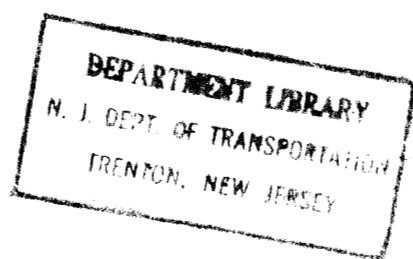

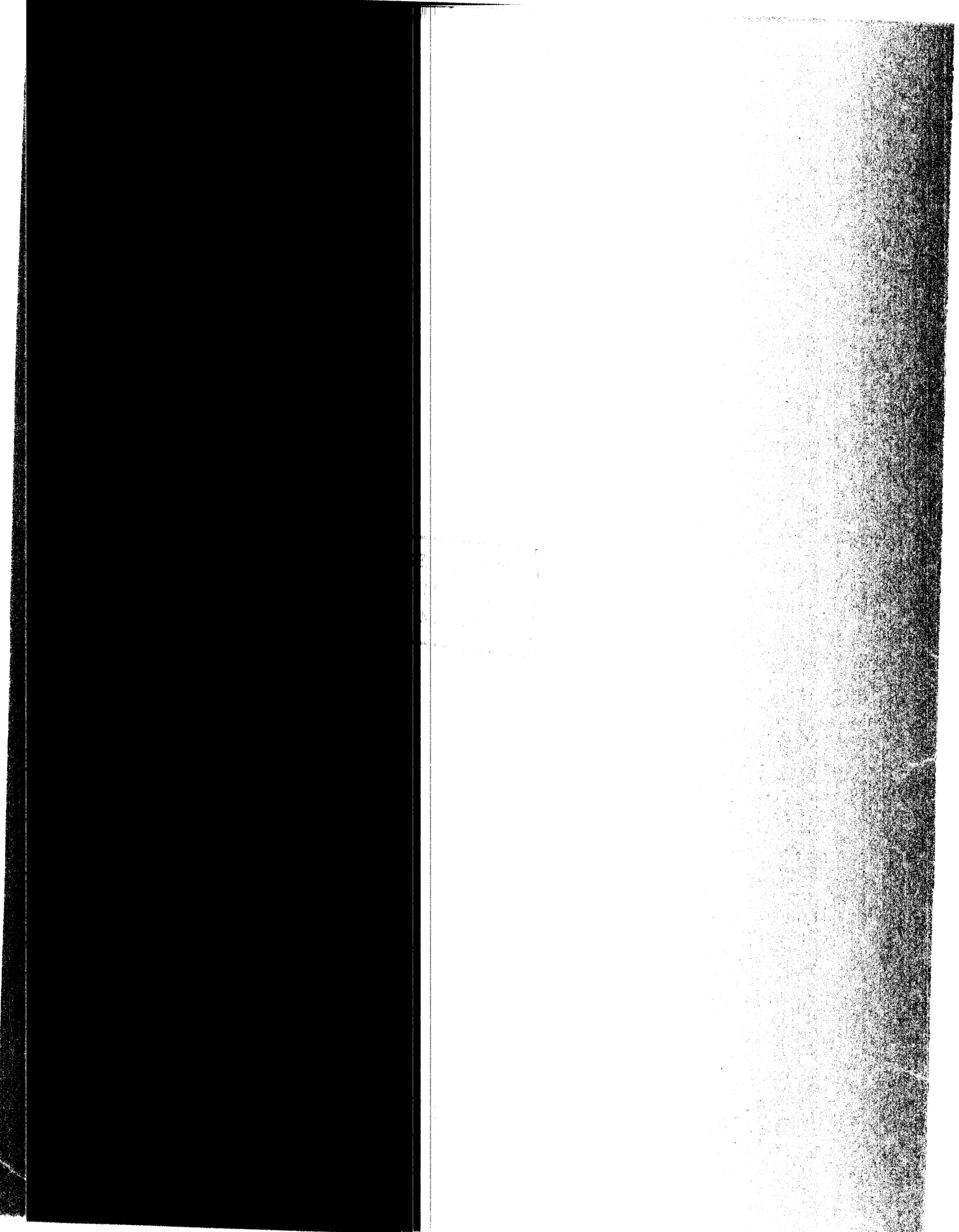

GRAPHS SHOW RATE OF POPULATION INCREASE OR DECREASE FOR THE CENSUS YEARS 1880-1960

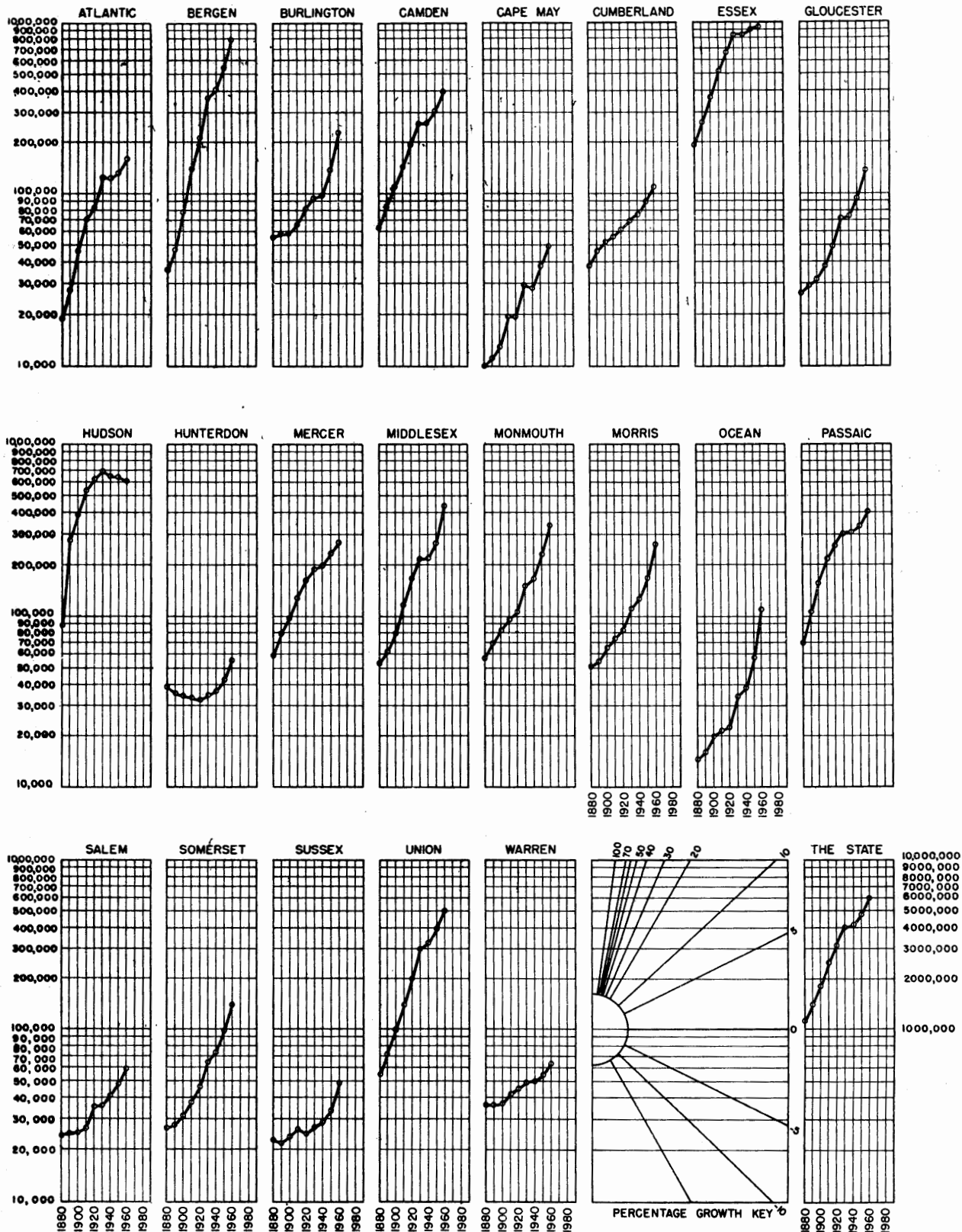

As one of the Thirteen Original States, New Jersey had a long and interesting population history. In 1790, it had a population of 184,139 persons. In 1960, 170 years later, the population of the State was more than 33 times as large, with 6,066,793 heads counted.

In the first 60 years of the 20th Century, the population of New Jersey increased from 1,883,669 to 6,066,793. This was a gain of 4,183,124 or more than 222%.

New Jersey's 184,139 residents of 1790 represented 4.7% of the total population of the United States. With our nation's boundaries and peoples moving westward, New Jersey's share of the total population decreased decade after decade until sometime between 1850 and 1860, when the trend was reversed. Since then the state has failed to advance its relative share only in one ten-year period (1930-1940).

Over this whole period, the ten years between 1950 and 1960 showed the largest numerical increase, adding 1,231,464 persons in the decade. The State-wide population and increases over preceding census periods are shown below:

Introduction

This report is devoted to a study of the population trends which have occurred within the state of New Jersey from 1880 to the present time. Tabulations have been made concerning changes in the number of total inhabitants in various areas throughout the state, changes in population densities, and shifts from urban to suburban - rural living.

Current population data made available by the United States Bureau of the Census in its Final Report on the 1960 Census of Population was the primary source for this report.

Population Changes

It is well known that births, less deaths and migration are the two main factors causing population growth. In most cases, increases in the number of inhabitants in a given area cannot be attributed to either of these factors alone, but instead, must be studied as a combination of these factors with different weights or measures of significance placed on each one accordingly. This balance between births, deaths, and migration varies throughout the history of man's existence. By isolating census data for various decades, and studying the history of events - sociological, economic, political - which occurred during the period under study, it is possible to qualitatively rank, according to their significance, each of the above mentioned causal factors.

By analysis similar to the type described, leading demographers have determined that the source of the recent rise of world population is due to an excess of births over deaths, over an extended period of time. Further, modern medicines, improved public health, and a higher standard of living have helped to reduce many of the risks of death, prolonging the life span.

Natural increase as a source of growth is obtainable by higher birth rates, and is the chief means of growth in certain regions of the world. However, a major factor in population expansion in New Jersey is migration. In the 1950 - 1960 period, 47% of the net increase in New Jersey's population was due to migration. In this present rapidly changing world with extremely rapid forms of transportation, it is not unreasonable to expect that interstate migration will play an even greater role in population growth than it has in the past.

It has been stated by Dr. George W. Barclay, in his book, Techniques of Population Analysis, that . . . "migration is the most potent source of change in the size of a population." This is not difficult to believe when one considers the wide range of variables which may act as either positive or negative stimuli -- political climate, state of the economy, natural resources, climate conditions, health standards. Any one or a combination of these variables is capable of causing changes in the composition of a country's inhabitants and its rate of growth.

Demographers use three principal measurements in evaluating population-expansion: (a) observed changes in the total number of people, (b) a current process of replacement, and (c) changes in the size of various classes of the population, such as age groups, gender, race and color, marital status.

This report is devoted to an analysis of population trends within the state of New Jersey during the period 1900-1960, with particular weight placed on the state's comparative standing within the United States.

Population Trends

The character of New Jersey as a state is such that it is all but impossible to postulate "trends" of population over long periods of time particularly in specific areas. Concentration of people tend to follow industrial development, and in the areas where such development predominates, the patterns differ widely from the areas, for instance, where

agriculture is most important.

For segments of the state, however, it is apparent that significant changes are taking place in the population of New Jersey which represent new and altered patterns of growth. A study of these changes in perspective with those that have occurred in past decades is useful to the businessman, labor leader, agriculturist, educator, social scientist, and to the average citizen. A chronological study of the rate of growth of the various counties is particularly useful.

Undoubtedly, some counties fared better than others. The important point is to know which counties grew and which were relatively dormant, and to determine the factors that were operative. This is often difficult to do, since usually a complexity of factors are responsible. Ocean County is a notable exception, where it can be definitely determined that the opening of the Garden State Parkway was the major cause of migration into the area. A sharply upward trend may level off, or even fall slightly, or a slow upward trend might show a sudden increase.

Comparison of the county rate of population expansion in the period 1800-1900 reveals one type of growth. In general, this pattern of growth was one of relatively slow but continuous population expansion, the reason lying in the fact that New Jersey was rural and primarily agricultural during the 1800's, in spite of a booming industrialization in some areas. Such communities have a tendency to grow by small increments.

Scrutiny of the population figures shows that the seeds of the 20th-century urban-industrial development were present as far back as 1850. The growth of four counties-Hudson, Essex, Camden, and Passaic support this view. The growth of these counties was phenomenal in comparison to the slow, steady pattern of the other counties. In 1800, the four population leaders with almost identical totals were Burlington,

Essex, Hunterdon, and Monmouth counties. Comparison of these same counties in 1900 shows Essex with approximately 16 times the 1800 total, and Hunterdon, Burlington, and Monmouth with only 2, 3, and 4 times the 1800 total, respectively.

Hudson County, established in 1840, rose from obscurity to surpass all other counties in rate of growth and total numbers by 1900. Several counties, Sussex, Hunterdon, and Gloucester, had the slowest rate of growth, failing to reach a 100% increase in the 1800-1900 period. The average for all other counties was an 892% increase.

In the 1900-1960 period, the population of some of the counties became predominantly urban and industrial. Using the state's percentage gain (220.1) as an average, it is possible to evaluate the relative position of each county. The counties with greater growth than the state's 220.1 percent of growth are:

The most rapid rate of growth took place in the northern counties of the state, the industrialized metropolitan section, with the single exception of Ocean County, and although Hudson and Essex counties are the core of this section, their percentage increases were far less than the average for the state. The greatest increases took place in the periphery of this metropolitan area - Bergen, Middlesex, Union, Somerset and Monmouth counties. The evident trend is towards decentralization to the outer fringe of the metropolitan area.

Many shifts have taken place in the relative position of the 21 counties in the 1900-60 period. In the three decades 1900-30, Bergen County had the greatest percentage increase. In the 1930-40 decade, Salem County took the lead, and in both 1940-50 and 1950-60, Ocean County had the greatest percentage increase. The significance of this shift in growth is that several of the Southern counties are developing at a faster rate than the other counties. The depression of the thirties had the effect of leveling off some of the leading industrial counties of the north, giving southern counties the greatest percentage of increase.

In 1900-10 the population growth of all the counties averaged +34.7 percent. In this decade, the rate of growth was very rapid with all counties making substantial increases except Hunterdon, which actually decreased 2.7%. From 1910-30, the percent increase was not as high as that of the 1900-10 decade, but it was still high (26.2%). During the depression decade (1930-40) population growth practically ceased with many counties having decreases up to 5.6 percent, and with an average increase of only 2.9 percent for all counties. This is evidenced by the small increase compared to the 34.7 percent increase of the 1900-10 decade. The 1940-50 decade had a 16.2 percent increase, a substantial improvement over the depression decade, but moderate compared to the first three decades of the 20th century, with their average increase of 30%.

Table II shows the rankings of the various counties over the period 1880 to date. Essex has remained the largest in terms of population since 1920, only slipping to second place behind Hudson during the three decades 1890, 1900 and 1910. Hudson had no difficulty in maintaining second place until 1960. Bergen has been consistently gaining from thirteenth place in 1880 to second in 1960.

1960 Census of Population

According to the United States Bureau of Census, New Jersey's total April 1, 1960 population was 6,066,782.* This figure represents an increase of 1,231,453 or 25.5% over the decade.

A study of census reports over the past 60 years indicate that the number of inhabitants within the state has increased in varying degrees. This expansion of population has advanced New Jersey from a national ranking of 16th (1900) to its present national ranking of eighth (1950-1960) in terms of total population. Census recordings for the same period rank New Jersey 11th in 1910; 10th in 1920; 9th in both 1930 and 1940. (Table III)

New Jersey's population increase of 25.5% from 1950-1960 was much greater than the 16.2% gain in the previous ten-year period. It was 1.5% above the percentage gains in 1910, 9.5% below those of 1900, 4.5% and 2.5% below those of 1890 and 1880, respectively. It must be remembered, however, that the higher rates of population increase during the last half of the 19th century and the beginning of the 20th century were strongly influenced by successive waves of immigration. During the 1940-1950 decade, immigration was a negligible factor, but in 1950-60 almost half of the state's net increase was due to migration, not from abroad, but from other states.

This 1950-60 increase of 25.5% puts New Jersey to the fore again, with only Connecticut's 26.3% increase exceeding this gain among the older, more established, industrial states, and a national average increase of 18.5%.

Within the state, regional growth has shown some important differences. Of the four areas which are classified as urban, the urban fringe areas showed the greatest gains, emphasizing decentralization

tendencies, pushing outward from the cities. The rates of change on the last enumeration ranged from a decline of 5.7% for Hudson County to an increase of 91.2% for Ocean County. Nine counties recorded numerical gains of 50,000 or more--Bergen, Burlington, Camden, Middlesex, Monmouth, Morris, Ocean, Passaic, and Union. Bergen, Monmouth and Union Counties increased their population by 50,000 in each of the two decades between the 1940-1960 period.. Of New Jersey's twenty-one counties Essex, with a population of 923,545, is the most populated for the second straight decade; the smallest is Cape May with, 48,555 inhabitants.

Predominantly Urban State

Data recently released by the United States Census Bureau puts New Jersey's urban population at 5,374,369, or 88.58% of the state's population. This figure represents a 2% increase when the 1960 urban ratio is compared with that of the previous decade. The 1950 and 1960 censuses revealed that New Jersey is the most urbanized state in the United States. The 28.4% increase in urban inhabitants over the recent decade indicates that New Jersey has maintained its urban growth. Although the urban population as a whole has increased, it is interesting to note that five cities with populations greater than 100,000, experienced declines in their total number of inhabitants over the past decade---Trenton, 10.8%; Jersey City, 7.7%; Newark, 7.7%; Camden, 5.9% and Elizabeth, 4.5%. One can speculate as to the whereabouts of the people who left the city during the 50's. It is apparent that the declines occurred in the older cities within the state and that these cities have limited land area available for expansion. Therefore it is safe to assume that those persons who have left the city have become part of the urban fringe. It is likely that this trend will continue until adequate redevelopment measures are taken.

Of the state's total inhabitants, 692,413 are rural dwellers. Percentagewise, over the past 10 years the greatest increase (149.9%) in population has taken place in urban places with 10,000 or more inhabitants. Population figures for each of New Jersey's twenty-one counties are presented in the tables which follow this text. (Table IV)

The population of New Jersey during 1960 was three times as great as in 1900. Naturally, the density of population per square mile has increased in the same ratio, with the land area of the state remaining the same.

Population Density

In terms of population density, New Jersey, with a recording of 806.5 inhabitants per square mile, ranks second only to Rhode Island's 812. based on 1960 Department of Commerce tabulations of United States land areas for the second straight decade.

Density figures for the years 1930, 1940, 1950 and 1960 show clearly that the areas of greatest concentration of population have been growing outward from the New York metropolitan area and from the Philadelphia metropolitan area. The average density of the state as a whole in 1960 of 807 persons per square mile varies widely, from a recording of 39,497 in West New York, over 37,000 in Bayonne and Hoboken, 20,000 in Jersey City and 16,786 in Newark, to a few persons per square mile (3.1) at the other end of the scale. Of our 568 municipalities, 309 had a density of over 1,000 persons per square mile. This indicates conclusively that there are large areas of open space throughout the state with intensive concentration in many specific areas. (Table V)

The population in rural areas is composed primarily of persons with non-farm-occupations who live in the country. The average density of rural farm population in New Jersey is only 14 persons per square mile. This low figure is more than likely due to the increased efficiency of farm production and a movement of people away from farm areas.

Future Population Growth

It is expected that by 1966 the United States will have nearly a tenth more people; a labor force of 79 million; a 6.5 million increase in the population of the Eastern and North-Central United States; and more crowded suburbs and cities. The most notable projection, however, is the one which establishes suburban expansion at 12 million or greater. The cities which already are becoming the primary places to work and are declining as places to live, will experience increased migration to the suburbs.

In line with the above projections, it is reasonable to expect greater population gains throughout the state. New Jersey can be expected to have a large increase in suburban growth, increased encroachment by housing developers on existing farm areas, and population losses in many of the central cities (unless adequate redevelopment projects are provided).

The charts and tables provided in this report present a detailed breakdown of primary population trends within the state. Included are comparisons with the Censuses of 1930, 1940, 1950, and 1960 for all municipalities and counties of New Jersey, and with the Censuses of 1880, 1890, 1900, 1910, and 1920 for all counties. (Table VI)

Also are shown the size of New Jersey in relation to some other states, and the relative sizes of the counties of the state, and how these have changed over a period of years.

A later report will deal with characteristics as shown in the 1960 Census, such as Densities, Age Groups, Sex, Color, Marital Status, Urban and Rural areas and Number of Households.
