




#### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

This graph presents the percentages of enrollment for each subgroup defined by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001




**Enrollment by Gender**

#### **Enrollment by Grade**








#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**






#### **Enrollment by Grade**




#### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup






NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 07






#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**
























## **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**






## NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 04




## NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 04




### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**
