According to the U.S. Small Business Administration, there were nearly 28 million small businesses in the United States in 2011. Data from the New Jersey Department of Labor & Workforce Development indicates that New Jersey companies with less than fifty employees make up over 96 percent of all companies statewide and employ about 36 percent of our state's private sector workers.

"Since Hurricane Sandy struck New Jersey, I witnessed countless scenes of New Jerseyans giving of themselves to help others in need," noted Lt. Governor Guadagno, who leads economic development efforts for the Christie Administration. "This Saturday, all New Jerseyans can take part in our recovery effort by shopping at local businesses. Doing this is very meaningful for these small businesses owners, the communities recovering from the storm, and the state's overall economy."
