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


Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

Enrollment by Gender



Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent





















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



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



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





Students in both elementary and middles schools begin to demonstrate college readiness behaviors long before they even enter high school. Among the behaviors that research has shown to be indicative of success and college and career readiness are regularly attending school and challenging themselves with rigorous course work. A chronically absent student is a student who was not present for any reason for more than 10% of the total days possible for that individual student.


