

NOTICE TO THE BAR
**NEW JERSEY ATTORNEY ELECTRONIC REGISTRATION AND
PAYMENT FOR 2021 IS NOW AVAILABLE**


Beginning **Wednesday, January 6, 2021**, New Jersey attorneys may complete their annual registration and payment for 2021 using the Judiciary's web-based application at <https://www.njcourts.gov/attorneys/cams.html>. The deadline for 2021 registration and payment is **Friday, February 26, 2021**.

Pursuant to the Court Rules, New Jersey attorneys are required annually to file a registration statement in a form prescribed by the Administrative Director of the Courts with approval of the Supreme Court and to pay an annual assessment in an amount determined by the Supreme Court. All attorneys must complete their annual attorney registration and pay the required annual fee electronically, except those attorneys who qualify for one of the limited exceptions approved by the Supreme Court.

An additional security feature – two-factor authentication – has been implemented in the online attorney registration application this year. Attorneys are now required to use two-factor authentication when accessing the online attorney registration application, using the email address or cell phone number they provided during the previous (2020) attorney registration reporting period. Two-factor authentication provides an additional level of security by verifying the user's identity through a security code sent to the user's cell phone or email address each time the user logs into the attorney registration application. Attorneys are required to enter that security code before they can proceed to the application. Attorneys will be prompted when they first access the application in this registration cycle to either verify or update their email address and cell phone number.

In addition, attorneys maintaining a plenary or limited license to practice law in New Jersey must certify to the completion of their continuing legal education (CLE) requirements in accordance with Rule 1:42. A noncompliance fee of \$50 will be assessed against attorneys who report that they failed to complete the requisite CLE credits by the deadline for course completion. An additional \$50 (for a total of \$100) will be assessed against attorneys who fail to complete their required CLE credits within the grace period provided by BCLE Reg. 402:1 and against attorneys who fail to report regarding CLE compliance at all.
