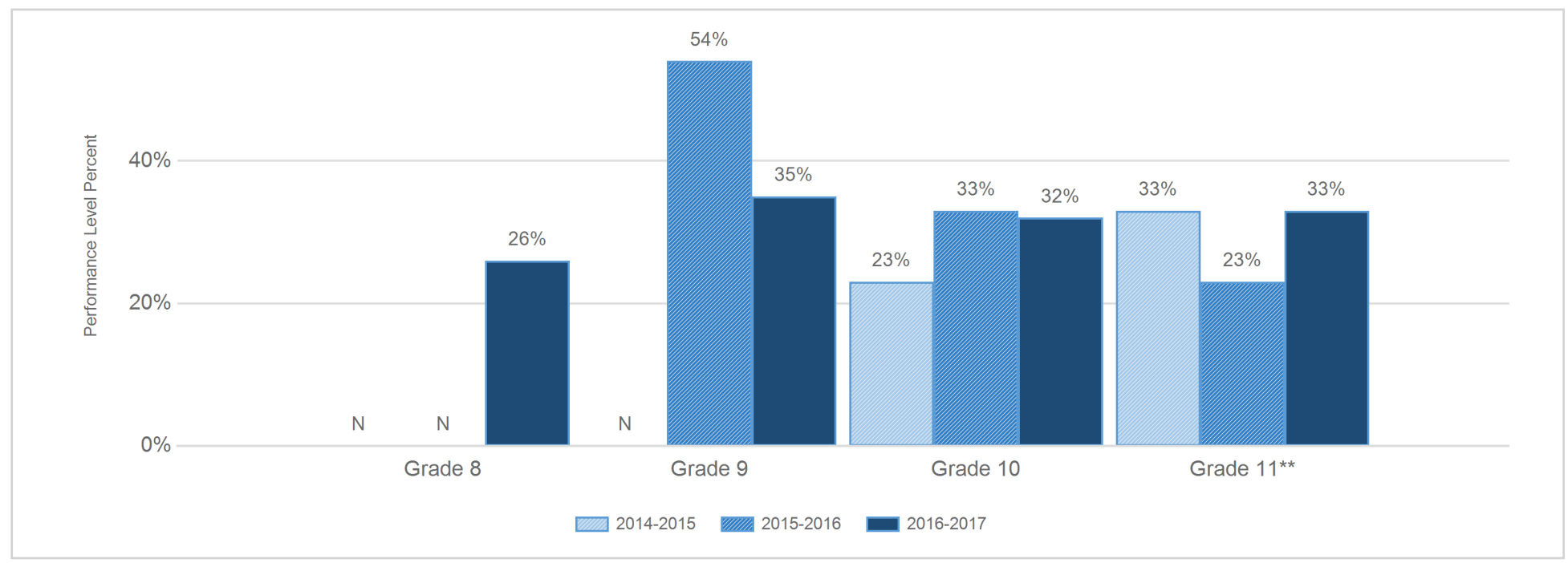


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**English Language Arts/Literacy Assessment - Performance Trends**

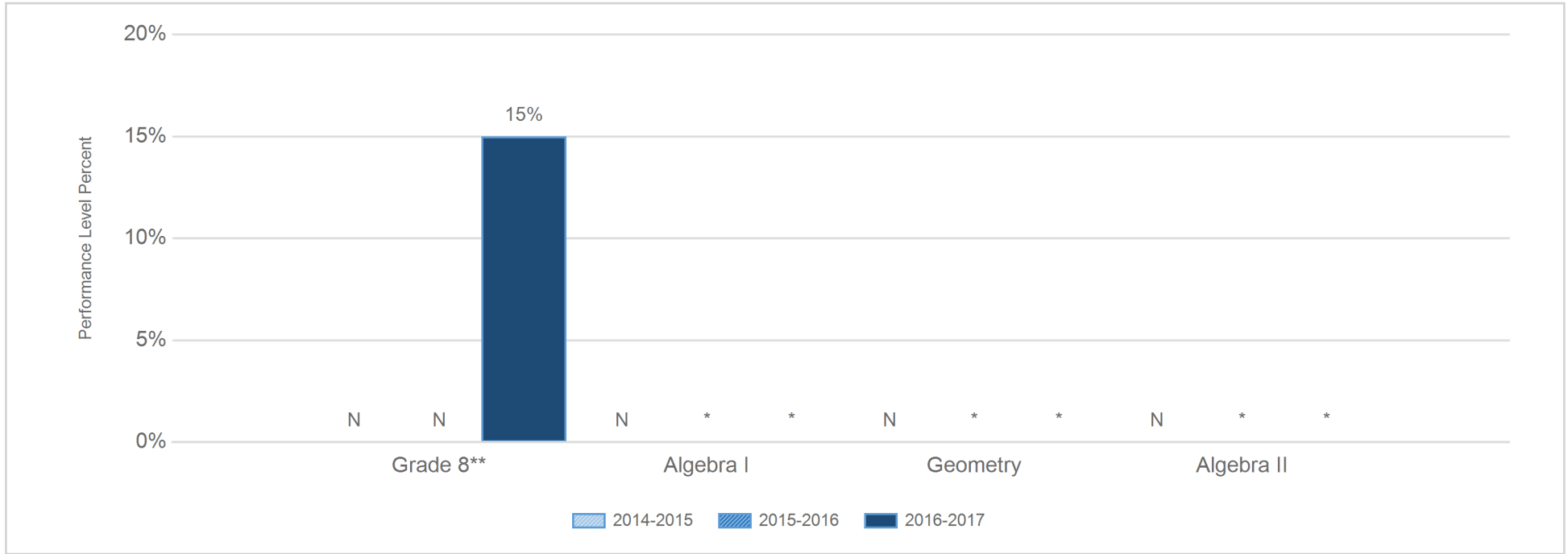

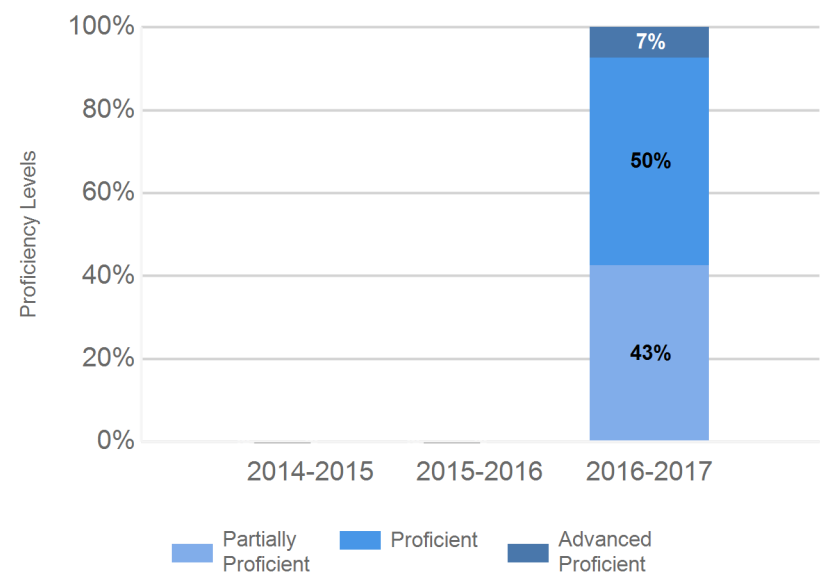

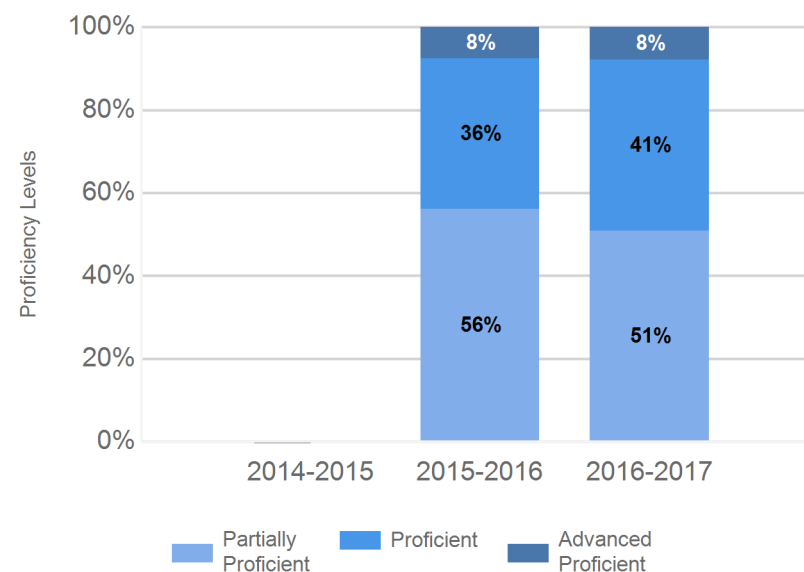

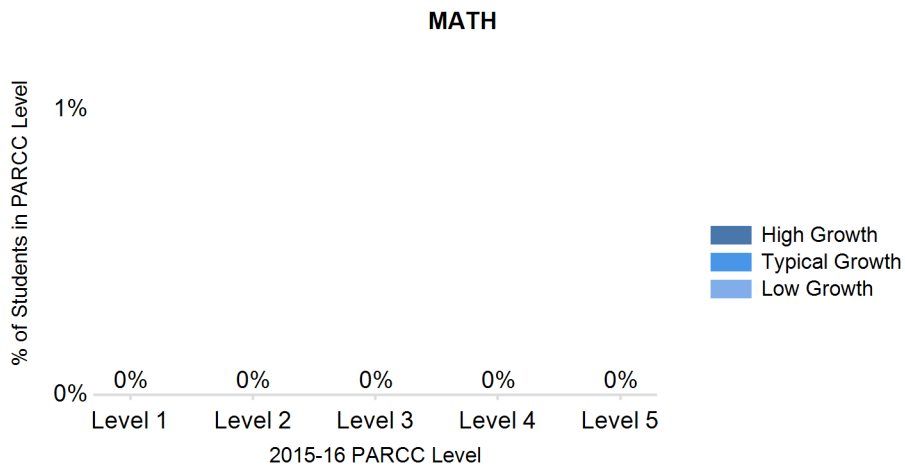

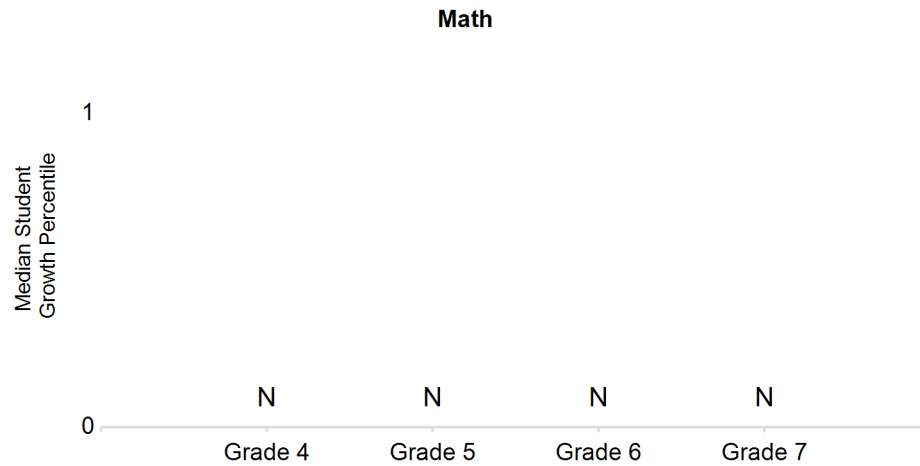
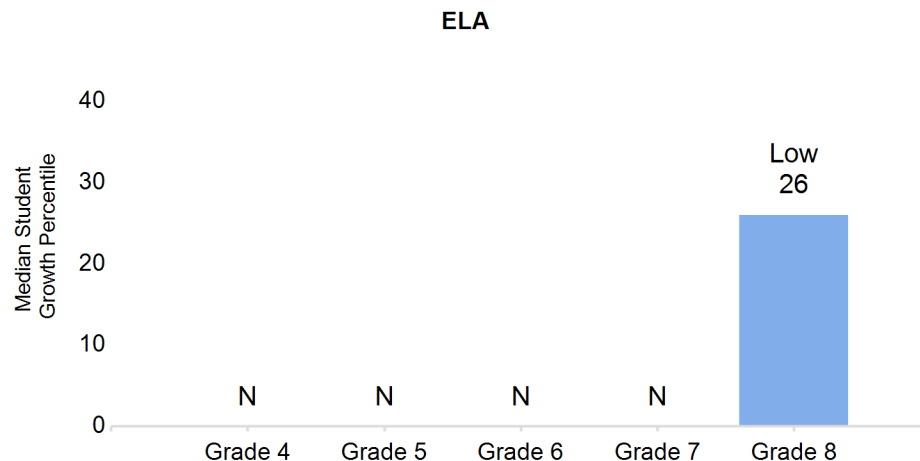

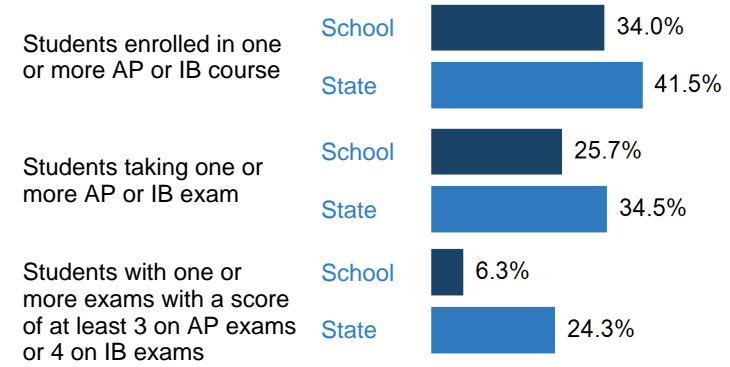

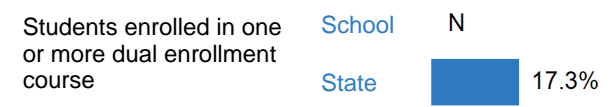

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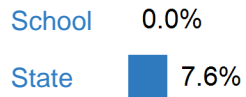

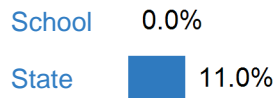

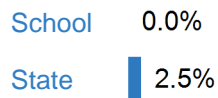

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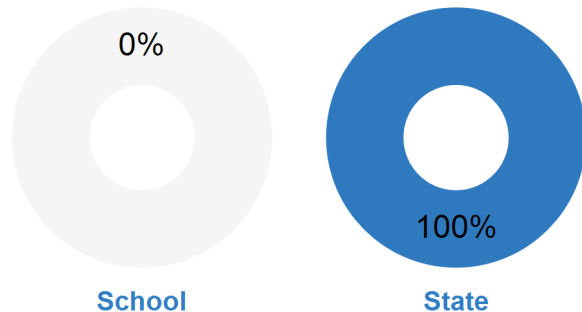

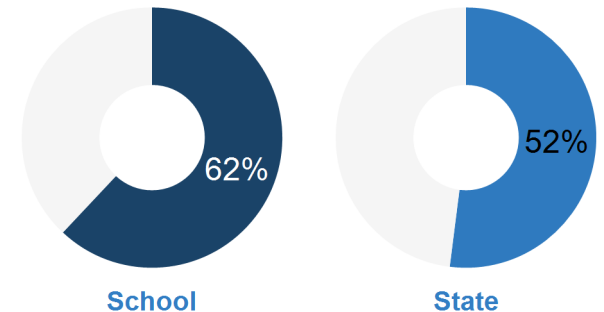

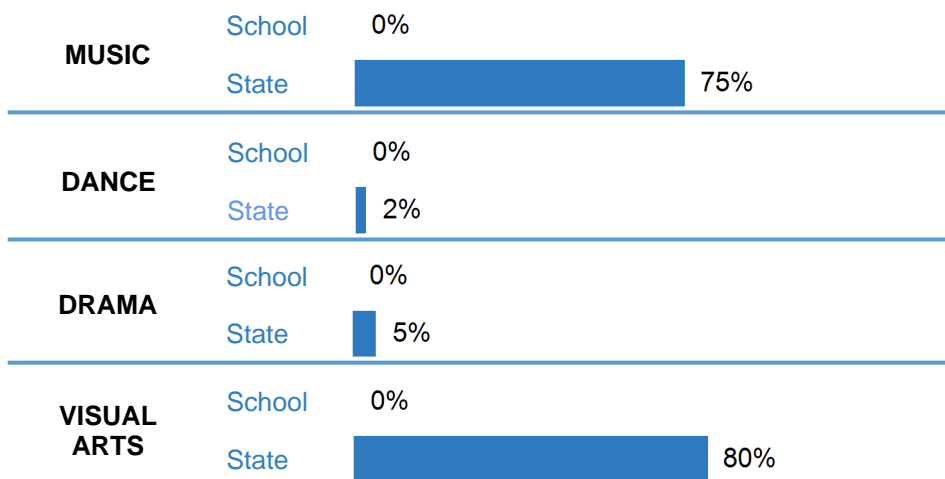

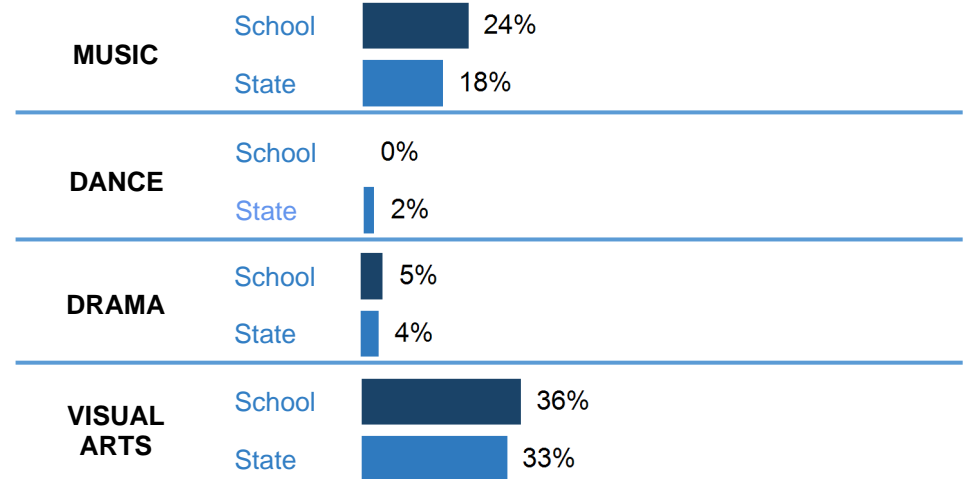

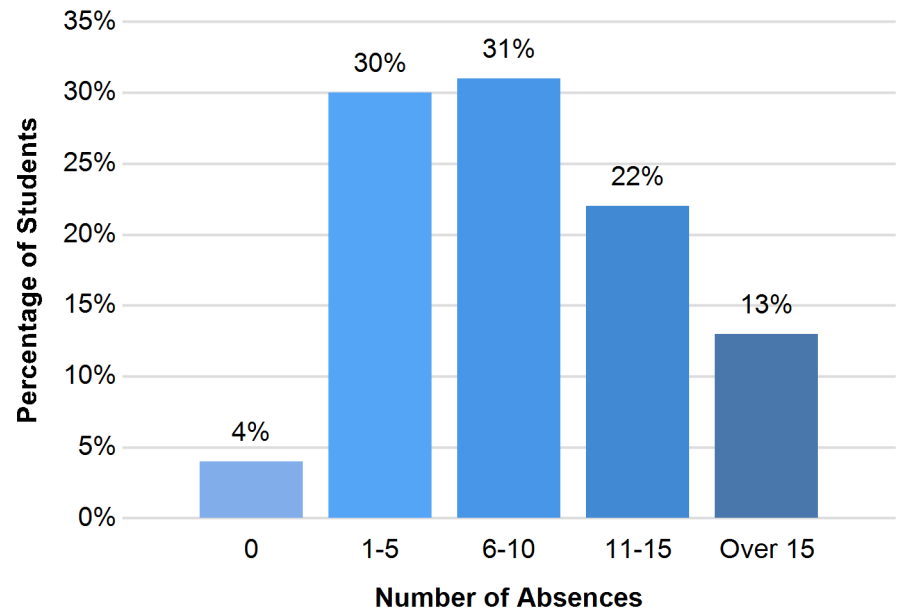

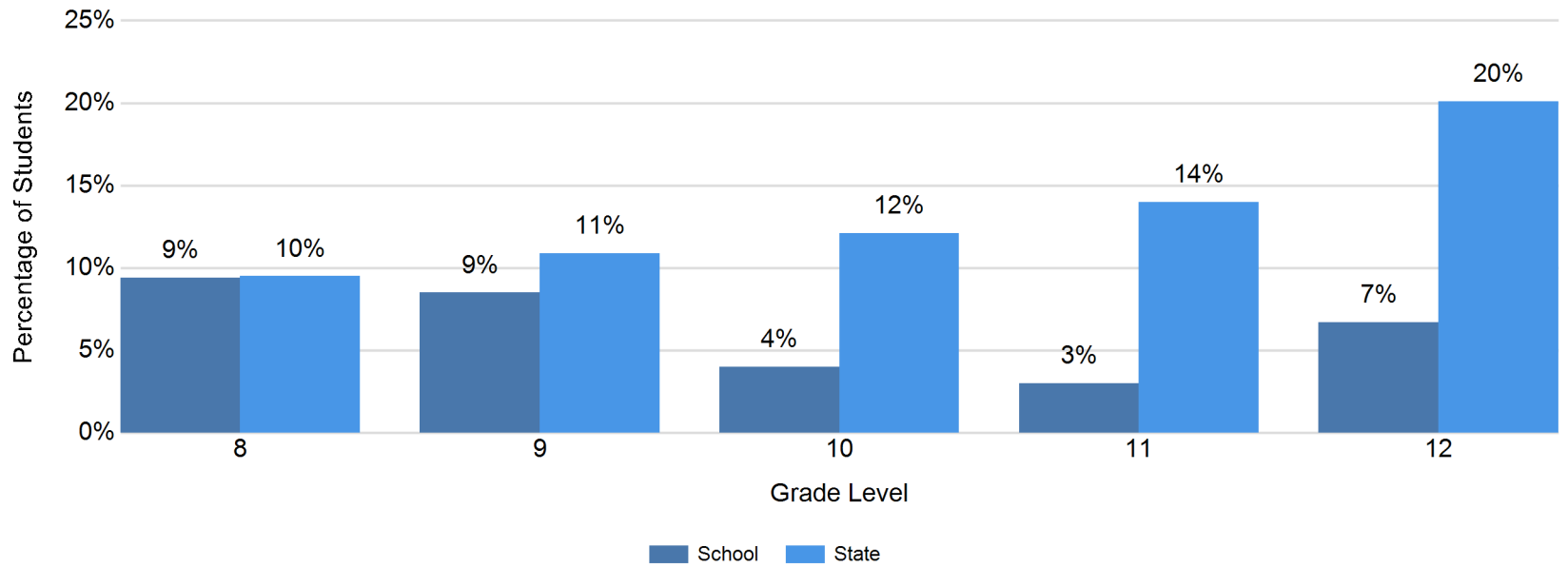

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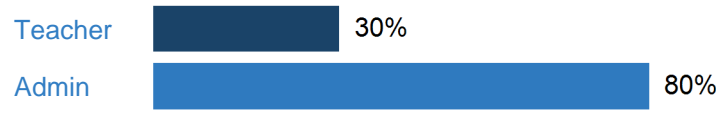
**Teachers and Administrators - Level of Education**

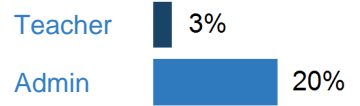
**Bachelor's Degree**

 <b>Mission, Vision, Theme:</b>	The mission of the Academy for Urban Leadership Charter School (AULCS) is to employ an educational design and experience that merges the highest standards of academic excellence with fostering commitment to economic and social justice. AULCS is comprised of four (4) thematic: Business Technology, Human Development, Applied Science, Business-Tech, and Law & Public Safety. Within these there are advanced tracks: Biopsychology, Education, Criminal Justice, International Business and Biomedical.
 <b>Awards, Recognition, Accomplishments:</b>	Ninety (90) out of Ninety-one (91) senior students graduated in 2016-2017, with most of them moving on to institutions of higher learning. AULCS students were the recipients of many award and accomplishments, having received thousands of dollars in academic scholarships from four-year universities, and also from the Perth Amboy Learning Empowerment Achievement Foundation (LEAF). A number AULCS students have achieved combined SAT scores of 1400, and/or perfect PARCC scores.







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 <p><b>Courses, Curriculum, Instruction:</b></p>	<p>Our school hosts traditional coursework that is aligned with the State of New Jersey high school graduation requirements. In addition to this we require an additional 20 credits to graduate from AUL. These credits are earned in electives that are grounded in our quest for social justice. Students are able to earn college credit through a variety of AP courses in math, Science, ELA, and Social Studies.</p>
 <p><b>Sports and Athletics:</b></p>	<p>Sports Offered: Baseball (Boys), Basketball (Boys &amp; Girls), Softball (Girls)</p> <p>For the last 2 years, the Academy for Urban Leadership Charter School (AULCS) has participated in four sports. Boys' Basketball, girls' basketball, baseball and softball. The girls' basketball team which started with 12 wins its first year, has improved to 18 victories, with one of its players accumulating 1000 points throughout her four years of participation, and a second player nominated as best junior in the state, for the 2017 season. All athletes are monitored for academic performance.</p>
 <p><b>Clubs and Activities:</b></p>	<p>Academy students are afforded opportunities to participate in the following clubs: Audio/Video, Business, Fashion, Link Crew, Mock Trials (Debate Club), Newspaper, National Honor Society, Science, Student Government, Video Game, Yearbook, Technology, Model UN, and Choral There are multiple opportunities for them to demonstrate learned skills and talents in these clubs throughout the course of the year. Teachers provide the necessary support as club advisers.</p>
 <p><b>Before and After School Programs:</b></p>	<p>AULCS promotes and supports both before and after school programs. These include credit recovery opportunities to ensure that students remain on track to graduate. It may also include other opportunities to gain credits in accelerated elective coursework. The after school expanded learning hour from 3:00 – 4:00 pm as well as the Saturday Academy Leadership Program for grade 8 has been instrumental in helping students advance or close academic gaps.</p>

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 <p><b>Staff and Professional Learning:</b></p>	<p>Faculty have received PD opportunities in the following: Danielson Framework, effective professional learning communities (PLCs) and instructional rounds (IRs). PLCs have allowed teachers to receive additional professional development relevant to lesson design, formative assessment, data analysis, lesson study, and related projects. Instructional rounds have created multiple opportunities for faculty to visit each other's' classrooms, and discuss their observations, in a collegial setting.</p>
 <p><b>Postsecondary Information:</b></p>	<p>The breakdown of our post-secondary experience is as followed: 48 went to a 4 year institution, 34 attended community college, 2 joined the Military, 1 went to trade school, and 5 went to work. Student undergo SAT/ACT preparation during the school day as well as before and after school. Students are provided financial aid support via after school presentations and one on one support from counselors. Some of the universities students attend range from Rutgers University to St. John's University.</p>
 <p><b>Student Supports and Services:</b></p>	<p>AULCS hosts traditional coursework that is aligned with State of New Jersey graduation requirements. To address the challenge of academic gaps that affect students' learning progress, supplemental instruction has been included into the daily schedule for any student below grade level in mathematics or ELA. There is also a schedule tutoring period afterschool that occurs daily from 3:00 pm to 4:00 pm. Students meet with academic teachers to get additional instruction and academic support.</p>
 <p><b>Student Health and Wellness:</b></p>	<p>AULCS provides clinically appropriate counseling and/or therapeutic services to individual students, groups of students, and families, whenever students show high levels of "at risk" symptoms for school failure. It also provides students and their families with crisis intervention and counseling. AULCS also provides timely support for the system's transient students and their parents, in order to facilitate each student's adjustment to the academic setting, and to enhance their social success.</p>
 <p><b>Parent and Community Involvement:</b></p>	<p>The Parent-Teacher Organization (PTO) meets every month during the school year. The group's mission is to enrich the learning opportunities for the students who attend AULCS. The academy encourages the involvement of all parents, teachers, and staff. Some events include fundraising, multicultural dinners, and recreational and educational workshops. AUL students participate in a number of community service events, including Perth Amboy Community Cleanup Programs and feeding families in need.</p>

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 <p>Climate Surveys:</p>	<p>Is a Climate Survey Used: Yes; Who is surveyed: Parents, Administrators, Teachers</p> <p>AULCS conducted three surveys in the areas of digital learning, community engagement, and overall satisfaction. These surveys were given throughout the year. Highlights from the surveys include, 84.6% of parents feel satisfied with the education being provided. 87.5% of parents report children are safe, while at AUL. 87.6% of stakeholders feel AULCS education prepares the students for post-secondary life. 85.1% of students feel comfortable asking for additional help from AULCS teachers.</p>
 <p>Facilities:</p>	<p>AULCS has focused on providing facilities that are safe and conducive to learning. We have made extensive updates to our Main Campus and to the two satellite campuses to include state-of-the-art technology. Each classroom is equipped with smart technology to meet the instructional needs of the faculty and the educational needs of all students. Main campus facility has been equipped with new sprinkler and communication systems, and fire alarms. More physical plant updates are forthcoming.</p>



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<p><b>Other Information:</b></p>	<p>University Partnerships: We believe that college and university partnerships are an essential component of our educational experience for students. Said partnerships ensure that our students find college enrollment, readiness and completion more successful experiences. AULCS has maintained a dual enrollment collaboration with Middlesex County College. Students take college level courses in Mathematics, Business, and Marketing. The dual enrollment initiative has allowed students to experience the academic demands and the rigor of college coursework and has ensured that transition from high school to college is much smoother. We have also established a partnership with Kean University for our Advanced Placement (AP) students in Chemistry that involves using their state-of-the-art facilities to conduct Chemistry laboratory exercises. This partnership has created opportunities for our students to complete the required labs for the AP Chemistry course. It has also opened opportunities for Kean University faculty to present their areas of scientific research to students. Academy expansion to include 7th and 8th Graders: AULCS has included one hundred of each 7th and 8th graders to ensure that academic gaps in Mathematics and English Language Arts can be addressed earlier in their academic careers. Strategies include: the use of evidence-based instruction, a rigorous curriculum, increased instructional time (supplemental instruction), comprehensive professional, development, effective professional learning communities (PLCs), and strong parental engagement. AP program: Math, ELA, Social Studies, Science, Spanish Language AULCS provides a rigorous academic program, enabling students to achieve college credit. These classes meet for 90 minutes per day. Courses provided in 2016-2017 included, Calculus AB, Biology, Physics, Chemistry, English Literature, Spanish Language and Culture and History. For the 2017-2018 school year, AUL will also provide instruction in Calculus BC.</p>
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
