
Unemployment Insurance (UI)

When you file, you will need:

- Social Security Number
- Alien registration number (if you are not a citizen)
- Recall date (if you expect to be recalled to your job)
- Union information, including local number and address (if you get your work through a union)
- Complete name, address, and telephone number of all employers you've had in the past 2 years
- Beginning and ending dates of each job and the reason for separation

- How UI benefits are calculated
- Potential Weekly Benefit Rate (WBR)
- Duration of a claim
- Maximum Benefit Rate
- Disability while claiming UI benefits
- Other information about UI

Unemployment Insurance (UI)

To file online:

To file your new unemployment claim online, you must meet the following requirements:

- You are a New Jersey resident
- All of your employment in the past 18 months was in New Jersey
- You did not work for the Federal Government in the past 18 months
- You were not in the military service in the past 18 months

One-Stop Career Centers

- Unemployment Insurance claimants must register at the One-Stop Career Center
- One-Stop hours are 8:30AM to 4:30PM, and some locations offer extended and weekend hours
- One-Stops are free and open to everyone
- You choose the intensity of service based on your needs
- Unemployment Insurance claimants may be called in for mandatory One-Stop workshops to continue receiving benefits

Individuals with Disabilities

The New Jersey Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Services (DVRS) is the One-Stop partner providing services that enable individuals with disabilities to find jobs.

Who qualifies for services?

Any individual with a physical or mental impairment substantially impeding employment may qualify for vocational rehabilitation services.

Foreign Trade Impacted Workers

The Trade Act program helps workers who have lost their jobs as a result of foreign trade. The Trade Act program offers a variety of benefits and services to eligible workers, including job training, income support, job search and relocation allowances, a tax credit to help pay the costs of health insurance, and a wage supplement to certain reemployed trade-affected workers 50 years of age and older.

Workers who believe they have been adversely affected by foreign trade, or others acting for those workers, may petition the U.S. Department of Labor (USDOL) for a determination of eligibility.

Older Workers (55+)

If You Are...

55 years of age or older, interested in paid work experience, and on a limited income you may qualify for free occupational training!

WorkForce 55+ has helped people find employment in these and other positions:

Clerk, Typist, Food Service Worker, Receptionist, Reservations Clerk, Retail Sales Associate, Floral Arranger, Security Guard, Data Entry Operator, Bookkeeper, Certified Home Health Aide, Teacher's Aide, and Library Aide.

Self Employed

The Self Employment Assistance (SEA) Program helps qualified, unemployed individuals with starting a business in New Jersey.

Benefits of the SEA program include:

- SEA compensation replaces unemployment benefits
- No work search requirement while actively engaged in selfemployment activities
- Counseling and technical assistance in developing a business plan

Transitioning to A New Career

One-Stop resources can help you identify the skills you can bring to a new job. This can help you focus your resume and target your job search.

COBRA and New Jersey Continuation

Eligible individuals may have a 65% premium reduction for up to 9 months to continue group health coverage provided by a former employer.

NJHOPE

New Jersey Home Ownership Preservation Effort (NJHOPE) is a voluntary public/private alliance of government agencies, not-for-profit organizations, and financial institutions committed to enhancing home ownership preservation by raising consumer awareness of available mortgage products and funding, providing increased access to credit and loan counseling for those who need it, and providing temporary assistance to consumers who are in immediate danger of foreclosure.

Support Services – Utility Bill Assistance

NJSHARES

NJ SHARES is a non-profit corporation that provides assistance to individuals and families living in New Jersey who are in need of temporary help in paying their energy bills. To qualify for NJ SHARES, a person or family must be facing a financial crisis and not be eligible for welfare or other income-based energy assistance programs. Recipients must also have a history of good-faith payments of their utility bills. Applications for NJ SHARES grants can be made at any of the more than 150 participating social service agencies throughout the state. Upon approval, recipients may receive a one-time grant of up to \$700 for gas and up to \$300 for electric (or up to \$700 for an all-electric home).

NJ Judiciary Foreclosure Mediation Program

Foreclosure mediation is an opportunity for qualified homeowners who are facing foreclosure to receive help from housing counselors, attorneys, and a neutral mediator to resolve a loan delinquency. The program aims to assist homeowners avoid foreclosure by proposing work-out and payment arrangements that balance the interests of the borrower and lender.

The program is free. Mediators are ready to encourage every participant and mortgage lender to reach an amicable result.
