#### **Academic Achievement**

This school outperforms 58% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 41% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of Academic Achievement. Additionally, this school is meeting 100% of its performance targets in the area of Academic Achievement.



Academic Achievement measures the content knowledge students have in language arts literacy and math. For elementary and middle schools, this includes measures of the school's proficiency rate on both the Language Arts Literacy and Math sections of the New Jersey Assessment of Skills and Knowledge (NJASK). A proficiency rate is calculated by summing the count of students who scored either proficient or advanced proficient on the assessment and dividing by the count of valid test scores.

#### **College and Career Readiness**

This school outperforms 69% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 45% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting 100% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.



College and Career readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. For all elementary and middle schools, this includes a measurement of how many students are chronically absent. For schools with middle school grades, it also includes a measurement of how many students take Algebra I in eighth grade.

#### **Student Growth**

This school outperforms 60% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 50% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of Student Growth. Additionally, this school is meeting 100% percentage of its performance targets in the area of Student Growth.

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

### **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**






### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**








## NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy - Grade Level - 04




#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 04



#### COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS PASSAIC

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Students in both elementary and middles schools begin to demonstrate college readiness behaviors long before they even enter high school. 



### Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**























## **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**






### **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**













## **Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent**






## **Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup**








