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













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



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










# **Enrollment by Grade**




# **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**

























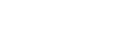
NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 05
















# **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**
