

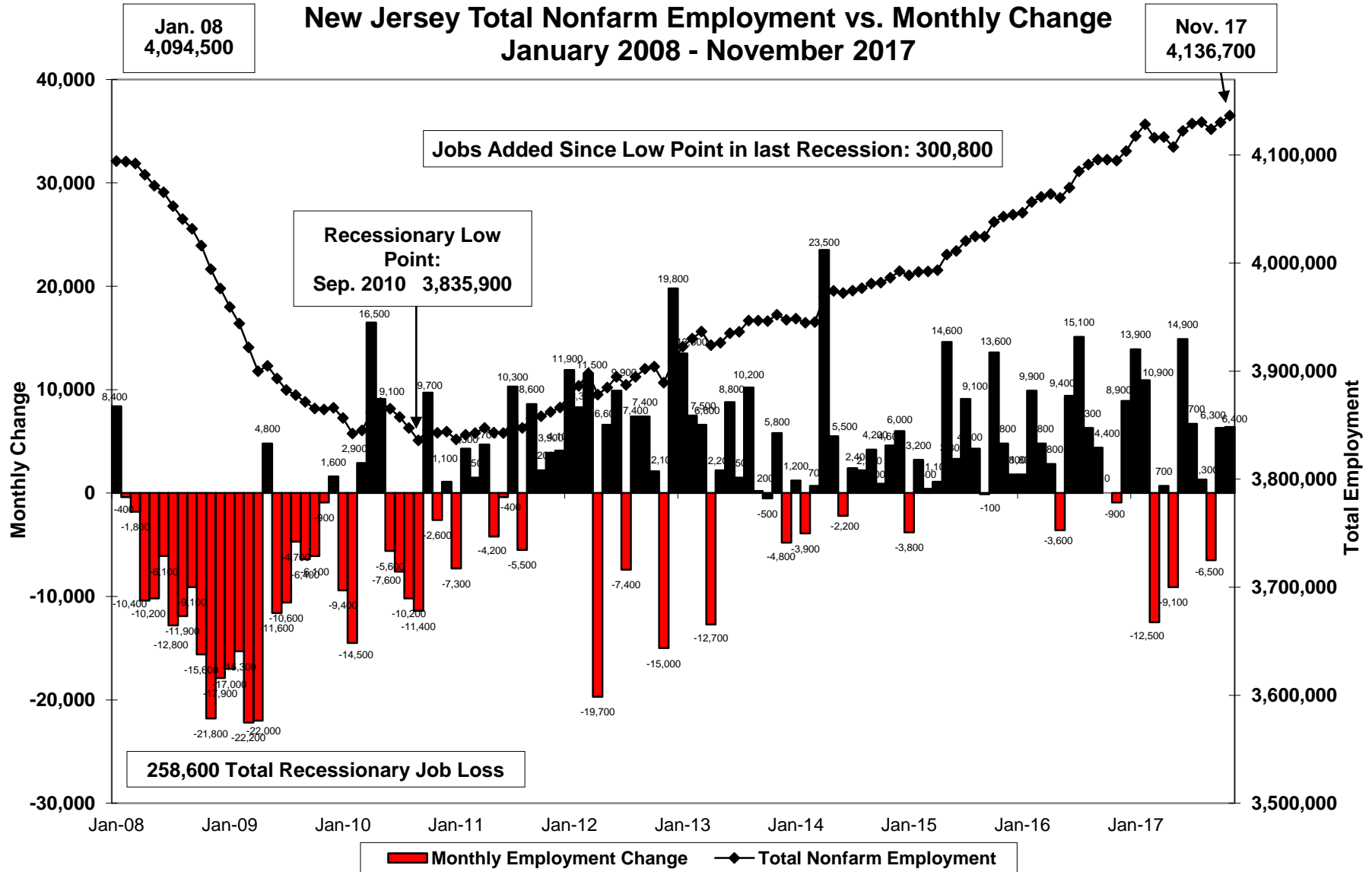

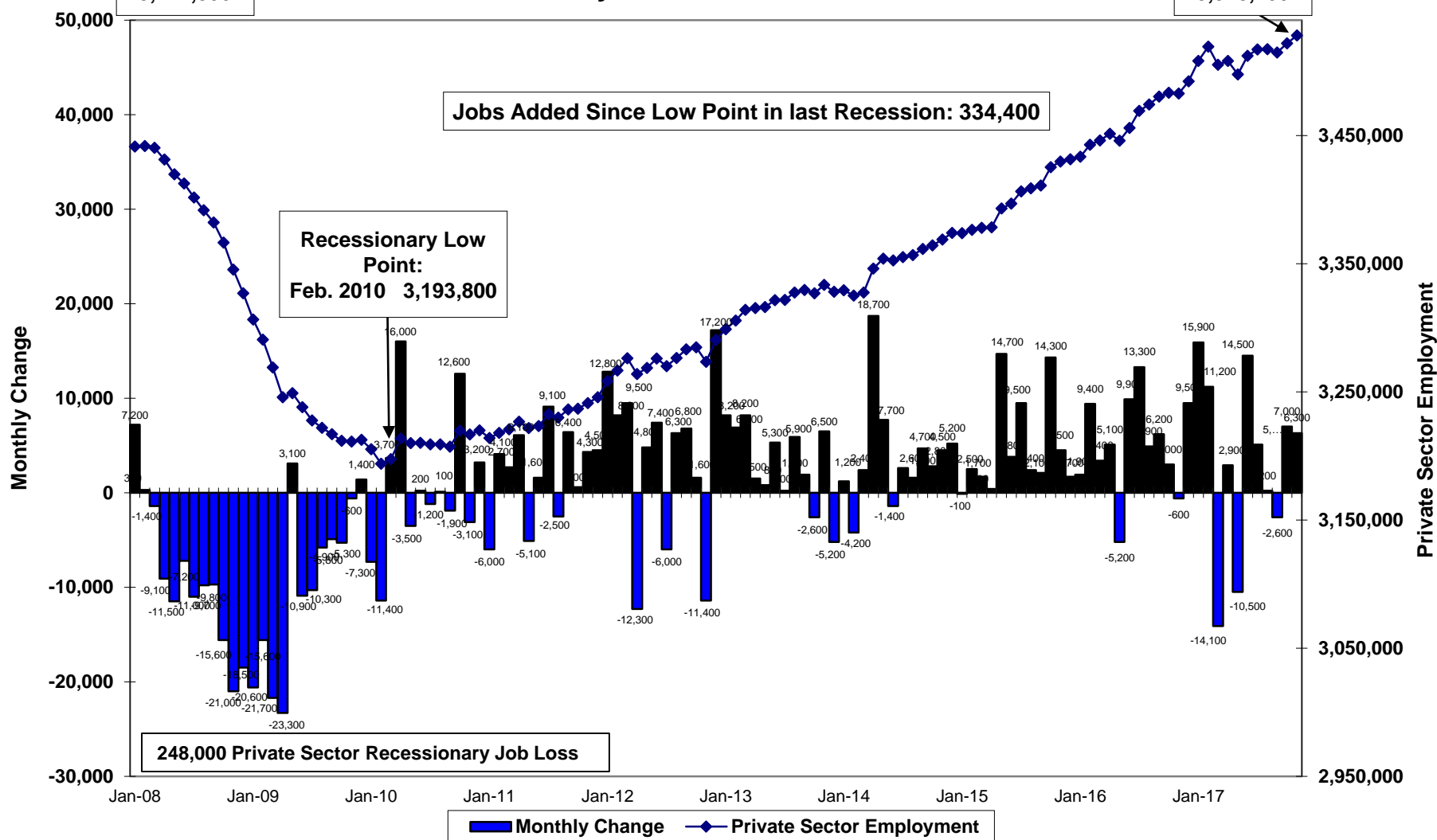

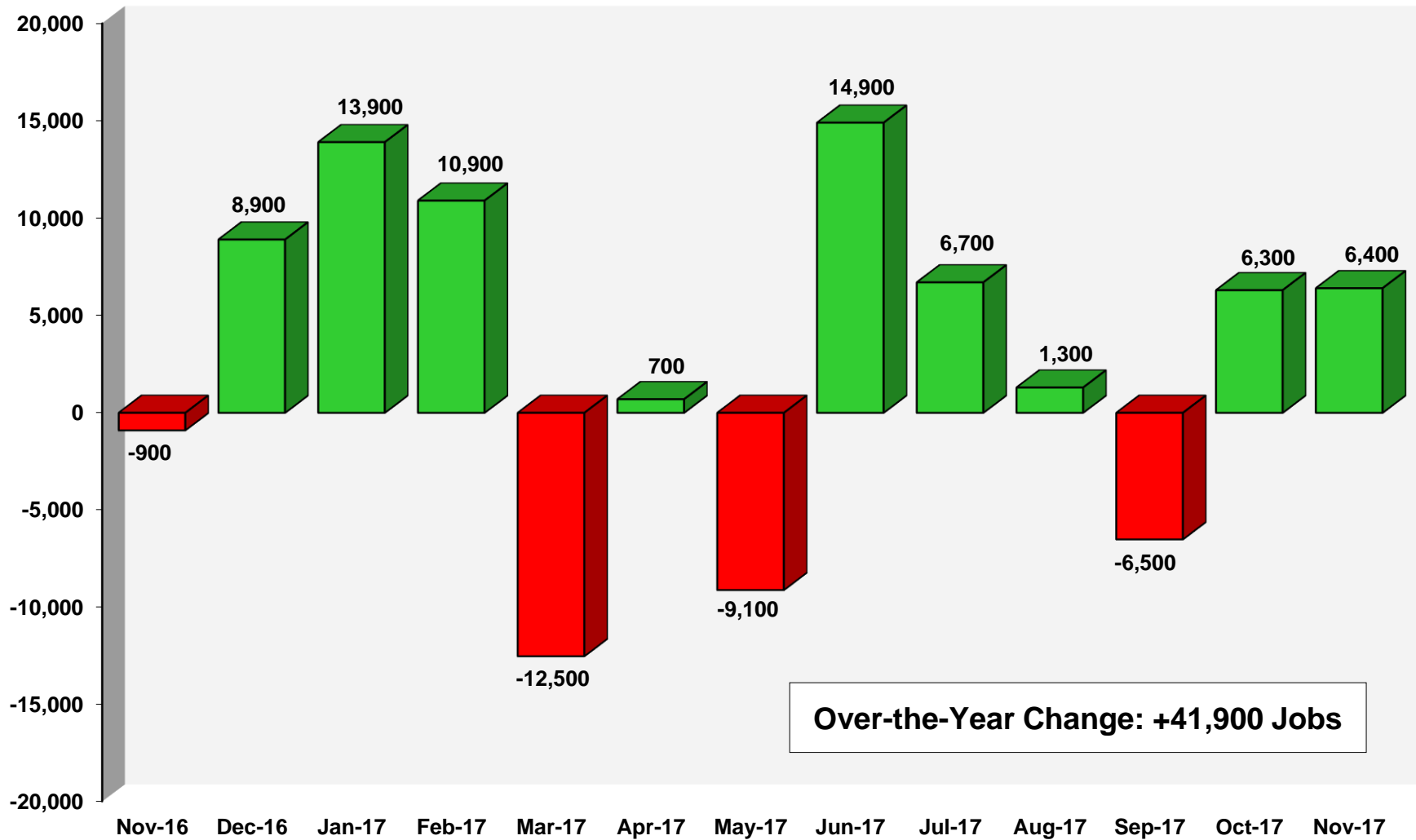
New Jersey Total Nonfarm Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - November 2017



New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - November 2017



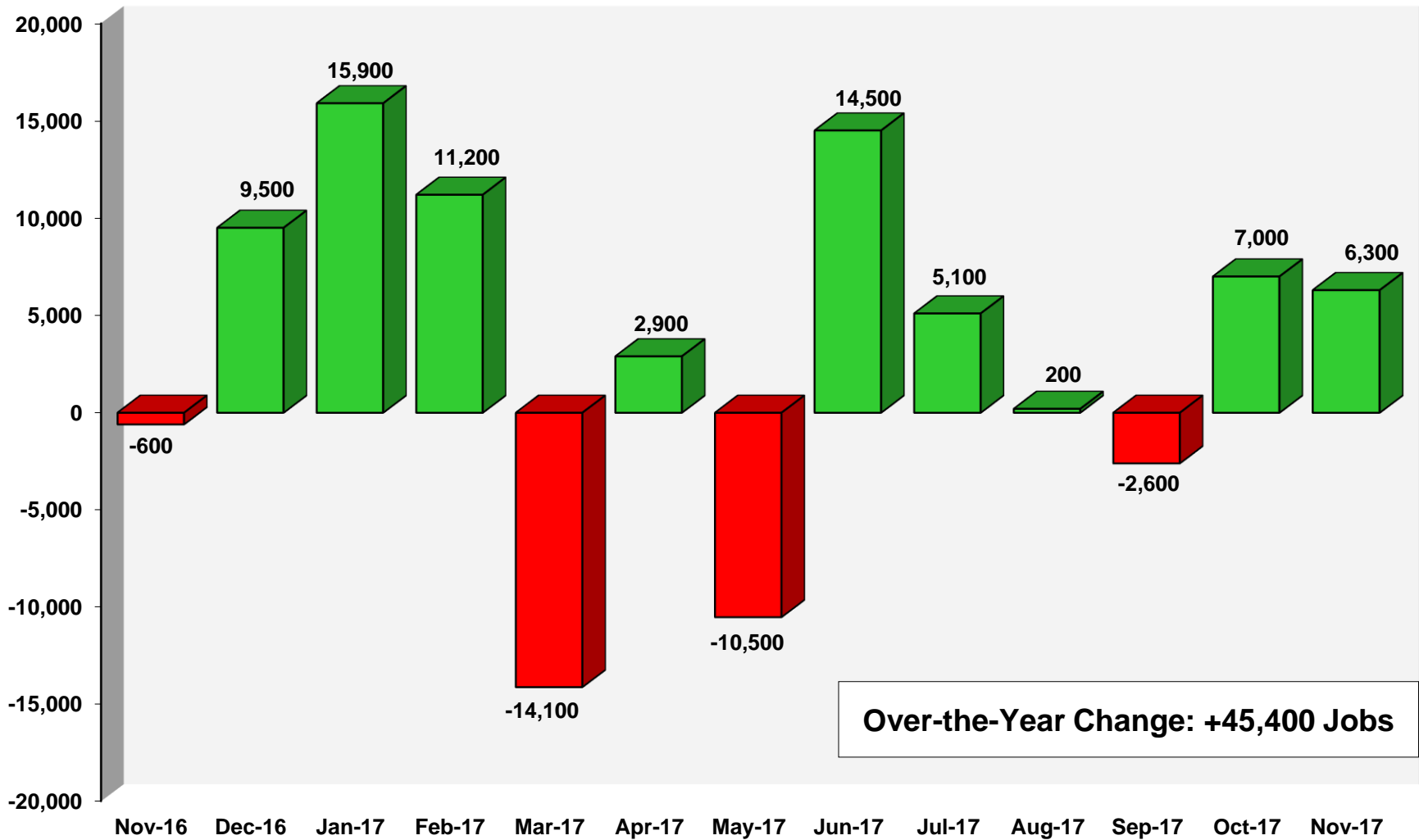
Monthly Total Employment Change New Jersey: November 2016 - November 2017



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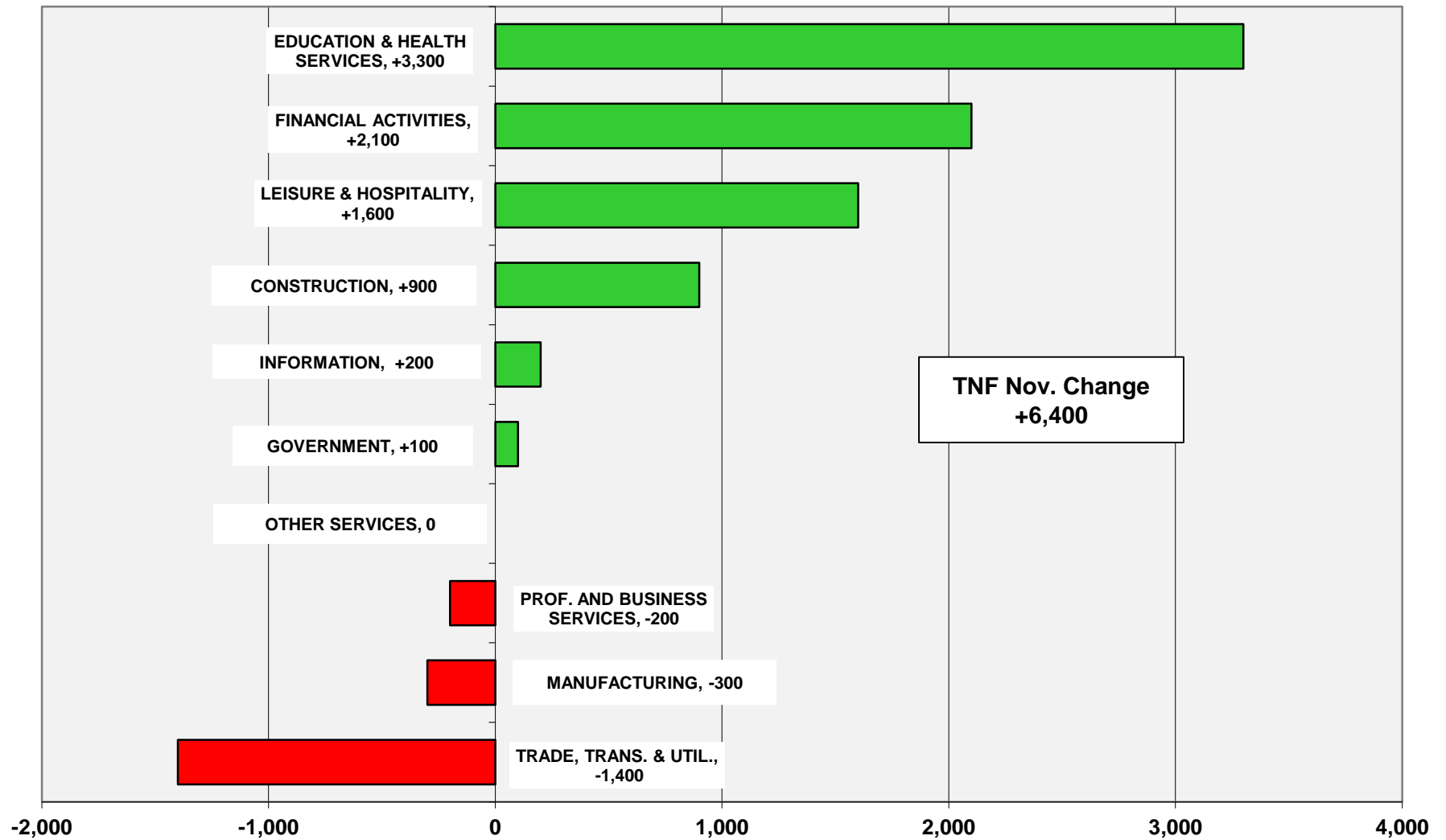
Monthly Private Sector Employment Change November 2016 - November 2017



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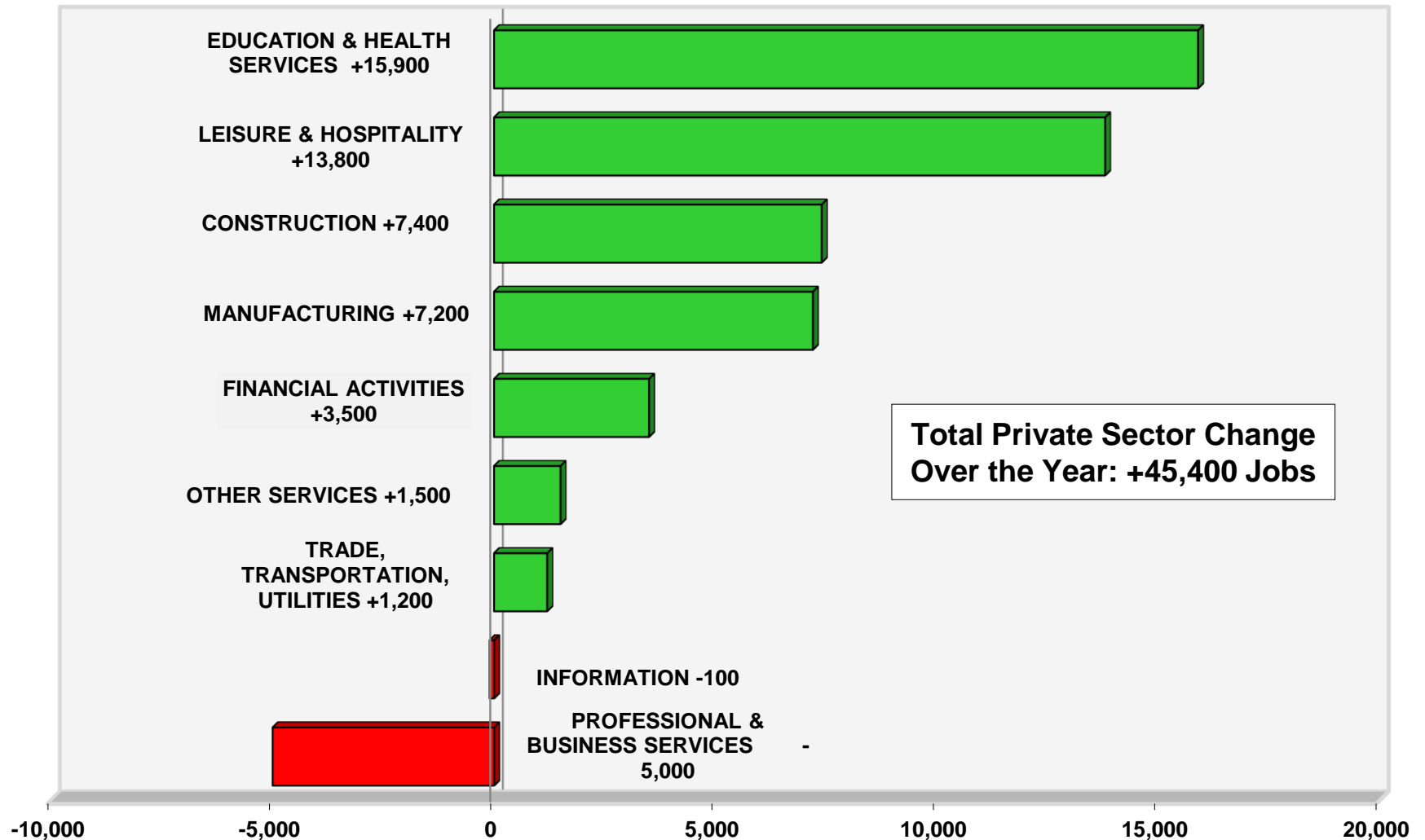

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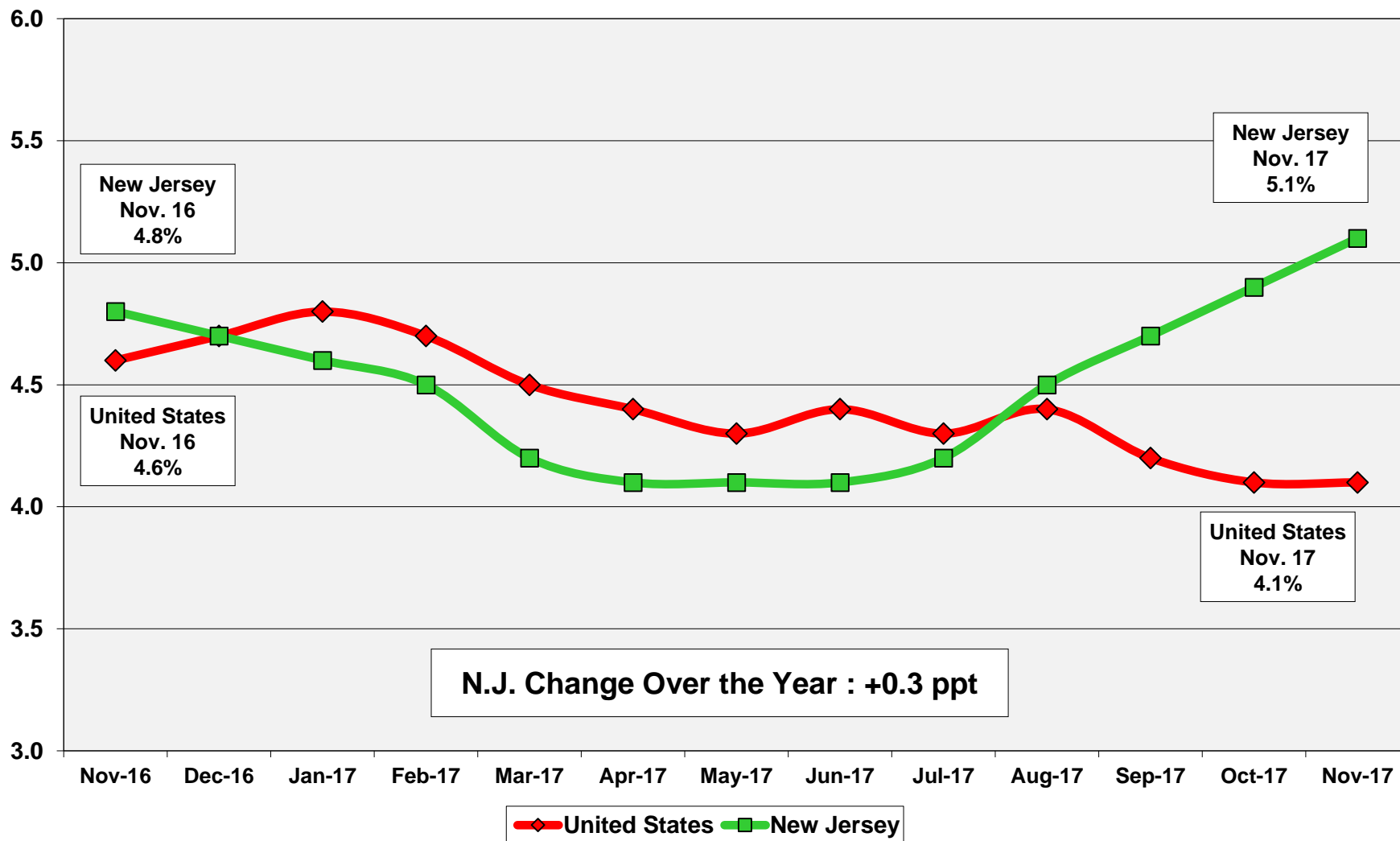
New Jersey Private Sector Employment Change by Industry November 2016 - November 2017



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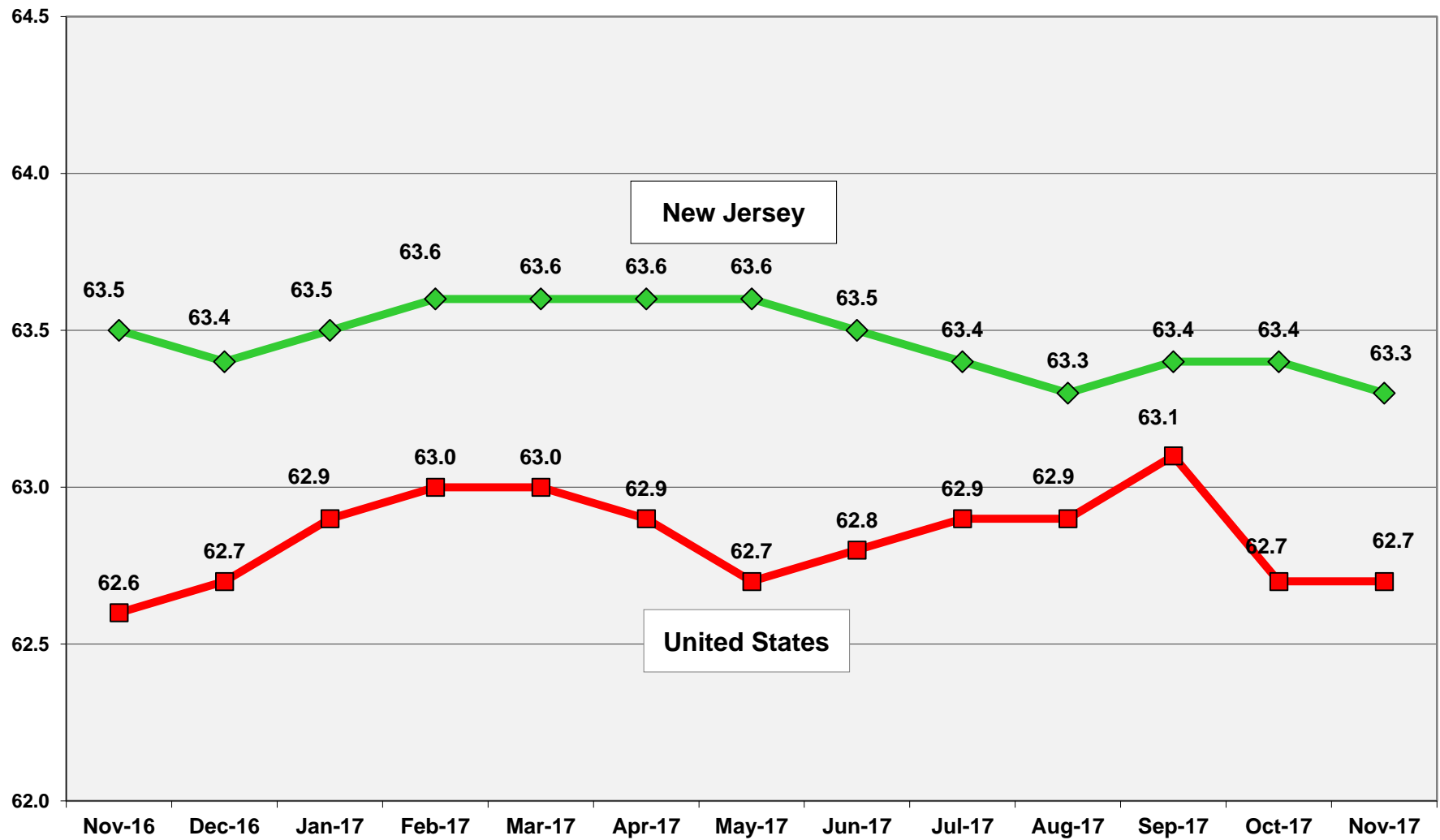
Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States November 2016 - November 2017



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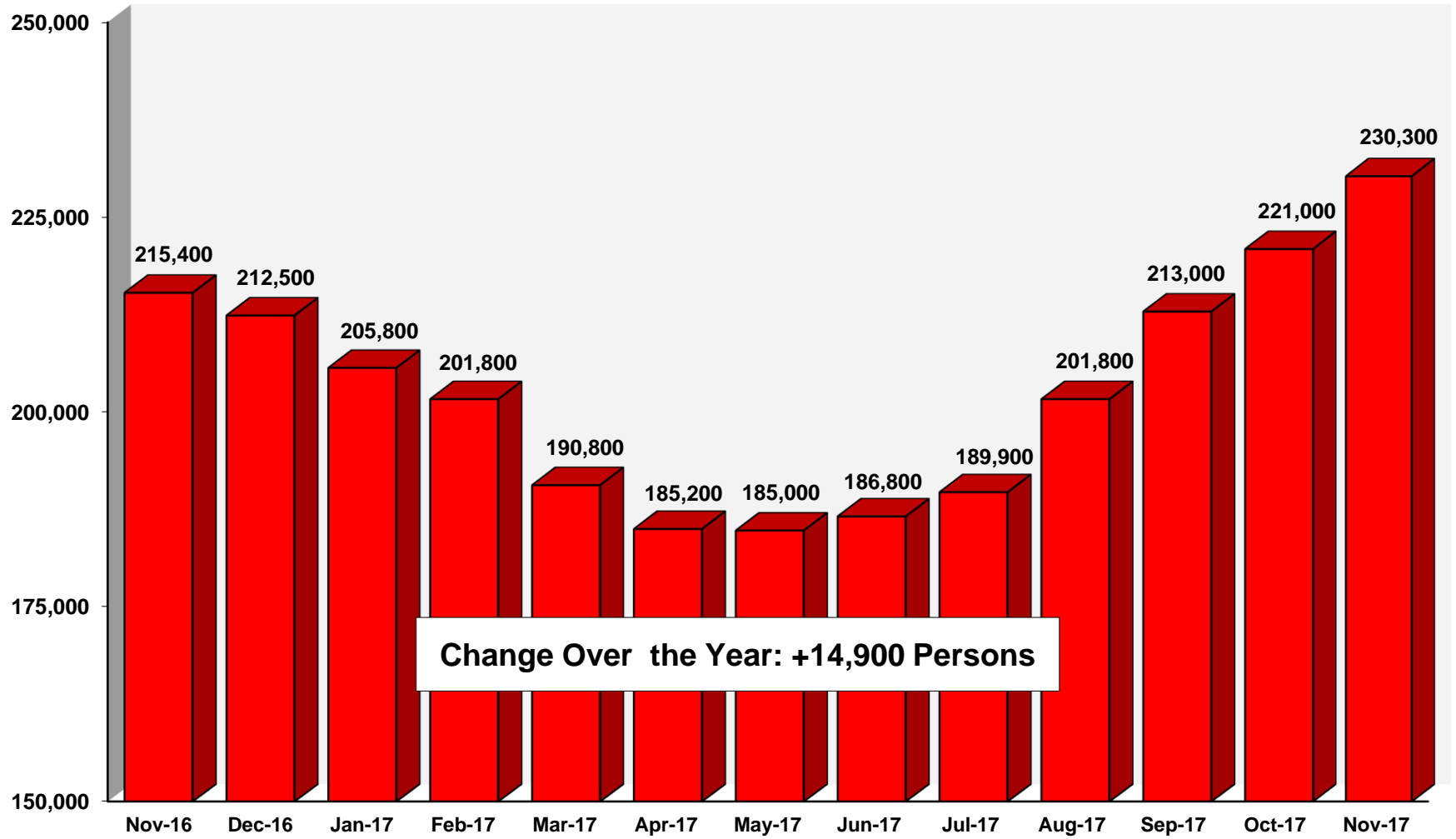
New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: November 2016 - November 2017



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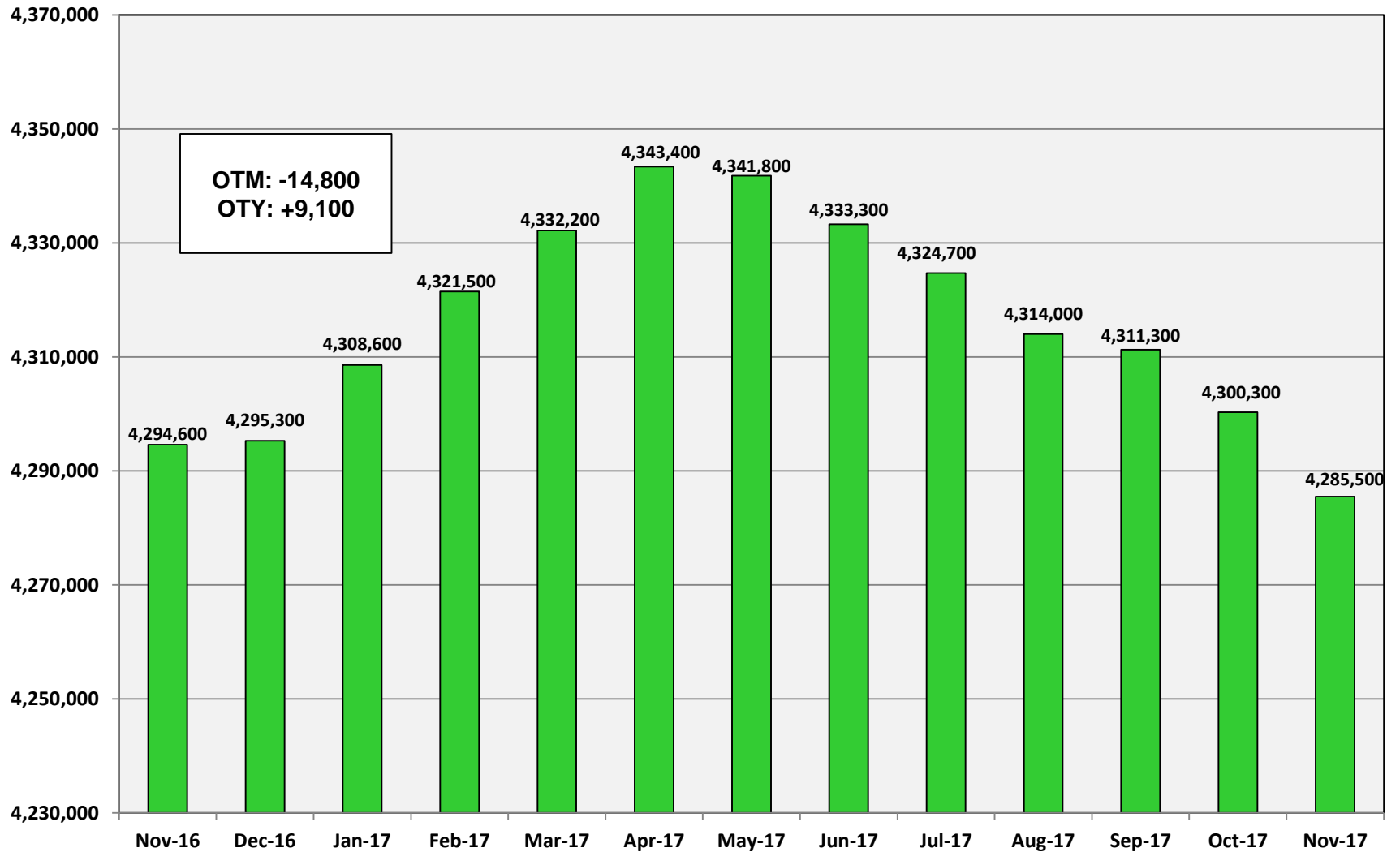
Unemployed New Jersey Residents November 2016 - November 2017



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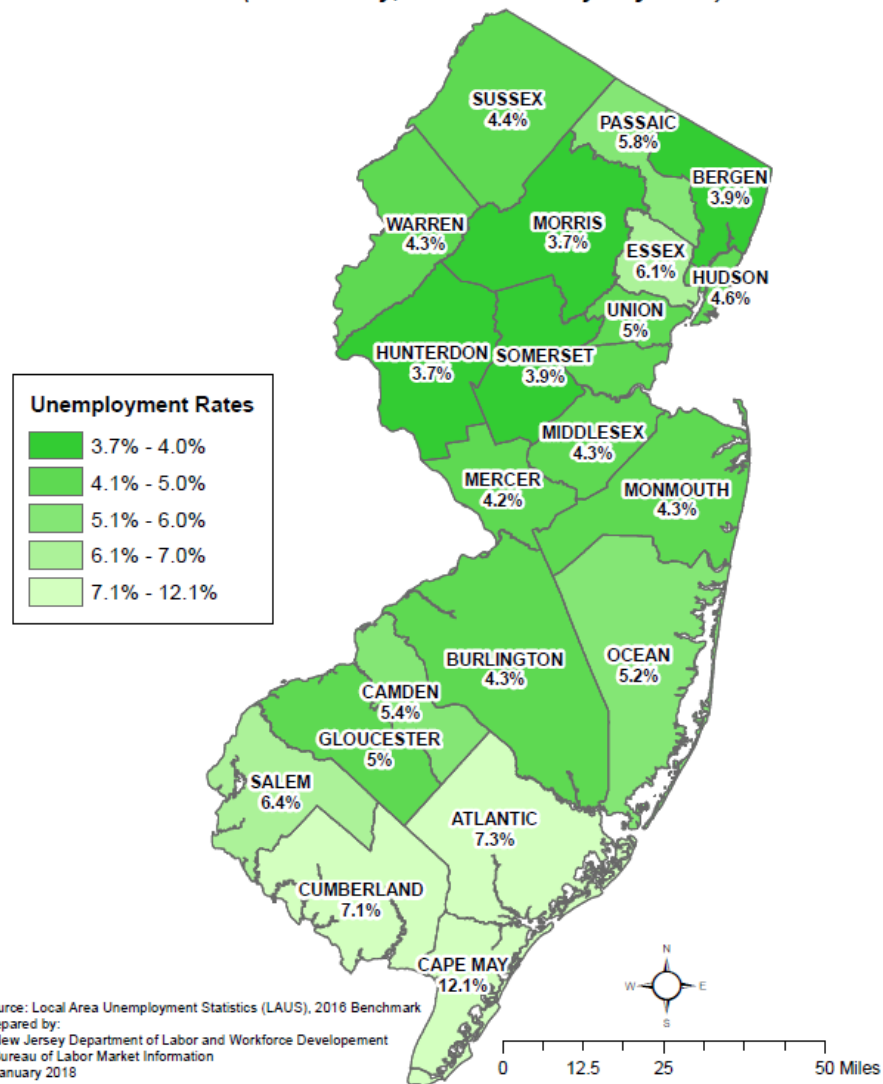
New Jersey Employed Residents: November 2016 - November 2017



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New Jersey Counties Unemployment Rates - November 2017 (Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)



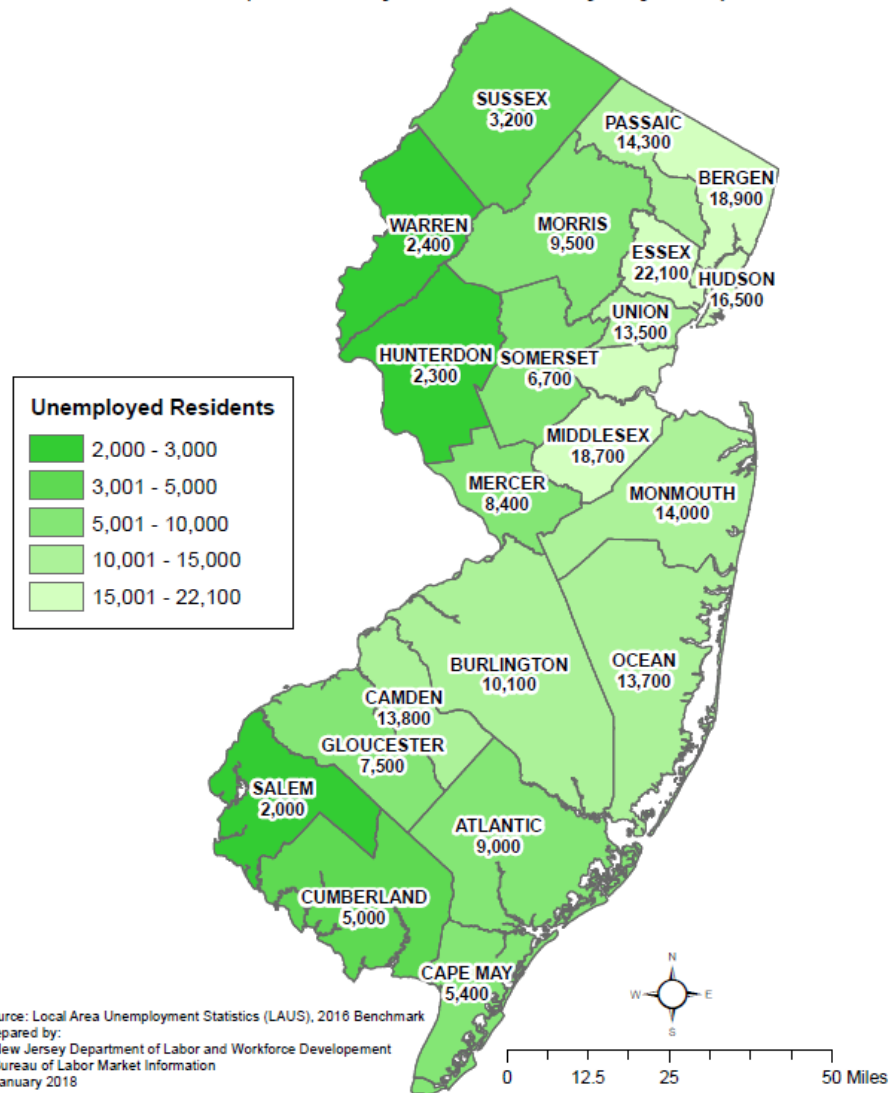

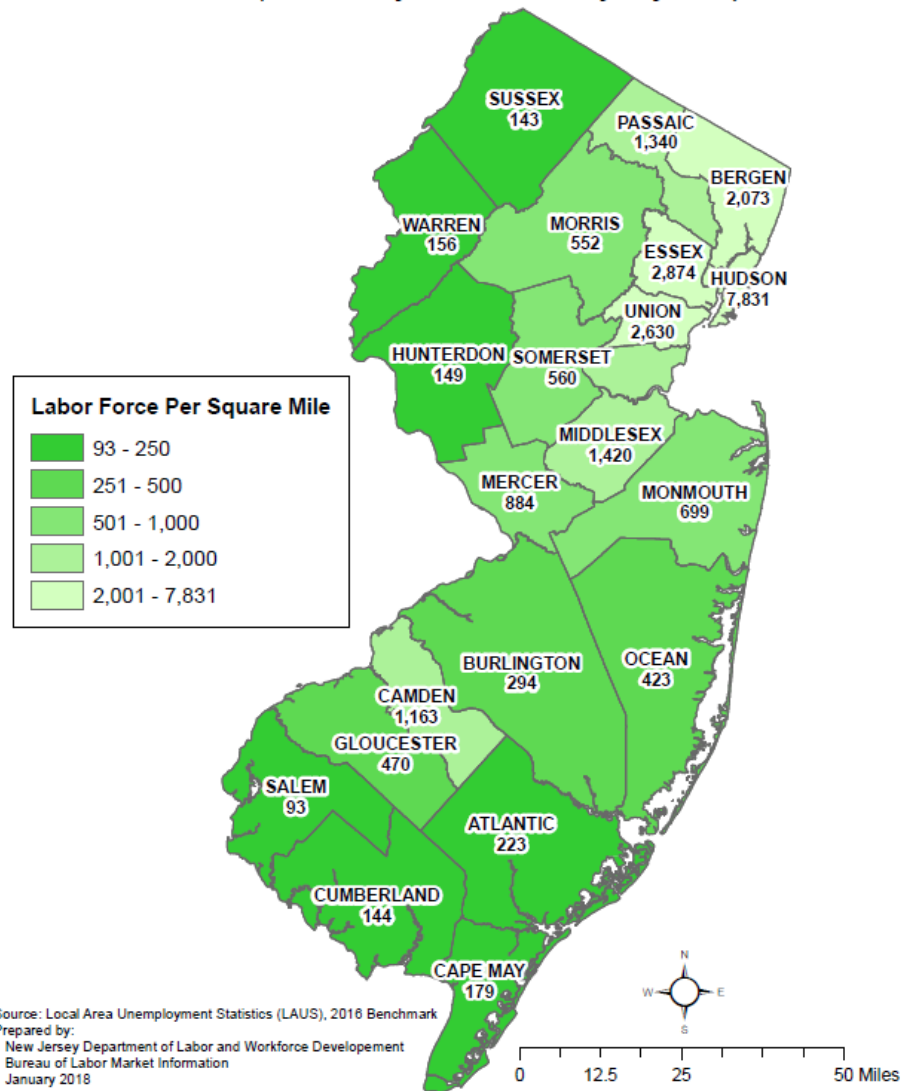

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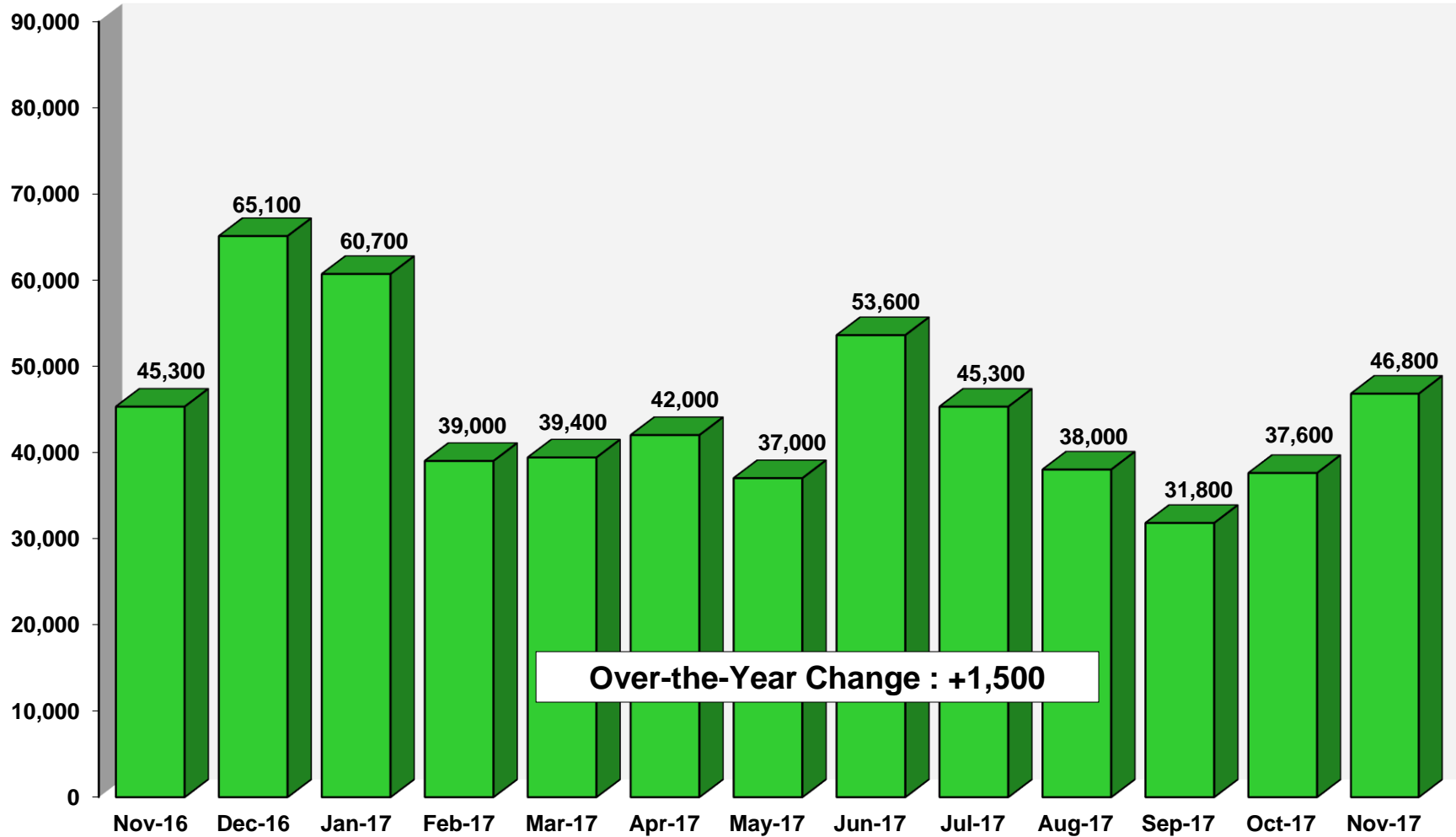
New Jersey Counties
