The ten Heart of a Hero recipients are:

Technical Sergeant Robert Abato, US Airforce (38), McGuire AFB: A Senior at American Military University, Robert is involved in many community service activities, including supporting Sport Aiding the Medical Research for Kids, or SPARKS. Since becoming involved with the organization, Robert has raised over \$10,000 and spent hundreds of hours volunteering. This scholarship will help him complete his Master of Science, Environmental Policy and Management degree.

Sergeant Jonathan Bowker, NJ Army National Guard (25), Cranbury: A Junior at Rider University, Jonathan joined the Cranbury Volunteer Fire Department at the age of 16, serving his town for the past 9 years. The *Heart of a Hero* Scholarship will help Jonathan obtain his degree from the College of Business Administration in Marketing and Advertising.

Senior Airman Meredith Fleece, US Airforce (31), Belmar: After losing her brother to leukemia, Meredith became involved in the fight against cancer through Relay for Life. More recently, in the aftermath of Superstorm Sandy, she worked with Family Promise of Monmouth County, helping families affected by the storm. A Senior at Monmouth University, Meredith is pursuing a career in social work with the military population.

Staff Sergeant Chivonne Green, NJ Air National Guard, (32), Pemberton: A Junior at Moore College of Art & Design, Chivonne is active in the Boys & Girls program at her church and assist with hosting events that keep children and teens off the streets and mentors two thirteen year-old girls in her community. This scholarship will help Chivonne attain her goal of becoming a licensed interior designer.

Specialist Kevin Parks, US Army (28), Highland Park: A third year medical student at Rutgers, Kevin noticed a need to help the veteran community on campus. He and two friends began RU-SERVS (Rutgers University-Services, Education and Resources for Veterans. The *Heart of a Hero Scholarship* will help Kevin achieve his medical degree.

Specialist James Raczowski US Army (26) Brigantine: A Freshman at the New York Academy of Art, James has volunteered at Covenant House in Atlantic City, teaching poetry to homeless at-risk youth. As a classically trained artist and combat veteran, James' goal is to use his art to help others better understand those who have experienced combat. This scholarship will help attain that goal.

Airman First Class Rebecca Roberts, US Airforce (18), Millville: A Sophomore at Rowan University, Rebecca has spent much of her time tutoring special needs children at the elementary school she attended as a child. The *Heart of a Hero* Scholarship will help Rebecca pursue a degree in Political Science.

Captain Christopher Southard, U.S. Marines (33) Margate: Currently serving overseas in Liberia, Christopher is working to obtain his graduate degree for a Master of Science Degree in Criminal Justice. Despite being on military assignments, he has been able to volunteer his time over the past nine years to the Mary Theresa Sher Foundation

Sergeant Ericka Steele, US Marines (29), Ocean: A Senior at Monmouth University, Ericka volunteers her time by giving back to veterans through the Work Vessels for Veterans organization, giving hundreds of hours of service to help the veteran community. This scholarship will help her complete her Bachelor's degree in Business Management.

Captain Michelle Williams, NJ Air National Guard (34), Chesterfield: Michelle volunteers her time and resources to support fellow Airmen and their families through events like Family Day and makes herself available to pick up deployments of men and women who want to be home with their families during the holidays. The Heart of a Hero Scholarship will help Michelle pursue a Master Degree in Social Work.

Yesterday's scholarship announcement builds upon the Christie Administration's ongoing commitment to New Jersey's military service members and veterans. The Governor recently signed a series of jobs-related legislation to help get the state's military heroes and their families back to work

In addition, the Department of Labor and Workforce Development continues to partner with the New Jersey Building and Construction Trades Council through the Helmets to Hardhats program to give veterans skills and placement in the building trades and the Department has implemented the Operation Hire a Hero program to promote job opportunities for veterans by connecting to employers.

New Jersey Heroes is an initiative of First Lady Mary Pat Christie that showcases the positive and unique ways people and organizations are impacting New Jersey and their communities.
