

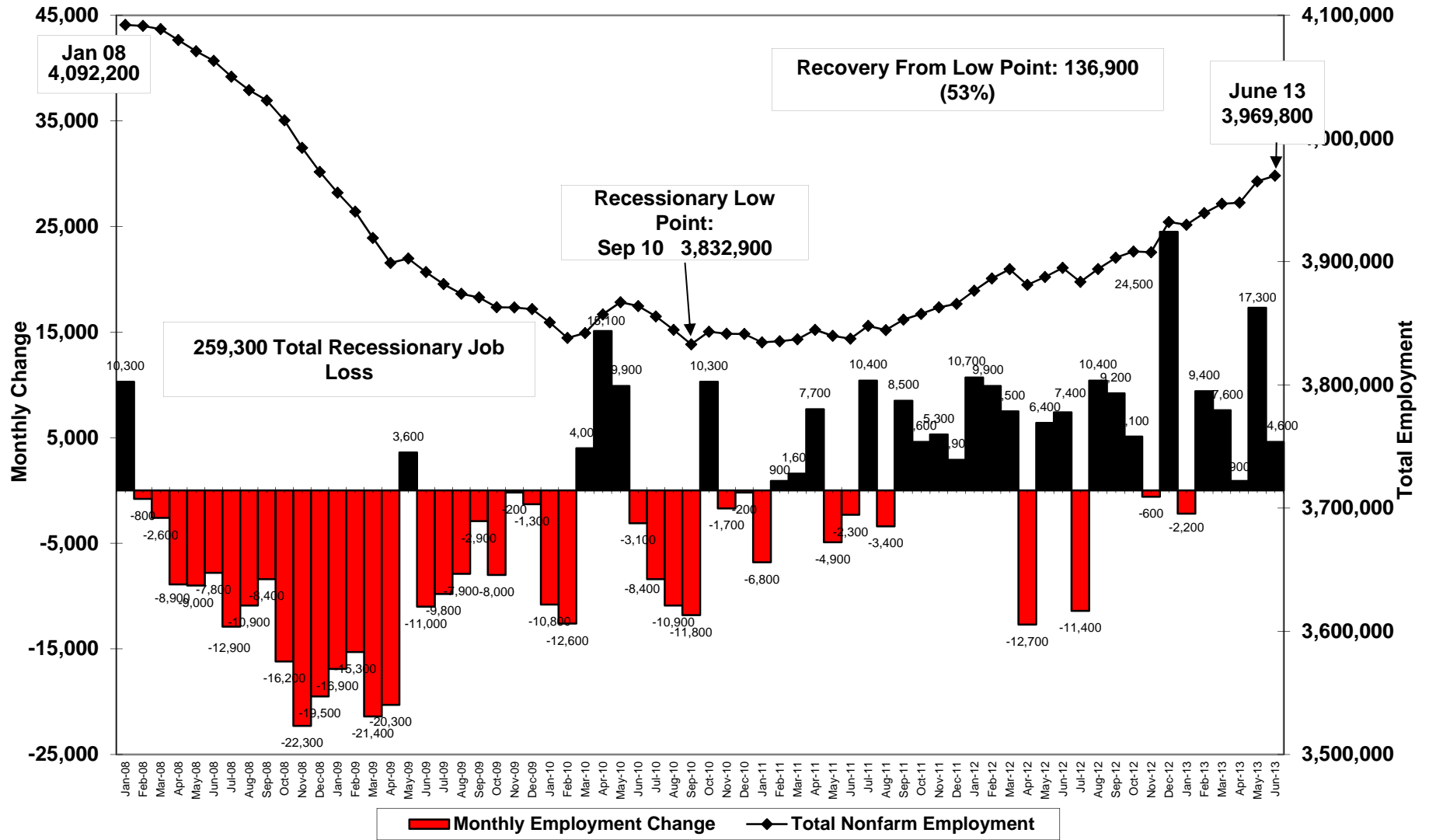

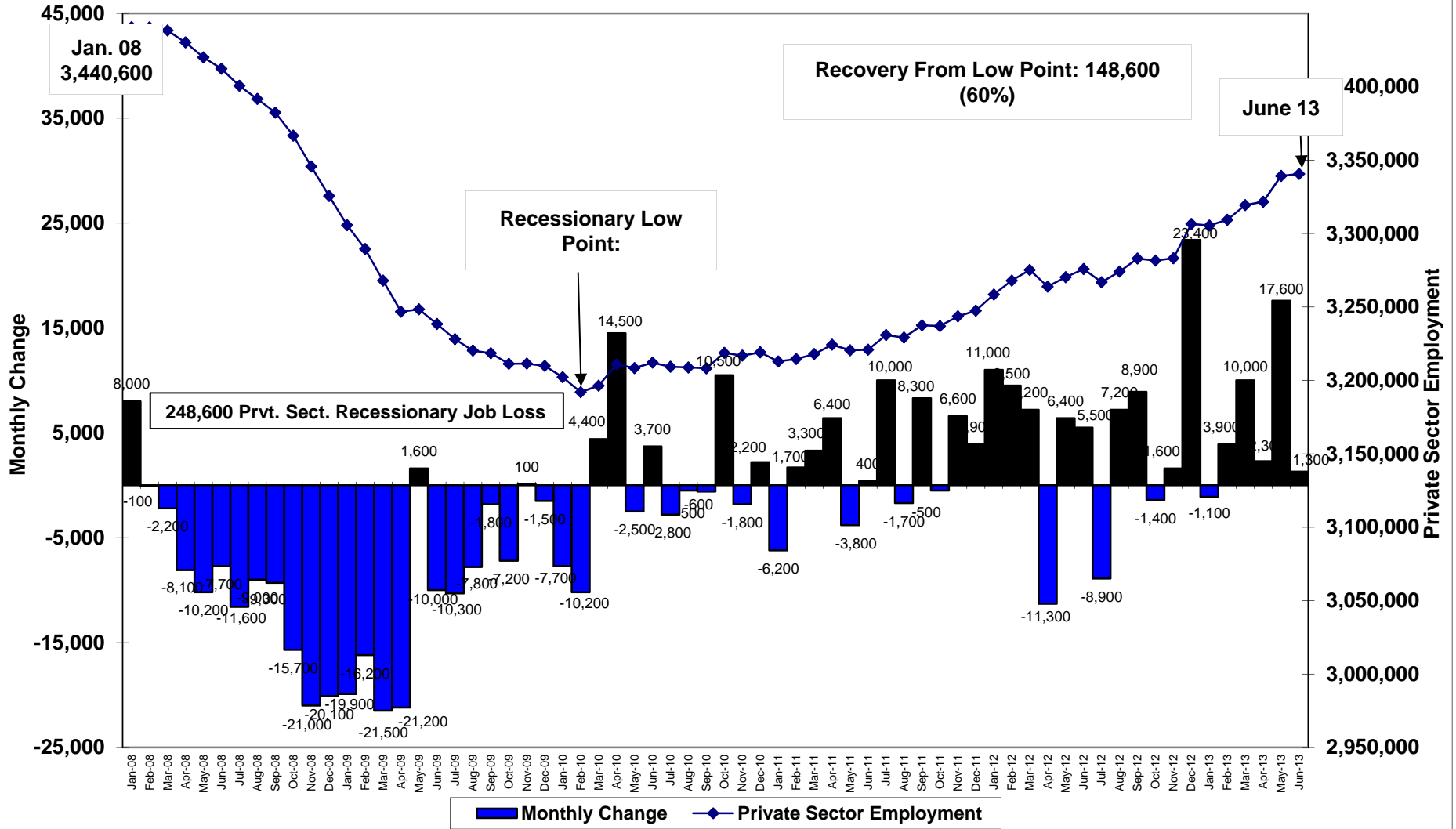

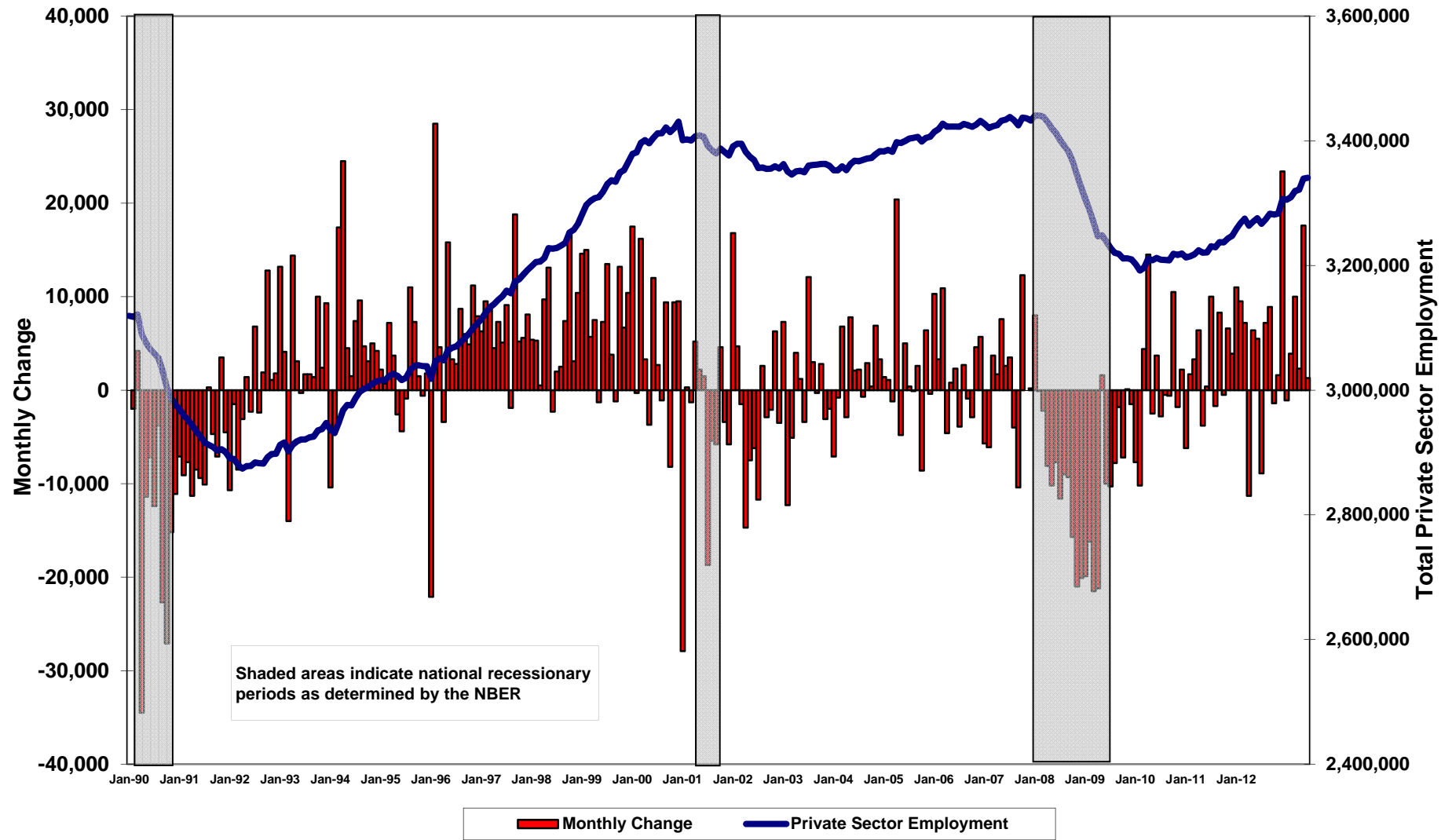
## New Jersey Total Nonfarm Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - June 2013



## New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - June 2013



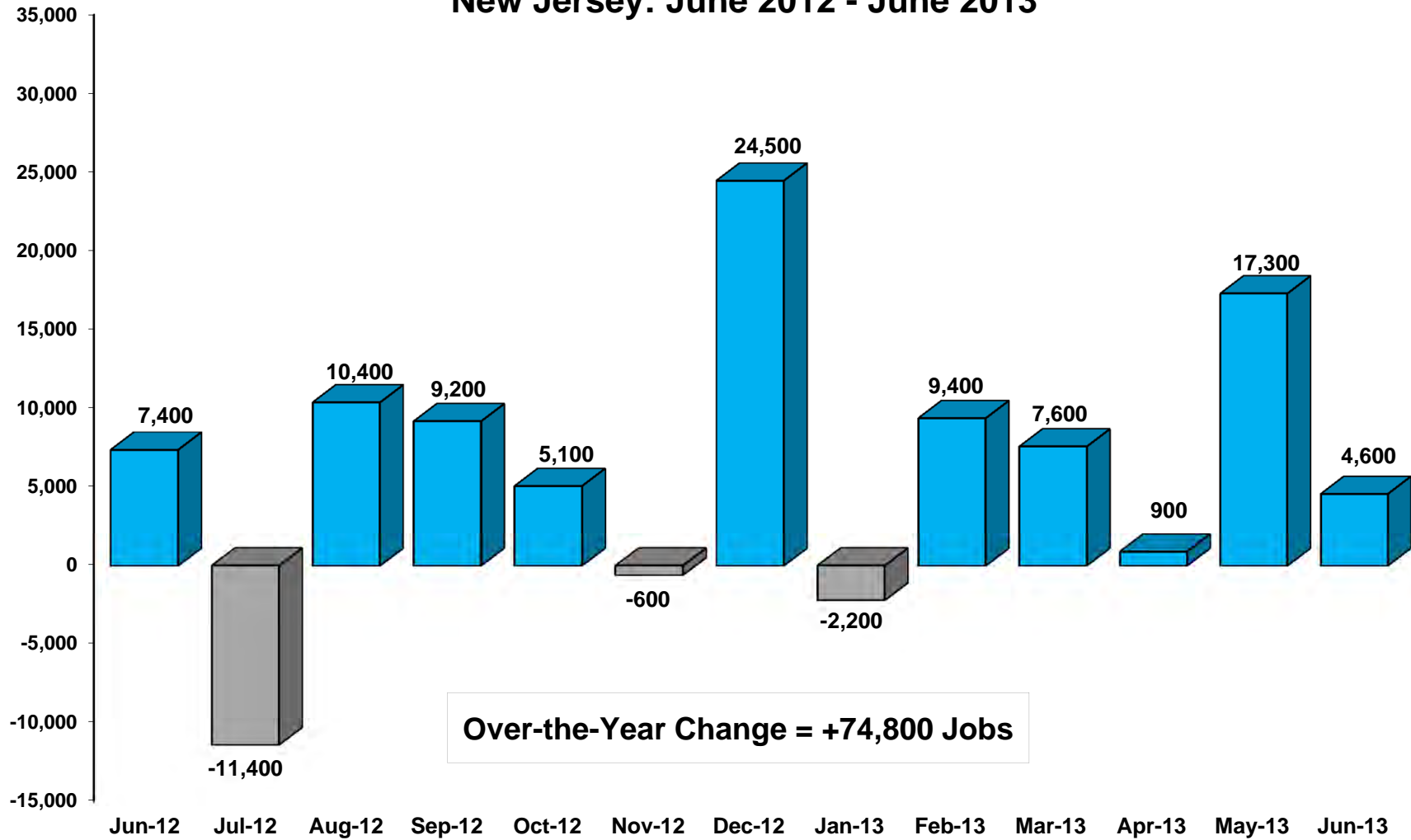
## New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 1990 - June 2013



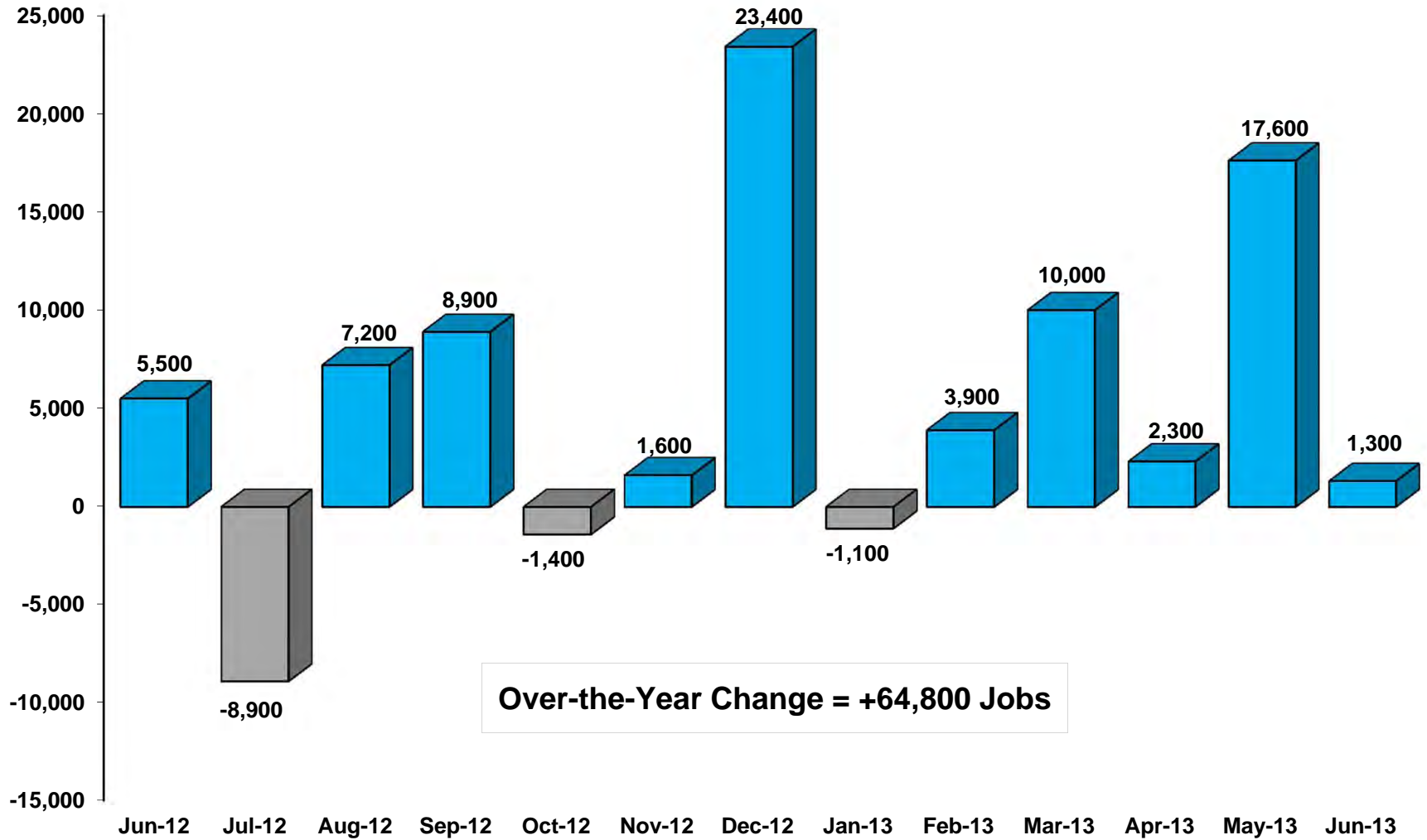

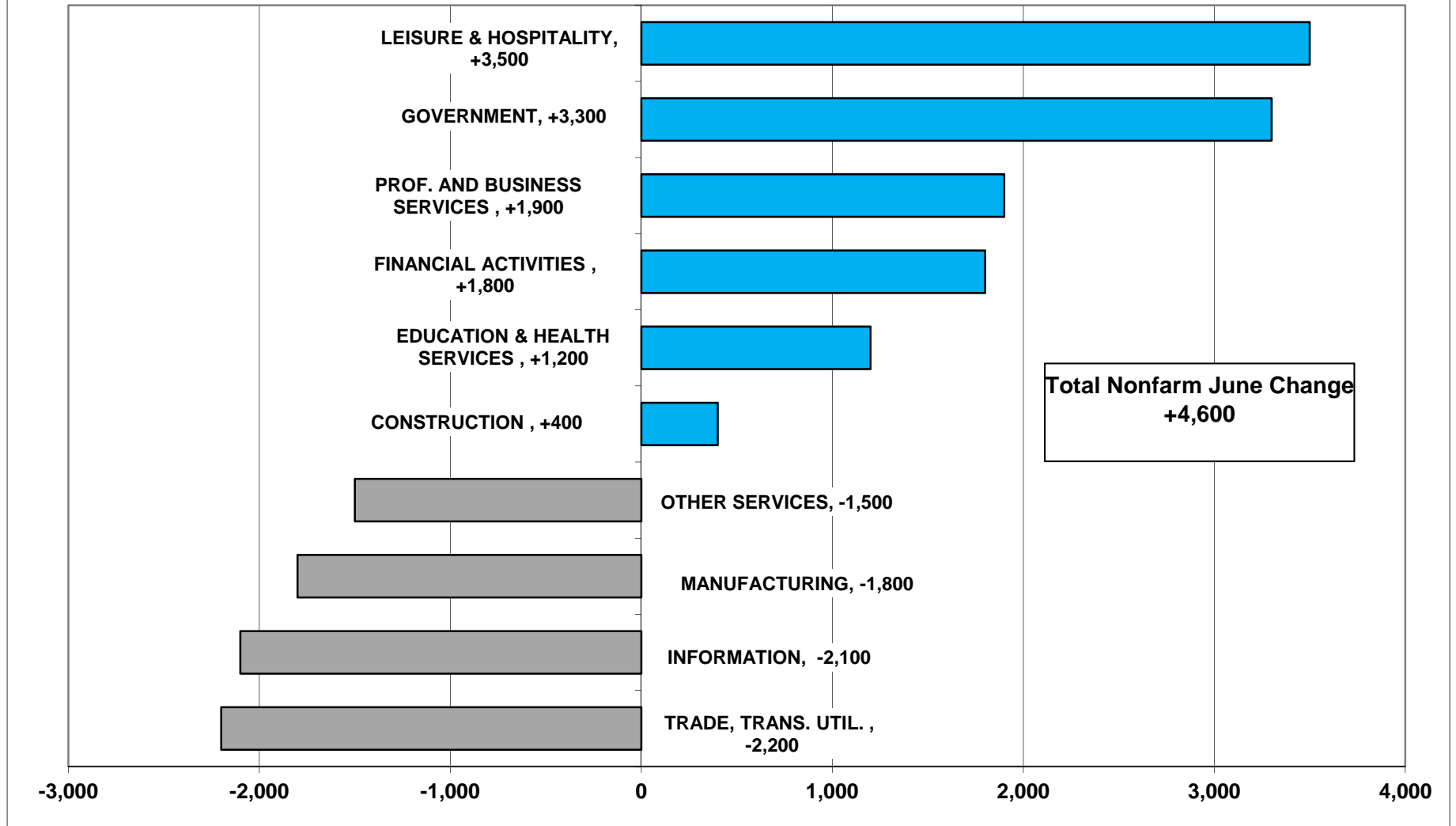
### Monthly Total Employment Change New Jersey: June 2012 - June 2013



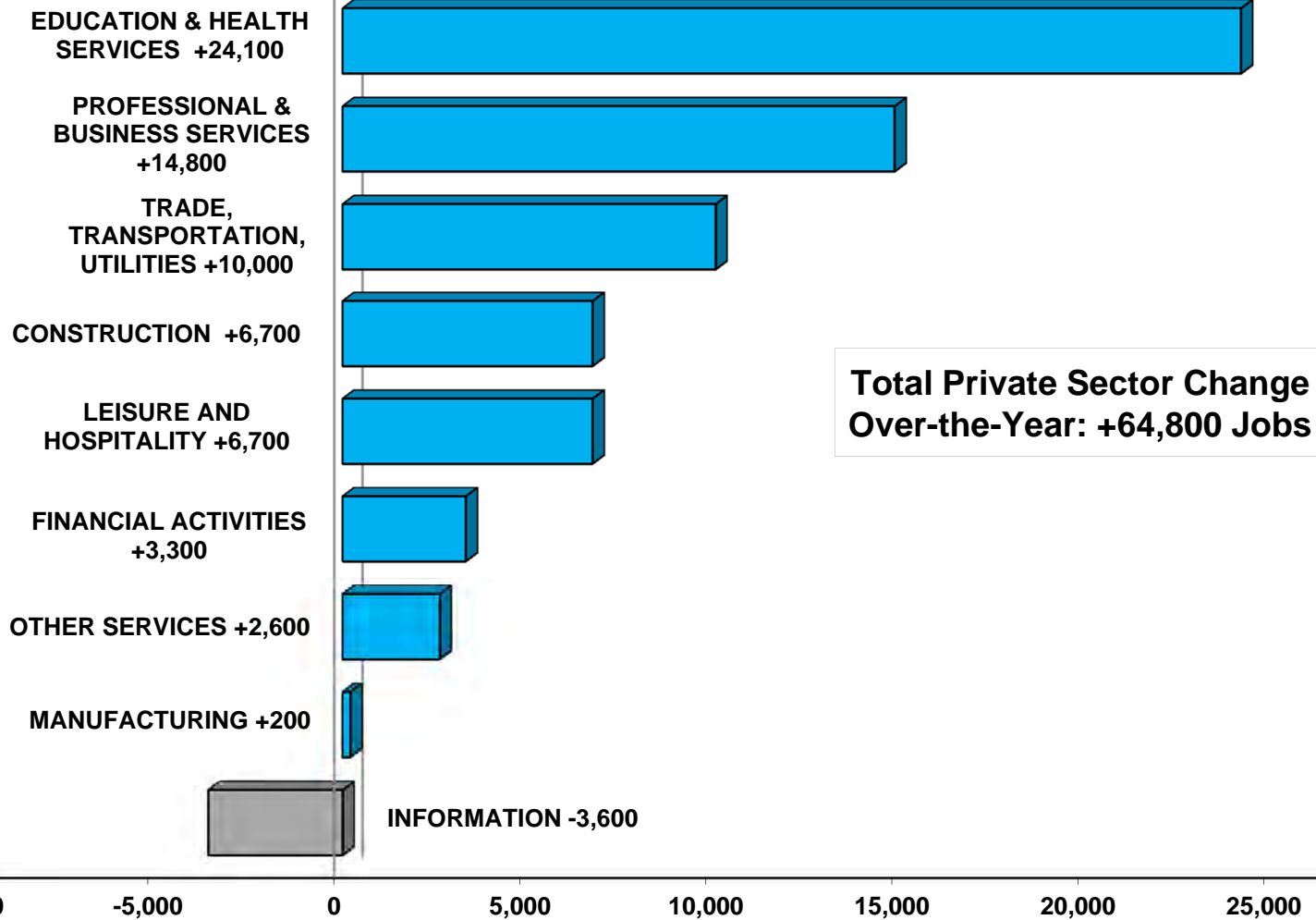
## Monthly Private Sector Employment Change June 2012 - June 2013



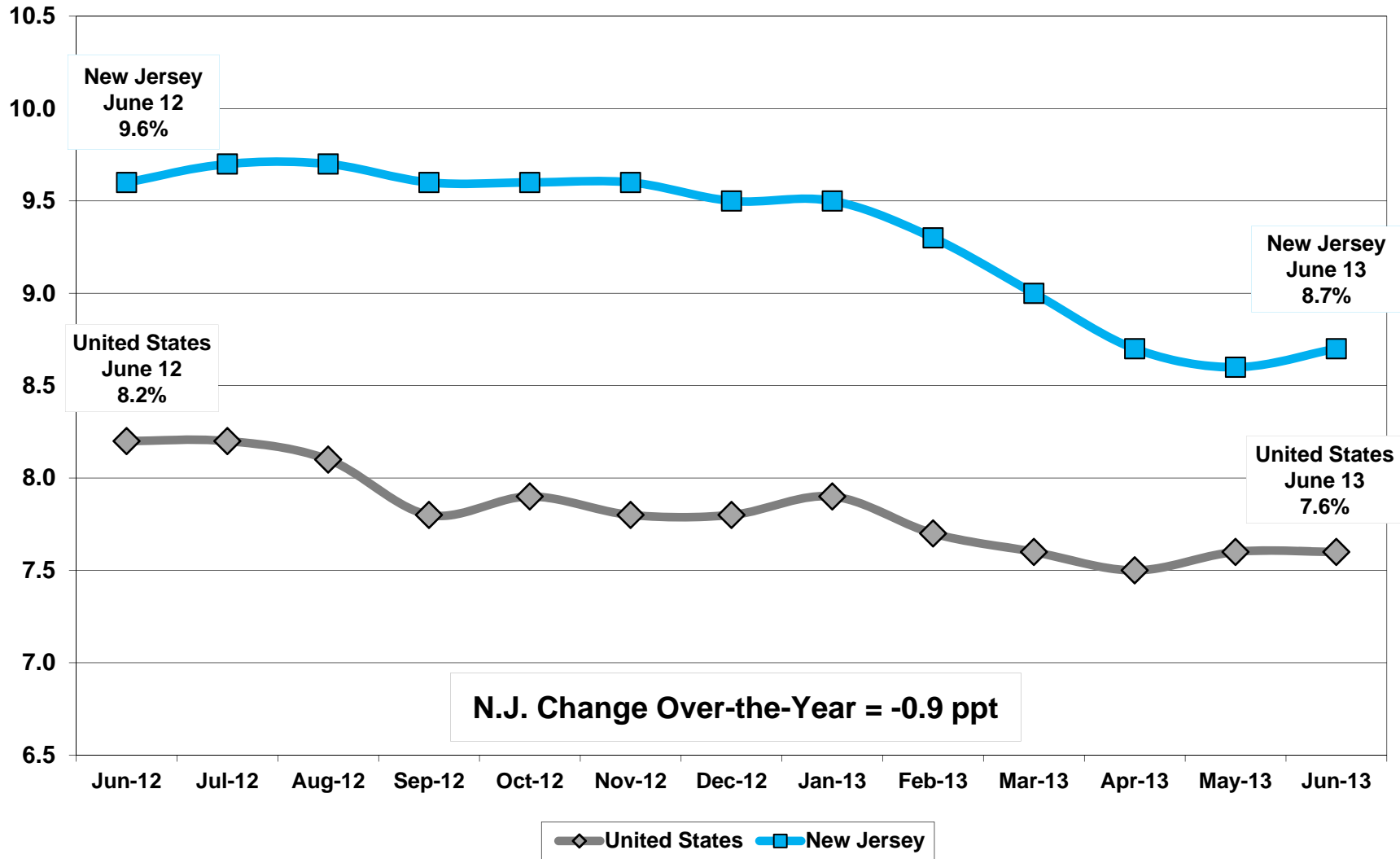
## Monthly Employment Change: June 2013



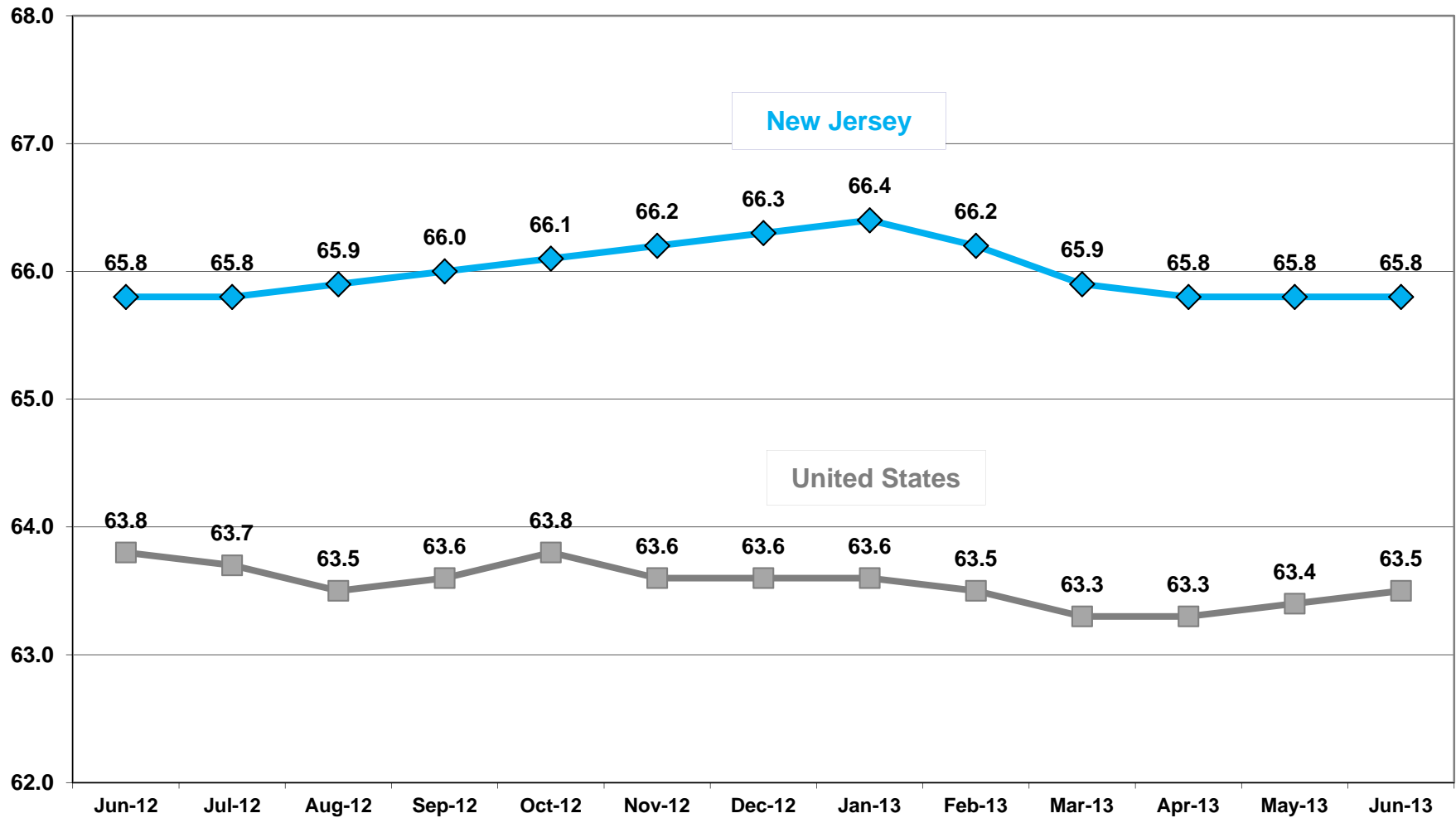
## New Jersey Private Sector Employment Change by Industry June 2012 - June 2013



## Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States: June 2012 - June 2013



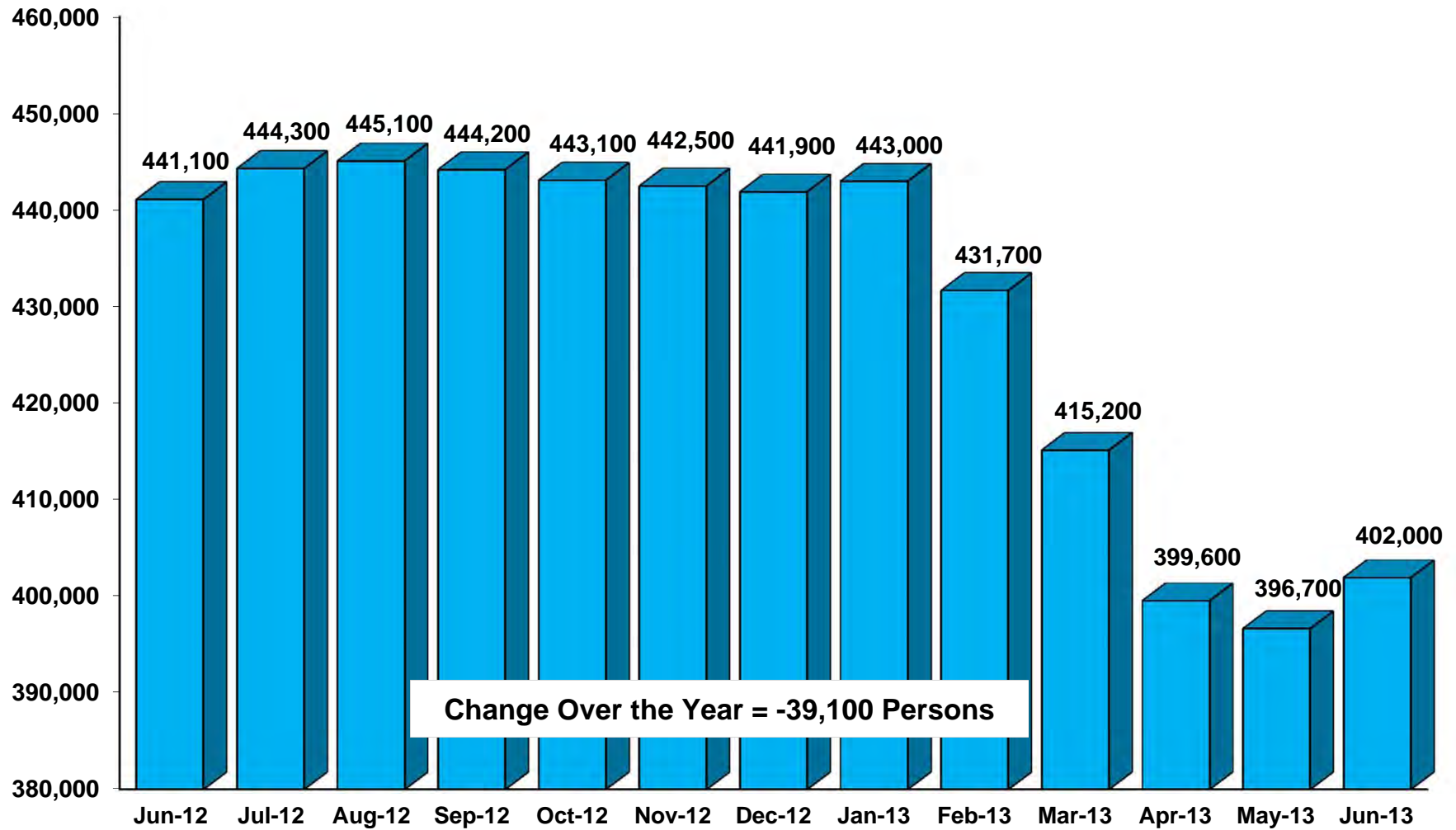
## New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: June 2012 - June 2013

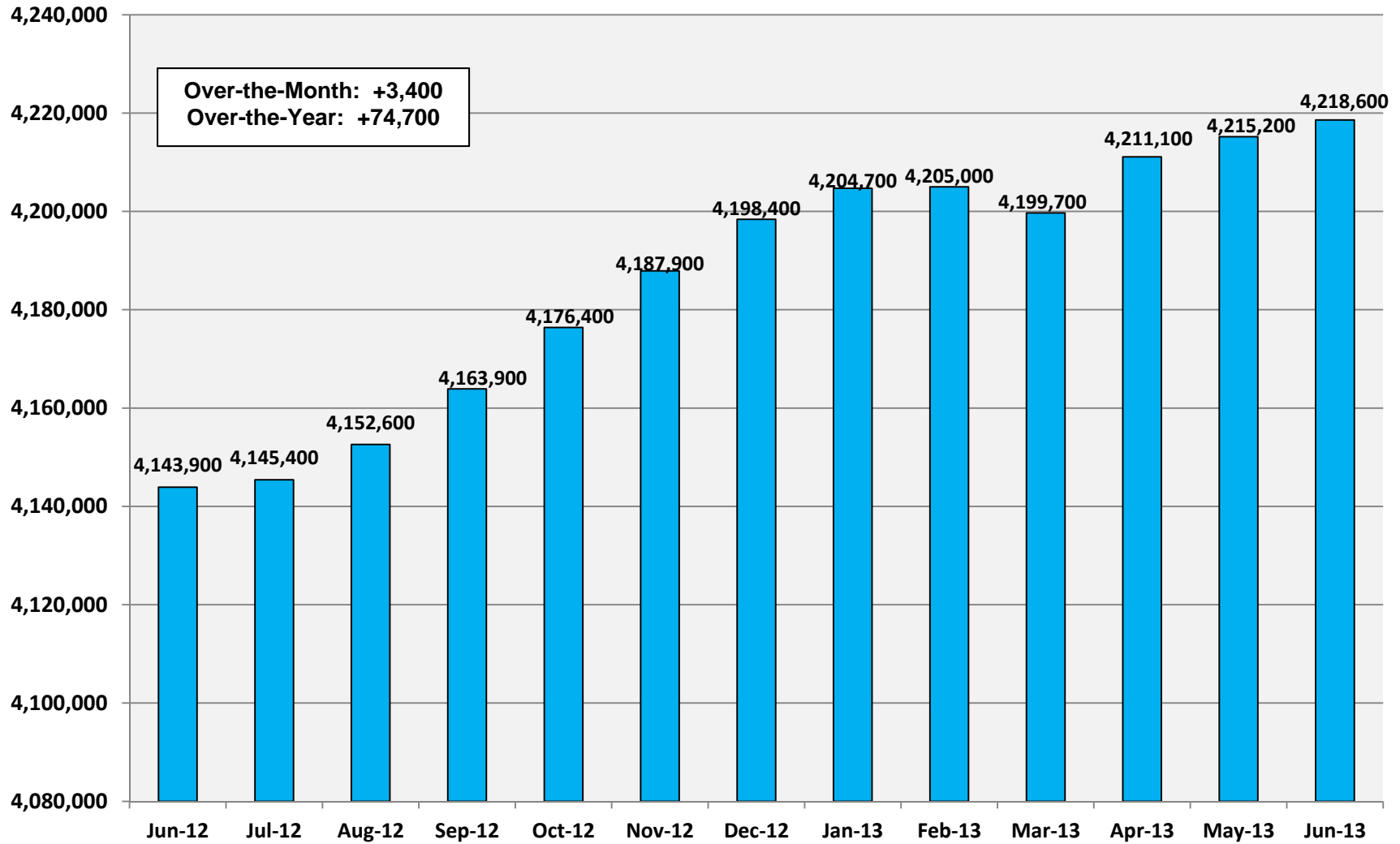
## Unemployed New Jersey Residents June 2012 - June 2013



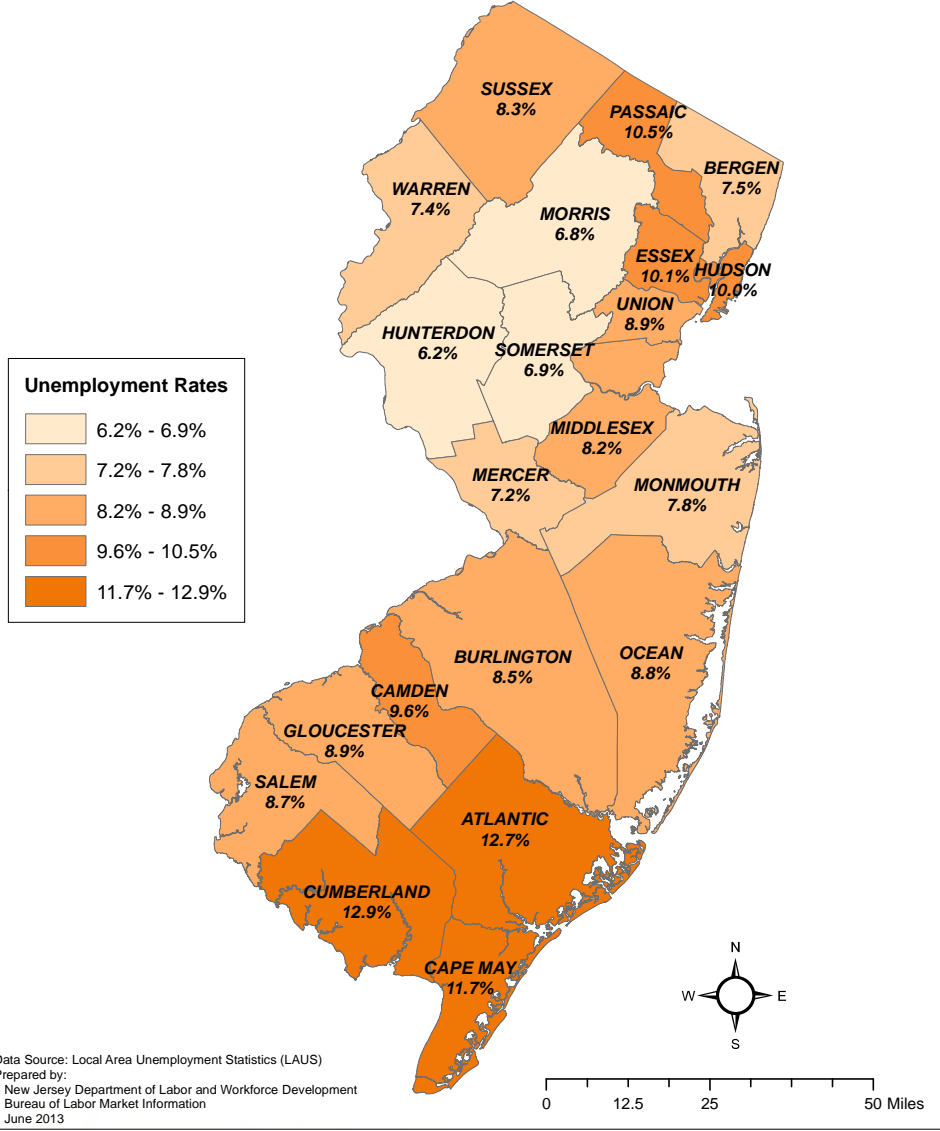

### New Jersey Employed Residents: June 2012 - June 2013



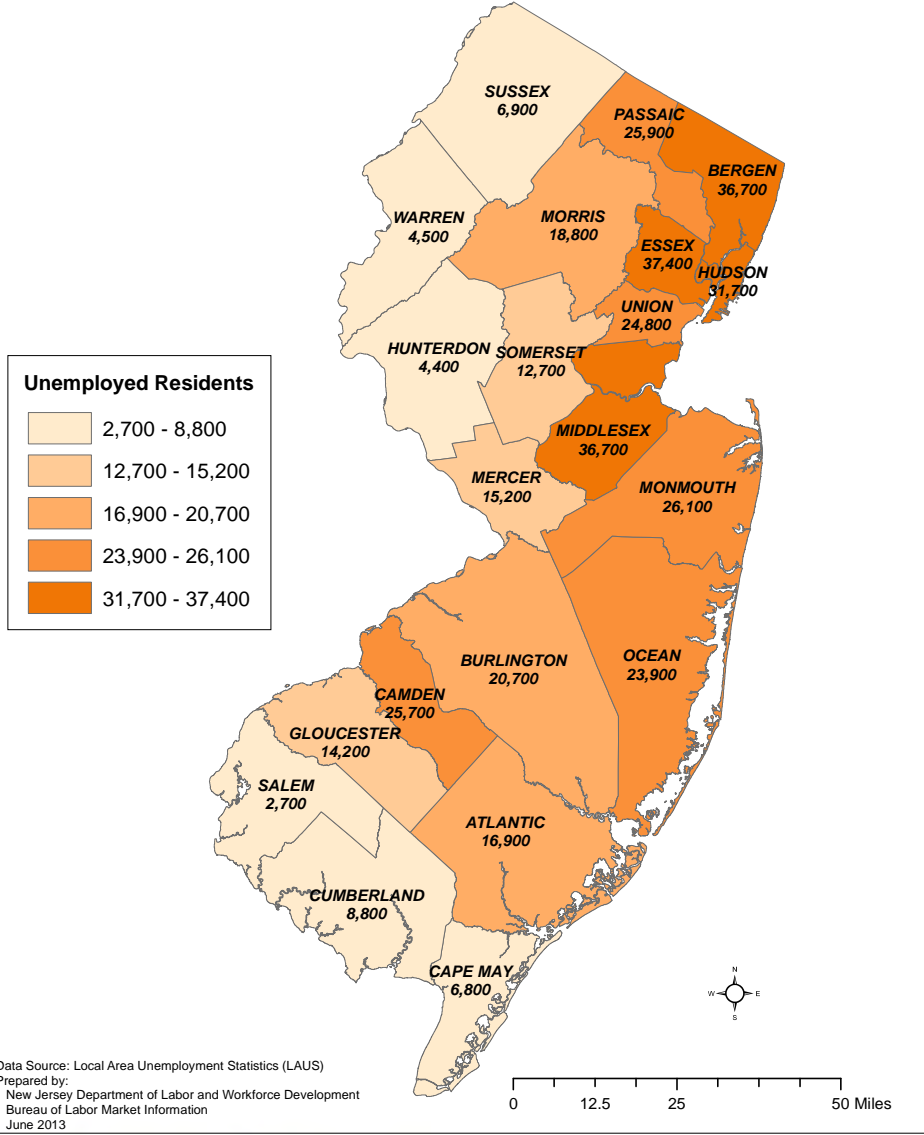
### New Jersey Counties Unemployment Rates - May 2013 (Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)



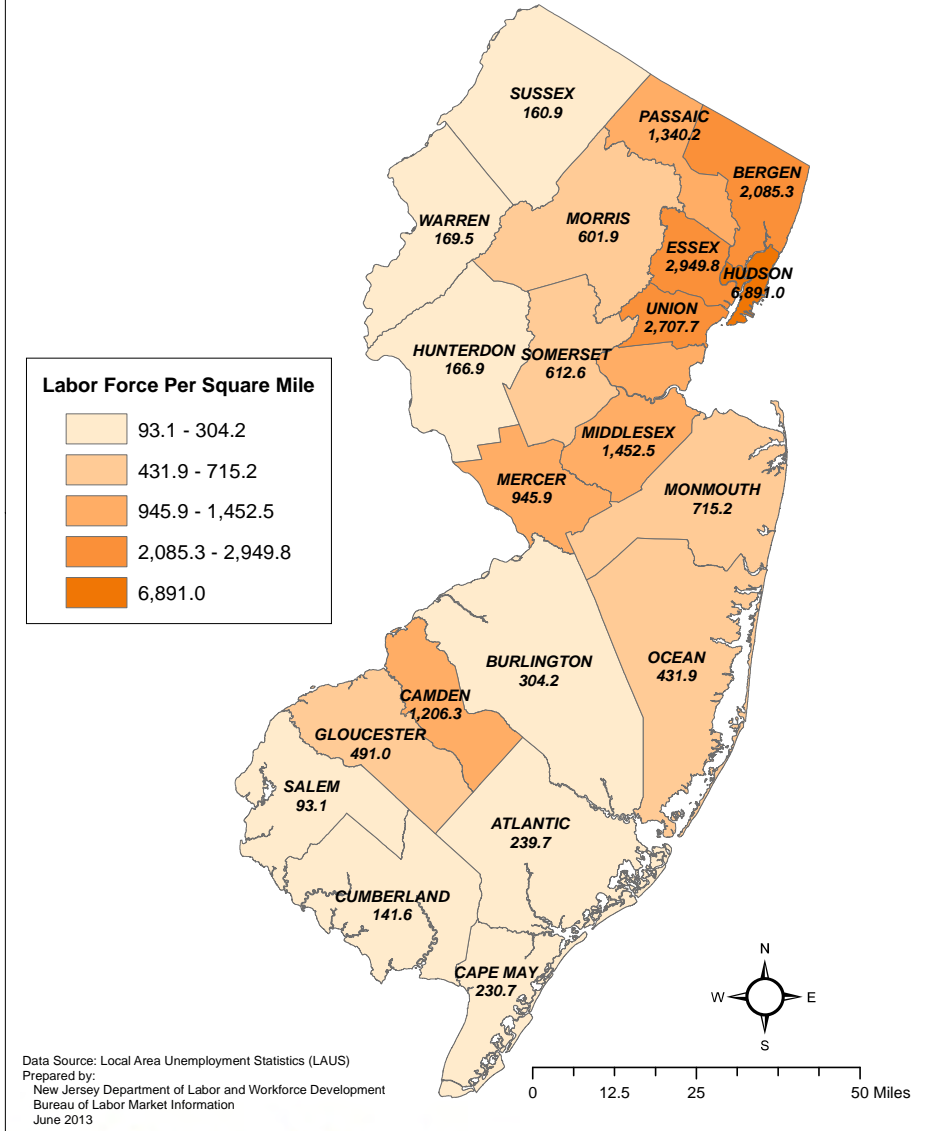

### New Jersey Counties Unemployed Residents - May 2013 (Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)



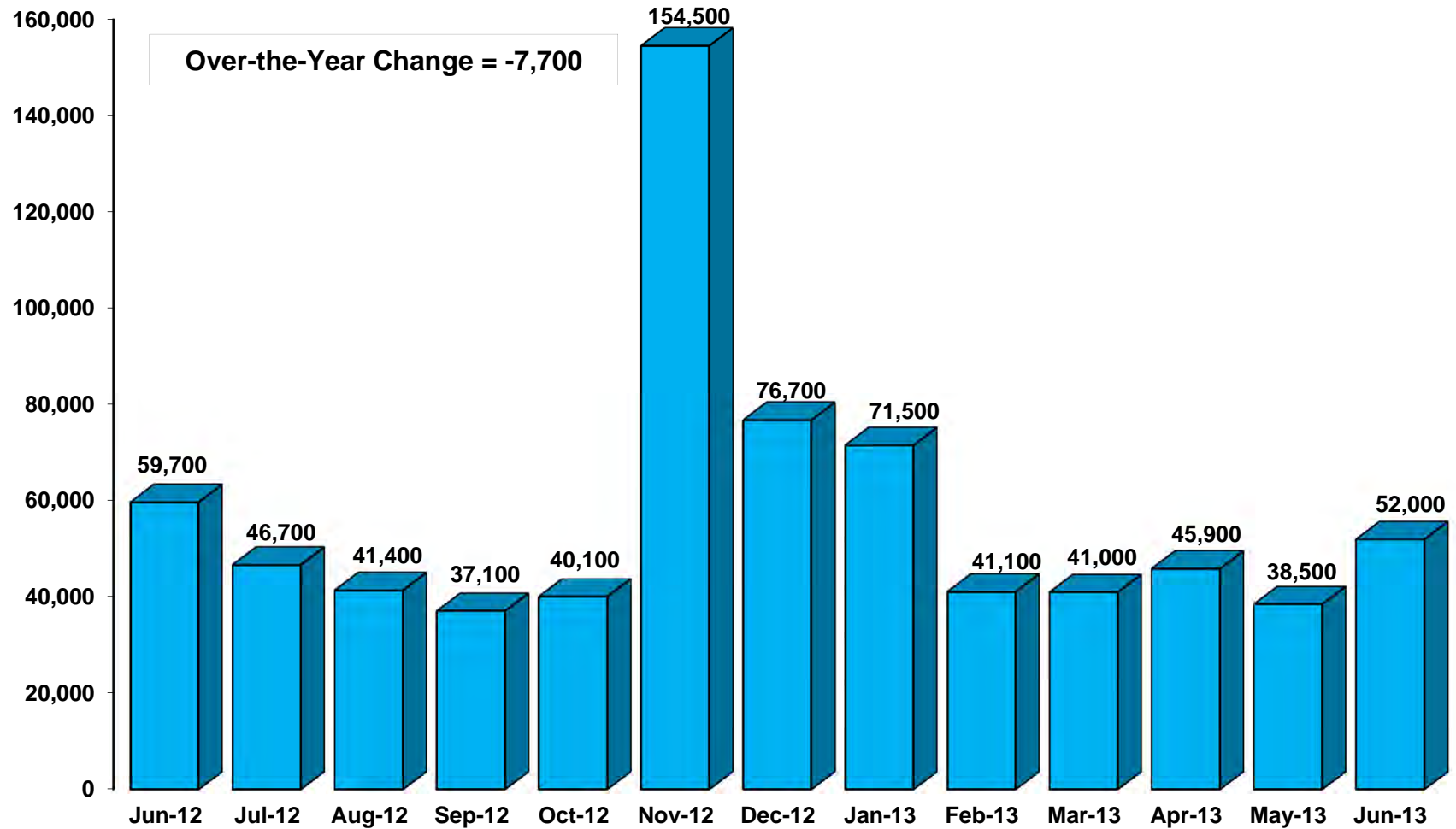
### New Jersey Counties Labor Force Per Square Mile - May 2013 (Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)
