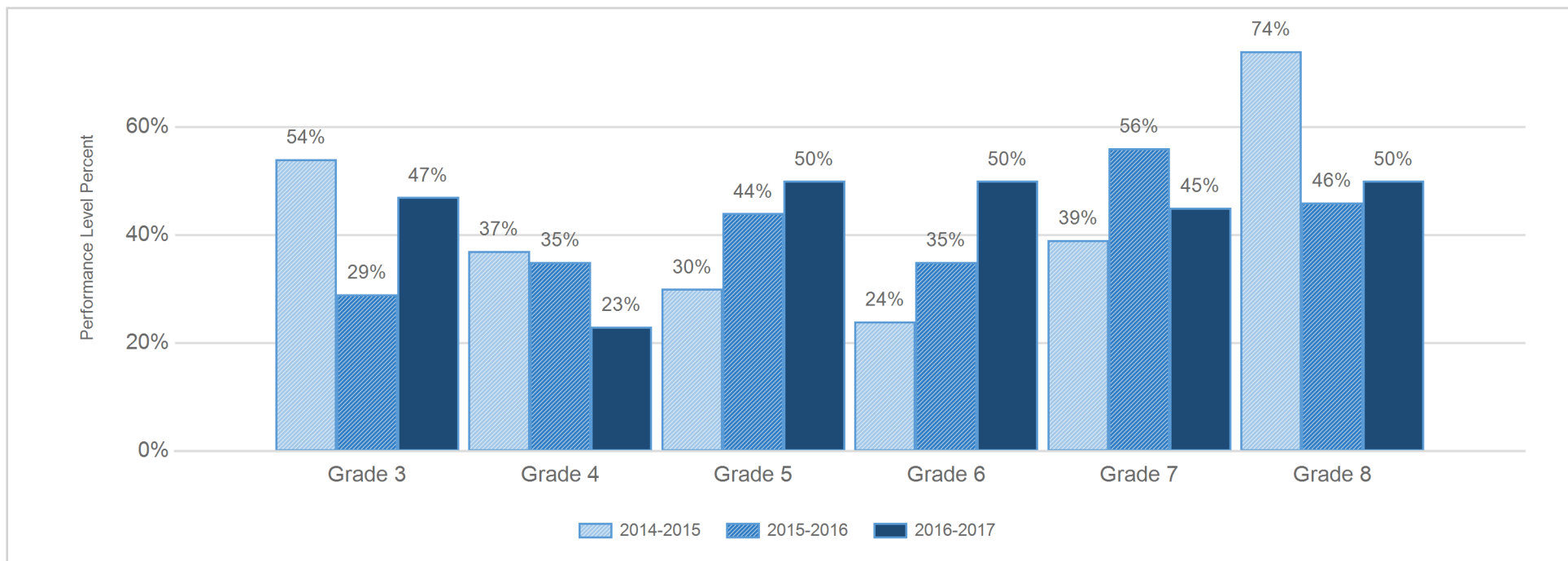

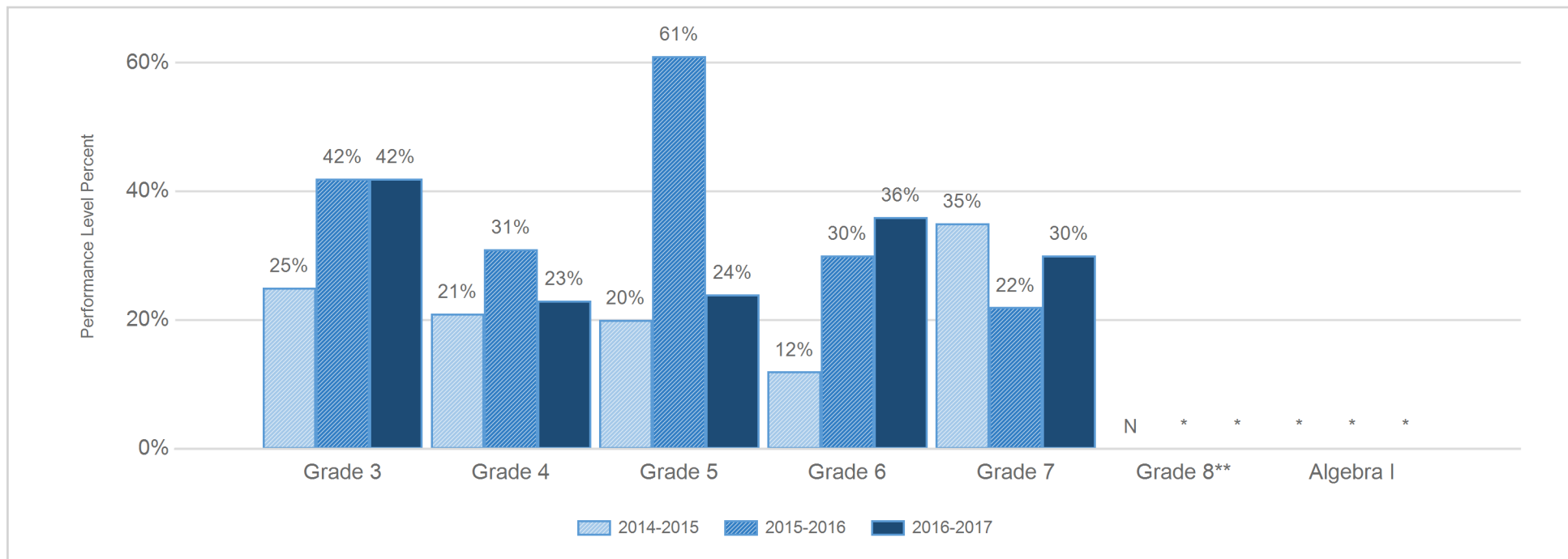

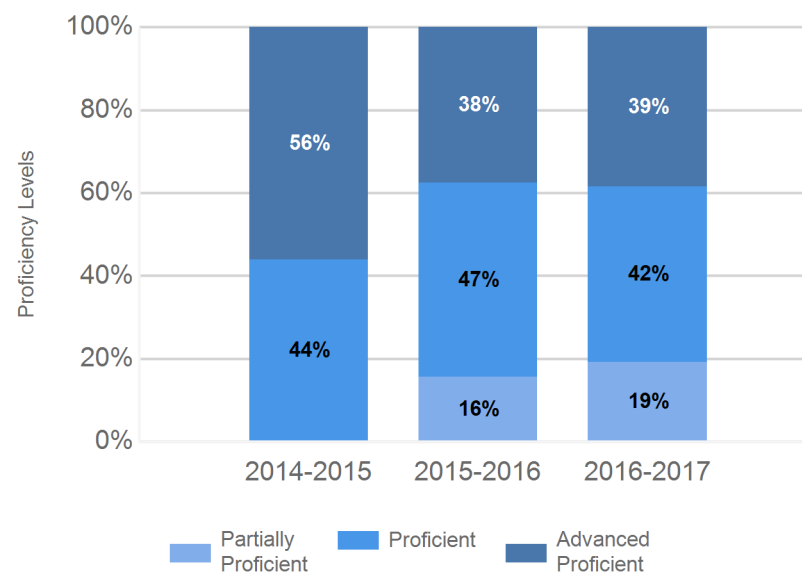

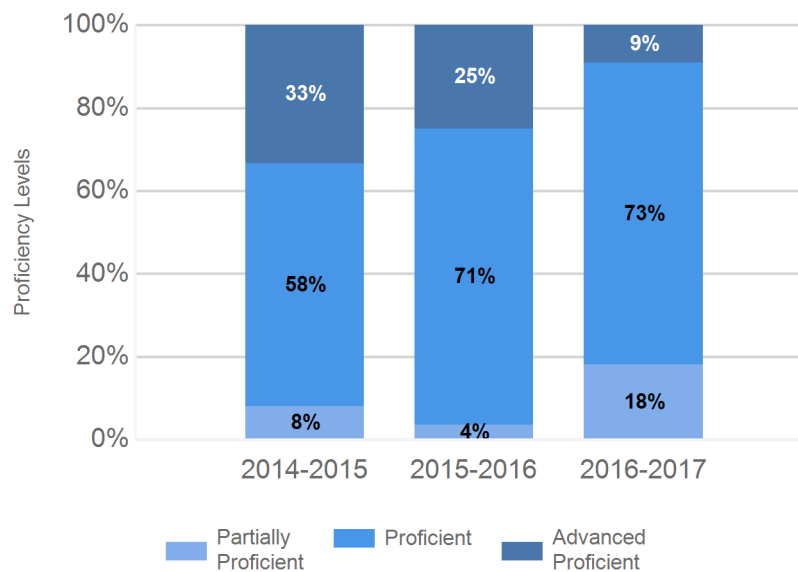

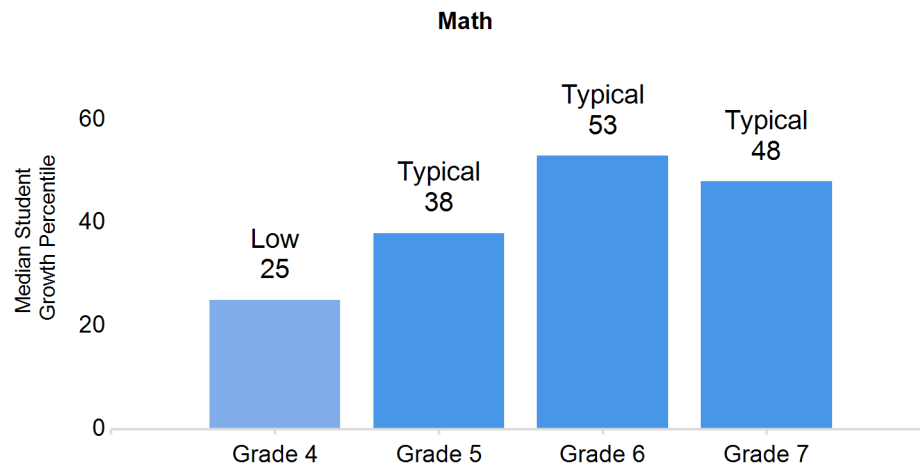
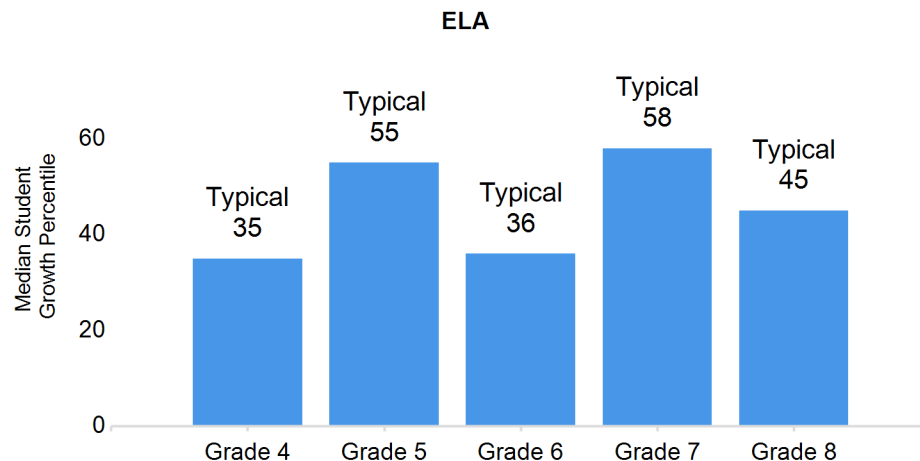
**Student Growth by Performance Level**

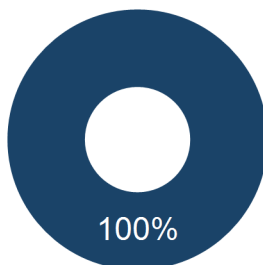

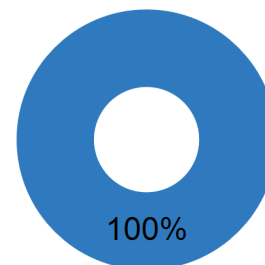

Students enrolled in one or more **visual and performing arts** classes

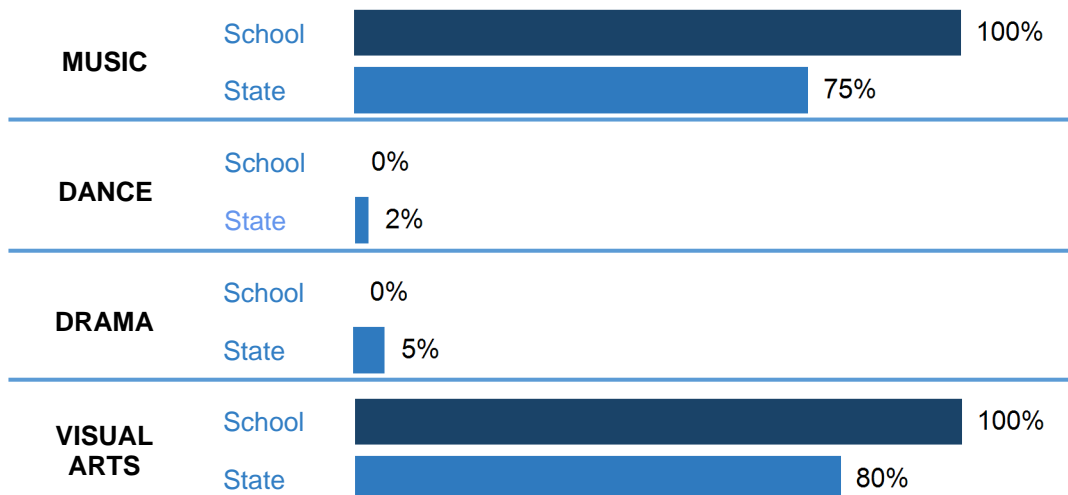

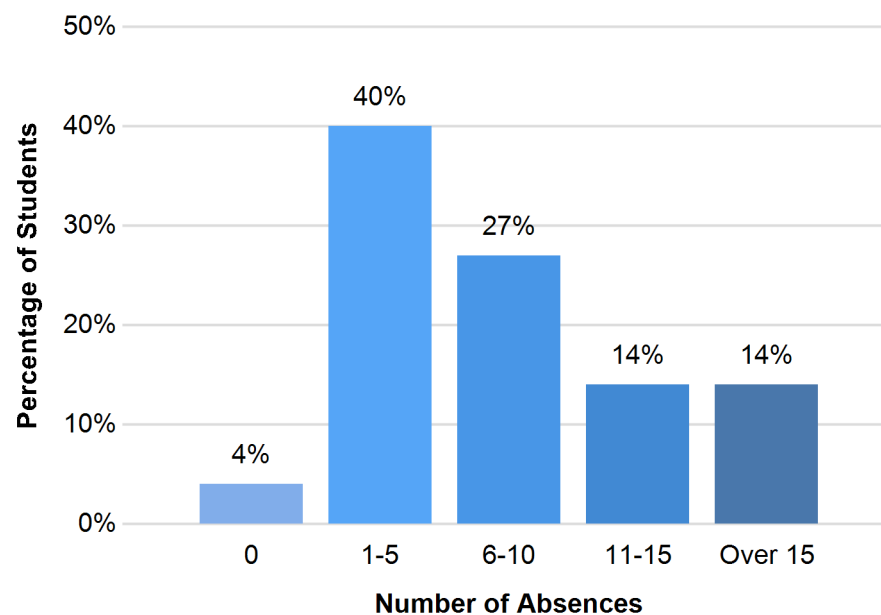

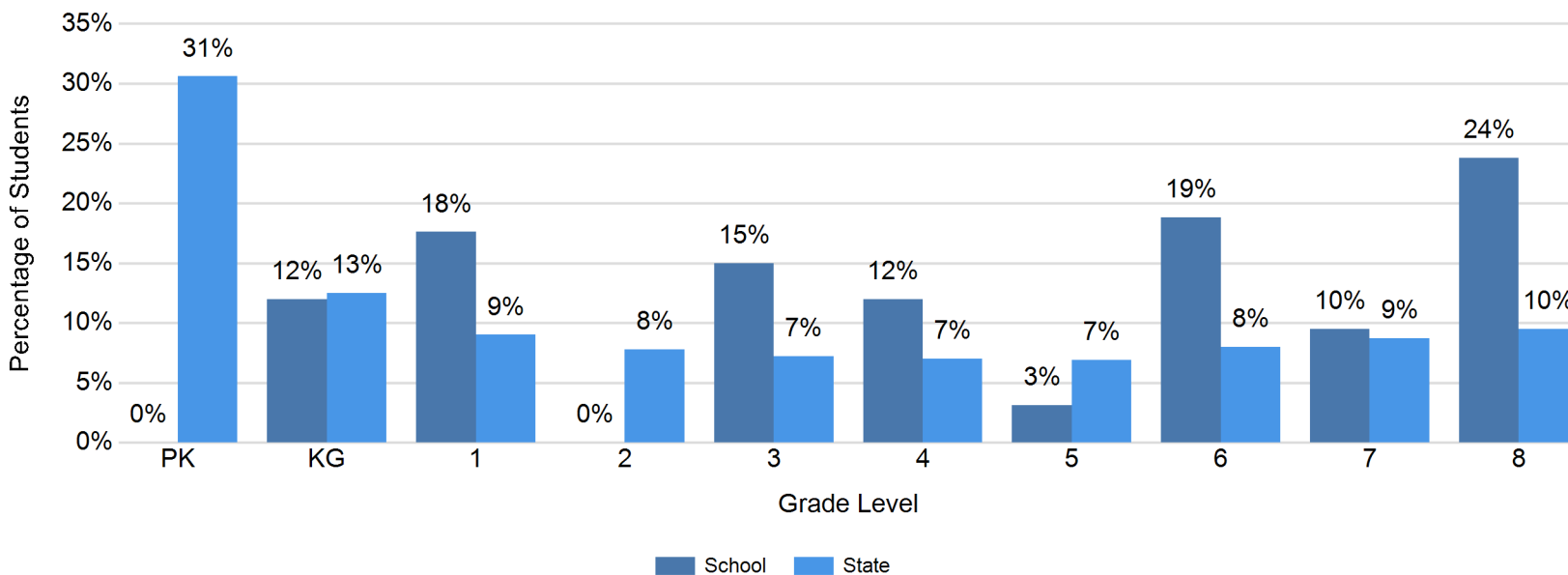
