

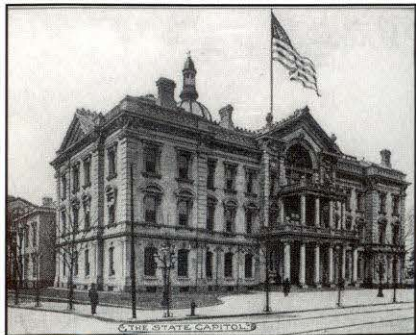
New Jersey's Most Historic Public Building!

Built in 1792, the New Jersey State House is the nation's second oldest state capitol in continuous use.

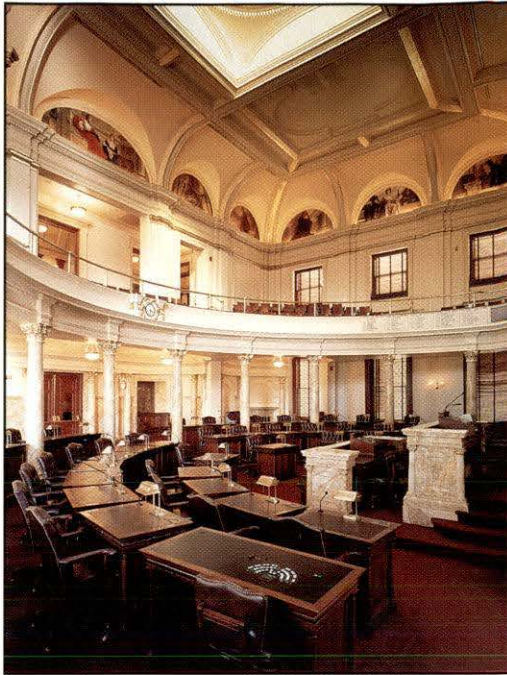

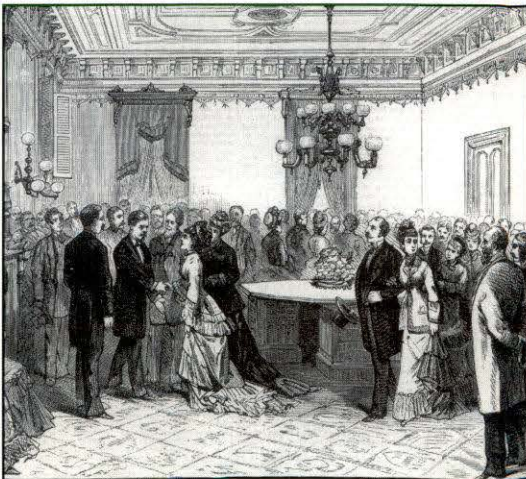

Touring the State House

HOURS - Tours run on the hour, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday, 10 am to 3 pm, and Saturday, 12 pm to 3 pm. Tours take place on non-legislative session days when the Legislature does not meet. Closed Sunday and state holidays.

RESERVATIONS - Required for all groups of ten or more. Call the State House Tour Office at least one month in advance at (609) 633-2709, Monday through Friday, from 8:30 am to 5 pm. For springtime visits, we recommend reserving nine months in advance.

GROUP TOURS - School and adult groups enjoy special tours geared to their particular grade levels or interests. Tell us about your needs when you reserve your tour.

FACILITIES - The State House includes restrooms but does not offer dining facilities or rooms for guests to eat a brown bag lunch. However, visitors are welcome to picnic on the grounds.

ACCESS - The building is fully equipped for barrier-free access. If members of your group have special needs, please notify the Tour Office when making your reservation.

ADMISSION - Free

PLEASE NOTE:

Dates and schedules are subject to change without notice. The State House is a working office building with periodic unannounced room closings. Also, the Governor does not routinely meet with tour groups.

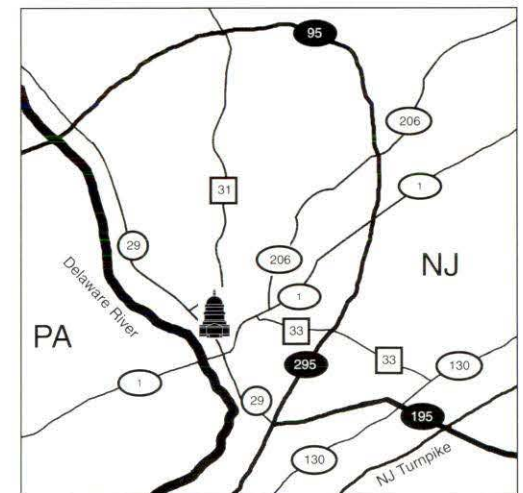

From routes 1, 95, 195, 295 or the New Jersey Turnpike, follow signs to route 29, Trenton. Once on 29, take the Calhoun Street exit. Turn right at the first traffic light onto West State Street. The Capitol Complex is on the right.
