MEMORANDUM TO: THE HONORABLE JON S. CORZINE AND THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY

The New Jersey Wiretapping and Electronic Surveillance Control Act (N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-1 to -34) requires the Chief Justice to submit an annual report to the Governor and the Legislature (N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-23E). In accordance with that section, I am submitting this report to inform you of the operation of the Act during 2007.

N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-2(i) provides that only Superior Court judges designated by the Chief Justice are authorized to hear wiretap applications. For the year 2007, the following judges were authorized wiretap judges: by order dated April 26, 1994, Judges Kevin G. Callahan and Robert A. Longhi; by order dated July 22, 1997, Judge Linda R. Feinberg; by order dated December 3, 1997, Judge Samuel D. Natal; by order dated June 11, 1999, Judge Albert J. Garofolo; by order dated July 22, 1999, Judge Marilyn C. Clark; by order dated June 15, 2004, Judge B. Theodore Bozonelis; by order dated September 1, 2004, Judge Ronald B. Sokalski; by order dated December 27, 2004, Judge Maurice Gallipoli; by order dated July 1, 2005, Judge Maria M. Sypek; by order dated January 6, 2006, Judge John S. Triarsi; and by order dated May 26, 2007, Judge Travis L. Francis and Judge Lawrence M. Lawson.

The data for the year 2007 include reports of all orders granting permission to intercept wire, electronic and/or oral communications, or to perform electronic surveillance, for any period that ended in 2007. It is the actual termination date of the surveillance that governs which reports are included within the reporting year. During 2007, the reports to the Administrative Office of the Courts reflected 218 applications¹ seeking permission to intercept wire, electronic or oral communications. No applications were denied. Thus, in 2007 the authorized judges entered 218 orders granting permission to intercept wire, electronic and/or oral communications.

¹ Note that the Office of the Attorney General reports 249 applications. The numbers differ because of differences in reporting methods for the two reports. The Judiciary reports a wiretap in the year that it terminated. The Attorney General does not report a wiretap until the investigation in the case is complete.

Of the 218 orders entered, 204 permitted interception of wire communications, 5 permitted interception of electronic communication, and 4 permitted interception of oral communication. In addition, 5 applications were authorized for the retrieval of stored communication, rather than for the interception of wire, electronic and/or oral communication. There were 118 orders authorized for 30 days each, 96 were specified for 20 days each, and 4 others were authorized for less than 20 days each. Additionally, 123 extensions of previously entered orders were granted during the reporting year. Of these, 88 extensions were for 30 days and 0 extensions were for 20 days. There were another 35 extensions for 10 days or less.

N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-11 provides that in certain instances a showing of special need is required before an order for interception of wire, electronic and/or oral communication is to be granted. The reports made by the authorized judges indicate that in reporting year 2007, a showing of special need was required in 0 of the orders, a showing was not required in 126 orders, and the special need information was not available in 92 orders.

COURT-AUTHORIZED ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE 2007

Following is a summary of the attached 2007 electronic surveillance report.

- In 2007, 249 applications were made statewide for electronic surveillance orders. As a result of these applications, 249 orders were granted authorizing the use of electronic surveillance.
- Extensions were requested and granted for 91 intercept orders. In addition to the first extension granted in 91 instances, second extensions were granted in 36 instances.
- Of the total 249 orders granted, 216 authorized wire (telephone) intercepts, 22 orders authorized electronic communications intercepts and six authorized oral intercepts. In addition, five intercepts were granted for stored communications: two intercepts for computers and three for voice mail. Of the 249 orders granting electronic surveillance, 239 were installed and utilized. Ten intercepts were never installed or utilized.
- Considering the most serious offense being investigated, the largest number, 159 (64%) involved controlled dangerous substance violations.
- In addition, 57 (23%) of the orders involved racketeering, 20 (8%) involved murder offenses, 7 (3%) involved gambling offenses, and 3 (1%) involved theft. Weapons offenses, money laundering and conspiracy were involved in one order each.
- At the close of the report year, 235 defendants were indicted statewide as a result of 2007 electronic surveillance orders.
- In addition, 555 defendants were arrested and awaiting grand jury, 14 were referred to the U.S. Attorney's office, one defendant pled guilty to disorderly persons offenses and one was dismissed prior to indictment.
- At the close of the report year, 133 of the 235 defendants indicted reached final disposition. Of those reaching final disposition, 78 were convicted through guilty pleas, 54 were admitted into pre-trial intervention programs, and one had indictment charges dismissed.

Court-Authorized Electronic Surveillance

The New Jersey Wiretapping and Electronic Surveillance Control Act requires the Attorney General to report annually on the use of court-authorized intercepts. To accomplish this, the Act directs the Attorney General to collect and maintain records of all court-authorized intercepts, regardless of whether the intercept is carried out by the Attorney General's Office, a county prosecutor's office, or a local law enforcement agency.

Data reported pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2A:156A-23 were compiled to report on the operation of the New Jersey Wiretapping Act. As required by statute, this report contains data concerning:

- (1) The number of applications made.
- (2) The number of orders issued.
- (3) The effective periods of such orders.
- (4) The number and duration of any renewals.
- (5) The crime in connection with electronic surveillance orders.
- (6) The name of the applicants.
- (7) Indictments resulting from each application.
- (8) The crime which each indictment charges.
- (9) The disposition of each indictment.

In addition to the detailed information provided for 2007 applications and orders, supplemental follow-up data is provided for electronic surveillance orders reported in previous calendar years.

APPLICATIONS

In 2007, 249 applications for electronic surveillance orders were reported statewide pursuant to the Wiretap Act. The applications made were authorized by prosecution officials as follows.

The 249 applications for electronic surveillance resulted in 249 orders granting the use of electronic surveillance.

ORDERS FOR ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE

In all, 249 court orders were entered granting court authorization for electronic

surveillance in 2007.¹

¹ The United States Administrative Office of the Courts 2007 wiretap report (Table B-1) lists 279 electronic surveillance orders for New Jersey. The state report lists 249 electronic surveillance orders for New Jersey. Discrepancies between federal and state reports are described below.

Atlantic County. The federal report lists one order that we previously reported in the state 2006 report: AO#2006-2: AJGATL0406. The federal report lists one order that was not sealed until 2008 and will not be on our state report until next year. AO#2007-4: AJGCUM1207.

Bergen County. Reports three electronic surveillance orders that were not reported by the US AOC: MCCBER0107 (3/12/07, money laundering); MCCBER0307 (4/03/07, gambling); and RBSBER0207 (3/14/07, CDS).

Cape May County. The US AOC reports one wire. The state report includes a second wire, AJGCPM0707 (7/18/07, racketeering).

Hudson County. The US AOC reports four orders. The state report includes a fifth order, KGCHUD1507 (3/09/07, murder).

Middlesex County. The US AOC report incorrectly lists AO#2007-2 as a separate wire. It is actually a 10 day extension of AO#2007-1: RALMID1207.

Monmouth County. The federal report lists incorrect dates for three orders: AO#2007-26, LMLMON1107; AO#2007-27, LMLMON1207; and AO#2007-28, LMLMON1307 should be dated 8/28/07.

Morris County. The US AOC report lists an incorrect date for one order: AO#2007-19, BTBMOR3107 should be 7/19/07.

Ocean County. Reports five orders that were not reported by the US AOC. These five orders: AJGOCE1007 (9/20/07, CDS); AJGOCE0407 (5/09/07,

extensions in 13 instances, fourth extensions in eight instances and fifth extensions in four

instances.

CDS); AJGOCE0507 (5/15/07, CDS); AJGOCE0507x (5/15/07, CDS); and AJGOCE0117 (9/26/07, CDS).

Somerset County. The federal report AO#2007-26 is a duplicate of AO#2007-25, LRFSOM3607 but with the wrong offense specified.

Union County. Union County reports 26 electronic surveillance orders. The federal AOC reports 40 orders. Fourteen of these orders were reported on the state 2006 report: AO#2006-1, JSTUNI0106 (2/01/06, CDS); AO#2006-2, JSTUNI0206 (2/1/06, CDS); AO#2006-3, JSTUNI0306 (2/10/06, CDS); AO#2006-5, JSTUNI0406 (2/24/06, CDS); AO#2006-6, JSTUNI0506 (2/24/06, CDS); AO#2006-7, JSTUNI0606 (3/2/06, CDS): AO#2006-8, JSTUNI0706 (3/3/06, CDS); AO#2006-9, JSTUNI0806 (3/10/06, CDS); AO#2006-10, JSTUNI0906 (3/10/06, CDS); AO#2006-11, JSTUNI1006 (3/28/06, CDS); AO#2006-12, JSTUNI0906 (3/10/06, CDS); AO#2006-13, JUSTUNI1206 (4/26/06, CDS); AO#2006-14, JSTUNI1406 (10/19/06, CDS); and AO#2006-15, JSTUNI1506 (10/19/06, CDS). AO#2006-4 is an extension of JSTUNI0306, not a separate wire. The AOC report does not list JSTUNI0407 (2/23/07, CDS), which is on the state report. The AOC reports the wrong applications date for AO#2007-6, BTBUNI3206. It is 12/19/06.

Warren County. Reports two orders that were listed on the 2006 federal report: LRFWRN1506 (5/17/06, CDS) and LRFWRN1706 (6/05/06, CDS).

State Attorney General. The US AOC reports 107 intercept orders; the state Attorney General's Office reports 83 intercept orders.

AO# 15-20, 22-26, 29, 31-44, and 91 refer to intercepts used in conjunction with ongoing investigations and were not reported by the state in 2007. These 27 intercept orders will be reported by the Attorney General's Office at the conclusion of the investigation.

The New Jersey Attorney General's report includes three intercept orders not included on the federal AOC report. These intercept orders were not previously reported by New Jersey as they were used in conjunction with ongoing investigations. However, they were included in prior federal AOC reports. These three intercept orders include: BTBMOR5905 (10/07/05, CDS); BTBMOR6005 (10/07/05, CDS); MMSMER4006 (10/16/06, racketeering).

Of the 249 orders granting electronic surveillance, 216 authorized wire (telephone) intercepts and 6 authorized oral intercepts.

In addition, intercepts were granted in 5 instances for stored communications: 2 intercepts were for computers and 3 intercepts were for voice mail

The remaining 22 orders authorized an electronic communication intercept. Nineteen of these were for text messages while 3 were for pagers.

Of the 249 orders granted for electronic surveillance, 239 were installed and utilized. Ten intercepts were never installed or utilized.

Of the total 249 original orders, 149 authorized use of intercepts for 30 days, 90 authorized use of intercepts for 20 days, 2 orders authorized use for 2 days, 2 orders authorized use for 1 day and 1 order authorized an intercept for 3 days. For the remaining 5, which involved stored communications, number of days authorized is not applicable since the intercept is for stored communications. Section 8 of the Wiretap Act specifies the crime for which electronic surveillance may be granted. Offense data collected and analyzed for court-authorized electronic surveillance consider the most serious offense investigated. Offense data consider only substantive offenses and not conspiracy to commit the offense.

Overall, electronic surveillance orders were granted in connection with investigations involving the following offense categories: controlled dangerous substance offenses, racketeering, murder offenses, theft, and gambling.

Of the 249 orders authorizing electronic surveillance, considering the most serious offense, the majority, 159 (64%), involved controlled dangerous substance offenses.

In addition, 57 (23%) of the orders involved racketeering, 20 (8%) involved murder offenses, 7 (3%) involved gambling, and 3 (1%) involved theft. Weapons offenses, money laundering and conspiracy were involved in 1 order each.

Applications resulting in orders granting use of electronic surveillance were made by the following law enforcement agencies.

DEFENDANT INDICTMENTS AND DISPOSITIONS

Summary information concerning defendant indictments resulting from electronic surveillance applications is provided below with detailed information on the following pages.² The information provided concerns defendant indictments resulting from each application, the offenses charged, and indictment dispositions.

At the close of the report year, a total of 806 defendants were arrested of which 235 were indicted statewide as a result of electronic surveillance applications and orders.

Of the total 806 defendants, 555 were arrested and awaiting grand jury and 14 were referred to the U.S. Attorney's office. One defendant pled guilty to disorderly persons offenses and one was dismissed prior to indictment.

Of those 235 defendants indicted, 228 (97%) were indicted for controlled dangerous substance offenses.

In addition, 3 defendants were indicted for racketeering offenses and 2 defendants were indicted for theft offenses.

Of the remaining 2 defendants indicted, one was indicted for murder while the other was indicted for a weapons offense.

At the close of the report year, 133 of the 235 defendants indicted reached final disposition.

Of those defendants reaching final disposition, 78 (59%) were convicted through guilty pleas, 54 (41%) were admitted into a pretrial intervention program and one defendant was dismissed.

² In addition to defendant indictment and disposition data for 2007 electronic surveillance applications, supplementary report or follow-up data is provided for electronic surveillance orders reported in previous calendar years.
