

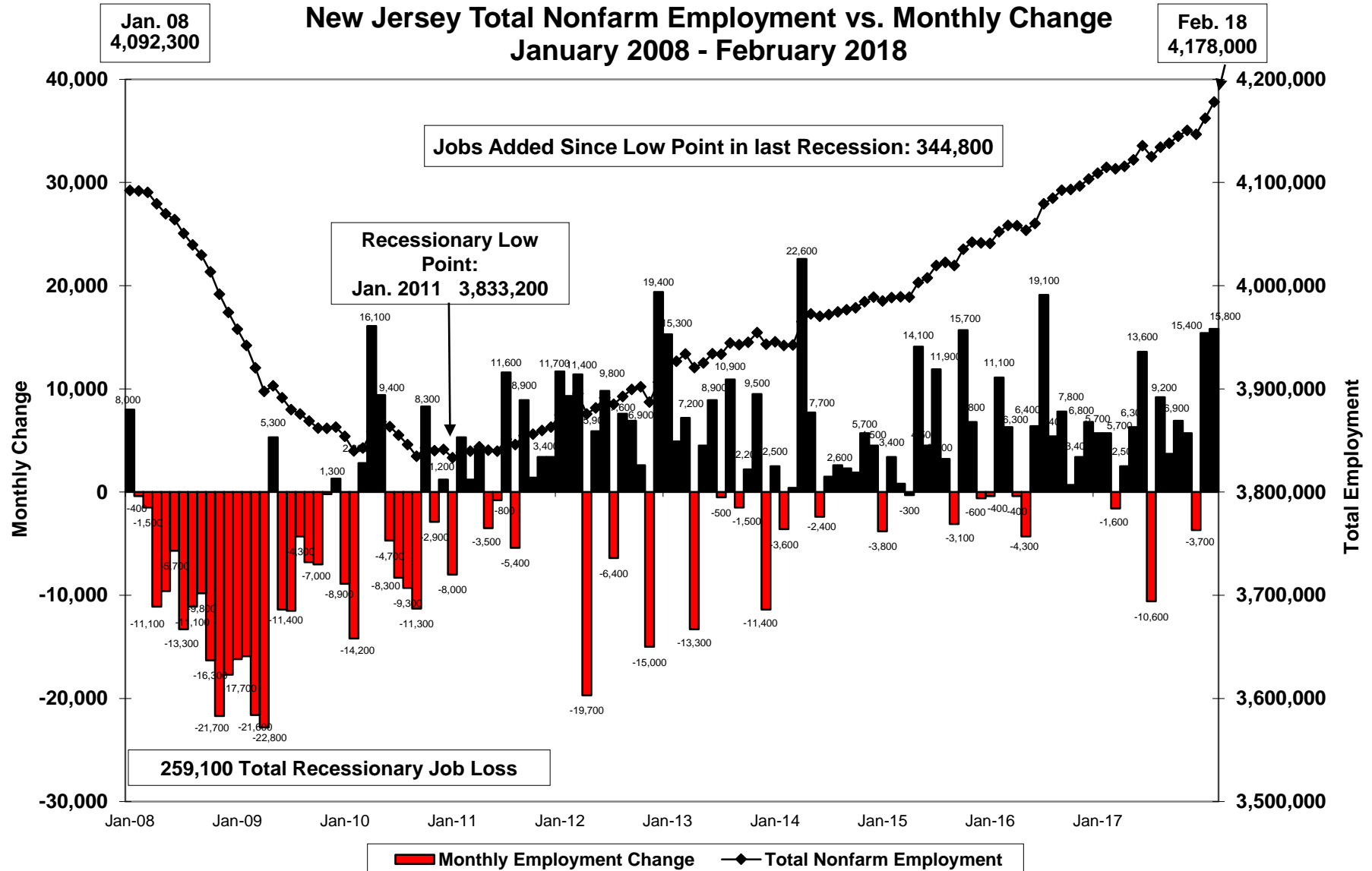

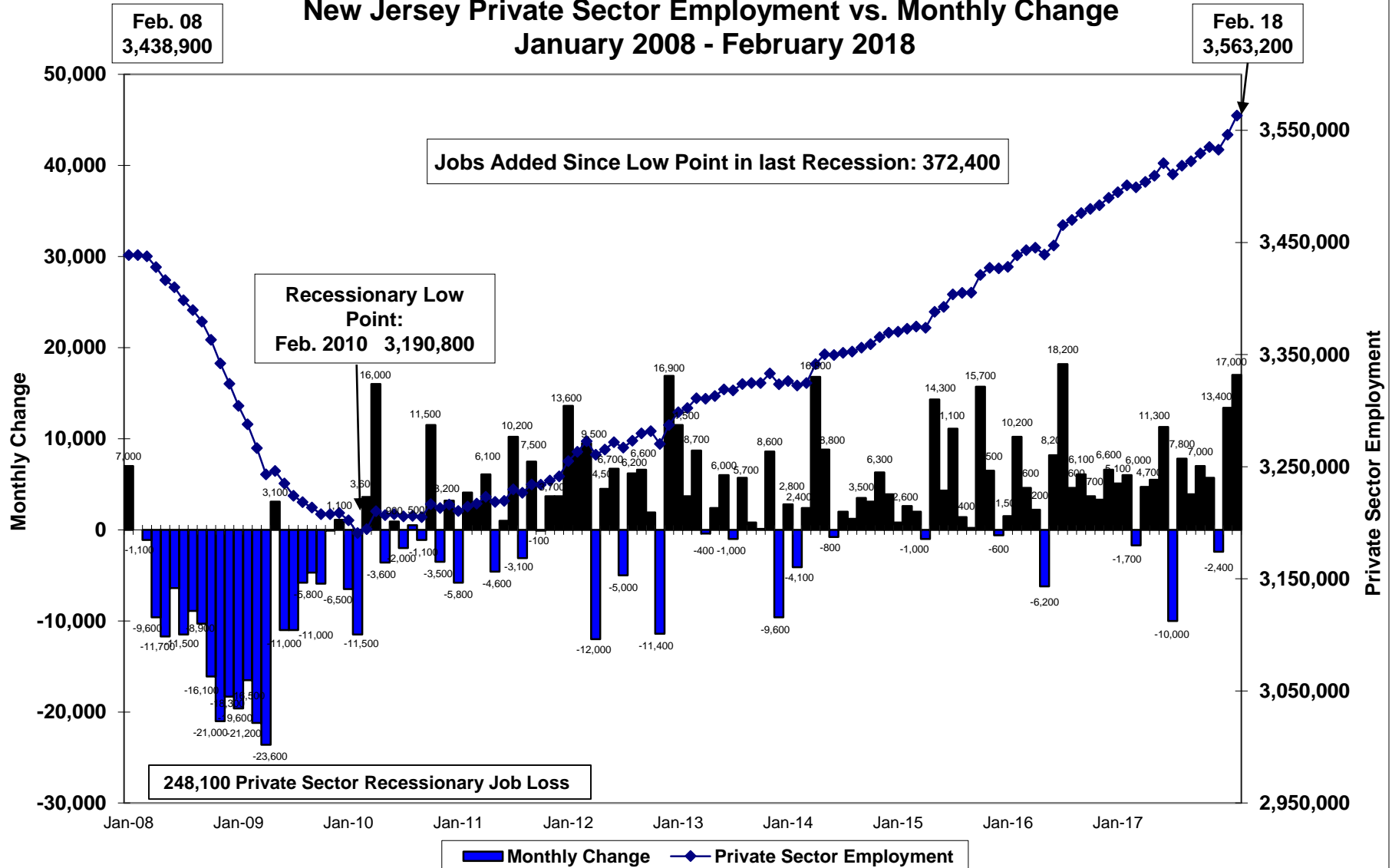

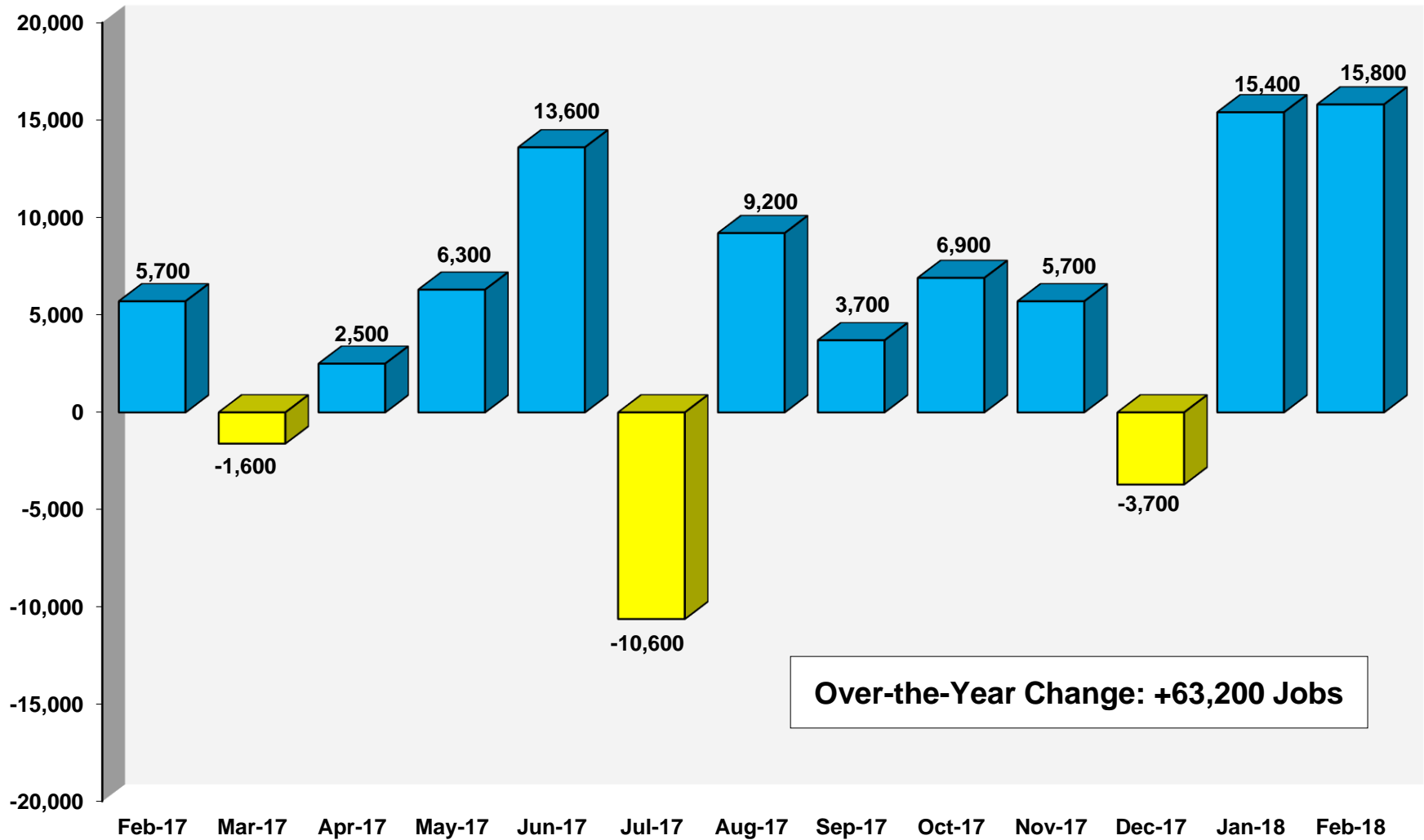
New Jersey Total Nonfarm Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - February 2018



New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - February 2018



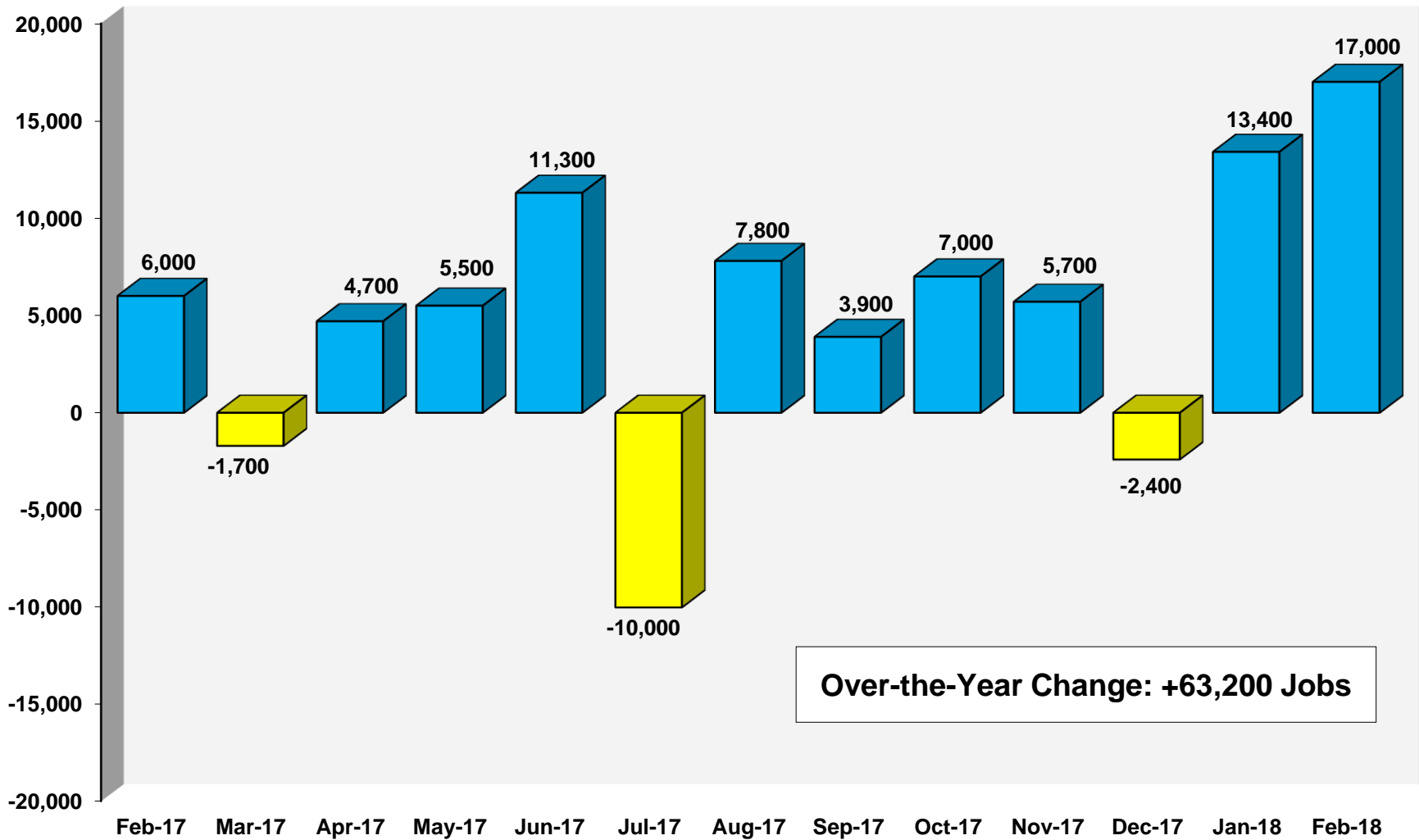
Monthly Total Employment Change New Jersey: February 2017 - February 2018



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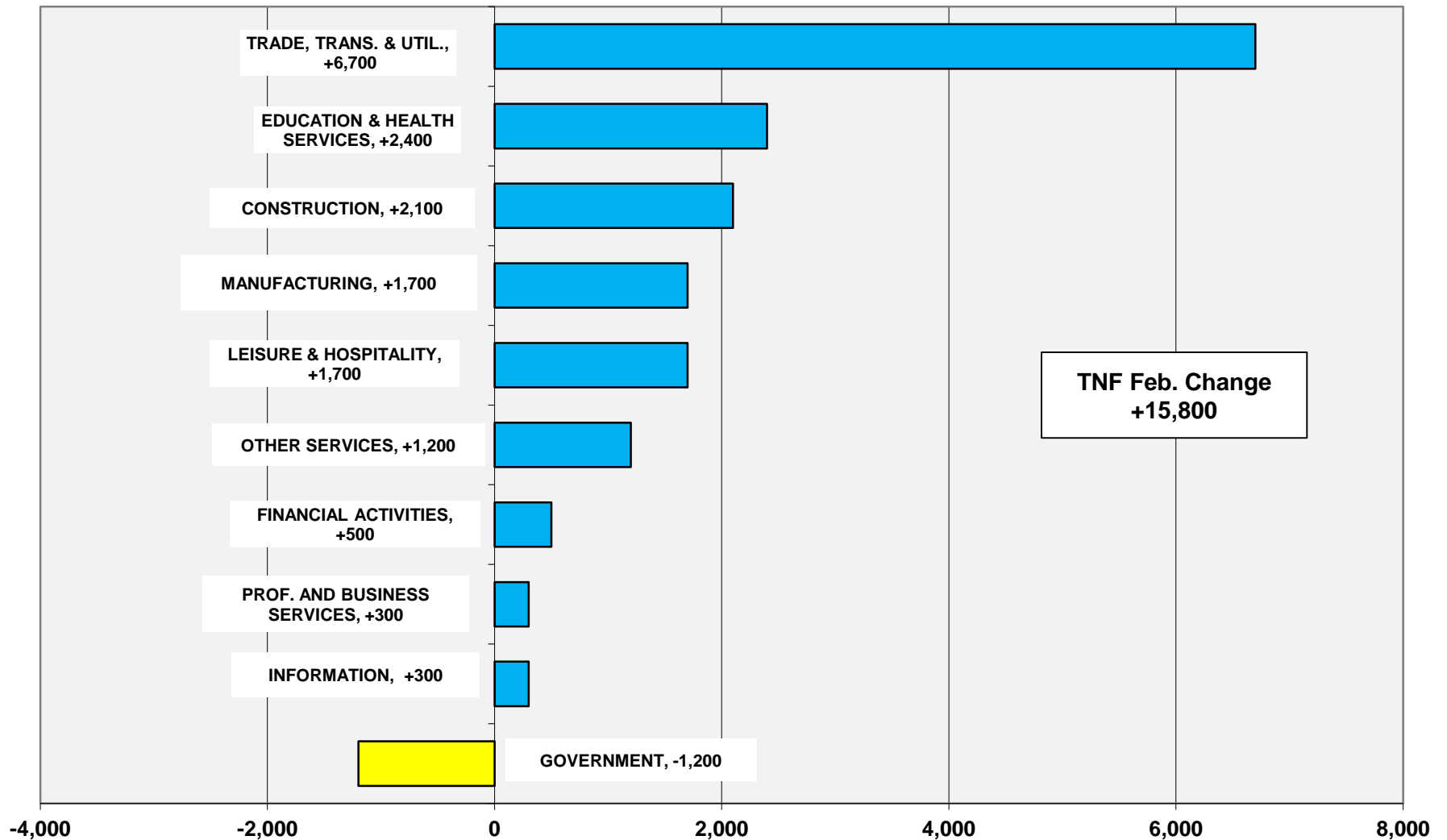
Monthly Private Sector Employment Change February 2017 - February 2018



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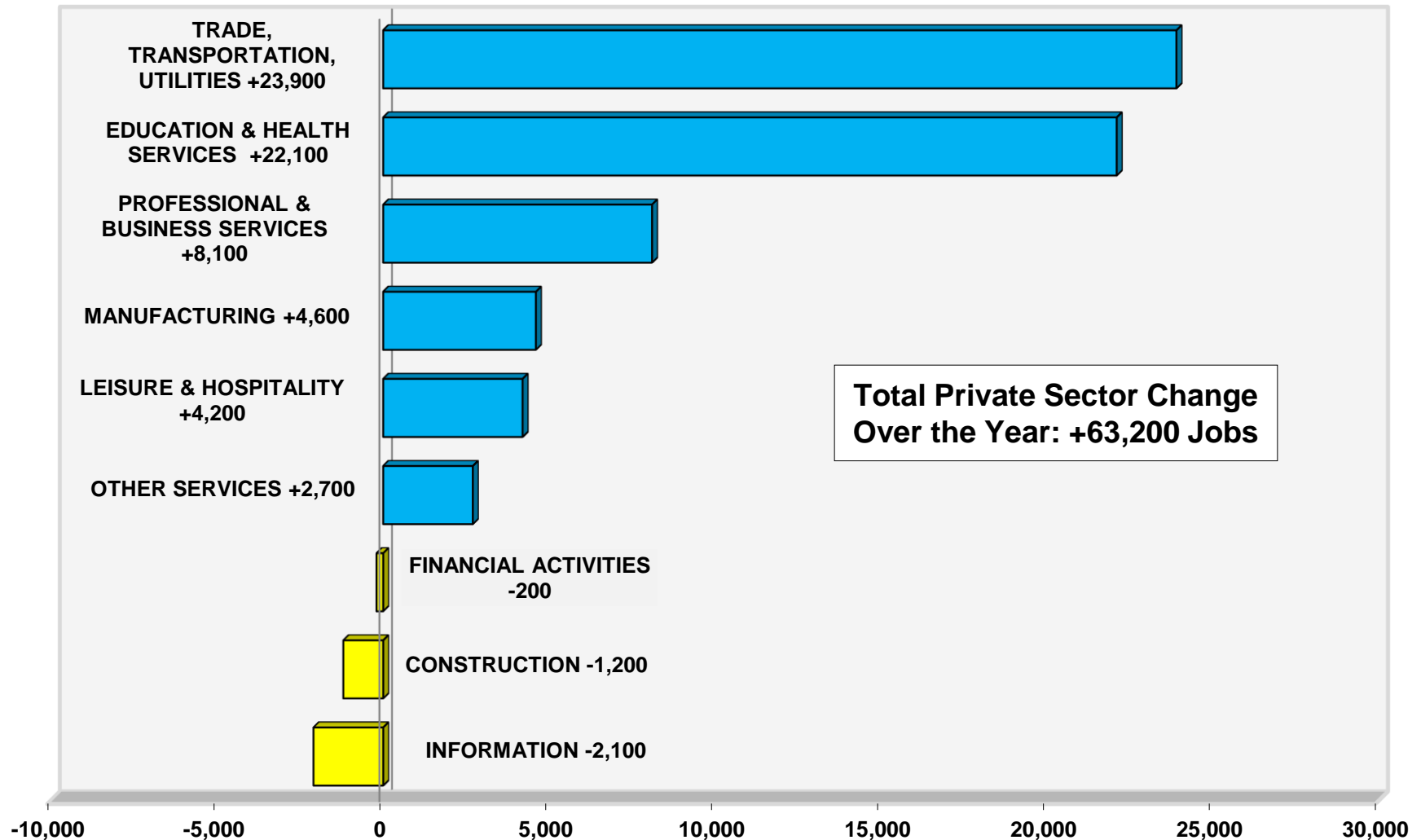

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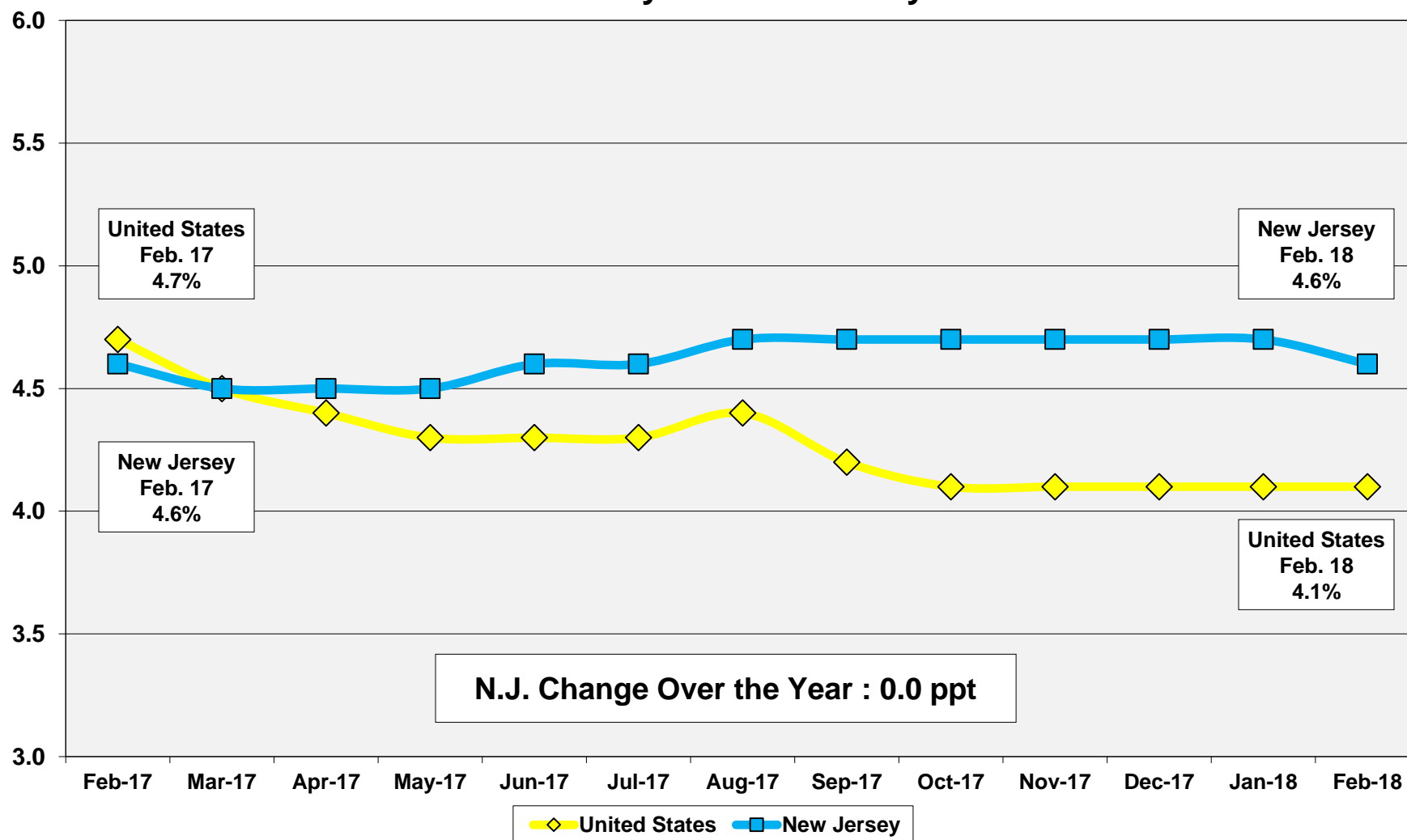
New Jersey Private Sector Employment Change by Industry February 2017 - February 2018



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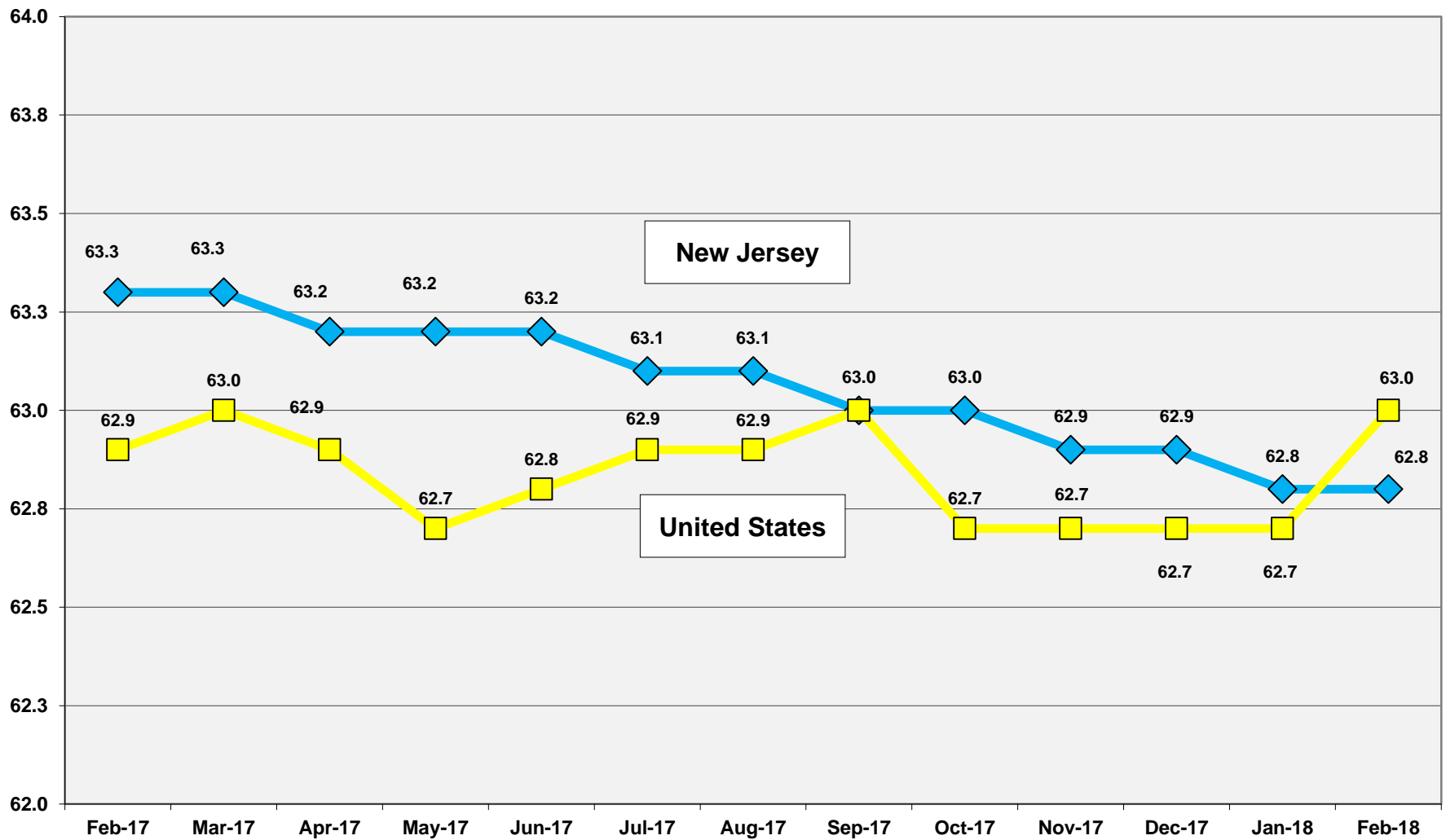
Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States February 2017 - February 2018



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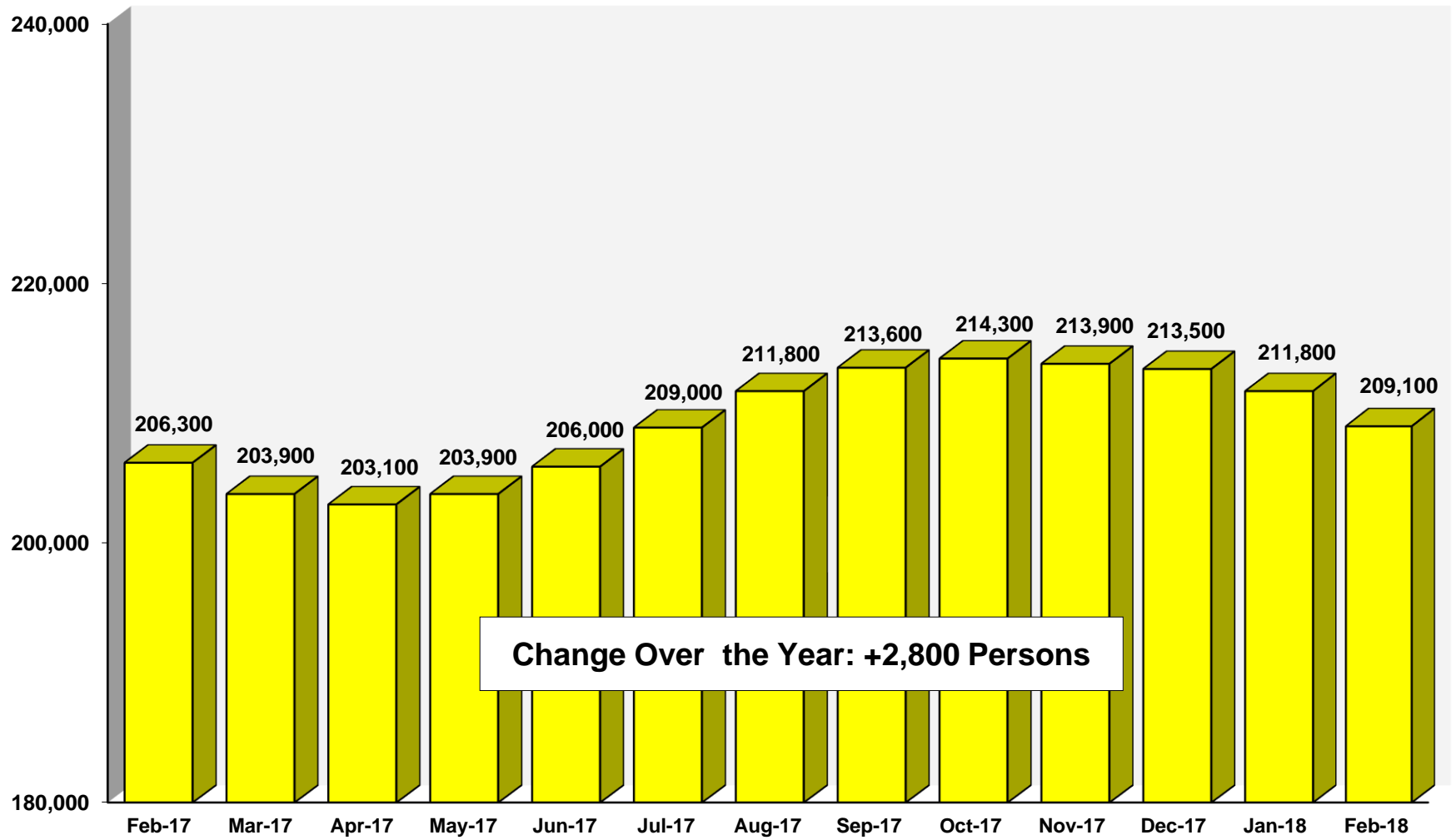
New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: February 2017 - February 2018



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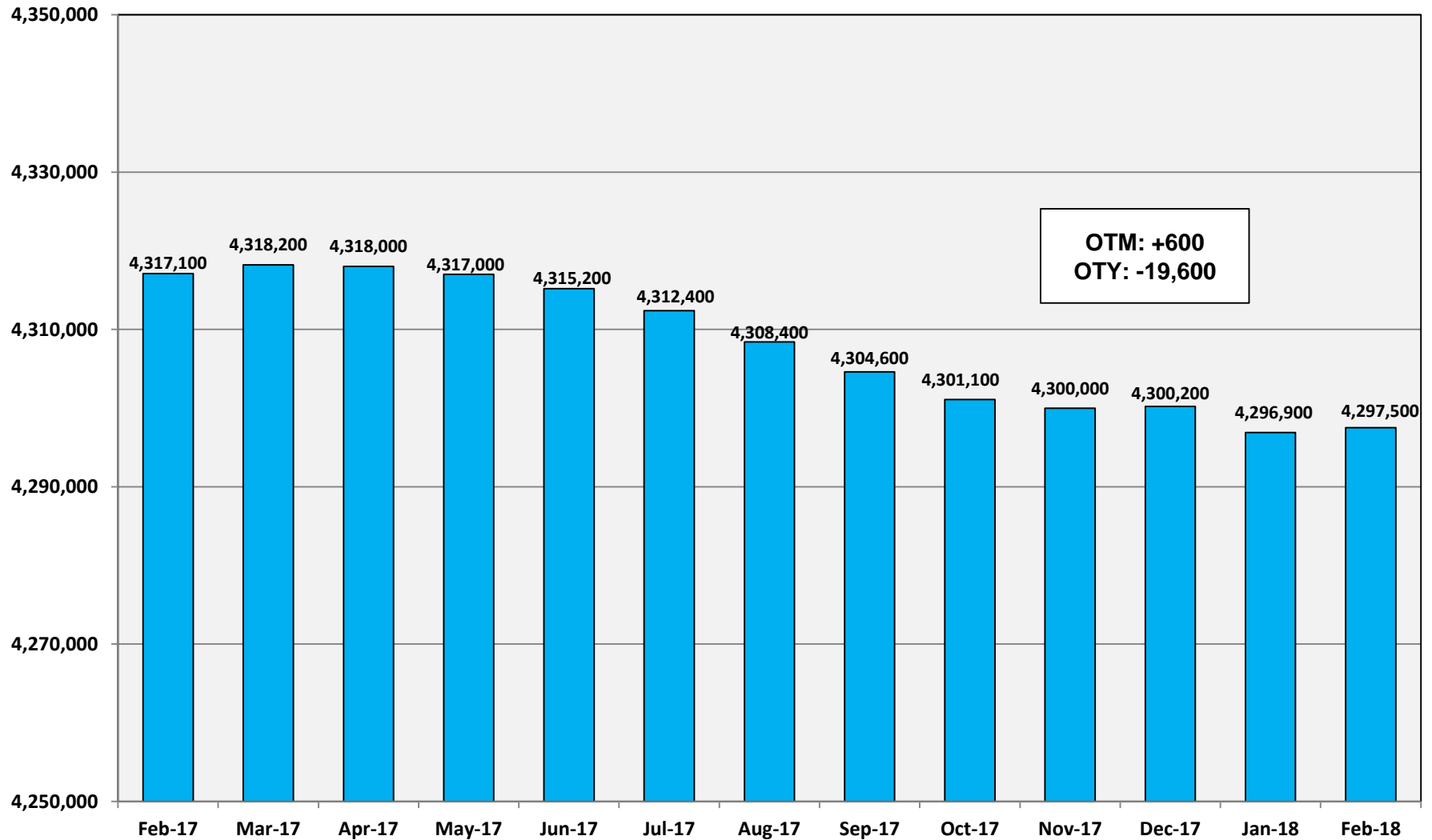
Unemployed New Jersey Residents February 2017 - February 2018



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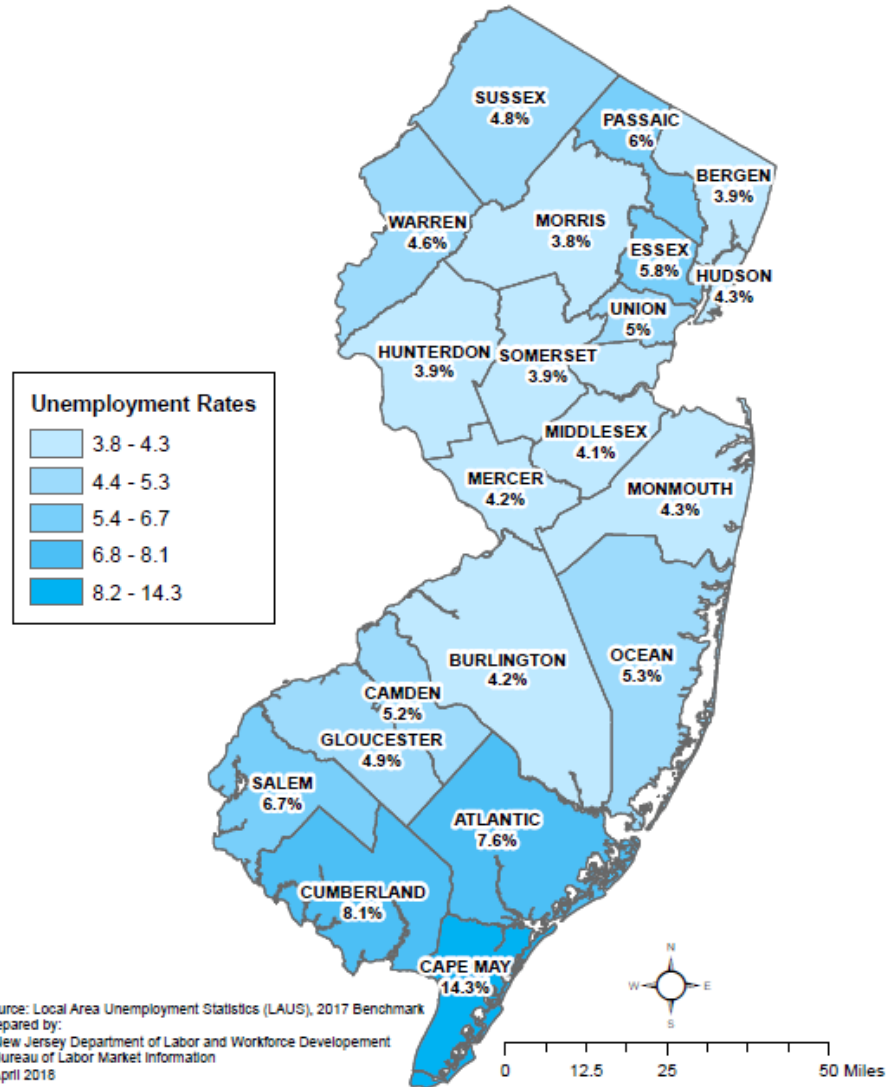
New Jersey Employed Residents: February 2017 - February 2018



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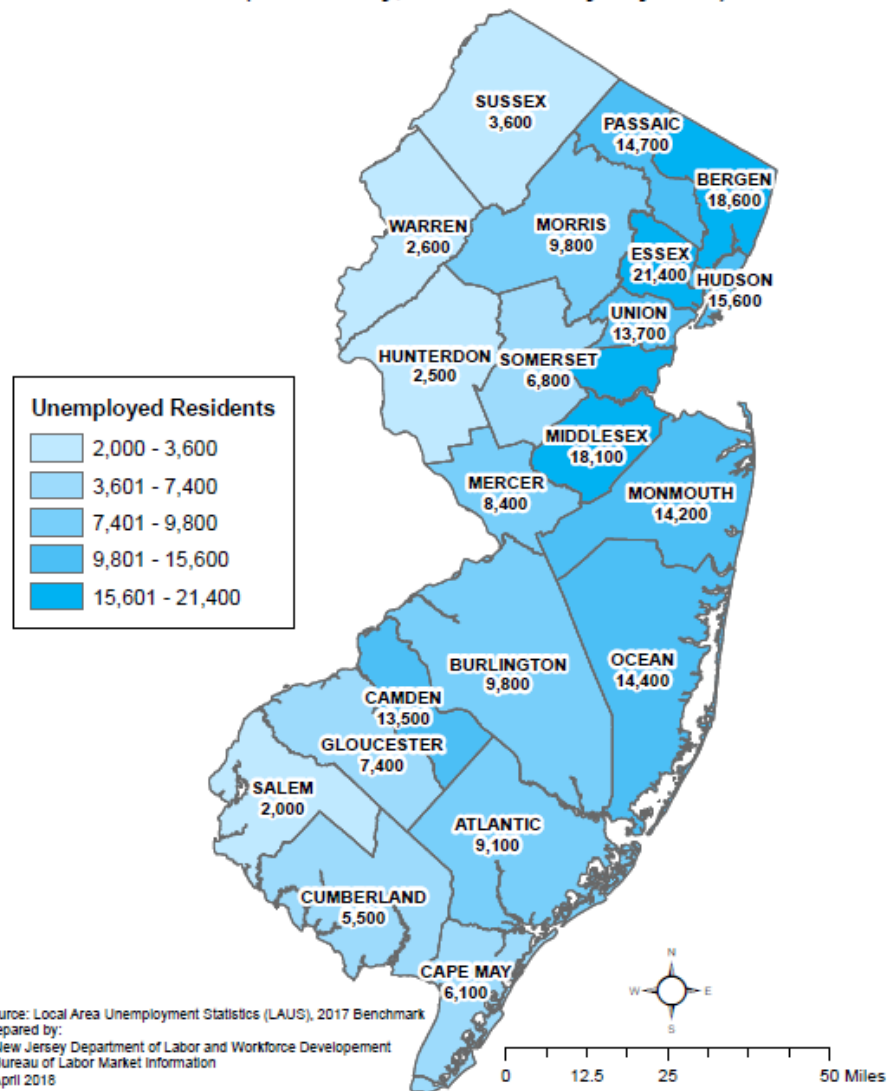
New Jersey Counties Unemployment Rates - February 2018 (Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)



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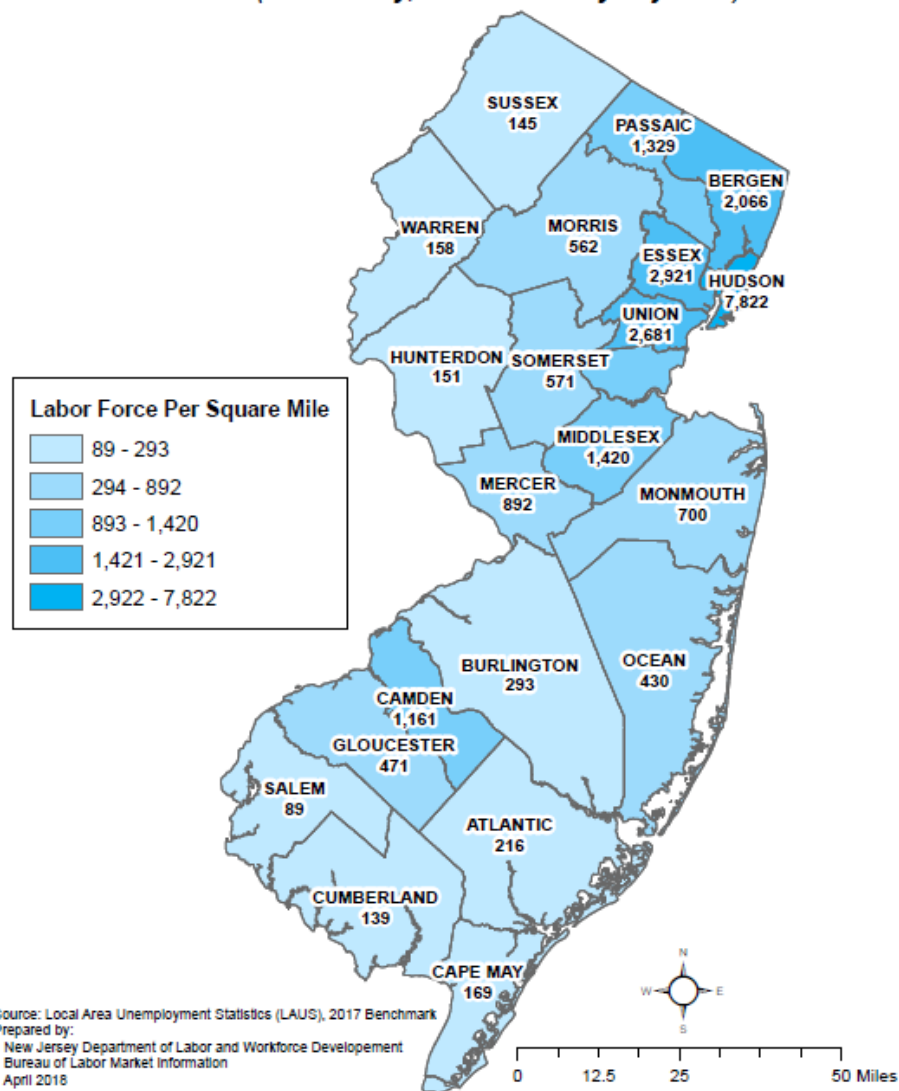

(Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)



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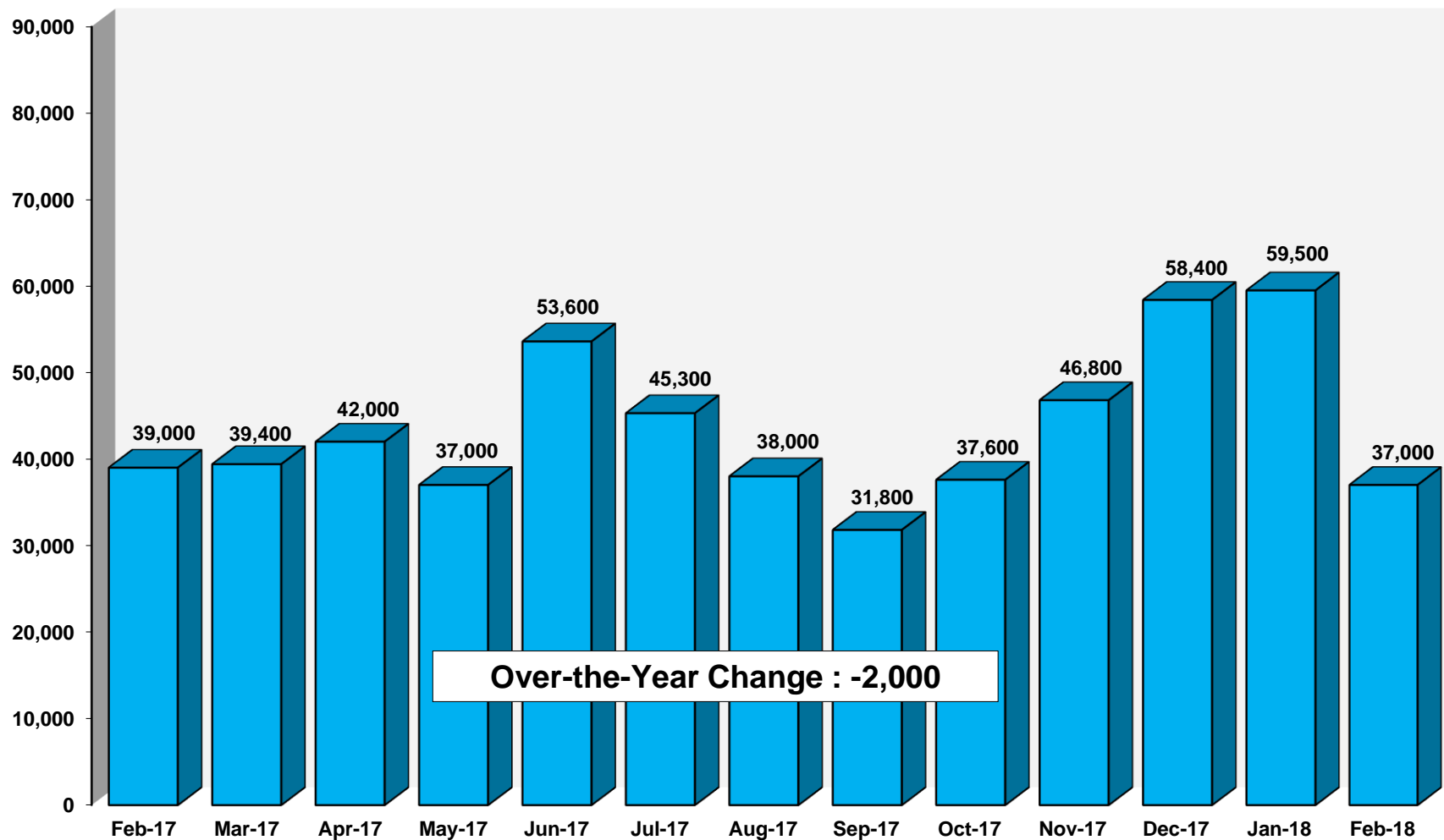
New Jersey Counties **Labor Force Per Square Mile - February 2018** (Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)
