As the fiscal year ended October 31, 1870, there was a balance due on appropriation to the several counties for Public Schools, of thirty-three thousand three hundred and thirty-three dollars and forty-one cents, (\$33,333.41,) which amount was paid November 15, 1870, and appears in statements of the year. The balance of appropriation due the School Fund from State Fund, for 1870, of fifty-five thousand dollars (\$55,000) has been transferred to School Fund; also, thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) of the amount appropriated for 1871, leaving a balance of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) due from State Fund to School Fund, for the year 1871.

The Agricultural College Fund, amounting to one hundred and sixteen thousand dollars (\$116,000) in all, invested in bonds of this State, the interest, amounting to six thousand nine hundred and sixty dollars (\$6,960,) has been received and disbursed for the maintenance of "Rutgers' Scientific School."
