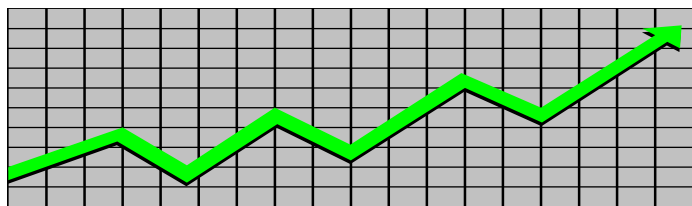

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## **DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS**

### **MARCH 2019**

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

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#### **WFNJ/TANF**

- As of the end of March, the TANF caseload had decreased by 3,182 cases, from 14,295 in March 2018 to 11,113 in March 2019, a decrease of 22.3%.
- The county where the family caseload percentage increased since March 2018 was Hunterdon (24.0%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased the most since March 2018 were Passaic (-27.0%), Burlington (-27.7%) and Atlantic (-32.3%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 3,986 or 35.9% were child-only in March 2019.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Camden (659), Essex (517) and Passaic (408).
- Essex (4,756), Camden (3,668), Hudson (3,436), Passaic (3,141) and Atlantic (1,792) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in March 2019.

#### **NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In March 2019, there were 351,783 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households decreased by 27,707 or 7.3%, since March 2018.
- There were 698,121 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of March 2019, a decrease of 58,550 or 7.7% since March 2018.
- The counties having the highest caseload decrease since March 2018 are Ocean (-9.0%), Somerset (-12.2%) and Atlantic (-12.8%).

#### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 1,505 TANF families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in March 2019, a decrease of 280 or 15.7% since March 2018.
- In March 2019, EA payments were made for 428 SSI recipients.

MARCH 2019**

- There were 1,981 GA cases with Emergency Assistance payments in March 2019, a decrease of 69 or 3.4% since March 2018.
- The counties that showed the highest percent increase in Emergency Assistance payments were Somerset (50.0%), Cumberland (66.7%) and Monmouth (66.7%).
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease in Emergency Assistance payments were Sussex (-30.3%), Cape May (-35.3%) and Salem (-91.7%).

**GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 12,469 to 10,488 since March 2018, a decrease of 15.9%.
- There were 4,215 Employable GA and 6,273 Unemployable GA cases in March 2019.
- The counties that showed a percent increase for GA cases were Somerset (9.8%) and Monmouth (13.5%) and Warren (14.2%) since March 2018.
- The counties that showed the highest percent decrease for GA cases since March 2018 were Gloucester (-22.2%), Cape May (-24.4%) and Monmouth (-28.0%).
- In March 2019, GA cases showed a 0.2% decrease since February 2019.

**CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)**

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$312 million from January 2019 to March 2019, a decrease of 1.0 percent over the same period for FFY 2018.
- Total distributions decreased 1.3% from March 2018.

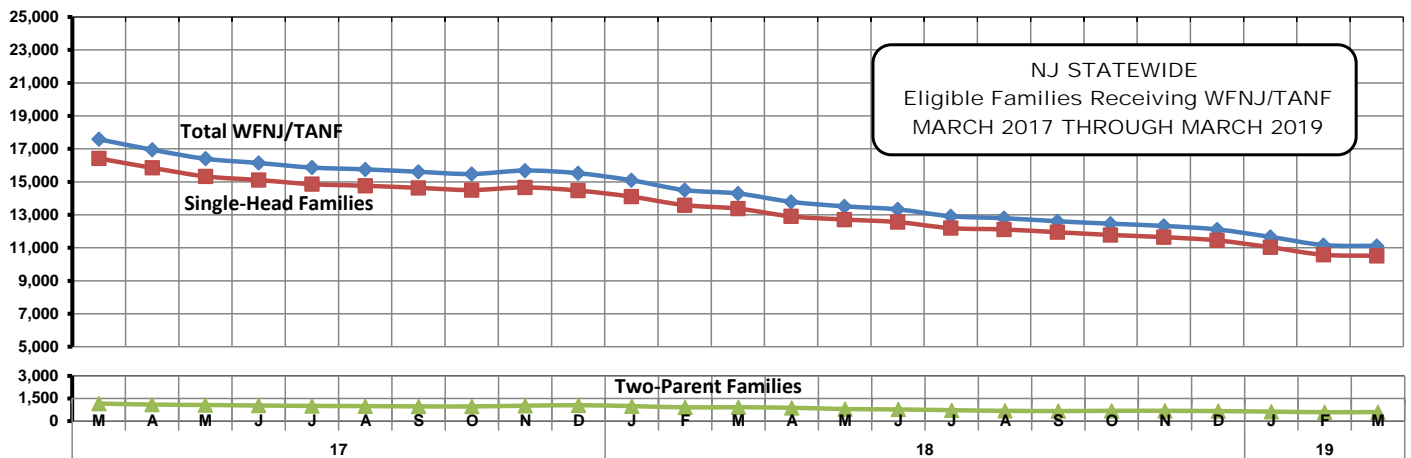
**WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of March 2019, there were 982 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 181 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (220), Camden (131) and Hudson (104).

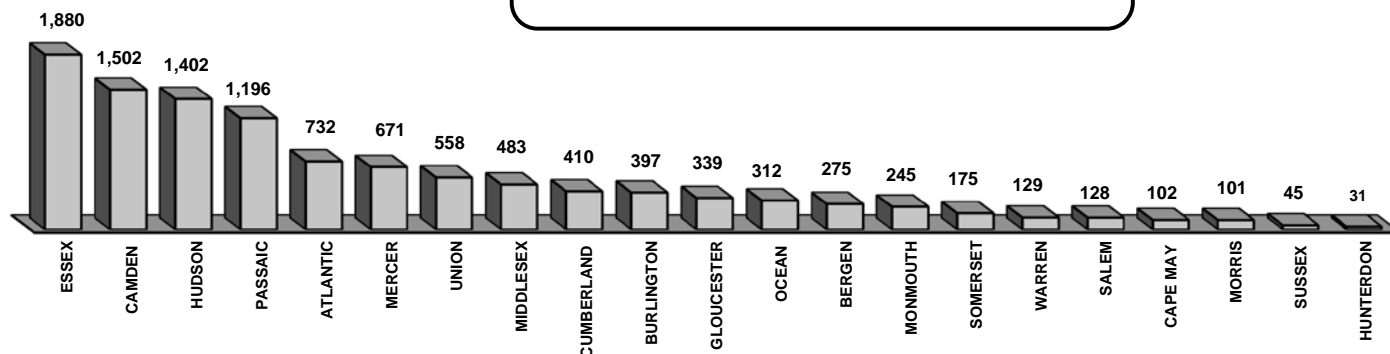

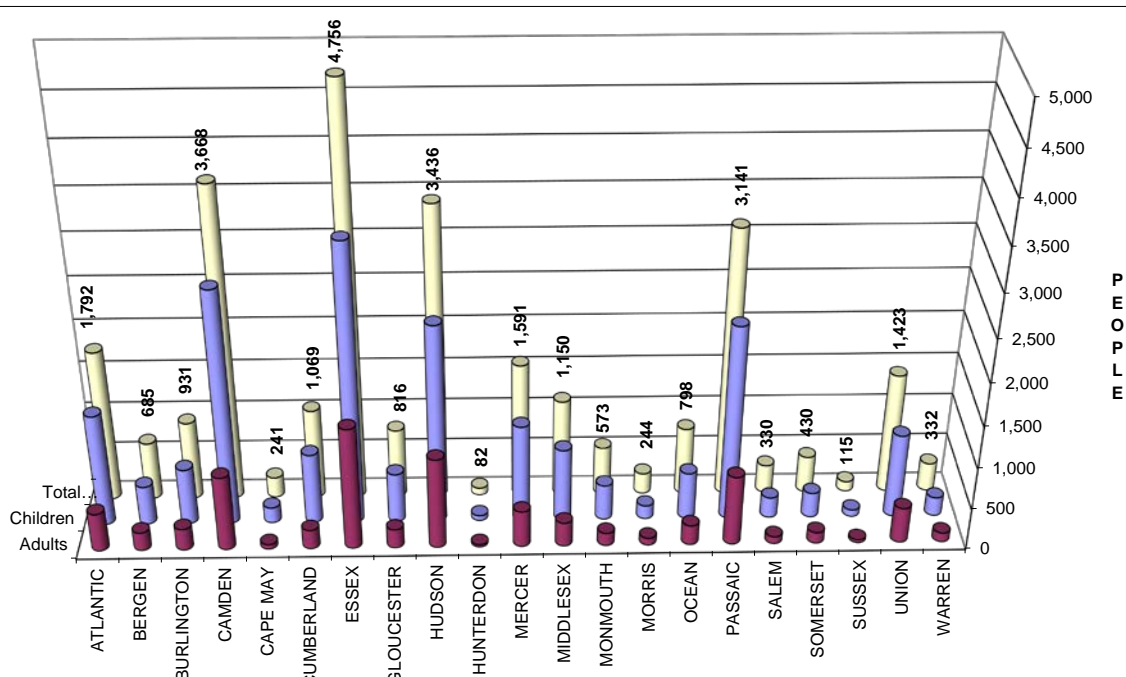

Ending With MARCH 2019**

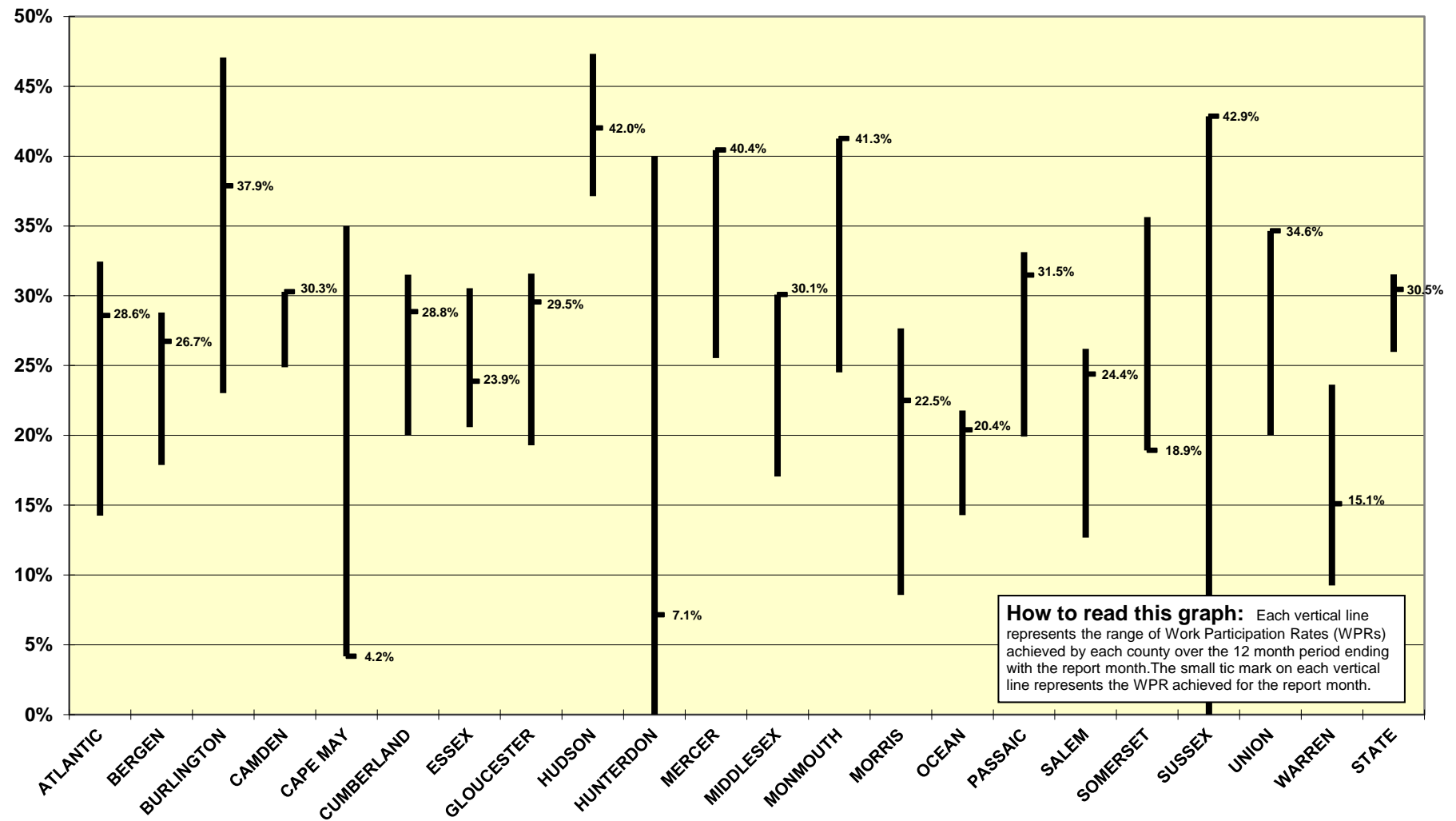
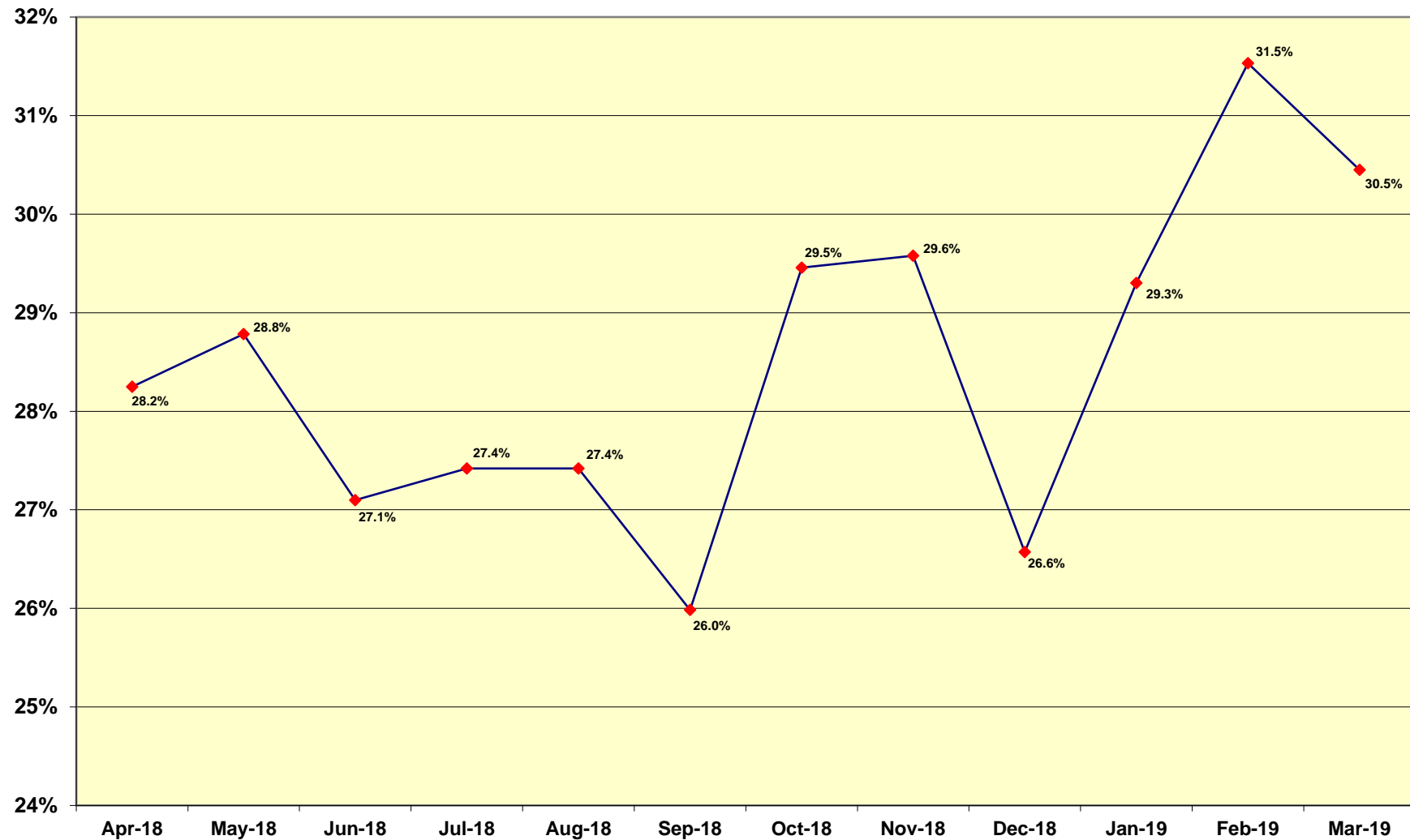

## **ACRONYMS**

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**NJKIDS:** New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE:** The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA:** Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
