

# 2015-2016 School Performance Reports

The New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) presents the 2015-16 School Performance Reports. These reports are designed to inform parents, educators and communities about how well a school is performing and preparing its students for college and careers. In particular, the School Performance Reports seek to:

- Focus attention on metrics that are indicative of college and career readiness.
- **Benchmark** a school's performance against other schools that are educating similar students, against district and state-wide outcomes, and against state targets to illuminate and build upon a school's strengths and identify areas for improvement.
- **Improve** educational outcomes for students by providing both longitudinal and growth data so that progress can be measured as part of an individual school's efforts to engage in continuous improvement.

While the New Jersey School Performance Reports seek to bring more information to educators and stakeholders about the performance of schools, they do not seek to distill the performance of schools into a single metric, a single score, or a simplified conclusion. Instead, the intention is that educators and stakeholders will engage in meaningful conversations about the full range of the data presented. While the School Performance Reports bring attention to important student outcomes, the NJDOE does not collect data about other essential elements of a school, such as the provision of opportunities to participate and excel in extracurricular activities; the development of non-cognitive skills; the pervasiveness of a positive school culture or climate; or the attainment of other employability and technical skills, as many of these data are beyond both the capacity and resources of schools to measure.






This graph displays the percentages of students by ethnic/racial subgroup defined by the ESEA Waiver.

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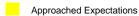



This graph presents the percentage of students who met or exceeded expectations for the past two years.











This graph displays the percentage of students who scored in each category for the past three school years.



#### 2015 National Assessment Educational Progress (NAEP)

The national assessment of education progress (NAEP) is the largest national assessment of what our nation's students know and can do. NAEP assesses fourth-, eighth- and twelfth-grade students in subjects such as reading, mathematics, science and writing. The reporting of NAEP scores on state report cards is a federal mandate. The results of NAEP are also published as the Nation's Report Card and are available for the nation, states, and, in some cases, urban districts. The NAEP scores on the report card include grades four and eight reading, math and science scores for New Jersey which are the last scores published.




#### Absenteeism




### **Enrollment by Gender**

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




# **Enrollment Trends by Special Population**




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### **PARCC Math Performance Trends**



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
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
### AP/ IB Test Performance


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


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
#### Absenteeism



# 2015-2016 School Performance Reports

The New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) presents the 2015-16 School Performance Reports. These reports are designed to inform parents, educators and communities about how well a school is performing and preparing its students for college and careers. In particular, the School Performance Reports seek to:

- **Focus** attention on metrics that are indicative of college and career readiness.
- **Benchmark** a school's performance against other schools that are educating similar students, against district and state-wide outcomes, and against state targets to illuminate and build upon a school's strengths and identify areas for improvement.
- Improve educational outcomes for students by providing both longitudinal and growth data so that progress can be measured as part of an individual school's efforts to engage in continuous improvement.

While the New Jersey School Performance Reports seek to bring more information to educators and stakeholders about the performance of schools, they do not seek to distill the performance of schools into a single metric, a single score, or a simplified conclusion. Instead, the intention is that educators and stakeholders will engage in meaningful conversations about the full range of the data presented. While the School Performance Reports bring attention to important student outcomes, the NJDOE does not collect data about other essential elements of a school, such as the provision of opportunities to participate and excel in extracurricular activities; the development of non-cognitive skills; the pervasiveness of a positive school culture or climate; or the attainment of other employability and technical skills, as many of these data are beyond both the capacity and resources of schools to measure.




### Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




### Enrollment by Ethnic/ Racial Subgroup



This graph presents the percentage of students who met or exceeded expectations for the past two years.














#### Absenteeism

- Benchmark a school's performance against other schools that are educating similar students, against district and state-wide outcomes, and against state targets to illuminate and build upon a school's strengths and identify areas for improvement.
- **Improve** educational outcomes for students by providing both longitudinal and growth data so that progress can be measured as part of an individual school's efforts to engage in continuous improvement.

While the New Jersey School Performance Reports seek to bring more information to educators and stakeholders about the performance of schools, they do not seek to distill the performance of schools into a single metric, a single score, or a simplified conclusion. Instead, the intention is that educators and stakeholders will engage in meaningful conversations about the full range of the data presented. While the School Performance Reports bring attention to important student outcomes, the NJDOE does not collect data about other essential elements of a school, such as the provision of opportunities to participate and excel in extracurricular activities; the development of non-cognitive skills; the pervasiveness of a positive school culture or climate; or the attainment of other employability and technical skills, as many of these data are beyond both the capacity and resources of schools to measure.




#### Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




## **Enrollment Trends by Special Population**

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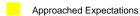




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### **PARCC Math Performance Trends**




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






# Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




## **Enrollment Trends by Special Population**




### **Enrollment by Gender**

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




### Enrollment by Ethnic/ Racial Subgroup

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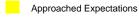



This graph presents the percentage of students who met or exceeded expectations for the past two years.











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
#### Absenteeism




#### Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




#### Enrollment by Ethnic/ Racial Subgroup

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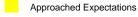



This graph presents the percentage of students who met or exceeded expectations for the past two years.











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
#### Absenteeism




#### **Enrollment by Gender**

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




#### Enrollment by Ethnic/ Racial Subgroup


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### PARCC ELA Performance Trends

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


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#### **PARCC Math Performance Trends**




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








#### Chronic Absenteeism Trend




## Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




## **Enrollment Trends by Special Population**




### Enrollment by Gender

This graph displays the percentage of students by gender for the past three school years.




### Enrollment by Ethnic/ Racial Subgroup

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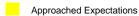









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
#### Absenteeism
