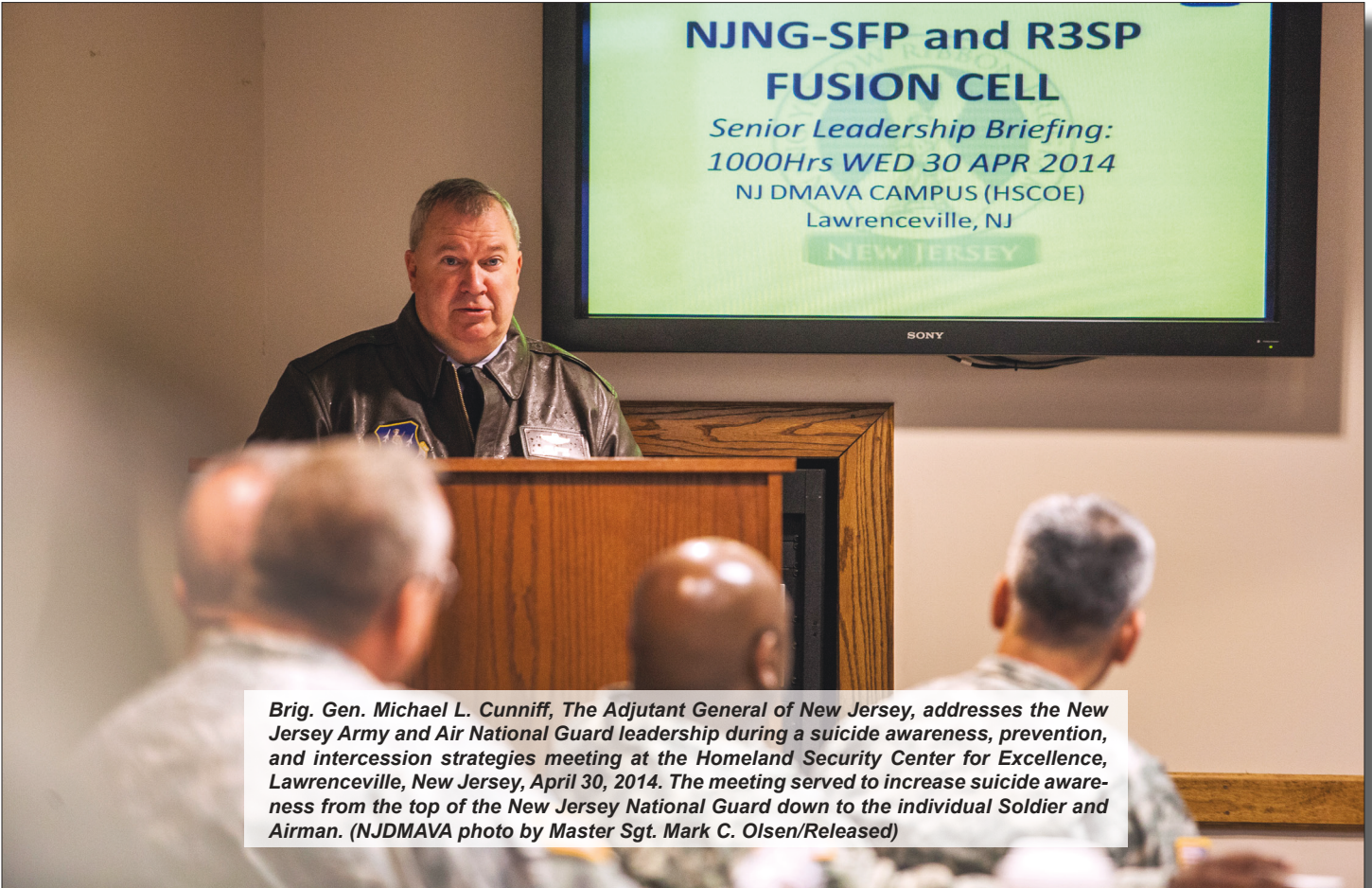
"Maybe some of you will make it to division one. Some of you won't," said Grant. "But you all have the opportunity to make choices to be leaders, community influencers."

"We want them to know that if they don't make it to the pros, there are other choices," said Sgt. 1st Class Peter Sarni, senior non-commissioned officer at the Recruiting and Retention Battalion and the non-commissioned officer in charge during the event. "Military service is an honorable and rewarding career. We want them to know that."
