Additionally, this school is meeting 20% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.



College and Career Readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. Graduation and Post-Secondary







Enrollment Trends by Program Participation








Proficiency Trends - Math









Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup












NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 06









Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy - Grade Level - 03






NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03









Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -**Grade Level - 03**















Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -**Grade Level - 03**






NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03






