Total nonfarm wage and salary employment in New Jersey dipped by 500 from September to October to a seasonally adjusted level of 3,091,100. An employment rise of 2,500 in the nonmanufacturing sector was barely offset by a decline of 3,000 in manufacturing, keeping total nonfarm payroll employment at about the same level since early 1981.

Jobholdings in nonmanufacturing expanded on a seasonally adjusted basis to an all-time record high in October of 2,319,200. Small to moderate increases occurred from September to October in all nonmanufacturing industry divisions except government.

Total government employment dropped on a seasonally adjusted basis by 900 to 519,000. The decrease was mainly due to a strike in the education segment and layoffs following terminations of CETA Public Service Employment programs in the local government sector.

The manufacturing sector did not fare as well as most nonfactory industries over the month due to scattered layoffs and small closings throughout the durable goods sector. At a seasonally adjusted level of 771,900 in October, manufacturing jobholdings were only fractionally above the 1980 recession low recorded in August 1980 of 770,700.

The most substantial over the month decreases in manufacturing were in stone, clay, and glass and in nonelectrical machinery, which dropped by 900 and 800, respectively. Countering the downtrend, transportation equipment rose in October by 700 as the result of marginal hiring and fewer-than-expected layoffs. Apparel registered the largest increase in the nondurable goods sector, gaining 400 jobs over the month, primarily in the accessories and fabricated textiles segment.

The weekly earning production workers averaged \$328.85 in October, up by \$2.43 from September and \$25.23 from a year ago. After seasonal adjustment, the average workweek registered 40.8 hours, up by 0.2 hours from September.

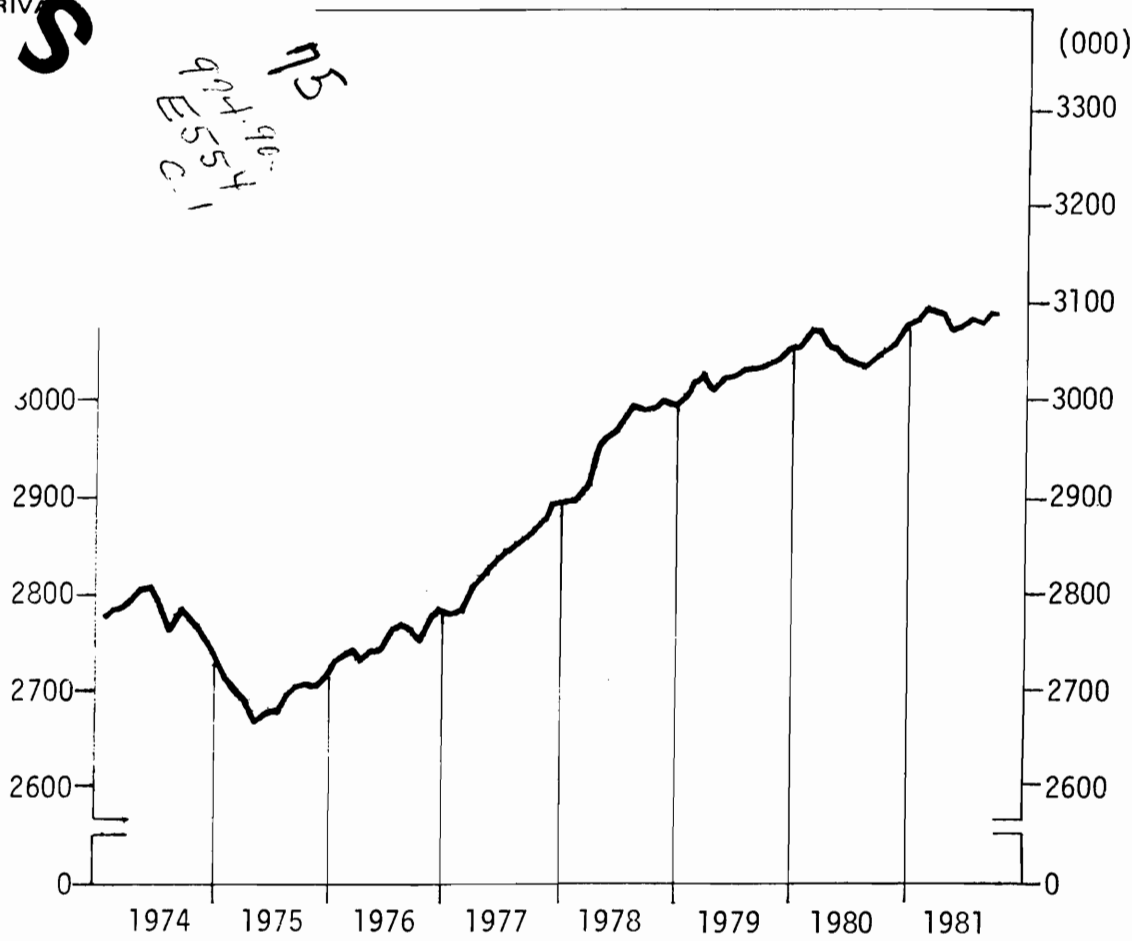

TECHNICAL NOTES

Nonfarm Wage and Salary Employment

Employment data refer to persons on establishment payrolls who received pay for any part of the pay period which includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude proprietors, the self-employed, unpaid family workers, farm workers, and domestic workers in households. Salaried officers of corporations are included. Government employment covers only civilian employees; federal military personnel are excluded.

Persons on an establishment payroll who are on paid sick leave (when pay is received directly from the firm), on paid holiday or paid vacation, or who work during any part of the pay period but are unemployed or on strike during the rest of the period, are counted as employed. Not counted as employed are persons who, during the pay period which includes the 12th, are laid off, on leave without pay or on strike for the entire period, or who are hired but do not work during the period.

Average Hours and Earnings

Hours and earnings data are derived from reports of payroll and man-hours for production and related workers in manufacturing. When the reported pay period exceeds one week, the payroll and man-hour figures are reduced to a weekly basis.

Average hourly earnings for manufacturing are on a "gross" basis, reflecting not only changes in basic hourly rates, but also such variable factors as premium pay for overtime and shift work, and changes in output of workers paid on an incentive plan. Excluded from average earnings are irregular bonuses, retroactive items, payments of various welfare benefits, and payroll taxes paid by employers.
