## SECTION XVII,

THE ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT CONCERNING INNS AND TAVERNS." PASSED

## FEBRUARY 24, 1797.

It shall be the duty of the said courts, and they are hereby respeced, at every of their spring sessions hereafter to ascertain the rates and pasture for horses, to be taken by every licensed innholder and tavern-keeper while the court, and in ten days after such session, fix or set up to open view, in the most public room in his or her inn and tavern, a fair copy of the *rates* and *prices* of the articles and things so ascertained by the said court, with a copy of this clause thereunto subjoined, attested by the said clerk, and keep up the said copy so as aforesaid, exposed to open view until a new rate shall be made, under the penalty of four dollars for every, day that he or she shall refuse, neglect, or omit to fix, set, or keep up the same, to be sued for and recovered by action of debt, with costs, in any court of record having cognizance thereof, by any person or persons who shall prosecute for the same ; and further, if any innholder and tavern-keeper shall ask, demand or receive a greater price for any liquors, diet, lodging, provender, stabling, pasturage, or other article, than by such rate shall be allowed, he or she so offending, shall for every offence, forfeit and pay four dollars, to be recovered in the manner last above mentioned, and his licensë shall immediately thereupon become void ; and lastly, the said clerk shall be entition innholder and tavern-keeper for the copy of rates aforesaid, and this
